The fifth-ranked Nebraska volleyball team (0-0) opens the 2021 campaign this weekend with the Husker Invitational, Aug. 27-28, at the Bob Devaney Sports Center. The Huskers' original season opener with Tulsa was cancelled in accordance with COVID-19 protocols, and the schedule for this weekend's tournament was amended to three total matches. First serve in NU's opener vs. Colgate (0-0) is set for 6:30 p.m., followed by a 4 p.m. Saturday finale against Kansas State (0-0).

Friday's match will be streamed live on Big Ten Network+. Saturday's match will be televised live on BTN and available on the FOX Sports app, with Connor Onion on play-by-play and Emily Ehman providing color commentary.

This weekend's action will be carried on Huskers Radio Network with John Baylor and Lauren Cook West on the call. Baylor is in his 28th season handling play-by-play duties for the Husker volleyball program, and West, a former All-America setter at NU, will provide color commentary for the sixth straight year. A live audio stream will be available at Huskers.com and on the Huskers app.

Quick Hits

- Fresh off her Olympic debut at the 2020 Tokyo Games, gold medalist and former Husker All-American Justine Wong-Orantes will be recognized during Saturday's match with K-State.
- Nebraska held its annual Red/White Scrimmage last Saturday at the Devaney Center, with the match ending in a 2-2 tie in front of a crowd of 7,940 fans.
- Lexi Sun, who has 1,329 career kills between her years at Nebraska and Texas, owns 992 to her credit as a Husker entering the opening weekend of play.

Scouting the Colgate Raiders

Colgate finished the 2020-21 season at 8-2, including 7-1 in Patriot League play. The Raiders won conference's regularseason title and dropped a four-set decision to Army in the Patriot League Tournament championship final. Alli Lowe is the two-time defending Patriot League Player of the Year after averaging 4.34 kills per set last season. Julia Kurowski was named Patriot League Setter of the Year after leading the conference with 9.71 assists per set.

Colgate was picked the preseason favorite in the Patriot League poll released last week, and Lowe and Kurowski were both preseason all-league selections.

Head coach Ryan Baker enters his 16th season at Colgate with a career mark of 239-182.

Nebraska leads 2-0 in the all-time series, with both matches contested in the John Cook era. NU last faced the Raiders on Sept. 13, 2014, sweeping 3-0 (25-9, 25-12, 25-15). The match marked Nebraska's sixth-best crowd at the Devaney Center with 8,539 fans in attendance.

Scouting the Kansas State Wildcats

K-State received votes in the AVCA's 2021 preseason poll. The Wildcats finished third in the Big 12 last season, going 13-8 (10-6 Big 12) during the fall conference slate. K-State returns 10 letterwinners and four starters from its 2020 squad. Aliyah Carter, the 2020 Big 12 Freshman of the Year, averaged 4.11 kills per set in her debut season. Kadye Fernholz is the team's leading returning blocker with 0.80 blocks per set, and Mackenzie Morris had a team-best 4.02 digs per set.

Head coach Susie Fritz enters her 21st year at K-State and carries a career record of 363-236.

Nebraska leads the all-time series with the Wildcats 22-4, including 22-3 in the John Cook era. K-State and the Huskers last met on Sept. 15, 2017, when NU picked up a 3-0 win (25-22, 25-11, 25-16).

Hames, Sun Named Preseason All-Big Ten

Seniors Nicklin Hames and Lexi Sun were voted to the 2021 Preseason All-Big Ten Team by the league's 14 head

coaches, the conference office announced Monday. The coaches also picked the Huskers as the No. 2 team in the Big Ten Preseason Poll behind Wisconsin.

Sun is a two-time All-American and two-time All-Big Ten honoree heading into her fifth year of eligibility. In 2020-21, she led the Huskers with 3.64 kills per set and added 2.21 digs per set, recording five double-doubles and reaching double-digit kills in 15 of 19 matches. The Encinitas, Calif., native was named Big Ten Player of the Week twice during the 11-week regular season. She earned her second straight third-team All-America award, as well as second-team Academic All-America plaudits.

Hames picked up second-team All-America recognition and her second straight All-Big Ten award in 2020-21. The Maryville, Tenn., native averaged a conference-leading 10.91 assists per set and led NU to a .270 hitting percentage, the second-best mark in the Big Ten. Hames also averaged 2.91 digs per set and posted 10 double-doubles in 19 matches. She surpassed the 3,000 career assists milestone to become the fourth Husker setter in the rally scoring era to reach that mark.

Cornhusker Captains

Seniors Nicklin Hames and Lauren Stivrins and junior Kenzie Knuckles were announced as team captains for the 2021 season on Tuesday. Hames and Stivrins are both returning captains from 2020-21, and Hames also served in the role in 2019.

Success in Season Openers

Nebraska is 17-4 in season openers since the John Cook era began in 2000. The Huskers have won two straight in season debuts and four of their last six.

2020-21 at a Glance

Nebraska capped the 2020-21 season with an overall record of 16-3 (14-2 Big Ten) and reached an NCAA Regional Final for the ninth straight year, which marks the longest Elite Eight streak in the nation. NU's NCAA Regional Final appearance was its 30th overall, which is the most in NCAA history.

