THE MATCHUP

The Nebraska wrestling team will host the Nebraska Duals on Thursday, Nov. 11 at the Devaney Center. The Nebraska Duals will begin at 7:00 p.m. with the Huskers taking on UNK. Following the matchup with the Lopers, the Huskers will wrestle Chadron State.

The Nebraska Duals provide fans with a chance to get a glimpse of the 2021-22 Huskers, who are coming off a third-place finish at the 2021 Big Ten Championships and a 12th-place finish at the NCAA Championships.

The team returns 29 letterwinners from last season, including eight NCAA qualifiers. All-Americans Mikey Labriola (174), Ridge Lovett (149), Chad Red Jr. (141), Peyton Robb (157), Eric Schultz (197) and Taylor Venz (184) highlight a strong group of returners.

Looking at the rest of the field, UNK is coming off a season in which the Lopers posted a 10-1 overall mark. UNK also posted a perfect 6-0 dual record en route to a second-place finish at the 2021 Division II NCAA Championships under sixth-year Head Coach Dalton Jensen.

Rounding out the group is Chadron State, which recorded four victories during the 2020-21 season. Head Coach Brett Hunter, entering his 11th season at the helm, led his team to a 43-0 dual win over Northeastern Junior College to start the 2021-22 season.

Nebraska continues the homestand as it hosts North Carolina on Wednesday, Nov. 17 at 8 p.m. Tickets to the North Carolina dual, as well as each of the other five home duals, are on sale now and can be purchased at Huskers.com/tickets or by calling 1-800-8-BIG-RED.

2020-21 RECAP

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Nebraska scored 38 points en route to a 12th-place finish at the 2021 NCAA Championships. Mikey Labriola finished third at 174 pounds, earning All-American honors for the third time in his career. Chad Red, Jr (141 pounds) also earned All-America honors, placing sixth.

BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Huskers placed third at the 2021 Big Ten Championships. Ridge Lovett (2nd place -- 149), Taylor Venz (2nd place -- 184) and Eric Schultz (2nd place -- 197) were the top individual finishers for Nebraska. Mikey Labriola (174 pounds) was the next highest individual as he placed third.

REGULAR SEASON

Nebraska finished the season ninth in the final national dual rankings with a 7-1 record. The Huskers finished the conference-only slate with six-straight dual wins. NU posted a 4-1 record against opponents who finished in the Top 25 at the NCAA Championships.

BACK POINTS

NEBRASKA TO FACE DIFFICULT DUAL SCHEDULE

Nebraska posted a 7-1 dual record in 2020-21, its 11th consecutive winning season and 32nd winning season in the last 34 years. This winter, the Huskers will look to continue that streak and build off a 12th-place at the 2021 NCAA Championships.

NU will face a challenging schedule that features eight of the top-25 team finishers from last year's NCAA Championships, including three teams that finished inside the top five. The home schedule is highlighted by the Big Ten dual against 2021 national title winner and border-rival Iowa (Feb. 20). The Huskers will also play host to fifth-place finisher Michigan on Feb. 4.

Nebraska faces a challenging road schedule with notable trips to Minnesota (Jan. 14), Northwestern (Jan. 23) and Penn State (Feb. 6). The Gophers are coming off a seventh-place finish at the 2021 NCAA Championships while the Wildcats placed 10th. The Nittany Lions were runner-up to the Hawkeyes.

As for tournament action, NU opens the season with the Nebraska Duals on Nov. 11. The Big Red will also compete in the Daktronics Open on Sunday, Nov. 21, in Brookings, S.D. The Huskers will host their first-ever Big Ten Championships on March 5-6 in Lincoln, Neb., where the Huskers looks to improve on a third-place finish in 2021. The NCAA Championships are set for March 17-19 at Little Caesars Arena in Detroit, Mich.

MANNING BEGINS 22ND SEASON AS HEAD COACH

The Huskers will have a familiar face at the helm this season. The 2021-22 campaign will be Mark Manning's 22nd season leading the NU wrestling program. Manning is the all-time winningest coach in program history with a mark of 264-97-3. During his decorated coaching career, Manning has coached 61 of Nebraska's 116 All-Americans and five of Nebraska's 11 national champions. The Huskers have nine top-10 NCAA finishes overall during his tenure. Manning has also been instrumental in helping former Huskers Jordan Burroughs and James Green enjoy international success, as Burroughs won the Olympic Gold in 2012 and World Championship Gold five times, while Green earned World Championship Silver in 2017.

