HUSKERS HOST SOUTHLAND CHAMP HCU FRIDAY NIGHT

- The Nebraska women's basketball team completes its two-game season-opening home stand by playing host to 2022 Southland Conference regular-season champion Houston Christian Friday night in Lincoln. Tip-off between the Huskers (1-0) and Huskies (1-0) at Pinnacle Bank Arena is set for 8 p.m.
- A live video stream of Nebraska's game with Houston Christian (formerly Houston Baptist) will be available to subscribers of B1G+. Fans can listen to the call of Matt Coatney and Jeff Griesch on the Huskers Radio Network (105.3 FM in Lincoln, and 105.9 FM in Omaha), the Huskers App and on Huskers.com.
- Tickets for the game are available through the Nebraska Athletic Ticket Office at Huskers.com or by calling 1-800-8-BIG-RED. As part of Military Appreciation Night, veterans and active-duty military may show military ID at the box office to receive one free general admission ticket.
- Nebraska women's basketball's late tip time is to accommodate NU's home volleyball match against lowa at the Devaney Center, which is set for 6 p.m. Fans holding a ticket to the volleyball match can also show their ticket at Pinnacle Bank Arena for free admission on Friday.
- Nebraska is ranked No. 22 in both the AP and USA Today/WBCA Top 25 preseason rankings.
- The Huskers opened the season with a 100-36 win over in-state rival Omaha on Monday. Nebraska's 64-point margin of victory was the largest in a season opener in school history.
- Nebraska hit 14 three-pointers against the Mavericks, with all 10 active Huskers sinking at least one three. It was the first time in NU history that every available Husker drained a three in a game.
- In addition to the 42 points from beyond the arc, the Huskers got 50 points in the paint, led by 21 points and nine rebounds from 6-2 power forward **Isabelle Bourne**.
- Naismith Trophy and Lisa Leslie Award candidate **Alexis Markowski** added 13 points and eight rebounds, while **Annika Stewart** contributed 10 points and seven boards off the bench.
- Allison Weidner led the Husker guards with 19 points and a career-high nine rebounds, while Maddie Krull added 18 points and a career-high-tying four three-pointers in her Husker debut.
- Naismith Trophy and Ann Meyers Drysdale Award candidate Jaz Shelley managed five points while distributing a game-high 10 assists and snagging a game-high four steals.
- Houston Christian comes to Lincoln after an 87-33 win over the University of the Southwest on Monday in Houston. The Huskies jumped to a 25-5 lead that included 5-of-7 three-point shooting.
- N'Denasija Collins led HCU with 21 points, while Enya Maguire added 17 points off the bench. Six different Huskies hit at least one three in the game, including Maguire (3-5) and Julija Vujakovic (3-7), as HCU knocked down 10-of-24 threes on the night. HCU also hit 23-of-28 free throws.

HUSKER NUGGETS

- Nebraska opened the 2022-23 campaign at No. 22 in the AP Preseason Top 25, its first AP Preseason ranking since 2014.
- The Huskers closed 2021-22 at No. 23 in the NET rankings. NU finished No. 10 nationally in scoring offense (77.8 ppg), No. 12 in assists per game (17.4 apg), No. 13 in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.24), No. 18 in scoring margin (+13.5 ppg), No. 20 in three-point field goal percentage (.357) and No. 21 in three-pointers made per game (8.5).
- Nebraska has hit 10 or more threes 13 times in the last 41 games, including nine times in 2021-22. NU hit a Big Ten Tournament-record 15-of-32 threes against Illinois (March 3), 14-of-28 threes against NC Central (Nov. 20), 14-of-30 at Iowa (Jan. 16), 12-of-29 vs. Drake (Dec. 19), 11-of-20 vs. Purdue (Jan. 30), 11-of-22 vs. Prairie View A&M (Nov. 11), 10-of-19 at San Diego (Nov. 27), 10-of-21 against Minnesota (Feb. 20) and 10-of-28 at Wake Forest (Dec. 1).
- The Huskers opened 2022-23 by hitting 14-of-34 threes in a win over Omaha (Nov. 7).
- Through the first 20 seasons with the three-point shot in women's basketball (1988-2007), Nebraska hit 10 threes in a game just six times (591 games).
- The Huskers have hit at least one three in 432 straight games dating back to a loss at UTEP on Dec. 20, 2008. Nebraska has hit at least two three-pointers in 311 consecutive games.
- Nebraska has scored 100 or more points four times in the last 34 games, including three times last season
- The Huskers have scored 30 or more in a quarter seven times in the last 34 games. In the previous six years combined (178 games), NU produced nine 30-point periods.

