STORYLINES

- Maryland is coming off a weekend "pod" series vs. Northwestern and No. 25 Michigan, where the Terps won three of four after sweeping the Wildcats and going 1-1 against the Wolverines. Counting the Terps' win against Ohio State the previous weekend, Maryland has won four of its last five.
- The Terps boast some of the most talented hitters in the conference. With the emergence of Benjamin Cowles who ranks first in the conference in slugging (.833), homers (9), and second in RBI (25), alongside prominent sluggers Randy Bednar and Maxwell Costes, Maryland is grooving offensively better than it has all season. Maryland's firepower has started to reflect on the Big Ten leaderboard, as the Terps rank top-five in nearly every offensive category.
- Maryland's weekend rotation of Sean Burke, Nick Dean, and Jason Savacool have given the Terps solid starts all season. Dean is nearing full strength after missing the first three weeks of the season, while freshman phenom Jason Savacool has exceeded already sky-high expectations. The ace of the staff, Sean Burke, has dazzled in his five starts this season. The redshirt sophomore has racked up 47 strikeouts (16.06 per nine), a mark that ranks among the best in the nation.

STORYLINES

PRESEASON HONORS

- Junior first baseman Maxwell Costes has earned the lion's share of Maryland's 2021 preseason honors. Most notably (and recently), Costes was named to USA Baseball's prestigious Golden Spikes Award Preseason Watch List. Costes becomes just the fifth Terp in program history to contend for the award, which is presented annually to the top amateur baseball player in the nation.
- Costes has also racked up Preseason All-American accolades from D1Baseball.com, Perfect Game, Collegiate Baseball, and the National Collegiate Baseball Writer's Association (NCBWA), as well as being named D1Baseball's Preseason Big Ten Player of the Year.
- Other Terps earning considerable preseason recognition are Sean Burke (Perfect Game Preseason Big Ten Pitcher of the Year, Perfect Game Preseason All-Big Ten), Randy Bednar (Perfect Game Preseason All-Big Ten), and Jason Savacool (Baseball America Big Ten Preseason New-comer of the Year).
- Costes, Burke, and Bednar appeared on the Big Ten's Preseason Honors List. Also released by the conference was the Big Ten coaches' preseason rankings, which tabbed the Terps to finish fifth in the league. Michigan was picked the conference favorite by the Big Ten coaches for the second-consecutive season.

TERPS IN THE MLB DRAFT RANKINGS

- Maryland has developed a number of elite draft prospects over the years, and this year's squad may be as loaded as ever with major-league potential.
- According to D1Baseball, Maryland possesses two of the best Big Ten draft prospects in the 2021 draft class (Sean Burke, #6; Maxwell Costes, #10), four top prospects in the 2022 draft class (Bobby Zmarzlak, #1; Connor Staine, #2; Nick Dean, #6; Dave Falco, #8), and two more in the 2023 draft class (Jason Savacool, #2; Matt Shaw, #9).
- Baseball America ranks the current Maryland prospects highly as well - with Sean Burke ranked third overall among Big Ten prospects in the 2021 draft class and Maxwell Costes ranked 14th.
- The 2022 Baseball America prospect rankings feature Bobby Zmarzlak (#1 overall in the Big Ten) and Connor Staine (#7), while the 2023 Big Ten prospects are headlined by another Terp in Jason Savacool (#1).

SERIES HISTORY VS. THE CORNHUSKERS

- Maryland owns a 6-4 all time advantage against Nebraska. The two teams did not meet until becoming conference partners in 2015.
- Maryland was slated to host Nebraska in 2020 before the season was canceled.
- Most recently, the Huskers took 2-of-3 in a series at Nebraska in 2018.
- The Huskers are led by head coach Will Bolt, who came up the coaching ranks alongside Rob Childress (Texas A&M), Andy Sawyers (Southeastern Missouri State), and Matt Deggs (Sam Houston State) - who Maryland skipper Rob Vaughn also spent time playing for and coaching alongside the same group.

