The No. 6 Nebraska volleyball team (6-2) plays its non-conference finale this Saturday, Sept. 18, welcoming No. 5 Louisville (9-0). First serve in the Huskers' fourth straight top-20 matchup is set for 7 p.m. at the Devaney Center. The match will be televised on BTN with Larry Punteneby on play-by-play and Emily Ehman providing color commentary.

This week's action will be carried on Huskers Radio Network with the NU radio team of John Baylor and Lauren Cook West. Baylor is in his 28th season handling play-by-play duties for the Husker volleyball program, and West, a former All-America setter at NU, will provide color commentary for the sixth straight year.

Huskers Radio Network will carry the matches on HRN radio affiliates, including 107.3 FM in Lincoln and AM 590 in Omaha. Inside the Devaney Center, fans can access the direct radio call of the match at 87.7 FM, and a live audio stream will be available at Huskers.com and on the Huskers app.

Quick Hits

- Saturday marks the first time Nebraska and Louisville tangle with both ranked in the top 10 nationally.
- After opening the year on a six-match win streak, the Huskers look to rebound from losses to No. 20 Utah (Sept. 11) and No. 16 Stanford (Sept. 14).
- Prior to this week, Nebraska had not dropped consecutive matches since a three-match skid in 2018.
- The Huskers will have played four straight top-20 opponents in an 11-day span by the end of this week with No. 19 Creighton (Sept. 8), No. 20 Utah (Sept. 11), No. 16 Stanford (Sept. 14) and No. 5 Louisville (Sept. 18).
- Nebraska has held its opponents to .136 hitting this season, the fourth-best mark in the Big Ten.
- Five of NU's six freshmen have seen the court so far this year. The Huskers started four -- Ally Batenhorst, Lindsay Krause, Whitney Lauenstein and Lexi Rodriguez -- Tuesday night at No. 16 Stanford.

Scouting the Louisville Cardinals

Louisville is 9-0 on the season after a 3-2 win over No. 8 Kentucky Wednesday night. Claire Chaussee had a team-high 18 kills, Anna DeBeer added 14, and Anna Stevenson had 12 more. UL ranks third in the country with 3.18 blocks per set and sixth for hitting percentage at .314. Seven of UL's nine wins have been secured in three sets, and its 9-0 start is the program's best since 2005.

Louisville finished 15-3 (12-2 ACC) last season, advancing to a regional semifinal in the NCAA Tournament before its season came to a close.

Dani Busboom is in her fifth season at the helm with a career record of 92-29 at Louisville.

Noting the Series

In the history of Nebraska-Louisville matchups, the Huskers lead the all-time series 5-0, including 2-0 in the John Cook era. Four of the five matches have been played in Lincoln.

The most recent Nebraska-Louisville contest was Sept. 8, 2006 at the Ameritas Players Challenge at the NU Coliseum. The then-No. 1 Huskers swept 3-0 (30-13, 30-24, 30-13). Then-senior Dani Busboom, who transitioned from setter to libero for her final season, finished with a match-high 14 digs and three service aces.

From Lincoln to Louisville

Saturday's match is a homecoming for two members of the Louisville staff in head coach Dani Busboom Kelly and associate head coach Dan Meske.

Busboom Kelly took the helm of the Cardinal program after five years as an assistant coach at Nebraska (2012-16). She was also a four-year starter at NU from 2003-06, helping the Huskers to a 124-10 record, three Big 12 titles, two NCAA finals appearances and a national championship in 2006.

Meske was a member of the Nebraska staff for eight seasons in graduate assistant, volunteer assistant and full-time assistant coach roles, serving three years alongside Busboom Kelly.

Two Big Weeks, Two B1G Awards

Nebraska counted a Big Ten weekly award winner in each of the first two weeks of the season. Lexi Rodriguez was

the first, earning Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Week recognition on Aug. 30 after her career debut, while Kayla Caffey collected Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 6.

Rodriguez paced the Huskers with 5.14 digs per set in a pair of wins at the Husker Invitational (Aug. 27-28) in the opening weekend. Caffey led NU with 1.56 blocks per set alongside 2.44 kills per set on .405 hitting at the Ameritas Players Challenge (Sept. 3-4). The Chicago native earned all-tournament team recognition.

