The No. 11 Nebraska volleyball team (19-6, 13-3 Big Ten) plays its final two home matches of the regular season this weekend, welcoming No. 15 Penn State (19-7, 12-4) and Rutgers (8-19, 0-16) to the Devaney Center. First serve against the Nittany Lions on Friday, Nov. 19 is set for 8 p.m., and the game will be televised on BTN and streamed via its digital extension on the FOX Sports app. Larry Puntenev will handle play-by-play duties, and Audrey Flaugh will provide color commentary.

On Saturday, Nov. 20, the Huskers' play host to the Scarlet Knights on Senior Night at 7 p.m. The match will be televised in a statewide broadcast on Nebraska Public Media and streamed on B1G+ with Puntenev on play-by-play alongside color analyst Kathi Wieskamp.

This week's action will be carried on Huskers Radio Network with the NU radio team of John Baylor and Lauren Cook West. Baylor is in his 28th season handling play-by-play duties for the Husker volleyball program, and West, a former All-America setter at NU, will provide color commentary for the sixth straight year.

Huskers Radio Network will carry the matches on HRN radio affiliates, including 107.3 FM in Lincoln and AM 590 in Omaha. A live audio stream will be available at Huskers.com and on the Huskers app. Inside the Devaney Center, fans can access the direct radio call of the match at 87.7 FM.

Quick Hits

- Nebraska is tied with Wisconsin for the lead in the Big Ten standings at 13-3.
- The Huskers stayed at No. 11 in the AVCA national poll this week. NU is No. 13 in the latest NCAA RPI report.
- Nebraska will play on back-to-back nights this weekend (Nov. 19-20) and next weekend (Nov. 26-27) to close out the Big Ten slate. The Huskers have previously had at least one day between all other conference matches this fall. Their last time playing on consecutive nights was the Ameritas Players Challenge (Sept. 3-4).
- All five Husker seniors -- Kayla Caffey, Nicklin Hames, Callie Schwarzenbach, Lauren Stivrins and Lexi Sun -- will be honored with Senior Night festivities following Saturday's match.
- NU's final four matches of the regular season include three top-15 opponents: No. 15 Penn State (Nov. 19), No. 5 Wisconsin (Nov. 26) and No. 6 Purdue (Nov. 27).
- Across all matches this season, the Huskers have held their opponents to .150 hitting, the 10th-lowest mark in the country.
- Nebraska was the last unbeaten team in Big Ten play. Its 10-0 start was their second-best since joining the conference in 2011.

Scouting the Penn State Nittany Lions

Penn State is 19-7 (12-4 Big Ten) and carries a four-match win streak after a 3-1 road win over Michigan State last Saturday. Adanna Rollins reached 1,000 career kills and 1,000 career digs in the match, finishing with a double-double (16 kills/10 digs). Kaitlyn Hord added 14 kills and five blocks, and Allie Holland had 10 kills. Gabby Blossom and Jenna Hampton each had 18 digs, and Blossom totaled 53 assists for another double-double.

Hord leads the Big Ten with a .470 hitting percentage in conference matches, and Holland is fourth (.393). Hampton also leads the way with 4.81 digs per set in conference play. As a team, PSU leads the league with a .272 attack percentage, 14.89 kills per set and 13.78 assists per set.

Russ Rose is in his 43rd season at Penn State with a career record of 1,328-225.

The Nittany Lions have gone 8-3 since their first meeting with Nebraska this season on Oct. 8.

Noting the Series: vs. Penn State

The Huskers have won 10 of the last 11 meetings with Penn State. They lead 24-11 in the all-time series, including 15-6 in the John Cook era and 11-5 in Big Ten matches. NU has an 18-3 advantage over the Nittany Lions in Lincoln, including 6-1 at the Devaney Center.

The last NU-PSU meeting at Devaney was Nov. 2, 2019, which the Huskers won 3-2.

Scouting the Rutgers Scarlet Knights

Rutgers, which visits No. 9 Minnesota Friday night, enters the weekend at 8-19 (0-16 Big Ten) and looks to snap a 17-match skid. The Scarlet Knights suffered a 3-0 loss at Michigan last Saturday, and Kamila Cieslik finished with a team-leading five kills.

Caitlin Schweihofer is in her second year at Rutgers with a record of 14-33 and a career mark of 87-141 over eight seasons as a head coach.

Noting the Series: vs. Rutgers

The Huskers lead the all-time series with Rutgers 11-1 and have triumphed in 11 straight against the Scarlet Knights. All 11 of those matches were as members of the Big Ten, and all but one were sweeps. NU is 6-0 when facing Rutgers at home, all at the Devaney Center.