2020 IN REVIEW

- Maryland's shortened 2020 campaign was a glimpse of things to come for the Terps, who haven't appeared in an NCAA Tournament since 2017. Just 15 non-conference games into the season, Maryland finished the year with a 10-5 record, winning the series against Bryant and Rhode Island but losing a three-game set at Coastal Carolina.
- Maxwell Costes led the Terps in nearly every offensive category, slashing .432/.620/.750 and belting 4 homers with 15 runs driven in.
- Randy Bednar and Chris Alleyne were mainstays at the top of the order and in the outfield for Maryland. Bednar and Alleyne were hit machines for the Terps, hitting at a .387 and .333 clip, respectively.
- The Maryland pitching staff was anchored by redshirt freshman Sean Burke, who started in four games and pitched a team-high 22 and one third innings. Burke went 2-0 with a 1.99 ERA. He was backed up by Sean Fisher and Nick Dean in the starting rotation, as well as impressive arms out of the bullpen in Elliot Zoellner, Sam Bello, and Connor Staine.

ROB VAUGHN

HEAD COACH | KANSAS STATE '11 | NINTH YEAR OVERALL
FOURTH YEAR AS HEAD COACH AT MARYLAND | 72-74 (.493)

Rob Vaughn is entering his fourth season as Maryland's head coach after being named to the post in June of 2017. Vaughn, the eighth head coach in school history, is in his ninth season overall at Maryland after five years as an assistant, most recently as associate head coach.

Vaughn - the youngest head coach in all of "Power Five" baseball and the eighth-youngest amongst Division I baseball - has coached a wealth of talent throughout his time in College Park. His 2021 squad is packed with talent that has received preseason honors from Baseball America, D1Baseball, Perfect Game, Collegiate Baseball, and multiple other outlets across the nation.

At the helm of the program for his most unique season yet, Vaughn led his 2020 team to a 10-5 record before the season was cut short due to COVID-19. Despite not having the chance to play in a conference matchup, several players started off their springs with eye-popping numbers.

Named a Third-Team All-American by Collegiate Baseball, Maxwell Costes picked up right where he left off following his freshman season. The sophomore from Baltimore hit the ball as well as any slugger in the nation to begin the 2020 campaign, ranking second in the country with a .620 on-base percentage. Costes finished his 15-game season with a staggering .432/.620/.750 slash line, also blasting four homers and driving in 15 runs.

Vaughn and the Maryland staff's development of redshirt freshman right-hander Sean Burke caught the eye of many in the first month of the 2020 college baseball season. The 6-foot-6 righty from Sutton, Massachusetts missed his first season in College Park due to injury, but shined in his first four outings on the collegiate diamond in 2020. Burke's 1.99 ERA led the club amongst starters and his 35 strikeouts was the most by a freshman pitcher in Division I baseball.

Despite the modified format of Major League Baseball during the summer of 2020, four of Vaughn's former pupils made the 60-man expanded Big League rosters to begin MLB's season. Brandon Lowe's breakout season with the World Series Runner-Up Rays vaulted him into league MVP discussion, while Mike Shawaryn, LaMonte Wade, and Kevin Smith trained and/or played at the MLB level in 2020.

Vaughn's 2019 club saw a five-win improvement from 24 to 29 wins as the Terps advanced to the Big Ten Tournament. Maryland had a program record six student-athletes earn All-Big Ten honors, including Big Ten Freshman of the Year Maxwell Costes. The skipper also saw two of his former players flourish professionally, with Brandon Lowe (2013-15) finishing second in American League Rookie of the Year voting and LaMonte Wade (2013-15) earning his first major league call up.

Vaughn was instrumental in Costes' breakout season, in which the freshman hit 15 home runs en route to freshman All-American and Big Ten Freshman of the Year honors. Outfielder Randy Bednar (.288/.362/.531, 12 HR, 55 RBI) and AJ Lee (.317/.443/.497), 7 HR, 36 RBI, 10 steals) both transformed their games in Vaughn's second season at the helm.