Nicklin Hames, Lauren Stivrins and Lexi Sun all picked up AVCA All-America honors, and the trio plus Madi Kubik earned AVCA All-North Region recognition. Hames, Stivrins and Sun also earned first-team All-Big Ten plaudits.

All-Americans Headline Husker Returners

The Huskers return three AVCA All-Americans in Nicklin Hames, Lauren Stivrins and Lexi Sun. Hames, a second-team honoree at setter last season, averaged a Big Ten-leading 10.91 assists per set while guiding NU to a .270 team hitting percentage.

Sun, a two-time All-American, averaged a team-leading 3.64 kills per set and 2.21 digs per set in 2020-21. She announced on May 19 her decision to return for a fifth season of eligibility, which the NCAA granted to student-athletes due to COVID-19 interruptions.

Stivrins, a three-time All-American, averaged 3.19 kills per set and 1.03 blocks per set. She had a team-best .468 hitting percentage, which led the Big Ten, ranked third nationally and was the second-best single-season mark in school history. Stivrins announced her return for a sixth season on Aug. 6.

Additionally, Madi Kubik received AVCA All-America honorable mention for the second straight season after averaging 2.85 kills and 2.38 digs per set as a sophomore.

NU also counts returning letterwinners in Kenzie Knuckles, Kayla Caffey, Anni Evans, Keonilei Akana, Kalynn Meyer

New Faces at Nebraska

Nebraska welcomes six newcomers in the 2021 signing class, which was ranked No. 1 by PrepVolleyball.com last November. All six were ranked in the top 70 recruits nationally. Five were counted in the top 16 and four were in the top 10, while each of the top three signed to become Huskers.

The freshman class includes outside hitter Ally Batenhorst (Houston, Texas), middle blocker Rylee Gray (Elkhorn, Neb.), outside hitter Lindsay Krause (Papillion, Neb.), outside hitter Whitney Lauenstein (Waverly, Neb.), setter Kennedi Orr (Eagan, Minn.) and defensive specialist/libero Lexi Rodriguez (Sterling, Ill.).

Batenhorst, the No. 3 overall prospect and No. 2 outside hitter, was the 2020-21 Gatorade National Player of the Year in May. She joined Gina Mancuso (2009), Mikaela Foecke (2015) and Lexi Sun (2017) as Huskers previously named Gatorade National Player of the Year. Batenhorst led Seven Lakes High School to the 2020 Texas Class 6A state title.

Gray, the No. 70 overall recruit, helped Elkhorn South High School to four state tournament appearances. A three-time all-state pick, she helped her team to the 2020 Class A state title.

Krause was the No. 2 overall recruit and the No. 1 outside hitter in the 2021 class. She was a member of the 2021 U.S. team at the U20 World Championships and a gold medalist with Team USA at the 2019 U18 World Championships. Krause was the 2020 Nebraska Gatorade Player of the Year, a four-time state champion and a four-time all-state pick at Skutt Catholic High School.

Lauenstein was tabbed the No. 16 recruit in the 2021 class and the No. 2 recruit in the state of Nebraska. She helped Waverly High School to three state tournaments and was a three-time all-state honoree.

Rodriguez joined Batenhorst and Krause on the 2021 U.S. U20 World Championship Team and was named the No. 10 overall recruit and No. 1 libero/defensive specialist in the 2021 class. Rodriguez also won a gold medal with Team USA at the 2019 U18 Worlds. Averaging 7.2 digs per set at Sterling High School, she was the 2020 Illinois Gatorade Player of the Year and a two-time state champion.

Orr, the No. 1 overall recruit in the 2021 class, was a six-year varsity player at Eagan High School in Eagan, Minn., where she won two state titles and added three runner-up finishes. She was a gold medalist with Team USA at the 2019 U18 World Championships, where she was honored as Best Setter. Orr was the 2019 Minnesota Gatorade Player of the Year.

From Husker Heroes to Gold Medal Greats

Former Nebraska All-Americans Jordan Larson, Kelsey Robinson and Justine Wong-Orantes became Olympic gold medalists on Aug. 8 as the United States defeated Brazil 3-0 in the final match of the 2020 Tokyo Games at Ariake Arena. Larson captained Team USA to a dominant run and became the first American woman to claim gold (Tokyo 2020), silver (London 2012) and bronze (Rio 2016) medals in indoor volleyball alongside three-time Olympic teammate Foluke Akinradewo.

Following the match, Larson was named Most Valuable Player and Best Outside Hitter, and she and Wong-Orantes earned spots on the Tokyo 2020 Dream Team. Larson led Team USA with a total of 96 points in eight matches.

Larson, who was a three-time All-American at Nebraska while lettering from 2005-08, competed in her third straight Olympics. Robinson, an All-American at NU in 2013, was also a member of the bronze-medal winning team in 2016, while two-time All-American Wong-Orantes (2013-16) made her Olympic debut in Tokyo.