SCOUTING THE HOUSTON CHRISTIAN HUSKIES

- Donna Finnie is in her 10th season leading the Huskies. A native of Edinburgh, Scotland, Finnie was the first international coach in NCAA Division I men's or women's basketball history. She began leading the program at Houston Baptist (which changed its name officially to Houston Christian in September of 2022) in 2013-14. Finnie played collegiately at Lamar before earning her bachelor's degree from Heriot-Watt in Edinburgh in 1998.
- Finnie led the Huskies to her first winning season a year ago, guiding HCU to a 16-11 record and a 12-2 conference mark to earn the school's first Southland Conference women's basketball title. The Huskies fell to Incarnate Word in the conference tournament before ending their season with a 61-51 loss to Toledo in the WNIT.
- Houston Christian must replace leading scorer and Southland Conference Player of the Year Timia Jefferson from last year's team. Jefferson, a 5-9 guard, averaged 12.7 points per game before transferring to Texas State for the 2022-23 campaign.
- Despite the departure of Jefferson, HCU has a load of experienced players back from a year ago. Senior N'Denasija Collins, a 6-0 senior forward, averaged 9.6 points and 6.4 rebounds while hitting 85.7 percent (60-70) of her free throws and 34.8 percent (8-23) three-pointers. Collins opened 2022-23 with 21 points in a win over the University of the Southwest in Houston on Monday.
- Julija Vujakovic, a 5-11 graduate guard, added 9.1 points, 2.9 rebounds and a team-best 1.7 steals per game. One of two players from Luxembourg on HCU's roster, Vujakovic also led HCU with 50 three-pointers and was the only Husky to start all 27 games. Vujakovic opened this season with nine points in a win over Southwest on Monday.
- Senior Kennedy Wilson also returns to the starting lineup after averaging 8.2 points, 2.3 rebounds and a team-best 2.3 assists per game. The 5-6 guard hit 40.4 percent (19-47) of her threes and 86.7 percent (85-98) of her free throws.
- Abbey Sutherland returns to the post for the Huskies after making 26 starts in 2021-22. The 6-4 senior from Hamilton, Australia, averaged 4.3 points and 4.8 rebounds while leading the team with 35 blocks. Sutherland hit 12-of-37 threes (.324) but just 28.3 percent (39-138) of her shots overall.
- Marilyn Nzoiwu, a 6-3 graduate center, gives HCU more size and experience. She averaged 4.9 points and a team-best 7.3 rebounds while blocking 33 shots last season.
- Enya Maguire, a junior from Belfast, Northern Ireland, also made 14 starts a year ago, averaging 5.7 points and 2.4 rebounds. She ranked second on the team with 36 made three-pointers.
- Sophomore Amy Cotton, a 6-0 forward from North Adelaide, Australia, added five points and nine rebounds off the bench in the win over Southwest Monday. She had 23 rebounds over 12 games the entire 2021-22 season.
- Junior Quincy Erickson, a transfer from Mineral Area College, opened her Husky career with seven points off the bench in Monday's win over Southwest, while fellow newcomer Jo Oly from Luxembourg pitched in seven points and two boards.
- Overall, the 2022-23 Houston Christian roster features seven international players (Australia-3, Northern Ireland-2, Luxembourg-2), six players from the state of Texas, and Erickson, who is from Washington, Missouri.
- Last season, the Huskies averaged just 57.7 points but held opponents to 56.2 points per contest. They hit a sparkling 77.8 percent from the free throw line, but knocked down just 35 percent from the field, including 31.6 percent from three-point range. Despite their size, the Huskies were out-rebounded 39.5-35.8 on the year. Opponents hit just 23.9 percent of their threes against HCU's defense.
- Friday's game will be the first-ever meeting between Nebraska and Houston Christian (or Houston Baptist) in women's basketball.

NOTING NEBRASKA'S WIN OVER OMAHA

- Nebraska's 64-point margin of victory (100-36) over Omaha was the largest in a season opener and the fifth-largest in any game in school history.
- The Huskers reached the century mark for the 30th time in school history and the fourth time in the last 34 games. Last season, Nebraska opened with 108 points against Maine, before scoring 102 in Game 2 vs. Prairie View A&M. NU added a season-high 113 points in a win over North Carolina Central in Game 5 in 2021-22.
- Nebraska's 36 points allowed to Omaha were the second-fewest in a season opener in history, trailing only the 33 points scored by Alabama A&M on Nov. 14, 2019.
- NU's 33 points in the third quarter tied for the most in a third quarter in school history. It was the sixth 30-point third quarter in Nebraska's last 34 games.
- Nebraska's 14 made threes tied for the fourth-most in school history and were the second most in an opener, trailing only the overall school record of 17 made threes against Vermont at the Devaney Center on Nov. 13, 2010. NU's 34 attempts tied for the second most in Husker history.
- All 10 active Huskers hit at least one three-pointer in the game the first time in school history that every Nebraska player available hit a three.
- Nebraska scored 100 points despite going without a free throw attempt in the game. It was the first time in Husker women's basketball history that NU did not attempt a free throw in a game (1,462 games).
- It marked just the third time in school history the Huskers went without a made free throw, joining an 86-58 win over Georgia State in Lincoln on Dec. 7, 1989 (0-3 FT) and a 68-58 loss at lowa on Dec. 11, 1987 (0-2 FT).
- The only time Nebraska has been held to a single free throw attempt in a game came at Maryland on Feb. 8, 2015, when the Huskers made their only attempt in a 59-47 loss to the Terrapins.

OPENER WITH OMAHA FEATURED LIFE SKILLS PEP RALLY

- Nebraska's regular-season opener with Omaha (Nov. 7, noon) included the annual Life Skills Sportsmanship Pep Rally.
- The 2022 Nebraska Life Skills Sportsmanship Pep Rally, which was cosponsored by the Nebraska High School Hall of Fame, featured messages from Husker student-athletes and coaches. This year, the Huskers had over 2,200 students and more than 200 accompanying staff members from 42 schools across the state of Nebraska.
- The 2022 opener marked the fourth time (2013, 2019, 2021) Pinnacle Bank Arena and Nebraska women's basketball have teamed with the Nebraska High School Hall of Fame to host the Pep Rally for 6th through 8th grade students. The students and accompanying staff were provided complimentary water from Pepsi and pizza from Nebraska Athletics.
- The Sportsmanship Pep Rally began at 9:30 a.m. on the main court at Pinnacle Bank Arena and featured messages from Nebraska Head Coach Amy Williams and Husker women's basketball players Jaz Shelley and Maddie Krull, along with appearances by Huskers Travis Vokolek (Football), Passmore Mudundulu and Mikey Hoffer (Track & Field), Ally Batenhorst and Lexi Rodriguez (Volleyball), Ava Bredwell and Mckinley Malecha (Softball) and special performances by Champions Forever/Spintacular. The Sportsmanship Pep Rally concluded at 10:45 a.m.
- Valentine Middle School students made the longest journey to Lincoln, nearly five hours and just over 300 miles, while Chambers students traveled nearly 190 miles to the Star City for the Sportsmanship Pep Rally. A strong representation of Northeast, Southeast and Central Nebraska community schools were also on hand.