The Texas native has also upped Maryland's recruiting during his time as the head coach. After leading the Terps to their highest ranked recruiting classes as an assistant, Vaughn set a new standard in 2019, as the Terps' 2020 class was named the seventh best in the nation by D1Baseball.com, the best ranking in program history.

Including 2019 draftees Hunter Parsons and AJ Lee, along with 2018 draftees Nick Dunn and Marty Costes, Vaughn has coached 29 players who have been drafted or signed professional contracts in his time as a coach.

Maryland won 30 games in each five of Vaughn's seasons as an assistant, a school-record streak. The Terps won a program-

record 42 games in 2015, and the top three winningest seasons in Maryland history (2015, 2014, 2017) have all come with Vaughn on staff. The Terps have won eight NCAA Tournament games with Vaughn in College Park after winning just one in the entirety of the program's history.

Vaughn's player development ability has paid dividends for Maryland's position players throughout his coaching career. He has helped produce four All-Americans (Maxwell Costes, Nick Dunn, Brandon Lowe, Kevin Martir), five freshman All-Americans, 12 all-conference selections and 13 draft picks. He helped Lowe become Maryland's highest drafted position player in 13 years when he was taken 87th overall in 2015.

In his first season as head coach, Vaughn helped Dunn become one of the best second basemen in the country. The Sunbury, Pa., native was named a second-team All-American by Baseball America and was selected in the fifth round of the 2018 MLB Draft.

Vaughn also helped Marty Costes rise from an unheralded recruit to a two-time draft pick and first-team All-Big Ten selection (2017).

As the leader of Maryland's offense, Vaughn has promoted an exciting offensive style that has utilized both speed and power. In 2017, the Terps hit 67 home runs and stole 101 bases, both marks that ranked in the top-35 in the nation.

After serving as assistant head coach for two seasons, Vaughn was promoted to associate head coach in July of 2016.

As the head of Maryland's recruiting efforts, Vaughn helped orchestrate the then highest ranked class in Maryland history in 2015. D1Baseball.com gave the Terps their best rating in history (17), while Baseball America (22) and Collegiate Baseball Newspaper (27) also gave the class stellar marks.

Maryland's freshmen did not wait to make an impact in 2016, with second baseman Nick Dunn earning Big Ten All-Freshman and All-Big Ten third team honors. Under Vaughn's tutelage, Dunn emerged as one of the best freshman hitters in the conference, leading Maryland with a .300 average and 16 doubles. Dunn also earned Big Ten Player and Freshman of the Week honors in single week, becoming the first double player/freshman of the week in the Big Ten since Kyle Johnson did it for Purdue in 2013.

Fellow freshman Marty Costes earned Big Ten All-Freshman honors after leading the Terps in home runs (9) and slugging (.479). Costes was also a two-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week. That helped Maryland to a school record seven conference player of the week honors during the 2016 season. Vaughn also oversaw the transformation of Kevin Biondic, who raised his average from his freshman year mark of .183 to .278.

Vaughn's development of Anthony Papio paid dividends for the Terps as the Maryland native finished his career with the second most triples in Maryland history (9) and the third most in a single season in 2016 (4).

The 2015 season saw Vaughn's offense put up huge power numbers. Maryland slugged 52 home runs, a 33 home run jump from 2014. Six Terps notched five home runs or more with Cuas leading the charge with 11. The Terps also put up more doubles (114) and triples (19) than in 2014. Maryland's slugging percentage jumped from .359 to .405. This offensive helped the Terps win a school record 42 games and capture their second straight NCAA Regional title.

