# #3 NEBRASKA CORNHUSKERS vs. #20 UTAH UTES

Saturday, Sept. 11 / 7:30 p.m. / Devaney Center / Lincoln, Neb. Stream: BTN+ / Listen: Huskers Radio Network, Huskers.com, Huskers App

The No. 3 Nebraska volleyball team (6-0) returns home this weekend, welcoming No. 20 Utah (6-0) on Saturday, Sept. 11. First serve in the top-20 matchup between the two unbeaten teams is set for 7:30 p.m. at the Devaney Center.

The match will be streamed Big Ten Network+. This week's action will be carried on Huskers Radio Network with the NU radio team of John Baylor and Lauren Cook West. Baylor is in his 28th season handling play-by-play duties for the Husker volleyball program, and West, a former All-America setter at NU, will provide color commentary for the sixth straight year.

Huskers Radio Network will carry the matches on HRN radio affiliates, including 107.3 FM in Lincoln and AM 590 in Omaha. A live audio stream will be available at Huskers.com and on the Huskers app.

# **Quick Hits**

• After a 3-0 weekend at the Ameritas Players Challenge and a midweek sweep of No. 19 Creighton, Nebraska remained undefeated. Entering the week, NU moved up one spot to No. 3 in the national rankings.

• Wednesday's battle of the unbeatens in Omaha also brought the Huskers' first meeting with a ranked opponent this season. They play four straight top-20 opponents between Sept. 8-18 with No. 19 Creighton, No. 20 Utah, No. 14 Stanford and No. 10 Louisville.

• The Nebraska-Creighton match was played in front of 11,279 fans at the CHI Health Center Omaha, marking the NCAA's largest regular-season crowd this season and the 10th-largest regular-season, volleyball-only crowd in NCAA history.

- Kayla Caffey was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on Monday for the first time in her career.
- Caffey's .500 hitting percentage ranks ninth nationally and third in the Big Ten.
- Ally Batenhorst made her career debut last weekend, making her the fifth NU freshman to see the court this year.

• Madi Kubik was NU's leader in kills in three straight matches vs. K-State (13), Omaha (16) and Georgia (15). Lexi Sun has led the way in the last two vs. Arizona State (14) and Creighton (11).

# **Scouting the Utah Utes**

Utah is 6-0 on the season after sweeping Weber State Thursday night at home. Dani Drews posted 18 kills with no errors, hitting .486 in the match, and added a match-high 20 digs. Madelyn Robinson tallied a career-high 19 kills on .378 hitting.

Last weekend, Utah went 3-0 at the Utah Classic with wins over No. 22 San Diego (3-1), Hawaii (3-1) and Cal Poly (3-0), part of a five-match home stand. The Utes' trip to Lincoln begins a five-match road stretch through the remainder of September.

Utah finished 13-5 (13-4 Pac-12) last spring, falling to Pittsburgh in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Drews was one of two Utes named an AVCA All-American and became the first two-time first-team honoree in program history after averaging a nation-leading 5.1 kills per set. Additionally, Drews was named the Pac-12 Player of the Year and picked up All-Pac-12 accolades, and Robinson earned All-Pac-12 honorable mention.

Head coach Beth Launiere is in her 32nd season at Utah with a career record of 606-375.

Nebraska leads the all-time series with Utah, 3-0-1, including 1-0 in the John Cook era.

# Last Time Out: Nebraska vs. Utah

Nebraska last faced Utah on Dec. 6, 2014, winning 3-2 (25-23, 25-22, 23-25, 17-25, 15-11) in the second round of the NCAA Tournament at the Devaney Center, advancing to an NCAA Regional Semifinal. Mary Pollmiller (45 assists/10 kills) and Kadie Rolfzen (15 kills/11 digs) both recorded double-doubles in the win, and Kelsey Fien finished with 19 kills.

### Two Weeks, Two B1G Awards

Nebraska has counted a Big Ten weekly award winner in each of the first two weeks of the season. Lexi Rodriguez was the first, earning Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Week recognition on Aug. 30 after her career debut, while Kayla Caffey collected Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 6.