SHELLEY, MARKOWSKI NAMED TO NAISMITH WATCH LIST

- Nebraska's Alexis Markowski and Jaz Shelley were among the 50 women's college basketball players named to the Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy Watch List, announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club on Nov. 4.
- Markowski, a 6-3 center out of Lincoln Pius X High School, was the 2022 Big Ten Freshman of the Year and was recently named to the 20-player watch list for the Lisa Leslie Award presented by the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame and the Women's Basketball Coaches Association of America (WBCA).
- A 2022-23 preseason first-team All-Big Ten selection by the conference coaches and media, Markowski averaged 12.8 points and a team-leading 8.0 rebounds per game. She was even better during Big Ten play when she averaged team bests of 15.6 points and 8.6 rebounds while shooting 54 percent from the field, including 53.6 percent from three-point range.
- Shelley, a 5-9 guard from Moe, Australia, was one of the nation's most impactful transfers in 2021-22. The Australian National Team member led Nebraska in scoring (13.1 ppg), assists (5.0 apg), steals (1.8 spg) and blocks (0.9 bpg) while ranking second on the team in rebounding (6.3 rpg) from her point guard position. The Oregon transfer was the only Big Ten player to rank among the top 20 in the conference in all five major statistical categories.
- Shelley, who was named one of 20 candidates for the Ann Meyers Drysdale Award in October of 2022, hit 82-of-202 three-point attempts (.406) last season, and her 82 makes tied for the fourth-best season total in school history.
- Over the final six games, Shelley averaged 19.5 points and 4.0 made threes per game, including a school-record 9-for-13 effort from three-point range in a Big Ten Tournament win over Illinois (March 3). Shelley's nine threes set the Nebraska game record while matching the Big Ten Tournament single-

game mark. She finished with a career-high 32 points to go along with five rebounds, seven assists and two steals against the Illini.

- Shelley, who finished with 21 double-digit scoring efforts, notched five 20-point games, including two 30-point performances. She also had six double-doubles, including just the fourth triple-double in Nebraska women's basketball history with 14 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists in a win over North Carolina Central (Nov. 20).
- The midseason 30 team will be announced in early January, and then the competition will be narrowed down to 10 national semifinalists in early March. Following those results, four finalists will be named on March 21, 2023, and the winner of the 2023 Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy for Women's Player of the Year will be announced on March 29, 2023.
- The Big Ten Conference placed the most athletes on the watch list with 10. The ACC, Pac-12 and SEC are close behind with nine candidates apiece. South Carolina, the 2022 NCAA Women's Basketball National Champions, has three players on the list, which ties them with Tennessee for most candidates from a single school.

MARKOWSKI NAMED TO LISA LESLIE AWARD WATCH LIST

- Nebraska center Alexis Markowski was honored as one of 20 candidates nationally on the 2023 Lisa Leslie Award Watch List, announced Oct. 21. Markowski is the only sophomore on the 20-player preseason list.
- The Lisa Leslie Award, presented by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA, honors the nation's top center in NCAA Division I women's basketball. It is named after three-time All-American and 1994 National Player of the Year Lisa Leslie, who was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2015.
- Markowski made an instant impact in her first season at Nebraska in 2021-22. The 6-2 center out of Lincoln Pius X High School was the Big Ten Freshman of the Year and earned secondteam All-Big Ten honors after averaging 12.8 points and a teambest 8.0 rebounds. Markowski, who came off the bench early in the season before taking over a starting role, was an eight-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week and the USBWA National Freshman of the Week (Jan. 11, 2022).
- Nebraska's Offensive MVP last season, Markowski was a Preseason First-Team All-Big Ten selection prior to the start of the 2022-23 campaign. She helped the Huskers to a 24-9 overall record and a trip to the Big Ten Tournament semifinals a year ago, after

averaging team bests of 15.6 points and 8.6 rebounds in Big Ten Conference play. She also hit 54 percent of her shots from the field, including 53.6 percent of her three-point attempts, during league action in 2021-22

- The Lisa Leslie Award Watch List features several Big Ten posts, including Iowa's Monika Czinano and Indiana's Mackenzie Holmes. Markowski is also scheduled to go head-to-head against Leslie Award Watch List members Jessika Carter from Mississippi State and Elizabeth Kitley from Virginia Tech during the 2022-23 regular season.
- A national committee of top college basketball personnel determined the watch list of 20 candidates for the Lisa Leslie Award. In late January, the watch list of 20 players for the 2023 Lisa Leslie Award will be narrowed to 10, and in late February a final list of five candidates will be selected. In March, the five finalists will be presented to Leslie and the Hall of Fame selection committee with a winner being selected.

SHELLEY NAMED TO MEYERS DRYSDALE WATCH LIST

- Nebraska guard Jaz Shelley was honored as one of 20 candidates nationally on the 2023 Ann Meyers Drysdale Award Watch List, announced Oct. 18.
- The Ann Meyers Drysdale Award, presented by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA, honors the nation's top shooting guard in NCAA Division I women's basketball. It is named after the first player, male or female, selected to an All-America team in four straight college seasons (UCLA, 1975-78).
- In her first season at Nebraska in 2021-22, Shelley made one of the greatest impacts of any Big Ten newcomer, earning second-team All-Big Ten honors and a spot on the Big Ten All-Defensive Team. One of the nation's top long-range shooters, Shelley set the Husker record and tied the Big Ten Tournament record with nine three-pointers in NU's second-round tournament win over Illinois in Indianapolis on March 3, 2022. She finished with a career-high 32 points against the Fighting Illini.
 - Over the final six games of 2021-22, Shelley averaged 19.5 points and 4.0 made threes per game.
- For the season, Shelley hit 40.6 percent (82-202) of her three-pointers on her way to averaging a team-best 13.1 points per game. She also led the Big Red in assists (5.0 apg), steals (1.8 spg) and blocked shots (0.9 bpg), while adding 6.3 rebounds per game. Shelley helped the Huskers to a 24-9 overall record that included a trip to the 2022 NCAA Tournament after advancing to the Big Ten Tournament semifinals.
- Along the way, the 5-9 guard from Moe, Australia notched six double-doubles, including just the fourth triple-double in Nebraska history with 14 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists in a win over North Carolina Central on Nov. 21, 2021.