Lowe staked his claim as one of the best hitters in the nation under Vaughn. The second baseman was named a second team All-American by D1Baseball.com and earned First Team All-Big Ten honors after a season that saw him bat .331 with a team-high 58 runs and 53 RBIs. Lowe also hit nine home runs, notched a team-high 18 doubles and four triples. Lowe ranked in the top-15 of the Big Ten in all major offensive categories and earned Big Ten Player of the Week on one occasion. Lowe was also named to

the midseason USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award watch list. The award is given to the best amateur baseball player in the country.

Martir became one of the best offensive catchers in the country in 2015, earning third team All-American honors. Martir ranked seventh in the Big Ten with a .342 average, eighth in doubles (17), eighth in slugging (.502) and second in OBP (.441). Martir also notched 45 RBIs and hit seven home runs. Cuas earned second team All-Big Ten honors after another season under Vaughn's tutelage. His 11 home runs and 53 RBIs ranked third in the Big Ten.

Vaughn also helped Kevin Smith become Maryland's third Freshman All-American in the last two seasons. Smith notched a .273 average with 55 runs scored and 35 RBIs. He recorded 14 doubles and hit seven home runs. Smith was named a Freshman All-American by Perfect Game and D1Baseball.com and also was a member of the 2015 Big Ten All-Tournament Team. He was also Big Ten Freshman of the Week on one occasion.

Vaughn also oversaw the late season offensive explosion of junior LaMonte Wade, who was named the most outstanding player of the Los Angeles Regional after hitting two home runs to help the Terps overcome top overall seed UCLA. Wade finished his injury impacted season with a .335 average and a .468 slugging percentage.

In 2014, Vaughn helped the Terps become one of the most dangerous offensive teams in the country over the final two months. Beginning in May, Maryland hit .294 as a team with a .399 slugging percentage en route to a NCAA Super Regional berth and the first 40-win season in school history. During that span, the Terps belted out 47 extra-base hits in 19 games including eight home runs.

Vaughn oversaw the development and emergence of second baseman Brandon Lowe. After missing the 2013 season with a knee injury, Lowe finished second in the ACC in hitting (.348) and on-base percentage (.464), led the team in slugging (.464) and tied for the team lead in RBI (42). Lowe earned freshman All-American honors from Baseball America, Louisville Slugger, NCBWA and Perfect Game becoming the first Maryland player, along with pitcher Mike Shawarzyn, to earn All-American status since 2002 as well as earning third team All-ACC honors.

The native of Humble, Texas, believes in an aggressive offensive approach built around speed and applying pressure to opposing defenses. After totaling 94 stolen bases in 2013; a mark that ranked second in the Atlantic Coast Conference and 30th nationally, Maryland totaled 85 stolen bases in 2014, which ranked second in the ACC and 32nd nationally.

Over the two seasons, Maryland's aggressive offensive approach on the base paths was spearheaded by White. During the 2014 season, White swiped a team-high 25 stolen bases after stealing a Maryland single-season record with 39 in 2013, which led the ACC and tied for fourth nationally. For his career, White

totalled 86 stolen bases to set a Maryland record.

Under Vaughn's tutelage, White also earned All-ACC honors in his final two seasons in College Park. As Maryland's table setter, White hit .290 in 2014 with a .400 OBP and scored a team-high 49 runs en route to being selected in the 21st round of the 2014 MLB Draft by the Chicago Cubs.

In addition, Schmit had a career year in 2014 finishing second on the team in batting average (.309), OBP (.413) and slugging (.420), and led the club in doubles (18). Schmit was drafted in the 26th round of the 2014 MLB Draft by the Minnesota Twins.

In 2013, his first season in College Park, the Terps saw their batting average jump 11 points in 2013 from the 2012 season along with increases in several other offensive categories. Along with the jump in batting average, the Terps saw an increase in slugging percentage, and an 18-point increase in on-base percentage (.358 to .376). The Terps also recorded 118 doubles, an increase of 20 from the season before, 11 shy of the program record.

Before coming to Maryland, Vaughn spent the 2011-2012 seasons as a volunteer assistant coach at Kansas State, where he coached the catchers, hitters and was in charge of base-running instruction.