Caffey paced the Huskers with 1.56 blocks per set alongside 2.44 kills per set on .405 hitting last weekend at the Ameritas Players Challenge. The Chicago native earned all-tournament team recognition.

On Friday vs. Omaha, Caffey came off the bench for six kills on 10 swings with no errors and seven blocks, all in the fourth and fifth sets. That night vs. Georgia, she added nine kills on .375 hitting with five blocks. Caffey closed the tournament with seven kills and a pair of blocks vs. Arizona State on Saturday.

# **Defensive Showcase**

A stifling defensive effort was the key in Wednesday night's sweep of No. 19 Creighton. The Huskers finished with 69 digs as a team over the three sets, holding CU to .053 hitting with 28 kills on 131 swings.

It was Nebraska's second-highest digs total of the season and their best mark of the year in a three-set match.

# **MVP Debut for Hames**

After missing the opening week of play, Nicklin Hames made her senior season debut last weekend at the Ameritas Players Challenge. She averaged 9.75 assists per set and 2.83 digs per set and registered three straight doubledoubles, earning the Most Valuable Player nod on the all-tournament team. In the tournament finale vs. Arizona State, Hames guided NU to a season-best .350 hitting percentage.

# Lauenstein Providing a Spark

Nebraska was given a spark off the bench from Whitney Lauenstein last weekend, as the freshman hit at a combined .484 clip over the final two matches against Georgia and Arizona State. The Waverly, Neb., product tallied eight kills on .429 hitting with two blocks against the Bulldogs, then followed with a season-high 11 kills on .529 hitting with a pair of blocks against the Sun Devils.

# Sun Reaches 1,000 Kills at NU

In NU's Aug. 27 season opener vs. Colgate, Lexi Sun became the 23rd player in program history and the ninth in the rally-scoring era to reach 1,000 kills as a Husker. Wednesday night at Creighton, she moved up to 22nd on the list with 1,057.

# **Among the Active Career Leaders**

Entering the week, three seniors rank among the NCAA's active career leaders in multiple categories. Kayla Caffey's .372 career hitting percentage between Nebraska and Missouri is the sixth-best mark among active Division I players. Nicklin Hames' 3,528 career assists are 16th in the ranks, and her career average of 10.69 assists per set comes in at ninth. Lexi Sun has 1,383 career kills between Nebraska and Texas, the 20th-most of any player.

# **Climbing the Rally-Scoring Career Charts**

Nicklin Hames is the 11th Husker in the rally-scoring era to reach 1,000 career digs. She sits 92 away from passing former Husker and current Director of Operations Lindsay Wischmeier Peterson (1,112) on the list. Hames also carries 84 career service aces, which ranks 10th on the list in the rally-scoring era.

Callie Schwarzenbach's 361 total blocks rank ninth in the rally-scoring era.

# **Cornhusker Captains**

Seniors Nicklin Hames and Lauren Stivrins and junior Kenzie Knuckles are team captains for the 2021 season. Hames and Stivrins are returning captains from 2020-21, and Hames also served in the role in 2019.

Final for the ninth straight year, which marks the longest Elite Eight streak in the nation. NU's NCAA Regional Final appearance was its 30th overall, which is the most in NCAA history.

Nicklin Hames, Lauren Stivrins and Lexi Sun all picked up AVCA All-America honors, and the trio plus Madi Kubik earned AVCA All-North Region recognition. Hames, Stivrins and Sun also earned first-team All-Big Ten plaudits.

# All-Americans Headline Husker Returners

NU returns three AVCA All-Americans in Nicklin Hames, Lauren Stivrins and Lexi Sun. Hames, a second-team honoree at setter in 2019, averaged a Big Ten-leading 10.91 assists per set while guiding NU to a .270 team hitting percentage.

Sun, a two-time All-American, averaged a team-leading 3.64 kills per set and 2.21 digs per set in 2020-21. She announced on May 19 her decision to return for a fifth season of eligibility, which the NCAA granted to student-athletes due to COVID-19 interruptions.