NEBRASKA'S 2022 ALL-BIG TEN HONORS

- Alexis Markowski (Lincoln, Neb.) captured Big Ten Freshman-of-the-Year honors from both the conference coaches and media. Markowski was also the only unanimous choice on the coaches' five-player Big Ten All-Freshman Team, while claiming second-team All-Big Ten honors from both the coaches and media. An eight-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week, Markowski averaged a double-double each of the final five weeks of the regular season.
- Jaz Shelley (Moe, Australia) joined Markowski on the All-Big Ten Second Team by both the coaches and media. The 5-9 guard was the only player in the Big Ten to rank among the top 20 in the league in all five major statistical categories scoring (16th), rebounding (15th), assists (5th), steals (T5th) and blocks (13th). Shelley was one of five players on the media's Big Ten All-Defensive Team.
- Isabelle Bourne (Canberra, Australia) joined Sam Haiby on the coaches' honorable-mention All-Big Ten team. The 6-2 forward was also an honorable-mention choice in 2020-21. Bourne surged down the stretch in 2021-22, averaging 13.2 points and 4.6 rebounds over the the final 13 games.
- Sam Haiby (Moorhead, Minn.) claimed All-Big Ten accolades for the second time by earning honorable-mention recognition from the coaches and media. A second-team All-Big Ten choice in 2020-21, Haiby continued to prove herself as one of the most versatile guards in the league, averaging 11.0 points, 4.5 rebounds and 3.9 assists in her fourth season. She is the first Husker in history to achieve the combined career milestones of 1,000 points (1,381), 500 rebounds (532) and 400 assists (414).

2021-22 BIG RED DOMINANT AT PINNACLE BANK ARENA

- Nebraska tied a school record by winning 16 home games at Pinnacle Bank Arena in 2021-22. The Huskers finished 16-1, matching the 1997-98 (16-0), 2009-10 (16-0) and 2013-14 (16-2) teams for most home wins. Coach **Amy Williams** was a senior guard on Nebraska's 1997-98 team coached by 2022 Women's Basketball Hall of Fame inductee Paul Sanderford.
- Nebraska's 16 home wins matched UNLV for the most regular-season home wins in NCAA Division I women's basketball in 2021-22.
- The Huskers didn't just win at home, they won big, posting the largest home combined cumulative margin of victory in school history despite losing a game to Big Ten co-champion Iowa (Jan. 9). The 2021-22 Huskers produced a total victory margin of 429 points (25.2 ppg). The 2009-10 Huskers that earned a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament and finished No. 3 in the AP final regular-season poll won their 16 games by a total of 388 points (24.3 ppg).
- Nebraska delivered double-digit margins in 15 of 16 home wins, including wins over top-10 Michigan (79-58) and Indiana (72-57) teams, with only Creighton falling by single digits (67-62).
- The Huskers also ranked No. 14 nationally in total attendance (76,317) and 18th in average home attendance (4,489).

NEBRASKA BY THE NUMBERS

- Nebraska's **three wins over top-10 opponents in 2021-22** marked just the second time in school history the Huskers posted multiple wins over top-10 teams in the same season, joining the 2009-10 campaign when NU also recorded three top-10 victories.
- The Huskers ranked among the **top 25 teams nationally** in 10 statistical categories, including scoring offense (10th, 77.8), assists per game (12th, 17.4 apg), assists (13th, 574), assist-to-turnover ratio (13th, 1.24), three-point field goals made (15th, 279), scoring margin (18th, +13.5 ppg), three-point field goal percentage (20th, .357), three-point field goals made per game (21st, 8.5 pg), total rebounds (24th, 1,380) and rebounds per game (24th, 41.8 rpg). The Big Red also ranked 26th in three-point field goal attempts (781), 27th in field goal percentage (.445), 28th in defensive rebounds per game (28.7 rpg) and 35th in rebound margin (+6.3 rpg).

- **Nebraska led the Big Ten** in field goal percentage defense (.385), three-point field goals made per game (8.5) and team rebounding average (41.8 rpg), while ranking second in the Big Ten in scoring margin (+13.5 ppg), three-point field goal percentage defense (.278), offensive rebounds (13.1 rpg), defensive rebounds (28.7 rpg), assists (17.4 apg) and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.24).
- Nebraska's 2,568 points in 2021-22 marked the No. 3 total in school history trailing only 2,801 (1979-80, 40 games) and 2,632 (2009-10). NU's 77.8 points per game marked its highest scoring average since 1987-88 (82.4 ppg).
- Nebraska's minus-21 foul disparity (28-7) at Iowa (Jan. 16, 2022) marked the largest foul differential in program history (by NU or opponent) in 1,461 games over 48 seasons. It marked the first time in history that a Husker team held a negative foul differential of greater than 17. In NU's other 32 games in 2021-22, the Huskers posted a positive foul differential of +1.5 per game.
 - NU hit a school-record 279 threes in 2021-22, surpassing the previous mark of 250 (2017-18).