A native of Humble, Texas, Vaughn began his coaching career in 2010 after spending two seasons in the Chicago White Sox organization. Vaughn served as student assistant coach before being elevated to a volunteer assistant coach prior to the 2011 season. In that capacity, Vaughn worked with the catchers, served as the first base coach, assisted with hitting and pitching instruction, and oversaw all on-campus recruiting activities.

Vaughn is no stranger to building tradition as he helped Kansas State reach the NCAA tournament for the first time in school history in 2009 as a player, then saw it reach the post season for the third straight year in 2011 as a coach. While at K-State, he helped tutor three top-10 round picks in the MLB Draft in Jason King, Nick Martini and Jared King, while helping three other hitters achieve draft status that were previously undrafted. As a player at Kansas State, Vaughn caught the Big 12 Pitcher of the Year, All-American and fourth round pick, AJ Morris. In addition, Vaughn also caught Brad Hutt, the career wins leader at K-State, as well as James Allen, who is the all-time leader in saves for the Wildcats.

Vaughn was drafted in the 30th round in the 2009 MLB Draft and was fortunate to play and work with some of the best guys in the business. While in the White Sox organization with Bristol (Rookie), Great Falls (Rookie) and Kannapolis (Low A), Vaughn hit .228 with two doubles, five home runs and 13 RBI in 29 games between Bristol and Kannapolis in 2009. He followed that up by hitting .277 with five RBI in 19 games with Great Falls.

Vaughn is married to the former Kayleigh Strickler. The couple married in October of 2010 in Manhattan, Kan., and currently reside in Annapolis, Md. They have a son, Wyatt.

Matt Swope is in fourth season as assistant coach/recruiting coordinator. Swope is entering his eighth season overall on staff at Maryland after serving as the Terps' director of operations for five seasons from 2013-2017.

In his second season as hitting coach, Swope helped five Terps achieve All-Big Ten honors including First Teamer and Freshman of the Year Maxwell Costes, Randy Bednar (Second Team), AJ Lee, Taylor Wright and Michael Pineiro (Third Team). AJ Lee was drafted by the Houston Astros in the 34th round by the Houston Astros.

Swope's recruiting efforts helped key Maryland's seventh ranked recruiting class in 2020. The class was the top ranked in Maryland history.

Two former Terps made Major League headlines in 2019 when Brandon Lowe won the American League Rookie of the Month award in April with the Tampa Bay Rays and LaMonte Wade made his debut in June with the Minnesota Twins.

In 2018, Swope helped Nick Dunn earn All-American and All-Big Ten honors before being drafted in the fifth round of the 2018 MLB Draft. Swope also helped develop Marty Costes, who was drafted in the 22nd round of the 2018 draft.

Swope has been a part of the four winningest seasons in Maryland history as a player or staff member (2015, 2014, 2017, 2002). Swope has played a key role in Maryland's rise to national prominence, as the Terps captured 233 wins and advanced to three NCAA Tournaments during his time on staff.

During Swope's time in College Park, Maryland has boasted nine All-Americans, two academic All-Americans and 32 Major League Baseball draft picks. The Terrapins advanced to their only two Super Regionals in school history (2014, 2015) and advanced to two conference tournament championship games.

Swope helped overhaul the Maryland baseball brand in his time as director of operations, managing a number of areas including the Terps' budget, fundraising, scheduling, travel logistics, team events, compliance, social media, equipment and apparel. He was directly involved with Maryland's locker room renovation project, the Home Field project with the architecture department and recent upgrades to Bob "Turtle" Smith Stadium.

The Maryland alum oversaw the state and foundation budgets and was directly involved with the Home Run Club, which liaises with former players and boosters of the program, helping raise over \$1 million in private funds since 2012.