The Last Time Out: at Indiana

- Lexi Sun moved into the top 20 all-time at Nebraska for career kills as a Husker, finishing with 11 on a .310 afternoon. Lindsay Krause added 11 more.
- Ally Batenhorst matched Sun and Krause, coming off the bench to contribute 11 kills on .333 hitting.
- Lauren Stivrins chipped in 10 kills at a .391 efficiency and had three blocks.
- Nicklin Hames notched her team-leading 17th double-double of the year with 47 assists and 10 digs.
- Hames and Lexi Rodriguez were two of four NU players with double-figure digs. Rodriguez led all players with 22 scoops for the second straight match. She added a season-high three aces and six assists.
- Keonilei Akana had double-figure digs for the sixth straight match.

Big Weeks, B1G Awards

Nebraska has counted 11 Big Ten weekly award winners this season, the most by any conference member. Lexi Rodriguez was the first, earning Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Week recognition Aug. 30 after her career debut, while Kayla Caffey collected Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 6. Lindsay Krause picked up Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors on Sept. 27.

On Oct. 11, the Huskers had three award winners: Madi Kubik as Big Ten Player of the Week, Nicklin Hames as Big Ten Setter of the Week and Rodriguez again as Big Ten Freshman of the Week. Kubik followed on Oct. 18 as Big Ten Player of the Week again, her second award in as many weeks and the third of her career.

On Oct. 25, Rodriguez was doubly honored as the Big Ten's Defensive Player of the Week and Freshman of the Week. Hames also picked up Co-Setter-of-the-Week for the second time in her career. Rodriguez added another Defensive Player of the Week award on Nov. 15.

Down the Stretch

Nebraska has frequently played some of its best volleyball down the stretch of the regular season. The Huskers are 287-30 (.905) all-time in the month of November.

Since 2016, NU is 18-2 (.900) when playing their final four regular-season Big Ten matchups.

Huskers Ink Three in Volleyball Signing Class

Head coach John Cook announced Nov. 10 the signing of three student-athletes to make up the Nebraska volleyball program's 2022 signing class. NU's recruiting class is ranked No. 2 by PrepVolleyball.com, and all three Husker signees intend to enroll at Nebraska in January.

This year's signees include middle blocker Bekka Allick (Lincoln, Neb.), setter/defensive specialist Maisie Boesiger (Firth, Neb.) and outside hitter Hayden Kubik (West Des Moines, Iowa).

Nebraska has brought in the nation's top-ranked recruit back-to-back years with Kubik for 2022 and current Husker Kennedy Orr from 2021.

Allick, a member of the U.S. U18 National Team, ranks as the No. 6 recruit among the Class of 2022. Her addition continues NU's streak of three years with a Waverly High School signee, as she joins current Huskers Anni Evans (2020) and Whitney Lauenstein (2021).

Record-Setting Scoops

Last Friday against Maryland, Nebraska set a school record for digs in a three-set match in the rally-scoring era with 78 scoops on the night. Four Huskers finished in double figures: Lexi Rodriguez (22), Nicklin Hames (21), Keonilei Akana (11) and Kenzie Knuckles (10).

Kubik Making Noise

Madi Kubik led the Huskers in kills 15 straight matches to start the conference slate, including 10 consecutive contests in double figures from Sept. 22 - Oct. 23. She has matched her season high of 19 kills three times: at Northwestern (Sept. 22), at Penn State (Oct. 8) and vs. Illinois (Oct. 16).

Kubik is second in the conference for kills per set in Big Ten play. She has improved from hitting .197 with 2.19 kills per set in non-conference to .228 with 4.15 k/s in conference matches, trailing only Minnesota's Stephanie Samedy (4.58 k/s).

When Kubik has a double-figure kill night, the Huskers are 15-2 this year.

Movin' On Up

- Nicklin Hames passed the 4,000 assists milestone on Oct. 23, becoming the third Husker in school history -- and the second in the rally-scoring era -- to reach the mark. Hames joined the company of Fiona Nepo (4,824 from 1995-98) and Kelly Hunter (4,125 from 2013-17).

- On Nov. 4, Hames passed Hunter for sole possession of second in school history and the top spot in the rally-scoring era for career assists. She currently has 4,266 assists to her credit.

- Hames owns 1,244 career digs. She is ninth both all-time and in the rally-scoring era and needs 11 to tie Kadie Rolfzen (1,255 from 2013-16) for eighth.

- Hames also has 106 career aces -- three away from passing Jennifer Saleaumua (108 from 2002-05) for fifth in the rally-scoring era. Hames is 13 away from breaking into the top 10 all-time in school history and tying Allison Weston (119 from 1992-95) for 10th on the all-time aces list.