MARKOWSKI 2022 BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

- Alexis Markowski made her mark in her first season with her hometown Huskers, capturing the 2022 Big Ten Freshman-of-the-Year award. Markowski led Nebraska in rebounding (8.0 rpg) while ranking second on the team in scoring (12.8 ppg).
- An eight-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week, Markowski increased her production to 15.4 points, 9.1 rebounds and 1.2 steals over the final 20 games of 2021-22 as a starter. The 6-2 forward/center hit 50.9 percent (110-216) from the field and 50 percent (19-38) from three-point range as a starter.
- Markowski captured six of the final eight Big Ten Freshman-of-the-Week awards and was named the USBWA Tamika Catchings National Freshman of the Week (Jan. 11).
- Markowski was the only freshman from a Power Five conference to average 12.0 points and 6.0 rebounds per game in 2021-22. Her 265 rebounds led all Power Five freshmen, while her 421 points ranked No. 3 among Power Five freshmen.
- Markowski's numbers compared favorably to the freshman campaigns of the three best forwards in Husker history, including 1993 Wade Trophy winner and first-team All-American Karen Jennings (13.4 ppg, 6.6 rpg, 1989-90); 2010 first-team All-American Kelsey Griffin (13.3 ppg, 6.0 rpg, 2005-06) and 2014 first-team All-American Jordan Hooper (14.6 ppg, 6.6 rpg, 2010-11).

SHELLEY SHINES AT NBA SUMMIT

- Jaz Shelley was one of just 15 student-athletes from around the nation invited to attend the inaugural NBA Student-Athlete Summit during Summer League action in Las Vegas (July 12-15, 2022).
- Shelley spent the week participating in panel discussions, networking sessions and behind-thescenes tours of the NBA Summer League. Shelley, a 22-year-old sports media and communication major at Nebraska, was the only active student-athlete from the Big Ten Conference to attend the event, which is a branch of the NBA's SALA platform - an events and media company that brings together a diverse group of accomplished leaders from across a wide variety of industries.
- "It was an incredible experience. I was fortunate to hear from and communicate with some very highly decorated professionals affiliated with the NBA. It was an intense two days with speaking events, networking conventions and watching NBA games, but it was so much fun. It really opened my eyes to a whole new world of sport," Shelley said. "The summit helped me narrow down my options for a career outside of basketball. I was able to pick the brains of the people working in my dream jobs, which helped me soak up so much more knowledge and insight. I hope to build on those connections I made in Las Vegas and continue to make steps in the direction of my career after basketball."
- The focus of the NBA Student-Athlete Summit is to bring the best and brightest college women's basketball players who aspire to work in sports together in order to connect with NBA team and league executives along with broadcast partners who are interested in filling future roles.

HUSKERS SIGN TWO STATE PLAYERS OF THE YEAR

- The Nebraska women's basketball program signed a pair of state players of the year, as two-time North Dakota Gatorade of the Year **Logan Nissley** and 2021 Missouri Gatorade Player of the Year **Natalie Potts** signed their National Letters of Intent to join the Huskers, Head Coach Amy Williams announced on Wednesday, Nov. 7.
- Nissley, a 5-10 guard from Bismarck, N.D. has been ranked as the No. 91 player in the Class of 2023 by ESPN after averaging more than 21 points and three steals while hitting 47 percent of her three-pointers as a junior. She led Bismarck Century to a 50-game winning streak over two seasons before claiming a state runner-up finish in 2021-22. In the 2022 state championship game, Nissley put up 32 points, 11 rebounds and four assists. As a junior in 2020-21, Nissley powered Bismarck Century to a state title to win Gatorade and MaxPreps North Dakota Player of the Year honors after producing school records with 556 points (21.4 ppg), 100 assists and 93 steals while hitting 46.4 percent of her three-point attempts. A four-time volleyball letterwinner, she added a 2021-22 North Dakota Volleyball Player of the Year award with 361 digs, 357 kills, 34 blocks and 19 service aces while leading the Patriots to their second straight volleyball state championship.

- Nissley played her club basketball for North Tartan the same program as current Husker guard Sam Haiby.
- "We are thrilled that we can finally make Logan's commitment to our program official," Williams said. "She is a prolific shooter and has an incredible feel for the game. Her skill-set translates perfectly to our team and system, and she is a great match for our team's culture. Her experience in winning multiple state championships will add to our winning culture. We are definitely excited to get her in a Husker uniform."
- The daughter of Brad and Ashley Nissley, Logan was born Oct. 3, 2004 in Bismarck, N.D. She has a younger brother, Garrett. Logan plans to double major in marketing and management in the College of Business at Nebraska. She selected Nebraska over Gonzaga, Minnesota, Utah and Iowa.
- "I chose Nebraska because of the family culture the girls brought to me when I visited," Nissley said. "The program itself and the facilities are amazing, but it felt like my second home and I knew it was meant for me. The coaches were unmatched and were by far my favorite because they cared about me as a person not just an athlete."
- Potts, a 6-2 power forward averaged 20.7 points and 9.3 as a sophomore to earn Gatorade and MaxPreps Missouri Player-of-the-Year honors after leading Incarnate Word Academy to a Class 6A state championship in 2021. She was also the St. Louis Metro Area Player of the Year. Incarnate Word finished No. 20 in the final espnW national rankings with a perfect 29-0 record. She also broke the Incarnate Word Academy single-game scoring record with 40 points on 19-of-21 shooting in a win over Ladue on Feb. 3, 2021. The previous record was held by two-time UConn first-team All-American Napheesa Collier.
- Potts followed her sophomore season with another impressive year, averaging 19.3 points, 8.6 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 1.5 blocks to lead the Red Knights to a second straight state title. Potts hit 61.9 percent of her shots from the field as a junior. Potts opened her high school career with averages of 10.1 points and 8.3 rebounds as a freshman.
- Potts, who played AAU basketball for Phee Elite, heads into her senior season ranked as the No. 1 recruit in the state of Missouri by Prep Girls Hoops.
- "We are so excited to add Natalie to our Husker women's basketball family," Williams said. "She is a great fit for us both on and off the basketball court. She has an incredible motor, and her competitive spirit matches the values we have for our team. She is versatile and a proven winner from one of the most successful high school programs in the country. We can't wait to see her thrive in a Husker uniform."
- The daughter of Eric and Sharon Potts, Natalie was born Nov. 7, 2004, in St. Louis, Mo. She has an older brother, Kyle, and a sister, Sarah. Natalie plans to major in sports management at Nebraska. She selected Nebraska over Gonzaga.
- "I chose Nebraska because I loved the community and the family feel. Everything about the campus and the town was what I wanted," Potts said. "The coaching staff and the team are just super sweet and welcoming and just a good group of people to be around."

