The Huskers welcome 11 newcomers to the 2020-21 squad. The group includes two transfers and nine freshmen who combined for the No. 2 ranked class by WIN.

### THE MATCHUP

The No. 5 Nebraska wrestling team kicks off the season on Friday, Jan. 8, hosting No. 12 Minnesota at the Bob Devaney Sports Center. The dual begins at 8 p.m. and will be broadcast by BTN.

Nebraska opens the 2020-21 campaign 306 days after the team last competed at the 2020 Big Ten Championships in March. Friday's season-opener marks the first time since 1958 that NU begins the season in January.

The Huskers' roster features 11 wrestlers with dual experience as the team heads into Big Ten competition. The group includes All-Americans Chad Red Jr., Taylor Venz, Eric Schultz, Mikey Labriola, Ridge Lovett and Peyton Robb. In addition, Alex Thomsen, a 2020 NCAA qualifier, and Christian Lance return as two starters who gained significant dual experience last season. Rounding out the group are Caleb Licking, Jevon Parrish and Colton Wolfe who have a combined 3-7 record in duals.

Nebraska and Minnesota meet for the 74th time in series history on Friday. The Golden Gophers lead the all-time series 50-23, but the Huskers have won the last four matchups. In the last meeting between the two teams, Nebraska earned a 29-12 victory to close the regular-season on a six dual win streak. NU won seven of 10 bouts to extend their momentum heading into the conference championship.

The dual is one of three home contests the Huskers host at the Devaney Center this season. The team welcomes Northwestern and Maryland on Jan. 23 for a tri-meet and closes the home slate with Wisconsin on Jan. 31.

## 2019-20 RECAP

### EIGHT GARNER ALL-AMERICA HONORS

Eight Huskers received All-America accolades at the conclusion of 2020 season. Chad Red Jr., Isaiah White, Taylor Venz and Eric Schultz rounded out the Huskers on the first-team. Collin Purinton and Mikey Labriola earned second-team honors. Ridge Lovett and Peyton Robb picked up Honorable Mention recognition.

### BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Huskers finished second with 132 points at the 2020 Big Ten Championships, the program's best finish as a member of the conference. Eric Schultz (2nd -- 197 pounds) was the top individual finisher for Nebraska. Chad Red Jr. (141), Collin Purinton (149), Peyton Robb (157), Isaiah White (165) and Taylor Venz (184) placed third in their respective weight classes.

### REGULAR SEASON

Nebraska finished the season No. 4 in the final national dual rankings with an 11-3 record. Nebraska went 6-3 in the Big Ten, which was good enough to tie for fourth in the regular-season Big Ten standings. The Huskers posted a 6-5 mark against ranked opponents.

## BACK POINTS

### HUSKERS TO FACE ABBREVIATED SCHEDULE

Nebraska posted an 11-3 dual record in 2019-20, its tenth consecutive winning season and 31st winning season in the last 33 years. This winter, the Huskers look to continue that streak and build off a second-place finish at the 2020 Big Ten Championships.

NU meets nine opponents in this season's condensed conference-only schedule. The home schedule is highlighted by duals against Minnesota (Jan. 8) and Wisconsin (Jan. 31). Nebraska will host a triangular meet with Maryland and Northwestern on Jan. 23.

Nebraska faces a challenging road schedule with notable trips to Iowa (Jan. 15), Indiana (Feb. 6) and Illinois (Feb. 21). The Huskers compete in a quad-dual in Bloomington where the team will face the Hoosiers, Rutgers and Michigan

### MANNING MARKS 20TH YEAR AT THE HELM

The Huskers will have a familiar face at the helm this season as Mark Manning enters his third decade as the head coach of the Nebraska wrestling program. In his 21st season leading Nebraska, Manning is the all-time winningest coach in program history with a mark of 246-93-3. During his decorated coaching career, Manning has coached 53 of Nebraska's 112 All-Americans and four of Nebraska's 11 national champions. The Huskers have five consecutive top-10 NCAA finishes under Manning's direction and nine top-10 NCAA finishes overall during his tenure. Manning has also been instrumental in helping former Huskers Jordan Burroughs and James Green enjoy international success, as Burroughs won the Olympic Gold in 2012 and World Championship Gold in 2017, while Green earned World Championship Silver in 2017.