Leading the Freshman Charge

The start of Lindsay Krause's Husker career has seen her average 2.04 kills per set and 1.00 blocks per set -- both the best among Husker freshmen. Krause had a season-high 15 kills on .317 hitting vs. No. 20 Utah, then followed with 10 at No. 16 Stanford. The Papillion native also had a breakout blocking effort with 10 vs. Omaha.

Batenhorst Stepping Out

Ally Batenhorst has come on strong of late, averaging 2.26 kills per set over the last four matches. The freshman had back-to-back 10-kill nights vs. No. 20 Utah and No. 16 Stanford for a season high.

More from the Middle

Kayla Caffey's .443 hitting percentage ranks fifth in the Big Ten and 17th nationally. The senior middle has back-to-back matches with double-figure kills and has hit .300 or better in four of the last five.

Caffey is second on the team with 2.52 kills per set as well as 1.19 blocks per set.

Defensive Showcase

A stifling defensive effort was the key in a Sept. 8 sweep of No. 19 Creighton. The Huskers finished with 69 digs as a team over the three sets, holding CU to .053 hitting with 28 kills on 131 swings. It was Nebraska's second-highest digs total of the season and the best mark of the year for any Big Ten team in a three-set match.

MVP Debut for Hames

After missing the opening week of play, Nicklin Hames made her senior season debut at the Ameritas Players Challenge. She averaged 9.75 assists per set and 2.83 digs per set and registered three straight double-doubles, earning the Most Valuable Player nod on the all-tournament team. In the tournament finale vs. Arizona State, Hames guided NU to a season-best .350 hitting percentage.

Sun Reaches 1,000 Kills at NU

In NU's Aug. 27 season opener vs. Colgate, Lexi Sun became the 23rd player in program history and the ninth in the rally-scoring era to reach 1,000 kills as a Husker. Sept. 11 vs. Utah, she moved up to 21st on the list with 1,065.

Schwarzenbach's Start

Callie Schwarzenbach leads the Huskers with 1.29 blocks per set this season, which ranks 10th in the Big Ten. For her career, the senior's 369 total blocks are ninth on the Huskers' rally-scoring era career chart.

Among the Active Career Leaders

Entering the week, three seniors rank among the NCAA's active career leaders in multiple categories. Kayla Caffey's .371 career hitting percentage between Nebraska and Missouri is the sixth-best mark among active Division I players. Nicklin Hames' 3,597 career assists are 18th in the ranks, and her career average of 10.64 assists per set comes in at ninth. Lexi Sun has 1,402 career kills between Nebraska and Texas, the 21st-most of any player.

Cornhusker Captains

Seniors Nicklin Hames and Lauren Stivrins and junior Kenzie Knuckles are team captains for the 2021 season.

Hames and Stivrins are returning captains from 2020-21, and Hames also served in the role in 2019.

2020-21 at a Glance

Nebraska capped the 2020-21 season with an overall record of 16-3 (14-2 Big Ten) and reached an NCAA Regional Final for the ninth straight year, which marks the longest Elite Eight streak in the nation. NU's NCAA Regional Final appearance was its 30th overall, which is the most in NCAA history.

Nicklin Hames, Lauren Stivrins and Lexi Sun all picked up AVCA All-America honors, and the trio plus Madi Kubik earned AVCA All-North Region recognition. Hames, Stivrins and Sun also earned first-team All-Big Ten plaudits.

All-Americans Headline Husker Returners

NU returns three AVCA All-Americans in Nicklin Hames, Lauren Stivrins and Lexi Sun. Hames, a second-team honoree at setter in 2019, averaged a Big Ten-leading 10.91 assists per set while guiding NU to a .270 team hitting percentage.

Sun, a two-time All-American, averaged a team-leading 3.64 kills per set and 2.21 digs per set in 2020-21. She announced on May 19 her decision to return for a fifth season of eligibility, which the NCAA granted to student-athletes due to COVID-19 interruptions.