NEBRASKA'S HISTORY OF HOME SUCCESS

- The Huskers are 495-168 (.747) all-time at home.
- Nebraska tied the school record for home victories by going 16-1 at Pinnacle Bank Arena in 2021-22, the 16th time the Huskers have posted double-figure home victory totals in the last 19 seasons.
- The Huskers were 15-4 at Pinnacle Bank Arena in 2015-16 after going 12-3 (13-3 at home) in 2014-15. The Huskers are 106-38 (.736) all-time at PBA since the building opened in 2013-14. The Big Red went 16-2 at home in 2013-14, suffering their only Big Ten loss to Purdue, 77-75, on Jan. 19, 2014. NU's 16 home wins in 2013-14 tied the school record for single-season home victories.
- The Huskers played the first regular-season game in arena history against USA Today No. 25 UCLA (Nov. 8, 2013) and rolled to a 77-49 win over the Bruins. NU's first win over an AP Top 25 team came with a 76-56 win over No. 24 Michigan State on Feb. 8, 2014. The Huskers added their first-ever win over an AP Top 10 team at the arena with a 94-74 victory over No. 8 Penn State on Feb. 24, 2014.
- NU won its first Big Ten home game at Pinnacle Bank Arena with a 66-65 thriller over Northwestern Jan. 2, 2014, before an 88-85 win over Minnesota on Jan. 16, 2014, marked the first overtime game.
 - NU suffered its first loss at the arena to Washington State (76-72) on Nov. 30, 2013.
- The Huskers are 46-3 all-time in home season openers, following a 100-36 win over Maine on Nov. 7, 2022. Nebraska has won 16 of its last 17 season openers.
- Nebraska played in the Devaney Center from 1976-77 through 2012-13, and added one appearance at Devaney against Utah on Nov. 23, 2014. The Huskers own a 389-130 record at the Devaney Center, including 146-88 (.624) mark in conference play.

HUSKERS RADIO NETWORK COVERS WORLD

- The Huskers Radio Network is in its second season of producing and marketing the live broadcasts of Nebraska women's basketball in 2022-23, but play-by-play announcer Matt Coatney and color commentator Jeff Griesch team up for their 22nd season as the Husker broadcast team.
- The Huskers Radio Network will carry every game, home and away, around the world for free on Huskers.com, marking the 22nd year that all of Nebraska's women's basketball games have been free and available to fans. In addition to carrying every women's basketball game free on Huskers.com, the Huskers Radio Network flagship stations B107.3 FM-KBBK (Lincoln) and ESPN 590 AM-KXSP (Omaha) provide strong signals for Husker women's basketball. When a network conflict occurs in Omaha, the Huskers also can be heard on CD105.9 FM-KKCD. 880-AM-KRVN (Lexington) also provides a huge AM signal statewide in central Nebraska, while more than 20 stations carry the Huskers Radio Network's women's basketball coverage across the state and the Midwest.
 - Inside Pinnacle Bank Arena, fans can access the direct radio call of the game at 87.7 FM.

- Nebraska's regular-season opener with Omaha marked Coatney and Griesch's 700th women's basketball broadcast together.
- Griesch also has an active streak of 659 consecutive Husker games called dating back to Jan. 5, 2003. The last game he missed came against Penn State on Dec. 30, 2002 at the Surf & Slam in San Diego, following the birth of he and his wife Emily's first child, Hollan. She is now a sophomore at the University of Nebraska and has three younger brothers, Jackson (18), Brennan (14) and Isaac (9).
- Griesch continued his streak this season despite undergoing open heart surgery on Sept. 28 to replace his aortic valve. Less than five weeks later, he was on air with Coatney for Nebraska's exhibition game with Washburn. Griesch also had open heart surgery as a junior in high school on May 1, 1990.

NEBRASKA POSTS 17TH STRAIGHT PERFECT GSR

- In the eyes of the NCAA's Division I Graduation Success Rate (GSR), the Husker women's basketball program has been perfect for 17 consecutive years. Nebraska is the only program among the 14 Big Ten Conference schools to accomplish the perfect score for 17 straight seasons.
- The NCAA announced the release of its annual Graduation Success Rate report Dec. 2, 2021, and Nebraska was a national leader in women's basketball for the 17th straight season, dating back to the initial public tracking of the GSR since 2004-05.
- The Nebraska women's basketball program joins the Husker women's tennis and volleyball programs as Husker teams that have produced perfect 100 percent rates each of the last 17 years.
- Overall, the Nebraska Athletic Department produced a record-high GSR for the 11th consecutive year, reaching 95 percent.
- Nebraska continues to lead NCAA Division I in Academic All-Americans across all sports (348) and NCAA Today Top Ten Award winners (18). More than 100 Huskers have also earned NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships in history.