VETERAN GROUP RETURNS TO LEAD NU

Nebraska will be guided by a strong group of veteran returners for the 2021-22 campaign. The Huskers qualified nine roster spots for the 2021 NCAA Championships and all nine were in the top 30 of their weight class and eight will return for this year's campaign. At 174, junior Mikey Labriola returns after finishing third at the 2021 NCAA Championships, while senior Chad Red Jr. (141) placed sixth after coming in as the No. 8 seed. Four-time NCAA qualifier and All-American Taylor Venz (184) returns after finishing second at the Big Ten Championships and tallying a 9-5 season record along with fellow senior All-American Eric Shultz (197), who finished second at the Big Ten Championships and has 86 career wins. Rounding out the group of participating seniors at the NCAA Championships is Liam Cronin (125) and Christian Lance (285), who are looking to build upon their previous success.

DUAL EXPERIENCE AN ASSET FOR NU

Nebraska returns 17 wrestlers with dual experience, including All-Americans Mikey Labriola, Ridge Lovett, Chad Red Jr., Peyton Robb, Eric Shultz and Taylor Venz. Seniors Liam Cronin and Christian Lance also return as two starters with significant dual experience and combined for a 12-4 record last season.

Tucker Sjomeling (133), Alex Thomsen (133), Brock Hardy (149), Jevon Parrish (149), Kevon Davenport (157), Nathan Haas (184), Colton Wolfe (184), Silas Allred (197) and Landon Brown (285) all return this season with dual experience. As a team, NU won seven of its eight duals overall.

NEBRASKA TO HOST BIG TENS

The Big Ten Championships will take place at the Pinnacle Bank Arena in Lincoln, Neb., March 5-6. It will be the first time the Huskers host the Big Ten Championships since joining the conference in 2011-12. Seeding for the tournament is determined by pre-seeds and finalized at the coaches' meeting ahead of the tournament. A double-elimination tournament will be held at each weight, with the top team finisher being determined by tournament scoring. The first rounds, quarterfinals and consolation rounds will be held in Session I on March 5, while the quarterfinals, consolation second rounds and semifinals will be held in Session II on that same day. Session III will consist of the consolation semifinals and seventh-place matches on March 6, with the finals, third-place and fifth-place matches being contested in Session IV. The 2022 NCAA Championships will be held in Detroit, Mich. on March 17-19.

NU WELCOMES HIGHLY TOUTED NEWCOMERS

Eight wrestlers will don the Scarlet and Cream for the first time this season, including one transfer and seven freshmen.

Redshirt junior Boo Dryden competed at Minnesota before transferring to NU, compiling 13 career victories and placing eighth at the 2021 Big Ten Championships and qualifying for the NCAA Championships.

Nebraska natives Quinton Chavez, a two-time state champion, Blake Cushing, a state and district champion, and Joshua Licking, a state runner-up with a 31-1 record his senior year, look to make immediate impacts for the Huskers. After compiling a 141-26 high school record and capturing a Pennsylvania state title, Jagger Condomitti joins the Huskers for the 2021-22 campaign. Fellow Pennsylvania native Lenny Pinto also was a state champion and totaled a school record of 44 wins in the 2020 season. Tahjae Jenkins-Harris and Adam Thebeau add to the impressive group of newcomers with Jenkins-Harris earning an undefeated season his senior year and Thebeau being named an all-state wrestler.

2021 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Former Husker wrestler Jordan Burroughs won his fifth World Championship, defeating Mohammad Nokhodilari of Iran, 5-1, in the men's freestyle 79 kg final at the World Wrestling Championships on Monday. Burroughs tied John Smith's U.S. freestyle record of six World and Olympic Championships combined.

In the 79 kg final, Burroughs took the early 3-0 lead with a double-leg takedown followed closely by another double. The victory gave Burroughs his fifth World Championship gold medal, joining his titles in 2011, 2013, 2015 and 2017.

At 70 kg, fellow former Husker James Green cruised to his first match victory, defeating Korea's Seungchul Lee by a 10-0 technical fall. The story in Green's second round was similar as he advanced to the quarterfinals with a 10-0 technical fall over Germany's Shamil Ustae.

In the quarterfinals, Green lost a hard-fought match to Azerbaijan's Turan Bayramov 6-5 and was eliminated from competition.

Burroughs' medal was the second gold medal of the day for the United States, as former Omaha Skutt and Iowa wrestler Thomas Gilman defeated Iran's Alireza Sarlak in the 57 kg championship match.

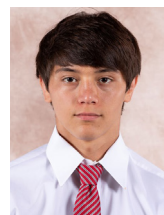