Swope was a four-year starter and had an illustrious career in College Park from 1999-2002. Playing in the outfield for the Terps, Swope finished his career with .331 batting average, 16 home runs and 135 RBI. He is Maryland's career leader in runs (181), ranks second in hits (253) and walks (106), third in total bases (360), fifth in RBI and at bats (764), and eighth in stolen bases (44).

As a senior in 2002, Swope posted a .368 batting average with 64 runs scored, 55 RBI and 31 extra base hits to help the Terps win a then program-record 34 games. As a junior, Swope hit .328 and tallied 7 home runs and 34 RBI.

The New Carrollton, Md., native was taken in the 2002 MLB Draft by the Montreal Expos where he spent the season with their Class A affiliate Clinton Lumber Kings and their Class A Short-Season affiliate Vermont Expos.

In 2005, Swope spent the season with the Washington Wild Things of the Frontier League. Swope and the Wild Things enjoyed a successful season. The Wild Things set a Frontier League record with 63 wins, while Swope hit .309 with ten home runs. Swope had a 28-game hitting streak during the 2005 season.

Swope was nominated as the Leukemia and Lymphoma Societies Man of The Year in 2010 and has raised over \$100,000 for the LLS and Kids Vs. Cancer

Corey Muscara is in fourth season at Maryland as an assistant coach after being named to the post in July of 2017. Muscara previously served as an assistant coach as St. John's for five seasons.

Muscara's work with Hunter Parsons propelled the senior to new heights in 2019. The Terps' Friday ace was named a third team All-Big Ten selection after leading the Big Ten with nine regular season wins along with notched a 3.45 ERA and 78 Ks in 104.1IP. Parsons was drafted in the 19th round of the MLB Draft by the New York Mets. Muscara also tutored John Murphy to an 11-save year, the third best total in Terps' history.

The Terps' assistant's efforts have also been felt on the recruiting trail. Muscara helped the Terps secure a program record seventh best recruiting class in 2020 after securing the services of a multitude of talented young pitchers.

In his first season with Maryland, Muscara helped Hunter Parsons go from unused starter to Friday ace. Parsons went from tossing 21 and two thirds innings with a 12.05 ERA in 2017 to starting 13 games and tossing 89 innings in 2018. He went 5-2 with a 3.44 ERA with 61 strikeouts and a .225 batting average against.

Muscara helped the Red Storm advance to the NCAA Tournament in 2015 and 2017, including a 43-win season in 2017. The former college pitcher coached four All-Americans and two freshman All-Americans at St. John's and had nine pitchers selected in the MLB Draft, including five in 2015. Two St. John's hurlers signed free agent minor league contracts over Muscara's tenure.

Muscara led one of the best pitching staffs in the country in 2017 as St. John's ranked eighth in the country with a 3.11 ERA. The staff also ranked 18th in WHIP (1.24), good enough for 18th in the nation.

St. John's boasted the BIG EAST Pitcher of the Year in three consecutive seasons (2015-17). In 2017, Muscara guided RHP Sean Mooney, who was named both the Pitcher of the Year and Freshman of the Year in the conference. Mooney was named the National Freshman Pitcher of the Year by multiple organizations and was named to the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team.

Muscara helped reliever Thomas Hackimer take home BIG EAST Pitcher of the Year honors in 2016 after compiling a sub-one ERA during the regular season, finishing the year with a 7-3 record and eight saves. In 2015, All-American and BIG EAST Pitcher of the Year Ryan McCormick went 11-1, matching a 47-year old program record for wins in a single season, and led a staff that ranked second in the BIG EAST with a 2.66 ERA. Hackimer set a school record for saves (15) that season.

The Red Storm topped the BIG EAST with 406 strikeouts in Muscara's second season in New York in 2014. He helped Joe Kuzia notch a league-high 13 saves. In his first season, Muscara helped a staff that was the third-youngest in the country, with 10 freshman combing throw 60 percent of the innings. The staff posted a 4.75 ERA.