Stivrins, a three-time All-American, averaged 3.19 kills per set and 1.03 blocks per set. She had a team-best .468 hitting percentage, which led the Big Ten, ranked third nationally and was the second-best single-season mark in school history. Stivrins announced her return for a sixth season on Aug. 6.

Additionally, Madi Kubik received AVCA All-America honorable mention for the second straight season after averaging 2.85 kills and 2.38 digs per set as a sophomore.

NU also counts returning letterwinners in Kenzie Knuckles, Kayla Caffey, Anni Evans, Keonilei Akana, Kalynn Meyer and Callie Schwarzenbach.

New Faces at Nebraska

Nebraska welcomed six newcomers in the 2021 signing class, which was ranked No. 1 by PrepVolleyball.com last November. All six were ranked in the top 70 recruits nationally. Five were counted in the top 16 and four were in the top 10, while each of the top three signed to become Huskers.

Ally Batenhorst, the No. 3 overall prospect and No. 2 outside hitter, was the 2020-21 Gatorade National Player of the Year. She joins Gina Mancuso (2009), Mikaela Foecke (2015) and Lexi Sun (2017) as Huskers previously named Gatorade National Player of the Year. Batenhorst led Seven Lakes High School to the 2020 Texas Class 6A state title.

Rylee Gray, the No. 70 overall recruit, helped Elkhorn South High School to four state tournament appearances. A three-time all-state pick, the middle blocker helped her team to the 2020 Class A state title.

Lindsay Krause was the No. 2 overall recruit and the No. 1 outside hitter in the 2021 class. She was a member of the 2021 U.S. team at the U20 World Championships and a gold medalist with Team USA at the 2019 U18 World Championships. Krause was the 2020 Nebraska Gatorade Player of the Year, a four-time state champion and a four-time all-state pick at Skutt Catholic High School.

Whitney Lauenstein was tabbed the No. 16 recruit in the 2021 class and the No. 2 recruit in the state of Nebraska. The outside hitter helped Waverly High School to three state tournaments and was a three-time all-state honoree.

Lexi Rodriguez joined Batenhorst and Krause on the 2021 U.S. U20 World Championship Team and was named the No. 10 overall recruit and No. 1 libero/defensive specialist in the 2021 class. Rodriguez also won a gold medal with Team USA at the 2019 U18 Worlds. Averaging 7.2 digs per set at Sterling High School, she was the 2020 Illinois Gatorade Player of the Year and a two-time state champion.

Kennedi Orr, the No. 1 overall recruit in the class, was a six-year varsity player at Eagan High School in Eagan, Minn., where she won two state titles and added three runner-up finishes. She was a gold medalist with Team USA at the 2019 U18 World Championships, where she was honored as Best Setter. Orr was the 2019 Minnesota Gatorade Player of the Year.

From Husker Heroes to Gold Medal Greats

Former NU All-Americans Jordan Larson, Kelsey Robinson and Justine Wong-Orantes became Olympic gold medalists on Aug. 8 as the United States defeated Brazil 3-0 in the final match of the 2020 Tokyo Games at Ariake Arena. Larson captained Team USA to a dominant run and became the first American woman to claim gold (Tokyo 2020), silver (London 2012) and bronze (Rio 2016) medals in indoor volleyball alongside three-time Olympic teammate Foluke Akinradewo.

Following the match, Larson was named Most Valuable Player and Best Outside Hitter, and Wong-Orantes was tabbed

Best Libero. Both earned spots on the Tokyo 2020 Dream Team. Larson led Team USA with 96 points in eight matches.

Larson, who was a three-time All-American at Nebraska while lettering from 2005-08, competed in her third straight Olympics. Robinson, an All-American at NU in 2013, was also a member of the bronze-medal winning team in 2016, while two-time All-American Wong-Orantes (2013-16) made her Olympic debut in Tokyo.

Tokyo Takeover

The gold-medal trio of Jordan Larson, Kelsey Robinson and Justine Wong-Orantes was part of a group of five Huskers with ties to indoor and beach competition at the 2020 Olympic Games. Four-time All-American Sarah Pavan (2004-07) competed in her second consecutive Olympics in beach volleyball and entered the Games as the No. 1-ranked pair in the world with partner Melissa Humana-Paredes and finished fifth.