NEBRASKA OVERTIME FACTS

- Nebraska is 23-25 all-time in overtime games, including 12-12 at home, 8-10 in true road games and 3-3 on neutral courts in overtime.
- The Huskers, who did not play an overtime game in 2020-21, were 1-2 in overtime games in 2019-20 following an 80-74 OT loss to Ohio State (Feb. 2). It was Nebraska's second overtime loss in Big Ten play, joining a 78-70 OT loss at Michigan State (Dec. 31, 2019). The Huskers opened road action with a 90-85 OT win at Missouri (Nov. 10, 2019).
- The 2019-20 season marked the first time that Nebraska played three overtime games in the same season since 2011-12 NU's first season in the Big Ten. In 2011-12, the Huskers played a total of seven OT periods in those three games.
 - Nebraska has never played four overtime games in the same season.
- Nebraska's lone overtime game of 2018-19 also came in the Huskers' first road game of the season, but NU suffered an 87-84 double-overtime loss at Washington State (Nov. 16, 2019). It marked the second straight season that Nebraska played a multi-overtime game (also at Drake, Dec. 9, 2017).
- The Huskers went 1-1 in overtime in 2017-18, including a 69-64 overtime loss to No. 23 Michigan at Pinnacle Bank Arena (Jan. 13). The Huskers won their first overtime game of 2017-18 with an 89-85 double-overtime win at Drake (Dec. 9).
- Nebraska was 1-1 in overtime in 2016-17, including a 76-74 win over Michigan State at Pinnacle Bank Arena to close the regular season (Feb. 26, 2017). The Huskers lost 79-69 in OT to Minnesota at the arena (Feb. 4, 2017).
 - The Huskers are 3-5 in overtime games under Coach Amy Williams.
 - Nebraska is 2-3 in overtime games at Pinnacle Bank Arena.
- Nebraska is 5-2 in multi-overtime games with its most recent loss coming in the 87-84 2OT setback at Washington State (Nov. 16, 2018) in Pullman. NU's only other loss in a multi-overtime game came to Purdue in the 2012 Big Ten Championship Game, 74-70 in double-overtime.
- The Huskers defeated Minnesota 88-85 in overtime on Jan. 16, 2014. It marked the first overtime game in the history of Pinnacle Bank Arena. Nebraska's first overtime game in the history of the Bob Devaney Sports Center also came against Minnesota a 68-67 win for the Huskers on Dec. 30, 1977.
- The Huskers have played 15 all-time overtime games against Big Ten opponents and own a 5-10 record. NU is 4-7 against Big Ten opponents in OT since joining the conference in 2011-12.
- Nebraska played its fourth OT game in 73 meetings with Missouri in a 90-85 OT win at Mizzou Arena (Nov. 10, 2019). All four OT games against the Tigers were settled in a single overtime period.
- Nebraska's next most frequent overtime opponents are Big Ten foes Purdue, Minnesota and Wisconsin. The Huskers and Purdue have played three overtime games in 14 all-time meetings. NU's six total overtimes against Purdue are the most against any team in school history.
- The Huskers also have played three overtime games against Minnesota (24 games), including two of the five overtime games in Pinnacle Bank Arena history.
 - In 18 all-time games with Wisconsin the Huskers have played three overtime contests.
- Nebraska has never played back-to-back overtime games at home. The Huskers have played back-to-back overtime games only once in school history, an 83-81 loss to Texas A&M in College Station on Dec. 30, 1985, before returning to Lincoln for an 80-75 win over Eastern Kentucky at the Devaney Center on Jan. 2, 1986.

NEBRASKA ATTENDANCE FIGURES

- Nebraska finished No. 14 nationally in total home attendance (76,317) while ranking 18th in NCAA Division I women's basketball in average home attendance (4,489). Nebraska's 16 home regular-season wins (16-1) at Pinnacle Bank Arena also led the nation in 2021-22.
- Nebraska ranked No. 20 nationally in average home attendance (4,397 fans per game) over 17 regular-season games at Pinnacle Bank Arena in 2019-20. It marked an increase of 296 fans per game compared to the 2018-19 season, when the Huskers ranked No. 22 nationally (4,101).
- The Huskers have ranked among the top 25 nationally in attendance for 12 consecutive seasons (not including 2020-21 when no fans were allowed at Pinnacle Bank Arena).
- In 144 all-time home games at Pinnacle Bank Arena, the Huskers own a 106-38 record (.736 winning percentage).
- In 133 games with attendance allowed (excludes games during COVID pandemic in 2020-21), the Huskers have averaged 4,994 fans per game (664,162 total fans/133 games).
- Nebraska attracted a Pinnacle Bank Arena non-conference record crowd of 9,750 to open its stay in the arena with a win over UCLA on Nov. 8, 2013.
- Nebraska set its all-time single-game record with a sellout crowd of 13,595 fans against Missouri at the Devaney Center on Feb. 27, 2010. NU drew 10 straight crowds of more than 10,000 fans at the Devaney Center in 2009-10.
- Nebraska produced its top attendance season in school history by ranking No. 7 nationally with a record 7,390 fans per game at the Bob Devaney Sports Center in 2009-10. The Huskers went 16-0 at the Devaney Center on their way to a perfect 29-0 record, a Big 12 title and a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament.

A second-team All-Big Ten selection and a member of the media's Big Ten All-Defensive Team, Jaz Shelley was the only player in the Big Ten to rank among the top 20 in the conference in scoring, rebounding, assists, steals and blocked shots in 2021-22. The 5-9 point guard from Moe, Australia led Nebraska in scoring (13.1 ppg), assists (5.0 apg), steals (1.8 spg) and blocks (0.9 bpg), while ranking second on the squad in rebounding (6.3 rpg). She notched a triple-double with 14 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists in just 20 minutes in a win over North Carolina Central (Nov. 20). She set the Nebraska school record and tied the Big Ten Tournament record by draining nine three-pointers in a win over Illinois (March 3) when she erupted for a career-high 32 points. She also struck for 30 points on 6-of-7 three-point shooting while adding seven rebounds and a career-high four blocks in a win over Drexel (Nov. 26).

