HUSKERS CAP BUSY STRETCH AT ALLSTATE SUGAR BOWL INTERCOLLEGIATE

The Nebraska women's golf team caps a three-tournament in 14-day stretch when the Huskers travel to New Orleans for the Allstate Sugar Bowl Intercollegiate, March 14-16.

The 13-team event opens Sunday, March 14 with tee times starting at 9 a.m. (CT) at English Turn Golf and Country Club. The tournament's second round will follow a similar schedule on Monday, before concluding with an 8 a.m. (CT) shotgun start in the final round on Tuesday.

Live scoring for the tournament will be available at GolfStat.com.

The tournament field includes Big Ten counterparts Rutgers and Wisconsin, along with the hosts from Tulane, Central Arkansas, Chattanooga, Louisiana Monroe, Loyola (La.), McNeese, Southern Miss, Seton Hall, SMU and Texas State.

Kate Smith, a fifth-year senior from Detroit Lakes, Minn., is hunting for her second career NCAA Regional bid. Nebraska's career stroke average leader (73.49), Smith has opened 2021 with two top-10 finishes. She tied for third at the Trinity Forest Invitational in Dallas, Texas (Feb. 1-2), before taking sixth against a loaded field in challenging scoring conditions at the Bruin Wave Invitational (March 1-3).

Most recently, Smith led the Huskers with a tie for 21st at the Arizona Wildcat Invitational in Tucson (March 8-9).

Freshman Michaela Vavrova added a breakthrough performance in Arizona, matching Smith with a career-best three-round total of 219 that included a career-best 70 (-2) in the second round.

SMITH EARNS AUGUSTA NATIONAL WOMEN'S AMATEUR INVITATION

After a series of solid performances during the summer and fall, Nebraska senior Kate Smith earned an invitation to compete in the second annual Augusta National Women's Amateur Championship (March 31-April 3). She was among an elite list of just 72 of the top amateurs in the world to receive a coveted invite to the event when they were sent to golfers in late January.

SMITH SHINES DESPITE ABRUPT END TO TRUE SENIOR SEASON IN 2020

Despite having her fourth year at Nebraska cut short by the COVID-19 pandemic, Kate Smith continued to add to her long list of accomplishments as a Husker golfer.

In the summer of 2020, Smith won the Minnesota Golf Association Women's Amateur Championship for the second time, before qualifying for the 120th U.S. Women's Amateur in Rockville, Md.

Smith finished 15th in the stroke play portion of the U.S. Women's Amateur and advanced to the round of 32 in the match play event. She also went on to be named the Minnesota Golf Association Women's Co-Player of the Year for 2020.

SMITH CLAIMS NEBRASKA'S FIRST BIG TEN MARY FOSSUM AWARD

One of the top golfers in Husker history, Kate Smith captured Nebraska's first Big Ten Mary Fossum Award for owning the best stroke average relative to par among all league golfers in 2019-20. Smith set the Nebraska season record for the third straight year with her 72.18 stroke average.

Smith also became the first Husker to earn All-Big Ten honors since Maddie Sheils earned the award in Nebraska's first season in the conference in 2012.

Smith was on track to earn an NCAA Regional bid as an individual for the Huskers in 2020, before the coronavirus outbreak brought the spring season to an end.

The NCAA granted seniors an additional year of eligibility, and Smith is taking full advantage of the chance for one more season of college golf in 2020-21.

Smith has played 113 rounds and owns a Nebraska-record 73.49 career stroke average.

ALLSTATE SUGAR BOWL INTERCOLLEGIATE, MARCH 14-16, 2021

In 2018-19, Smith's 73.52 stroke average was a school record. In 2016-17, Smith set the Nebraska freshman record with a 73.90 stroke average while earning a spot in the 2017 NCAA Regional field.

Smith finished No. 101 in the 2019-20 GolfStat player rankings after closing 2018-19 at No. 223 nationally. She owns 27 career top-25 individual tournament finishes, including 18 top-10 showings. She has also won four career Big Ten Golfer-of-the-Week awards.

In 2017-18, Smith smashed a school record with her 14-under-par 202 at the 2018 Westbrook Spring Invitational (Feb. 25-26). She added the second-best tournament in school history with her 203 (-13) at the 2020 Westbrook Spring Invitational (Feb. 23-24) to finish as the runner-up.

She has fired 32 rounds better than par in her career, including a school-record 64 (-8) in the second round of the 2018 Westbrook Invite.

HUSKERS TAKE 10TH IN ARIZONA

In a 16-team field that featured all 16 teams ranked among the top-130 in the country, Nebraska closed with a season-best final-round 291 (+3) to take 10th at the Arizona Wildcat Invitational in Tucson (March 8-9).

Kate Smith led Nebraska's charge up the leaderboard with a final-round 69 (-3). Smith tied for 21st individually alongside freshman teammate Michaela Vavrova, who fired a career-best 219 that included a career-best 70 (-2) in the second round.

The Huskers finished ahead of Colorado, UNLV and Iowa among others, beating the Big Ten-rival Hawkeyes by 25 strokes.

SMITH WINS BIG TEN WEEKLY HONOR AFTER STRONG SHOWING AT SMU

Kate Smith got her 2021 collegiate season off to a strong start with a tie for third at the Trinity Forest Invitational in Dallas (Feb. 1-2).

Smith charged 15 spots up the leaderboard over the last 18 holes with a final-round 68 (-4). She carded five birdies and an eagle in the final round to finish with a three-round score of 219.