### VETERAN GROUP RETURNS TO LEAD NU

Nebraska will be guided by a strong group of veteran returners for the 2020-21 campaign. The Huskers lose just two senior starters as they get set for this year's campaign. Collin Purinton (149) went 18-9 overall in his senior season and Isaiah White (165) recorded a 20-4 record. Both earned All-America honors with third-place finishes at the 2020 Big Ten Championships in their respective weight classes. David Jensen (HWT), Zak Hensley (133), Kyle Ruettiger (157) and Cade Svoboda (197) added depth.

The Huskers qualified all 10 roster spots for the 2020 NCAA Championships before the event's cancellation due to the coronavirus pandemic. Seven of those qualifiers, and six All-Americans, return to the mat for NU this season. The senior class touts three returning All-Americans in Chad Red Jr. (141), Eric Schultz (197) and Taylor Venz (184). Red Jr. picked up his third All-America honor after earning a 15-6 overall record and a third-place finish at the 2020 Big Ten Championships. Schultz recorded the highest Husker finish at the conference championships, finishing second and earning his first All-America honor. Earning All-America honors for the second time in his career, Venz finished third at the Big Ten Championships and finished the season with a 16-8 overall record. Junior Mikey Labriola (174) capped off his second season at NU with a sixth-place finish at the Big Ten Championships, securing a 17-7 overall record and a second All-America nod. Sophomores Ridge Lovett (133) and Peyton Robb (157) garnered their first All-America honors with seventh and third-place finishes at the conference championships, respectively.

### HUSKERS AIM FOR SIXTH STRAIGHT TOP-10 FINISH

The cancellation of the 2020 NCAA Championships due to the coronavirus pandemic kept Nebraska from trying for its sixth straight top-10 NCAA finish last season. Since 1980, Nebraska has finished as one of the top-10 teams at the NCAA Championships 17 times.

### NEBRASKA WELCOMES HIGHLY TOUTED NEWCOMERS

Eleven wrestlers will don the Nebraska singlet for the first time this season. The group includes two transfers and nine freshmen.

Senior Liam Cronin competed at Indiana before transferring to NU, compiling 41 victories and qualifying for the NCAA Championships following a fifth-place finish at the 2020 Big Ten Championships. Junior Landon Brown wrestled three seasons at Western Wyoming Community College where he qualified for three consecutive NJCAA Wrestling Championships, earning third in 2019.

A Nebraska native, Nic Stoltenburg won three state titles and finished his prep career with over 140 victories. Zak Taylor finished his senior season with 18 victories, including nine by fall, and a sectional championship. After serving two-year missions, Brock Hardy and Brandyn Van Tassell join the Huskers for the 2020-21 campaign. Hardy was a four-time state champion at Box Elder High School and was ranked as the No. 2 recruit in the country at 145 pounds. Van Tassell won Utah state titles in 2017 and 2018. Elise Brown Ton is a two-time Texas state champion and earned three consecutive Texas-USA Wrestling State Championship titles. Both Jeremiah Reno and Dominick Serrano earned undefeated prep records and four state championships in Missouri and Colorado, respectively. Nathan Haas and Silas Allred add to the collection of state titles won by the incoming class having both earned two championships. Haas compiled a 163-25 record at St. John Bosco High School where he earned two California state titles. Allred's two Indiana state titles are just a piece of his 146 prep victories, 138 of which were earned by fall.

- Nebraska features a 34-wrestler roster as it begins official practice.
- Over half of the Huskers' 2020-21 roster are underclassmen, as 22 of Nebraska's 34 wrestlers are either freshmen or sophomores.
- Included in Nebraska's roster are also six seniors and six juniors.
- 26 Huskers on this season's roster are returning letterwinners.
- This year's Huskers come from 17 states, and six are Nebraska natives.



This fall, Husker grapplers competed at the 2020 UWW Junior and Senior Nationals with two adding titles to their resumes.

At Senior Nationals in October, Alex Thomsen took home the 60 kg Greco-Roman title. The sophomore earned the championship in a 5-3 decision over Mosha Schwartz in the final bout. Seeded ninth at the event, he picked up a 10-4 decision over No. 1 seed Taylor LaMont in the quarterfinals on his way to the title.

Ridge Lovett (61 kg) led the Huskers at Junior Nationals in November, finishing first in freestyle. He took a 5-4 decision in the final bout against Cole Matthews for the title. He won one bout by fall and three more by technical fall over two days of wrestling.