- Lauren Stivrins sits at 1,189 career kills, which ranks 16th at NU. Her next target is Melissa Elmer (1,210 from 2002-05).

- Lexi Sun moved into the top 20 in school history for career kills last week and now has 1,131. She currently sits at 19th behind Stephanie Thater (1,158 from 1989-92).

She's Back

Nebraska's Oct. 1 sweep of Michigan was highlighted by the return of All-American Lauren Stivrins, who missed the first 11 matches of her sixth year of eligibility after undergoing offseason back surgery. After a rousing ovation from the Husker crowd during starting lineups, the senior finished with a match-high 11 kills on 15 errorless swings for a .733 night along with three blocks.

Stivrins is averaging 2.45 kills and 1.00 blocks per set while hitting .373 to rank fifth in the league in attack percentage.

Stivrins reached the 500 career blocks milestone Oct. 30, making her just the fourth Husker in the rally-scoring era to do so. She is also only the second player in the rally-scoring era to register at least 1,000 career kills and 500 career blocks, joining Melissa Elmer (1,210 kills, 767 blocks from 2002-05).

Nov. 12 vs. Maryland, Stivrins broke into the top 10 all-time at Nebraska for career blocks and currently sits at 10th (521). She ranks as second among the Big Ten's active career leaders for blocks.

Leading the Freshman Charge

The start of Lindsay Krause's Husker career has seen her average 2.48 kills per set and 0.77 blocks per set -- both tops among Husker freshmen. Since solidifying a starting role, she has gone from 1.94 kills per set with .163 hitting in non-conference to 2.70 kills per set on .243 hitting against Big Ten competition. Krause has had a double-figure night seven times in league play.

In Krause's Big Ten debut week, she averaged 3.86 kills, 1.00 digs and 0.43 blocks per set on .500 hitting against Northwestern and Iowa.

The Defense Does It

Nebraska's defense has limited opponents to .152 hitting during the conference season, which is the league low. The Huskers have kept 10 of their last 13 opponents under .200. Their 18.65 digs per set are the best mark in Big Ten play.

NU's defense is anchored by libero Lexi Rodriguez, who is second in the conference with 4.67 digs per set in Big Ten matches. The freshman has averaged 5.32 digs per set in the last nine matches and has finished in double figures in all of those. Last weekend, Rodriguez came in at 6.29 digs per set with back-to-back 22-dig performances over two NU wins.

At the Service Line

Nebraska's serving game has often been an asset this season, as the Huskers have averaged a Big Ten-leading 1.56 aces per set as a team in conference play, tied with Illinois. NU has registered at least five aces as a team in 10 Big Ten matches, and for the fall have had a season-best 10 aces in a match twice.

In Big Ten play, Nicklin Hames is fifth in the conference at 0.37 aces per set.

Four players have had at least three aces in a single match nine times this season: Kenzie Knuckles (3), Keonilei Akana (3), Hames (2) and Lexi Rodriguez (1). Rodriguez's three-ace effort at Indiana on Nov. 14 is the most recent.

Hames Is the Name

After missing the opening week of play, Nicklin Hames made her senior season debut at the Ameritas Players Challenge. She averaged 9.75 assists per set and 2.83 digs per set and registered three straight double-doubles, earning the Most Valuable Player nod on the all-tournament team.

Hames has averaged 11.20 assists per set -- fourth-best in the conference -- in guiding Nebraska to the top of the Big Ten standings. Oct. 1 vs. Michigan, she totaled a career-high five service aces -- including four straight in the third set alone -- and has averaged 0.37 aces per set in conference play. She tallied a double-double in seven consecutive matches from Oct. 13 - Nov. 4.

Among the Active Career Leaders

Entering the week, all five seniors ranked among the NCAA's active career leaders in multiple categories. Lauren Stivrins' .384 career attack percentage was the sixth-best mark among active Division I players, and Kayla Caffey (.366 between Nebraska and Missouri) was 10th. Stivrins was also eighth for total blocks (521). Callie Schwarzenbach's 1.23 blocks per set were 11th.

Nicklin Hames' 4,266 career assists were 17th in the ranks, and her career average of 10.69 assists per set came in at sixth. Lexi Sun has 1,468 career kills between Nebraska and Texas, 35th-most of any player.

Sun Reaches 1,000 Kills at NU

In NU's Aug. 27 season opener vs. Colgate, Lexi Sun became the 23rd player in program history and the ninth in the rally-scoring era to reach 1,000 kills as a Husker. Now with 1,131 to her credit, she ranks 19th on the list.