Her performance at Trinity Forest earned her the fourth Big Ten Golfer-of-the-Week award of her career on Feb. 3.

FRESH FACES FILLING HUSKER LINEUP AROUND FIFTH-YEAR SENIOR SMITH

Nebraska's lineup early in 2021 is led by a five-year collegiate veteran in Kate Smith, but it is also filled with new faces.

Graduate transfer Alice Duan hopes to make an instant impact for the Big Red this spring. Duan earned her bachelor's degree from Washington in June before transferring to Nebraska.

During the summer of 2020, Duan was named the Washington Golf Women's Player of the Year after winning the Washington Women's Amateur Championship.

Duan spent the first two years of her college career at Cal State Northridge before helping Washington to the NCAA Championships as a junior in 2019. She tied for 13th individually at the 2019 Pac-12 Championships before tying for 28th at the 2019 NCAA Cle Elum Regional to help the Huskies to a runner-up finish and a berth at nationals.



Freshmen Michaela Vavrova (Bojnice, Slovakia) and Lindsey Thiele (Wahoo, Neb.) have brought young energy to the lineup.

Vavrova came to Nebraska as a two-time Slovak U18 National Champion. She earned a spot on the Slovak Elite National Team in 2021.

The first Slovakian women's golfer in Husker history, Vavrova tied Kate Smith for NU's top finish at the Arizona Wildcat Invitational (March 8-9).

CORNHUSKER STATE GOLFERS IMPACT NEBRASKA 2021 ROSTER

Nebraska's 2021 women's golf roster features a strong Cornhusker State flavor.

Senior Hannah Thiele and her younger sister Lindsey continue a Husker golf family tradition that included their older sister, Haley. The sisters represent the southeast Nebraska town of Wahoo.

Kirsten Baete provides more southeast Nebraska spirit. The redshirt junior from Beatrice has competed in 39 rounds as a Husker, including a lineup spot in the 2019 Big Ten Championships.

Megan Whittaker (Elkhorn) completes the four Nebraska natives on the Big Red roster. Whittaker has appeared in 44 rounds for the Huskers, including lineup spots in NU's first three tournaments of 2021.

Whittaker, the daughter of former Husker golfer Kim (Lefler) Whittaker, matched Kate Smith for Nebraska's top individual finish at the 2019 Big Ten Championships. In October of 2020, Whittaker won The Harvest at Indian Creek hosted by the Nebraska Golf Association.

SMITH, HERZOG CONTINUE MINNESOTA CONNECTION

Kate Smith (Detroit Lakes) and Leah Herzog (Red Wing) continue a tradition of top golfers from the state of Minnesota playing at Nebraska.

Smith, who owns Nebraska's career stroke average record (73.49), is the only Husker in history with a career average better than 75.

Herzog, who joined Smith as the only Huskers to compete in all 17 rounds in 2019-20, was the 2019 Minnesota Ms. Golf.

A four-time All-Minnesota selection and a two-time Class 2A state runner-up, Herzog is the latest in a nearly continuous flow of Huskers from the Land of 10,000 Lakes. Cassie Deeg (Hugo, 2013-16), Steffi Neisen (New Prague, 2011-14), Chrissie McArdle (Eden Prairie, 2004-07) and Jackie Beste (2003-06) were all standout golfers for the Big Red.

The 2020-21 season marks the 11th straight year NU has had at least one Minnesota golfer.

Nebraska also had two Minnesota golfers in its lineup in 2015-16, when Deeg and Neisen played out of the top of the Husker lineup.

Smith is the only five-time individual state champion in Minnesota high school history. She capped her career by claiming a share of her record fifth title on June 15, 2016 while leading Detroit Lakes High School to its fourth state team championship in the past five years. She was also the winner of the 2016 Minnesota Ms. Golf Award.

BIG RED FACE SOLID SCHEDULE

The Huskers put together a challenging spring schedule, beginning with the SMU Trinity Forest Invite (Feb. 1-2). NU faced a field with nationally ranked opponents and tied for ninth with perennial national power Washington at the two-day event.

After nearly a month off from competition, the Huskers tied for seventh in a loaded 15-team field that featured 11 top-100 teams at the Bruin Wave Invitational in Somis, Calif. (March 1-3).

Nebraska took 10th in a 16-team field at the Arizona Wildcat Invitational (March 8-9) with all 16 teams ranked among the nation's top 130, before venturing to New Orleans for the Allstate Sugar Bowl Intercollegiate (March 14-16).

Kate Smith will become the first Husker women's golfer in history to compete in the Augusta National Women's Amateur Championship (March 31-April 3).

Nebraska is scheduled to close the regular season at the Indiana Spring Invitational in Bloomington, April 17-18, before returning to Maineville, Ohio, to compete at the Big Ten Championships (April 23-25). The Huskers will compete for the conference crown on the Arnold Palmer-designed Tournament Players Club River's Bend Course, which will serve as the host to the conference tournament for the fourth straight season.

NCAA Regional competitions will be held at sites to be determined (May 10-12) before the NCAA Championships are held at the Grayhawk Golf Club in Scottsdale, Ariz. (May 21-26).

HUSKERS SET PACE IN CLASSROOM

Nebraska leads the nation with 340 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans and 18 NCAA Top 10 Award winners across all sports. Nebraska women's golf leads the nation with 82 WGCA Scholastic All-Americans since 1989.

Nebraska established a school-best 94 percent graduation rate across all student-athletes in all sports in 2019-20. Husker student-athletes also posted a fall-record combined semester GPA of 3.325.
