#### HUSKERS TRAVEL TO TEXAS A&M FOR AGGIE INVITATIONAL

Fresh off a strong tournament showing in Indiana, the Nebraska men's golf team turns its attention to Texas to compete at the Aggie Invitational in College Station this weekend.

The Huskers will be part of a loaded 17-team field that features 11 top-75 teams, including No. 1 Oklahoma, No. 5 Texas, No. 12 Texas A&M and No. 25 Texas Tech, along with Baylor, Houston, Kansas, Lamar, Louisville, New Mexico State, Northern Illinois, North Texas, Prairie View A&M, Rice, UNLV and UTSA.

The teams will play single rounds each of the tournament's three days, beginning with 8:15 a.m. tee times on Friday, April 9. Tee times continue at 8:15 a.m. on Saturday, before the final round tees off at 7:30 a.m.

Live scoring for the event will be available at GolfStat.com.

Nebraska's five-player lineup in count-four scoring will be led by freshman Jack Lundin, who tied for fourth at the Hoosier Invitational (April 3-4). Tom Westenberger added a top-10 finish in Indiana to help the Huskers to a third-place team finish. Branden Meyer, Jeremy Sisson and Will Marshall, who all played major roles in NU's strong showing in Indiana, will all be back in the lineup for the Big Red in Texas.

Following the tournament at Texas A&M, Nebraska will play host to the Git-R-Done Husker Invitational at Firethorn Golf Club in Lincoln (April 17-18). Coach Mark Hankins and the Huskers will host a Media Day for the event at Firethorn on Tuesday, April 13 at 1:30 p.m.

# HUSKER NEWCOMERS MAKING IMMEDIATE IMPACT ON LINEUP

While the Nebraska roster features eight returning lettermen from 2019-20, the Huskers also showcase a talented five-player class of freshmen.

Jack Lundin, who was a two-time high school state champion and the South Dakota Men's Amateur Champion in 2019, was Nebraska's top finisher by tying for fourth with a career-best 221 (71-75-75) at the Hoosier Invitational (April 3-4).

Lundin said the mental adjustments he made following Nebraska's first spring stroke play tournament in San Diego were key to his success in Indiana.

"I was very patient and didn't really get ahead of myself, and that was big for me," Lundin said. "I stayed in the present and played each shot, which allowed me just to stay focused on my game. That really helped me when things didn't go well. I was able to recover more quickly and get back on track."

Lundin also led the Huskers with a 3-1 individual record at the 2021 Big Ten Match Play.

Redshirt freshman Jeremy Sisson (Skaneateles, N.Y.) played out of the top of Nebraska's lineup in Indiana after making his competitive debut as NU's top finisher at the Lamkin San Diego Classic with a 231. His opening-round 73 in Indiana was a key to NU's season-best 296 team score in the first round.

Sisson, who produced Nebraska's best individual round at the Nebraska Open with a final-round 66 (-6) during the fall, redshirted at Arkansas in 2019-20.

Freshman Gentry Scheve (Emporia, Kan.) led the Nebraska Open entering the final day after rounds of 68 and 67 to head to the last 18 holes at 9-under par. Scheve was a two-time first-team Kansas Class 5A all-state selection in high school. He closed 2019 ranked No. 42 nationally in the Golfweek ratings.



Fellow Kansas standout Will Harding also brings a distinguished background to the Big Red roster. Harding was the Midwest PGA Student-Athlete of the Year in 2019 and was a first-team Kansas Class 6A all-stater as a junior after leading Shawnee Mission East to its second straight state title.

True freshman Reed Malleck (York, Neb.) rounds out Nebraska's group of newcomers. The No. 1 golfer in the state of Nebraska in the class of 2020, Malleck was the 2020 Nebraska Junior Match Play Champion after earning first-team Nebraska Super-State accolades in 2019.

# EXPERIENCED GOLFERS GIVE HUSKERS REASON FOR OPTIMISM

NJCAA All-American Branden Meyer, who held Nebraska's No. 2 stroke average with a (75.53) while competing in all 15 rounds in the Husker lineup last season, continues to improve.

Meyer was NU's No. 3 finisher in San Diego and at the Hoosier Invitational, where he contributed three solid counting scores to Nebraska's third-place team finish.

"We know it is a great field and a great course at the Traditions, but we are going to compete to win," Meyer said. "We know some of the best teams in the country will be there, but we are going to focus on us and keep playing shot by shot. We are getting close to playing some really good golf. We know the course, and it sets up pretty well for us."