Sun's 1,468 career kills between Nebraska and Texas are the fifth-most among the Big Ten's active career leaders.

Go Big Grad

Three Huskers have already earned bachelor's degrees and are pursuing further study their senior campaign. Lauren Stivrins and Lexi Sun both graduated with their degrees in communications studies from Nebraska in December 2020, and Kayla Caffey earned her degree in elementary education from Missouri in May 2020. Caffey is pursuing her master's degree in teaching, learning and teacher education with an emphasis in early literacy, while Sun is working toward her graduate degree in integrated media communications.

Additionally, Nicklin Hames and Callie Schwarzenbach are both on track to complete their undergraduate degrees in 2022.

Sister Act

Five Huskers come from families with multiple daughters currently playing college volleyball. Lauren Stivrins' younger sister, Amber, started her career at Louisville before transferring to Georgia, where she is a junior outside hitter. Nicklin Hames' younger sister, Kayleigh, is a junior outside hitter at Pepperdine.

Keonilei Akana's older sister, Braelyn, is a sophomore outside hitter/middle blocker at Hawaii. Lexi Rodriguez's older sister, Kaylee Martin, played first at Illinois State and transferred to Clemson, where she is a senior outside hitter. And Ally Batenhorst's older sister, Dani, is a sophomore outside hitter at Gonzaga.

Cornhusker Captains

Seniors Nicklin Hames and Lauren Stivrins and junior Kenzie Knuckles are team captains for the 2021 season.

Hames and Stivrins are returning captains from 2020-21, and Hames also served in the role in 2019.

All-Americans Headline Husker Returners

NU returns three AVCA All-Americans in Nicklin Hames, Lauren Stivrins and Lexi Sun. Hames, a second-team honoree at setter in 2019, averaged a Big Ten-leading 10.91 assists per set while guiding NU to a .270 team hitting percentage.

Sun, a two-time All-American, averaged a team-leading 3.64 kills per set and 2.21 digs per set in 2020-21. She announced on May 19 her decision to return for a fifth season of eligibility, which the NCAA granted to student-athletes due to COVID-19 interruptions.

Stivrins, a three-time All-American, averaged 3.19 kills per set and 1.03 blocks per set. She had a team-best .468 hitting percentage, which led the Big Ten, ranked third nationally and was the second-best single-season mark in school history. Stivrins announced her return for a sixth season on Aug. 6.

Additionally, Madi Kubik received AVCA All-America honorable mention for the second straight season after averaging 2.85 kills and 2.38 digs per set as a sophomore.

NU also counts returning letterwinners in Kenzie Knuckles, Kayla Caffey, Anni Evans, Keonilei Akana, Kalyann Meyer and Callie Schwarzenbach.

New Faces at Nebraska

Nebraska welcomed six newcomers in the 2021 signing class, which was ranked No. 1 by PrepVolleyball.com last November. All six were ranked in the top 70 recruits nationally. Five were counted in the top 16 and four were in the top 10, while each of the top three signed to become Huskers.

Ally Batenhorst, the No. 3 overall prospect and No. 2 outside hitter, was the 2020-21 Gatorade National Player of the Year. She joins Gina Mancuso (2009), Mikaela Foecke (2015) and Lexi Sun (2017) as Huskers previously named Gatorade National Player of the Year. Batenhorst led Seven Lakes High School to the 2020 Texas Class 6A state title.

Rylee Gray, the No. 70 overall recruit, helped Elkhorn South High School to four state tournament appearances. A three-time all-state pick, the middle blocker helped her team to the 2020 Class A state title.

Lindsay Krause was the No. 2 overall recruit and the No. 1 outside hitter in the 2021 class. She was a member of the 2021 U.S. team at the U20 World Championships and a gold medalist with Team USA at the 2019 U18 World Championships. Krause was the 2020 Nebraska Gatorade Player of the Year, a four-time state champion and a four-time all-state pick at Skutt Catholic High School.

Whitney Lauenstein was tabbed the No. 16 recruit in the 2021 class and the No. 2 recruit in the state of Nebraska. The outside hitter helped Waverly High School to three state tournaments and was a three-time all-state honoree.

Lexi Rodriguez joined Batenhorst and Krause on the 2021 U.S. U20 World Championship Team and was named the No. 10 overall recruit and No. 1 libero/defensive specialist in the 2021 class. Rodriguez also won a gold medal with Team USA at the 2019 U18 Worlds. Averaging 7.2 digs per set at Sterling High School, she was the 2020 Illinois Gatorade Player of the Year and a two-time state champion.