Stivrins, a three-time All-American, averaged 3.19 kills per set and 1.03 blocks per set. She had a team-best .468 hitting percentage, which led the Big Ten, ranked third nationally and was the second-best single-season mark in school history. Stivrins announced her return for a sixth season on Aug. 6.

Additionally, Madi Kubik received AVCA All-America honorable mention for the second straight season after averaging 2.85 kills and 2.38 digs per set as a sophomore.

NU also counts returning letterwinners in Kenzie Knuckles, Kayla Caffey, Anni Evans, Keonilei Akana, Kalynn Meyer and Callie Schwarzenbach.

# **New Faces at Nebraska**

Nebraska welcomed six newcomers in the 2021 signing class, which was ranked No. 1 by PrepVolleyball.com last November. All six were ranked in the top 70 recruits nationally. Five were counted in the top 16 and four were in the top 10, while each of the top three signed to become Huskers.

Ally Batenhorst, the No. 3 overall prospect and No. 2 outside hitter, was the 2020-21 Gatorade National Player of the Year. She joins Gina Mancuso (2009), Mikaela Foecke (2015) and Lexi Sun (2017) as Huskers previously named Gatorade National Player of the Year. Batenhorst led Seven Lakes High School to the 2020 Texas Class 6A state title.

Rylee Gray, the No. 70 overall recruit, helped Elkhorn South High School to four state tournament appearances. A three-time all-state pick, the middle blocker helped her team to the 2020 Class A state title.

Lindsay Krause was the No. 2 overall recruit and the No. 1 outside hitter in the 2021 class. She was a member of the 2021 U.S. team at the U20 World Championships and a gold medalist with Team USA at the 2019 U18 World Championships. Krause was the 2020 Nebraska Gatorade Player of the Year, a four-time state champion and a four-time all-state pick at Skutt Catholic High School.

Whitney Lauenstein was tabbed the No. 16 recruit in the 2021 class and the No. 2 recruit in the state of Nebraska. The outside hitter helped Waverly High School to three state tournaments and was a three-time all-state honoree.

Lexi Rodriguez joined Batenhorst and Krause on the 2021 U.S. U20 World Championship Team and was named the No. 10 overall recruit and No. 1 libero/defensive specialist in the 2021 class. Rodriguez also won a gold medal with Team USA at the 2019 U18 Worlds. Averaging 7.2 digs per set at Sterling High School, she was the 2020 Illinois Gatorade Player of the Year and a two-time state champion.

Kennedi Orr, the No. 1 overall recruit in the class, was a six-year varsity player at Eagan High School in Eagan, Minn., where she won two state titles and added three runner-up finishes. She was a gold medalist with Team USA at the 2019 U18 World Championships, where she was honored as Best Setter. Orr was the 2019 Minnesota Gatorade Player of the Year.

# From Husker Heroes to Gold Medal Greats

Former NU All-Americans Jordan Larson, Kelsey Robinson and Justine Wong-Orantes became Olympic gold medalists on Aug. 8 as the United States defeated Brazil 3-0 in the final match of the 2020 Tokyo Games at Ariake Arena. Larson captained Team USA to a dominant run and became the first American woman to claim gold (Tokyo 2020), silver (London 2012) and bronze (Rio 2016) medals in indoor volleyball alongside three-time Olympic teammate Foluke Akinradewo.

Following the match, Larson was named Most Valuable Player and Best Outside Hitter, and Wong-Orantes was tabbed Best Libero. Both earned spots on the Tokyo 2020 Dream Team. Larson led Team USA with 96 points in eight matches.

Larson, who was a three-time All-American at Nebraska while lettering from 2005-08, competed in her third straight Olympics. Robinson, an All-American at NU in 2013, was also a member of the bronze-medal winning

# **Tokyo** Takeover

The gold-medal trio of Jordan Larson, Kelsey Robinson and Justine Wong-Orantes was part of a group of five Huskers with ties to indoor and beach competition at the 2020 Olympic Games. Four-time All-American Sarah Pavan (2004-07) competed in her second consecutive Olympics in beach volleyball and entered the Games as the No. 1-ranked pair in the world with partner Melissa Humana-Paredes and finished fifth.