Another junior college All-American, Tom Westenberger, will play out of the No. 2 spot for the Huskers at Texas A&M after tying for seventh at the Hoosier Invitational. The German opened with a win and a tie at the Big Ten Match Play Championships before posting NU's fourth-best score in San Diego.

Nebraska's individual stroke average leader the past two seasons, graduate student Tanner Owen returns for a fifth season after being granted an additional year of eligibility along with other NCAA golfers because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

In 2018-19, Owen posted a 72.86 average and tied for 16th at the Big Ten Championships, before posting a 75.46 average in 2019-20.

Senior Mark Foelbaek, who was an NJCAA All-American in 2019 before transferring to Nebraska, had an outstanding summer and fall after adjusting to NCAA Division I competition as a junior in 2019-20. Foelbaek won the Nebraska Open (Sept. 11-13) at Elks Country Club in Columbus with a 204 (-12) with rounds of 69-68-67.

Junior Caleb Badura, who added a tie for ninth at the Nebraska Open with a 209 (-7), was a significant

contributor in a shortened 2019-20 season, including a history-making 4-0 record at the 2020 Big Ten Match Play Championships.

Sophomore Will Marshall helped the Huskers at the Hoosier Collegiate in his first lineup appearance of 2021. Marshall's final-round 72 was NU's best score of the day, as he finished in a career-best tie for 39th at 232.

"I have learned a lot and my game is improving," Marshall said. "I am trying to just stay committed to every shot, see the flight of the ball and use my athleticism to play some good golf. I think we are developing a great culture with guys who care about each other a lot and love playing golf."

#### HANKINS SET FOR THIRD SEASON AS NEBRASKA'S HEAD COACH

An outstanding coach with a record of success at the NCAA Division I and Big Ten Conference levels, Mark Hankins has the Nebraska men's golf program on the rise as he enters his third season in Lincoln.

In 2020-21, a senior-laden roster that includes fifth-year golfer and graduate student Tanner Owen, will lead the Big Red. The five-player class includes three 2019 NJCAA All-Americans (Mark Foelbaek, Branden Meyer and Tom Westenberger).

Hankins led Nebraska to its best Big Ten Match Play Championship finishes in history by taking fourth in 2019 and 2020. He also guided the Huskers to their best-ever Big Ten finish by capturing fifth at the 2019 conference tournament.

One of only three active coaches to lead a team to a Big Ten Conference men's golf title, Hankins came to Nebraska after serving as an assistant athletic director at lowa. He enters his fifth year as a member of the NCAA Division I Men's Golf Committee.

Overall, in 17 seasons as a Big Ten men's golf head coach, Hankins has coached five All-Americans, 21 golfers who earned All-Big Ten honors, including two Big Ten Players of the Year and a Big Ten Freshman

of the Year. His student-athletes also earned a total of 55 Academic All-Big Ten accolades and 12 All-America Scholar awards from the Golf Coaches Association of America (GCAA).

#### 2020 SPRING SEASON RECAP

Nebraska began its 2020 spring season at the Big Ten Match Play Championship, Feb. 7-8, at Hammock Beach Resort in Palm Coast, Fla. Nebraska opened by winning the tiebreaker in a 3-3 match against No. 4 seed Ohio State. Later the same day, the Huskers improved to 2-0 with an impressive 3.5-2.5 victory over Michigan State.

The Huskers secured a fourth-place finish despite suffering a 4-2 setback to Northwestern and a 3.5-2.5 loss to Maryland on the tournament's final day.

Caleb Badura provided the biggest individual highlights by becoming the first Husker to go 4-0 at the Big Ten Match Play. Meyer added an impressive 3-1 match play performance for the Big Red.

Badura built momentum for the spring by leading the Huskers a month later at the Desert Mountain Intercollegiate in Arizona (March 7-8). The Aurora, Neb., native tied for 21st with a 223 (+7) on the Outlaw Course at Desert Mountain, while Meyer added a tie for 32nd (226) to help Nebraska to a ninth-place team finish.

The Aggie (April 4-5), Git-R-Done Husker (April 11-12), the Hawkeye (April 18-19) invitationals and the Big Ten Championships (May 1-3) were canceled because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Tanner Owen capped his 2020 season by earning his bachelor's degree from Nebraska, while being named a Golf Coaches Association of America Scholar All-American, a Big Ten Distinguished Scholar and Academic All-Big Ten. Owen was also Nebraska's Big Ten Sportsmanship Award winner for men's golf.

Branden Meyer joined Owen as a GCAA Scholar All-American, while Daniel Pearson and Patrick Clare added Academic All-Big Ten honors of their own.