Taking Over Tokyo

The gold-medal trio of Jordan Larson, Kelsey Robinson and Justine Wong-Orantes was part of a group of five Huskers with ties to indoor and beach competition at the 2020 Olympic Games. Four-time All-American Sarah Pavan (2004-07) competed in her second consecutive Olympics in beach volleyball and entered the Games as the No. 1-ranked pair in the world with partner Melissa Humana-Paredes and finished fifth.

Nebraska Associate Head Coach Tyler Hildebrand served as the USA Volleyball Director of Coaching for the American beach national teams, which included gold medalists April Ross and Alix Klineman. Performance Nutrition Coordinator Nuwanee Kirihennedige also supported Team USA as a sports dietitian at the Games.

Huskers Picked Fifth in AVCA Preseason Poll

- Nebraska ranks No. 5 in the AVCA Preseason Coaches Poll released Aug. 16.
- The Huskers have been ranked No. 1 in 100 all-time polls, the most in NCAA history.
- The Huskers have been ranked in the top 10 a total of 515 times, which is also the most in NCAA history.
- Nebraska has appeared in all 571 AVCA Coaches Polls it has been eligible for since it was established in 1982. Nebraska is the only program to be ranked in every eligible poll all-time.

Freshman Trio Helps U.S. to Fifth-Place Finish at U20 World Championships

Three Husker freshmen -- outside hitters Ally Batenhorst and Lindsay Krause and libero Lexi Rodriguez -- helped the United States to a fifth-place finish at the 2021 FIVB U20 World Championships in July. It was the Americans' highest finish at U20 Worlds in 10 years.

AVCA Hall of Fame Head Coach John Cook in 22nd Season at Nebraska

- Nebraska head coach John Cook enters his 22nd season as the Nebraska volleyball head coach in 2021. He has led the Huskers to four national championships, nine final fours, 12 conference championships and 19 top-10 final rankings since 2000.
- Cook owns 765 career wins and is one of the all-time winningest coaches in NCAA history. Since taking over the program in 2000, Cook has led the Huskers to a nation-leading .878 win percentage in that time (604-84).
- Under Cook, the Huskers have tallied 60 AVCA All-Americans and 20 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, both among the best in the nation. He is a two-time AVCA National Coach of the Year, earning the prestigious honor in 2000 and 2005, and a seven-time conference coach of the year, including Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2016 and 2017, his first and second Big Ten honors with the Huskers in their Big Ten era (2011-present).
- Cook is one of only four active coaches and one of six all-time to be a two-time AVCA National Coach of the Year and was honored in 2008 by USA Volleyball, receiving its All-Time Great Coach Award.
- Cook was inducted into the AVCA Hall of Fame in 2017, joining former Husker volleyball coach Terry Pettit in the hall.
- Cook became the ninth active Division I head coach to reach 700 career wins in 2018.

The Huskers in 2020-21

- Lexi Sun led the Huskers in 2021 with 3.64 kills per set and 26 service aces. She ranked sixth in the Big Ten in kills per set and was a first-team All-Big Ten selection.
- Lauren Stivrins put up 3.18 kills per set on a team-high .468 hitting percentage, which led all Big Ten players last season and ranked third nationally. She was also named to the All-Big Ten First Team.
- Stivrins missed the Huskers' final two matches of the year against Baylor and Texas. The BU match was the first match of her Husker career that she did not play in.
- Nicklin Hames paced the Husker attack with 10.91 assists per set the most in the Big Ten and chipped in 2.91 digs per set with 16 service aces. Along with Sun and Stivrins, Hames was a repeat All-Big Ten First-Team selection.
- Madi Kubik was third on the team with 2.85 kills per set alongside 2.38 digs per set, which was fourth.
- Kayla Caffey's 2.04 kills per set were the fourth-most on the team. She hit .380 and added 1.09 blocks per set, with both marks the second-best among NU players.
- The Huskers limited opponents to .168 hitting to rank second in the Big Ten behind only Wisconsin.
- Nebraska's .270 team hitting percentage also ranked second in the Big Ten behind Wisconsin.

Huskers in the History Books

- Lauren Stivrins surpassed 1,000 career kills last season on March 12 against Ohio State and now has 1,068. Stivrins became the 22nd Husker in school history to reach 1,000 career kills at Nebraska and the eighth player to do so in the rally scoring era (2001-present).
- Stivrins has also established herself as one of the most efficient hitters in Nebraska volleyball history. She has a .386 career hitting percentage, which ranks fourth all-time in school history and first since the rally scoring era began in 2001.
- Lexi Sun also owns more than 1,000 career kills with 1,329 (337 as a freshman at Texas in 2017).
- Nicklin Hames surpassed 3,000 career assists last season and now has 3,376 to rank fifth in school history. She became the 10th Husker setter in school history to reach 3,000 career assists at Nebraska and the fourth in the rally scoring era (2001-present), joining Kelly Hunter (4,125), Sydney Anderson (3,332) and Lauren Cook (3,198).

Up Next

Nebraska plays host to the Ameritas Players Challenge, Sept. 3-4, at the Devaney Center. On Friday, the Huskers face Omaha at 11 a.m. and Georgia at 6 p.m., followed by a Saturday finale with Arizona State at 6 p.m.