Muscara came to St. John's after spending the 2012 season at Southern New Hampshire where he helped the program reach the NCAA Division II College World Series and win a school record 43 games. The program's pitching staff led the nation in both ERA (2.41) and strikeouts per nine innings (9.3). He also served as the recruiting coordinator. Mooney had previously coached at Southern New Hampshire in 2010, his first coaching, before heading to Binghamton for the 2011 season where he helped three Bearcat pitchers earn American East All-Conference honors.

As a player, Muscara spent his final two seasons at Franklin Pierce and captained the 2009 squad. Franklin Pierce won the Northeast-10 tournament crown both of Muscara's seasons and captured an NCAA Northeast Regional title in 2008. He had previously spent three seasons at Siena, earning letters in 2005 and 2007 while sitting out 2006 as a medical redshirt.

Muscara graduated from Franklin Pierce with a degree in history in 2009. He and his wife Suzie have a son, Theodore.

After a standout playing career in College Park, Anthony Papio is in his fourth year as Maryland's volunteer assistant coach after assuming the role in July of 2017. Papio spent one season as a student assistant coach during the 2017 season after a five-year college playing career.

Papio's role helping tutor Maryland's outfielders has helped Marty Costes earn selection in the 2018 MLB Draft. The former Terp star also played a key role in the development of Randy Bednar, who went from up-and-down freshman to standout sophomore, earning second-team All-Big Ten honors. As the Terps running game coach, Papio helped three Terps notched double digit steals.

In his first year as a coach, Papio helped the Terrapins win 38 games, the third-most in school history, and advance to the Winston-Salem Regional. Maryland's three winningest seasons in program history have included Papio as either a player or coach (2014, 2015, 2017). He has been involved in 212 wins over six years in College Park, the best six-year stretch in school history.

Papio served as Maryland's first base coach and was the main running game coach. His work with Maryland's baserunners saw the Terps jump from 28 steals in 2016 to 101 in 2017. Five Terrapins notched double digit steals.

An accomplished outfielder as a player, Papio helped spark the development of Marty Costes and Zack Jancarski in 2017. Jancarski set career highs in all statistical categories and became one of the best defensive outfielders in the Big Ten. Costes made a successful transition to right field under Papio and exploded offensively, earning first-team All-Big Ten honors.

Papio finished his career as the winningest player in Maryland history as the Terps captured 174 victories over his five seasons in College Park. He also played the most games in school history (230) and ranks second all-time in triples (9).

In 2016, Papio started 50 times between center and right field and batted .261 with four home runs, a team-high four triples and eight doubles. He was also an invaluable team leader who served as the Terps' de facto captain.

A versatile outfielder, Papio started all 66 games during Maryland run to a second straight Super Regional appearance. He had his finest offensive season, batting .262 with a .425 slugging percentage. The Olney, Md., native hit six home runs and scored 40 times, along with driving in 26 runs.

Papio starred during Maryland's postseason run and was named to the Los Angeles Regional All-Tournament team after his clutch hitting and superb defense helped Maryland topple No. 1 overall seed UCLA.

As a sophomore, Papio started 53 games as the Terps advanced to their first NCAA Regional since 1971. He batted .271 with nine doubles and two home runs and once against came up clutch in the postseason, nabbing two hits and two RBI in both the ACC Championship game against Georgia Tech and the Columbia Regional final against South Carolina.

Papio's redshirt freshman season saw him appear 47 times with 39 starts. He posted a .245 average with five doubles and 21 RBI.

Considered the pound-for-pound strongest player on the team during his career, Papio won Maryland's internal "Iron Terps" competition three times. He was named a 2015 All-American Athlete award recipient by the National Strength and Conditioning Association.

Papio was also a contributor off the field during his career, earning Big Ten All-Academic honors twice and being honored by the Big Ten as Maryland's Outstanding Sportsmanship Award winner in 2016. He was also honored by his peers at the 2016 Terp Awards with the James H. Kehoe Award, given to the student-athlete who exemplifies the ideals of sportsmanship.
