HUSKERS CLOSE DUAL SEASON WITH RUTGERS

Nebraska's swimming and diving team returns to the Devaney Center Natatorium this weekend to host Rutgers in its regular-season home finale.

After opening the dual on Friday evening, the Huskers (6-1, 2-1 Big Ten) will celebrate Senior Day Saturday by honoring an accomplished group of 10 student-athletes who have made a lasting impact on the Nebraska program. The 10-member class has combined for seven All-America honors and a pair of medals at the Big Ten Championships, including the Huskers' first Big Ten individual title. In the classroom, the group has combined for six CSCAA first-team Scholar All-America awards, 10 Big Ten Distinguished Scholar awards and 18 Academic All-Big Ten honors.

These outstanding student-athletes came to Nebraska from eight states across America and as far away as Great Britain to represent the Huskers at the Big Ten, National and International levels.

Nebraska and the Scarlet Knights (2-4, 0-1 Big Ten) met for the first time in 2018. The Huskers will be looking to even the series at two wins apiece. In the last meeting (January 2020), Rutgers edged the Huskers, 181-172. In 2019, Nebraska cruised to a 193-160 victory.

After a dual victory last weekend against Illinois featuring 10 event titles, the Huskers hope to continue their success and pick up their third Big Ten dual win of the season.

Fifth-year senior Autumn Haebig made history last season by becoming Nebraska's first Big Ten champion with her victory in the 200 free at the conference meet in a school-record time of 1:44.39. At the 2021 NCAA Championship, the senior from Grafton, Wis., claimed All-America honors with a ninth-place finish in the 200 free. She has continued to be a leader in and out of the pool this season, picking up eight individual victories and four runner-up finishes so far. In early December, Haebig swam to a top-10 finish at the U.S. Opens in the 200-meter freestyle.

Nebraska has had a solid group of backstroke swimmers, as they claimed the top three spots in the 100 backstroke and top four places in the 200 backstroke against Illinois. Senior captain Madesyn Ronquillio has led the charge with eight titles in backstroke events this season. Freshman Madison Lloyd and sophomores Sarah Barton and Gabby Donahue have also provided strong finishes in the backstroke.

The distance corps has been the backbone of the team, led by All-American Audrey Coffey. The senior from Naperville, Ill., is coming off a 1,650 freestyle victory in her home state, while teammate Molly Rosenthal swam to third in the event. Freshman Ilaria Murzilli has made an immediate impact with a pair of wins in both the 500 freestyle and the 1,000 freestyle this season.

Freshmen Maia Hall and JoJo Randby, along with sophomore Ella Stein have joined forces to make a mark in the breaststroke. Stein (Hudson, Wis.) and Hall (Whitby, England) each earned top-10 finishes at the U.S. Opens in the 100 and 200-meter breaststroke events. Stein owns seven titles this season, Hall has placed in the top three on eight occasions, and Randby has six top-five finishes.

Senior Shannon Stott has won 10 events this season, including six victories in the 200 butterfly. She also recorded a top-10 finish in the 200-meter fly at the U.S. Open. Fellow senior Maggie Berning has added solid swims of her own in the 200 fly, including a third-place finish at the Mizzou Invitational and at Illinois last weekend.

Sophomore Lexi Kucera and junior Emily Haimes have provided the Huskers with explosiveness in the sprints, with Kucera powering racing to nine top-three finishes, and Haimes capturing 10 top-five showings on the season.

Junior Berkeley Livingston has shown her versatility throughout the year with a team-high 17 top-five finishes. At the Mizzou Invitational, the Lincoln Southwest graduated recorded a career-best in the 400 IM (4:17.10) on her way to victory.

Senior Sara Troyer has led the Big Red on the boards this season with 11 titles. At Illinois (Jan. 22), Troyer erupted for a career-best three-meter score of 382.35. She is joined by senior Hallie Roman, who owns eight top-three finishes this year, and sophomore Reagan Hinze, who has seven top-three finishes to her credit.

Nebraska will see a pair of familiar faces this weekend in the diving well. Abi Knapton spent five seasons with the Huskers and is the most decorated diver in Nebraska history. A six-time All-American, two-time Big Ten Champion and Nebraska's Female Student-Athlete of the Year, Knapton was a first-team CoSIDA Academic All-American and an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship following a remarkable 2020-21 season for the Huskers.

Knapton is completing an additional year of eligibility at Rutgers, joining former Husker Head Diving Coach Natasha Chikina in her first season in New Jersey. Chikina spent 15 seasons leading the Husker diving program to national prominence.

Rutgers is led by juniors Sofia Chichaikina and Giulia Ghidini. Chichaikina owns two school records (100 and 200 free). She won the 100 free and 200 fly against Purdue earlier this season. Ghidini is a versatile sprinter who owns a multitude of top-three finishes this season.

Alice Scarabelli and Sofia Lobova are newcomers who have made instant impacts for the Scarlet Knights. Scarabelli notched three victories in the season-opening dual at Army, before adding two wins at Colgate. Lobova was the Big Ten Freshman of the Week on two occasions. She won individual event titles in the 50 and 100 freestyles at Princeton.

At the Big Ten Championships last season, Nebraska finished seventh with 542.5 points, while Rutgers settled for 13th with 60 points. Last season, the Huskers earned their best team finish at the NCAA Championships since 2001 after scoring 33 points to finish 26th. The Scarlet Knights did not score at nationals.

Following the dual with Rutgers, Nebraska will continue preparations for the 2022 Big Ten Championships in Madison, Wis. (Feb. 16-19).