Nebraska Associate Head Coach Tyler Hildebrand served as the USA Volleyball Director of Coaching for the American beach national teams, which included gold medalists April Ross and Alix Klineman. Performance Nutrition Coordinator Nuwanee Kirihennedige also supported Team USA as a sports dietitian at the Games.

# **Noting the National Poll**

- Nebraska has been a preseason top-five pick for seven straight years.
- The Huskers have been ranked No. 1 in 100 all-time polls, the most in NCAA history.
- The Huskers have been ranked in the top 10 a total of 517 times, which is also the most in NCAA history.

# Freshman Trio Helps U.S. to Fifth-Place Finish at U20 World Championships

Three Husker freshmen -- outside hitters Ally Batenhorst and Lindsay Krause and libero Lexi Rodriguez -- helped the United States to a fifth-place finish at the 2021 FIVB U20 World Championships in July. It was the Americans' highest finish at U20 Worlds in 10 years.

# AVCA Hall of Fame Head Coach John Cook in 22nd Season at Nebraska

• Nebraska head coach John Cook enters his 22nd season as the Nebraska volleyball head coach in 2021. He has led the Huskers to four national championships, nine final fours, 12 conference championships and 19 top-10 final rankings since 2000.

• Cook owns 771 career wins and is one of the all-time winningest coaches in NCAA history. Since taking over the program in 2000, Cook has led the Huskers to a nation-leading .879 win percentage in that time (610-84).

• Under Cook, the Huskers have tallied 60 AVCA All-Americans and 20 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, both among the best in the nation. He is a two-time AVCA National Coach of the Year, earning the prestigious honor in 2000 and 2005, and a seven-time conference coach of the year, including Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2016 and 2017, his first and second Big Ten honors with the Huskers in their Big Ten era (2011-present).

• Cook is one of only four active coaches - and one of six all-time - to be a two-time AVCA National Coach of the Year and was honored in 2008 by USA Volleyball, receiving its All-Time Great Coach Award.

• Cook was inducted into the AVCA Hall of Fame in 2017, joining former Husker volleyball coach Terry Pettit in the hall.

• Cook became the ninth active Division I head coach to reach 700 career wins in 2018.

# The Huskers in 2020-21

• Lexi Sun led the Huskers in 2021 with 3.64 kills per set and 26 service aces. She ranked sixth in the Big Ten in kills per set and was a first-team All-Big Ten selection.

Lauren Stivrins put up 3.18 kills per set on a team-high .468 hitting percentage, which led all Big Ten players last season and ranked third nationally. She was also named to the All-Big Ten First Team.
Stivrins missed the Huskers' final two matches of the year against Baylor and Texas. The BU match was the first match of her Husker career that she did not play in.

• Nicklin Hames paced the Husker attack with 10.91 assists per set - the most in the Big Ten - and chipped in 2.91 digs per set with 16 service aces. Along with Sun and Stivrins, Hames was a repeat All-Big Ten First-Team selection.

• Madi Kubik was third on the team with 2.85 kills per set alongside 2.38 digs per set, which was fourth.

• Kayla Caffey's 2.04 kills per set were the fourth-most on the team. She hit .380 and added 1.09 blocks per set, with both marks the second-best among NU players.

- The Huskers limited opponents to .168 hitting to rank second in the Big Ten behind only Wisconsin.
- Nebraska's .270 team hitting percentage also ranked second in the Big Ten behind Wisconsin.

# Up Next

Nebraska plays its final non-conference road match on Tuesday, Sept. 14, visiting No. 14 Stanford. First serve is set for 7 p.m. CT, and the match will be televised on Pac-12 Network. John Baylor and Lauren Cook West will have the radio call on Huskers Radio Network.