Nebraska Associate Head Coach Tyler Hildebrand served as the USA Volleyball Director of Coaching for the American beach national teams, which included gold medalists April Ross and Alix Klineman. Performance Nutrition Coordinator Nuwane Kirihennedige also supported Team USA as a sports dietitian at the Games.

Noting the National Poll

- Nebraska has been a preseason top-five pick for seven straight years.
- The Huskers have been ranked No. 1 in 100 all-time polls, the most in NCAA history.
- The Huskers have been ranked in the top 10 a total of 518 times, which is also the most in NCAA history.
- NU has appeared in all 574 AVCA Coaches Polls it has been eligible for since it was established in 1982. Nebraska is the only program to be ranked in every eligible poll all-time.
- Nebraska's 30-match regular-season schedule in 2021 features 12 matches against teams ranked in the top 25 and seven matches against top-10 opponents.

Freshman Trio Helps U.S. to Fifth-Place Finish at U20 World Championships

Three Husker freshmen -- outside hitters Ally Batenhorst and Lindsay Krause and libero Lexi Rodriguez -- helped the United States to a fifth-place finish at the 2021 FIVB U20 World Championships in July. It was the Americans' highest finish at U20 Worlds in 10 years.

AVCA Hall of Fame Head Coach John Cook in 22nd Season at Nebraska

- Nebraska head coach John Cook enters his 22nd season as the Nebraska volleyball head coach in 2021. He has led the Huskers to four national championships, nine final fours, 12 conference championships and 19 top-10 final rankings since 2000.
- Cook owns 771 career wins and is one of the all-time winningest coaches in NCAA history. Since taking over the program in 2000, Cook has led the Huskers to a nation-leading .879 win percentage in that time (610-85).
- Under Cook, the Huskers have tallied 60 AVCA All-Americans and 20 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, both among the best in the nation. He is a two-time AVCA National Coach of the Year, earning the prestigious honor in 2000 and 2005, and a seven-time conference coach of the year, including Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2016 and 2017, his first and second Big Ten honors with the Huskers in their Big Ten era (2011-present).
- Cook is one of only four active coaches - and one of six all-time - to be a two-time AVCA National Coach of the Year and was honored in 2008 by USA Volleyball, receiving its All-Time Great Coach Award.
- Cook was inducted into the AVCA Hall of Fame in 2017, joining former Husker volleyball coach Terry Pettit in the hall.
- Cook became the ninth active Division I head coach to reach 700 career wins in 2018.

The Huskers in 2020-21

- Lexi Sun led the Huskers in 2021 with 3.64 kills per set and 26 service aces. She ranked sixth in the Big Ten in kills per set and was a first-team All-Big Ten selection.
- Lauren Stivrins put up 3.18 kills per set on a team-high .468 hitting percentage, which led all Big Ten players last season and ranked third nationally. She was also named to the All-Big Ten First Team.
- Stivrins missed the Huskers' final two matches of the year against Baylor and Texas. The BU match was the first match of her Husker career that she did not play in.
- Nicklin Hames paced the Husker attack with 10.91 assists per set - the most in the Big Ten - and chipped in 2.91 digs per set with 16 service aces. Along with Sun and Stivrins, Hames was a repeat All-Big Ten First-Team selection.
- Madi Kubik was third on the team with 2.85 kills per set alongside 2.38 digs per set, which was fourth.
- Kayla Caffey's 2.04 kills per set were the fourth-most on the team. She hit .380 and added 1.09 blocks per set, with both marks the second-best among NU players.
- The Huskers limited opponents to .168 hitting to rank second in the Big Ten behind only Wisconsin.
- Nebraska's .270 team hitting percentage also ranked second in the Big Ten behind Wisconsin.

Up Next

Nebraska opens Big Ten play on Wednesday, Sept. 22, visiting Northwestern. First serve is set for 8 p.m. in Evanston, Ill. The match will be televised on BTN and streamed on the FOX Sports app, and John Baylor and Lauren Cook West will have the radio call on Huskers Radio Network.