Kennedi Orr, the No. 1 overall recruit in the class, was a six-year varsity player at Eagan High School in Eagan, Minn., where she won two state titles and added three runner-up finishes. She was a gold medalist with Team USA at the 2019 U18 World Championships, where she was honored as Best Setter. Orr was the 2019 Minnesota Gatorade Player of the Year.

Five of NU's six freshmen have seen the court this year.

From Husker Heroes to Gold Medal Greats

Former NU All-Americans Jordan Larson, Kelsey Robinson and Justine Wong-Orantes became Olympic gold medalists on Aug. 8 as the United States defeated Brazil 3-0 in the final match of the 2020 Tokyo Games at Ariake Arena. Larson captained Team USA to a dominant run and became the first American woman to claim gold (Tokyo 2020), silver (London 2012) and bronze (Rio 2016) medals in indoor volleyball alongside three-time Olympic teammate Foluke Akinradewo.

Following the match, Larson was named Most Valuable Player and Best Outside Hitter, and Wong-Orantes was tabbed Best Libero. Both earned spots on the Tokyo 2020 Dream Team. Larson led Team USA with 96 points in eight matches.

Larson, who was a three-time All-American at Nebraska while lettering from 2005-08, competed in her third straight Olympics. Robinson, an All-American at NU in 2013, was also a member of the bronze-medal winning team in 2016, while two-time All-American Wong-Orantes (2013-16) made her Olympic debut in Tokyo.

Tokyo Takeover

The gold-medal trio of Jordan Larson, Kelsey Robinson and Justine Wong-Orantes was part of a group of five Huskers with ties to indoor and beach competition at the 2020 Olympic Games. Four-time All-American Sarah Pavan (2004-07) competed in her second consecutive Olympics in beach volleyball and entered the Games as the No. 1-ranked pair in the world with partner Melissa Humana-Paredes and finished fifth.

Nebraska Associate Head Coach Tyler Hildebrand served as the USA Volleyball Director of Coaching for the American beach national teams, which included gold medalists April Ross and Alix Klineman. Performance Nutrition Coordinator Nuwane Kiri-hennedige also supported Team USA as a sports dietitian at the Games.

Noting the National Poll

- Nebraska has been a preseason top-five pick for seven straight years.
- The Huskers have been ranked No. 1 in 100 all-time polls, the most in NCAA history.
- The Huskers have been ranked in the top 10 a total of 524 times, which is also the most in NCAA history.
- NU has appeared in all 583 AVCA Coaches Polls it has been eligible for since it was established in 1982. Nebraska is the only program to be ranked in every eligible poll all-time.
- NU held a streak of 60 straight weeks in the top 10 of the AVCA poll before briefly dropping to 12th in the Sept. 20 and Sept. 27 releases earlier this season. It was the only time the Huskers had ranked outside the top 10 since Sept. 18, 2017, when they were 14th.

Freshman Trio Helps U.S. to Fifth-Place Finish at U20 World Championships

Three Husker freshmen -- outside hitters Ally Batenhorst and Lindsay Krause and libero Lexi Rodriguez -- helped the United States to a fifth-place finish at the 2021 FIVB U20 World Championships in July. It was the Americans' highest finish at U20 Worlds in 10 years.

AVCA Hall of Fame Head Coach John Cook in 22nd Season at Nebraska

- Nebraska head coach John Cook enters his 22nd season as the Nebraska volleyball head coach in 2021. He has led the Huskers to four national championships, nine final fours, 12 conference championships and 19 top-10 final rankings since 2000.
- Cook owns 784 career wins and is one of the all-time winningest coaches in NCAA history. Since taking over the program in 2000, Cook has led the Huskers to a nation-leading .874 win percentage in that time (623-90).
- Under Cook, the Huskers have tallied 60 AVCA All-Americans and 20 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, both among the best in the nation. He is a two-time AVCA National Coach of the Year, earning the prestigious honor in 2000 and 2005, and a seven-time conference coach of the year, including Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2016 and 2017, his first and second Big Ten honors with the Huskers in their Big Ten era (2011-present).
- Cook is one of only four active coaches - and one of six all-time - to be a two-time AVCA National Coach of the Year and was honored in 2008 by USA Volleyball, receiving its All-Time Great Coach Award.
- Cook was inducted into the AVCA Hall of Fame in 2017, joining former Husker volleyball coach Terry Pettit in the hall.
- Cook became the ninth active Division I head coach to reach 700 career wins in 2018.

Nebraska brings the regular season to a close next weekend, starting with a visit to Wisconsin on Friday, Nov. 26. First serve is scheduled for 4:30 p.m. at UW Field House in Madison, Wis.