Game Highlights: Isabelle Bourne led five Huskers in double figures with 21 points, as Nebraska rolled to a 100-36 win over Omaha. Nebraska's 64-point victory margin was its largest in an opener in school history, and it came in front of the second-largest season-opening crowd in history with 6,233 fans at Pinnacle Bank Arena. Bourne added a game-high nine rebounds, as the Huskers posted a plus-20 rebound margin. Allison Weidner led the Husker guards with 19 points and a career-high nine boards, while Maddie Krull contributed 18 points and four three-pointers. As a team, NU sank 14-of-34 threes, as all 10 active Huskers hit at least one three in a game for the first time in NU history. Alexis Markowski pitched in 13 points and eight rebounds, while Annika Stewart contributed 10 points and seven boards and 2-of-3 threes. NU dished out 26 assists, led by 10 from Jaz Shelley, against just seven team turnovers. NU reached 100 points without attempting a free throw - the first time in program history without an attempt at the line.

Australian National Team member Jaz Shelley returns for her second season as a Husker. The 5-9 guard from Moe, Australia (pronounced MO-ee) will hunt for All-Big Ten honors while helping the Huskers pursure a second straight NCAA Tournament bid.

A second-team All-Big Ten selection in 2021-22, Shelley was honored as one of 20 shooting guards nationally on the Ann Meyers Drysdale Award Watch List. She opened the season with 10 assists in a win over Omaha (Nov. 7).

SOPHOMORE (2021-22)

Shelley led Nebraska in scoring (13.1 ppg), assists (5.0 apg), steals (1.8 spg) and blocks (0.9 bpg) while ranking second in rebounding (6.3 rpg). She was the only Big Ten player to rank among the top 20 in all five statistical categories in 2021-22.

She erupted for a career-high 32 points (11-16 FG) with a Nebraska and Big Ten Tournament recordtying nine threes in a win over Illinois (March 3). She added seven assists. It was her second 30-point and fifth 20-point performance of the season.

Shelley poured in 30 points in a 65-53 win over Drexel (Nov. 26). She added seven boards and a

career-high four blocks. She added 16 points and a career-high four steals in a win at San Diego (Nov. 27).

Shelley had 21 points and five threes at Illinois (Feb. 12). She scored 20 in a road win at Wisconsin (Feb. 23) and led NU with 18 points, six rebounds and six assists in a win at Wake Forest (Dec. 1). She closed Big Ten play with 17 points in a win over Northwestern (Feb. 27). She added 15 points, five assists, four rebounds, three blocks and three steals in a win at Minnesota (Dec. 6) and 17 points in a win over Indiana State (Dec. 11).

Shelley produced her first triple-double with 14 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists in just 20 minutes in a win over NC Central (Nov. 20). She had her first career double-double with 22 points and 11 boards against Prairie View A&M (Nov. 11), when she connected on 6-of-9 threes. Shelley added pointsrebounds double-doubles vs. Wyoming (12-11), No. 8 Michigan (12-12) and No. 22 Iowa (14-11).

Shelley had a double-double with 12 points and a career-high-tying 12 boards in a 79-58 win over No. 8 Michigan (Jan. 4), before getting a doubledouble with 12 rebounds and 11 assists in a win over Penn State (Feb. 3). She also had 15 points and nine rebounds at No. 6 Indiana (Jan. 13).

The 5-9 guard from Moe (pronounced MO-ee), Australia, spent two seasons at Oregon. Shelley and Husker teammate Isabelle Bourne were teammates for the silver-medal winning Gems at the 2019 FIBA U19 World Championships.

SOPHOMORE (OREGON, 2020-21)

Shelley played 22 games with 11 starts. She missed Oregon's first two NCAA Tourney games with injury before facing No. 8 Louisville. She had an assist and a steal in five minutes.

Shelley averaged 4.0 points, 1.7 rebounds and 1.9 assists. She had a season-high 13 points in a win over USC (Jan. 1) when she tied a then-career high with five assists. She added 11 points vs. Utah (Dec. 6) and Washington State (Dec. 21).

FRESHMAN (OREGON, 2019-20)

Shelley averaged 6.3 points, 1.5 assists and 1.0 rebound over 33 games to help Oregon to a pair of Pac-12 titles. In her only start, Shelley had 32 points and set the Oregon record by going 10-for-14 from three-point range in a win over UC Riverside (Dec. 16, 2019). She was the Pac-12 Freshman of the Week. She scored double figures six times, including 17 points (5-8 3FG) at Long Beach State. She added 14 points (4-4 3FG) in a win over Arizona State (Feb. 9), and had 10 points in a Pac-12 Tourney win over Utah (March 6).

JUNIOR (2022-23)

Trinity Brady returned to the court to start the 2022-23 season opener for the Huskers after missing all of the 2021-22 season and all but the first two games of 2020-21 with injuries.

Brady helped the Huskers to a 64-point win over Omaha with three points, three rebounds, two assists and a career-high two blocks.

Brady enjoyed a strong summer of consistent training. She is an outstanding communicator, a consistent shooter, an efficient player and a solid rebounder.

SOPHOMORE (2021-22)

Brady redshirted in 2021-22.

SOPHOMORE (2020-21)

Brady opened her second season at Nebraska as a starter, but an ankle injury suffered in the final minute of a win over Big Sky champion Idaho State (Dec. 6) sidelined her for the rest of the season. Brady averaged 8.5 points, 5.0 rebounds and 2.0 steals in two wins as a starter, but missed the final 24 games of the year.

The 5-11 guard from Indianapolis produced the best game of her career in Nebraska's 90-61 season-opening win over Oral Roberts (Dec. 4). She erupted for a career-high 15 points while adding a career-best five rebounds in the first start of her college career. She hit 5-of-7 shots from the field and all three of her three-point attempts against the Golden Eagles.

She added five more rebounds while setting a career high with four steals against Idaho State.

TRINITY BRADY

5-11 Junior Guard Indianapolis, Indiana (Heritage Christian (Tenn.) Academy)

FRESHMAN (2019-20)

Brady brought strength and versatility to Nebraska's backcourt as a freshman. One of the top high school players in Indiana in 2017-18, Brady completed her prep career at Hamilton Heights Christian Academy in Tennessee.

She missed Nebraska's first 10 games as part of the concussion protocol, before making her regular-season debut in the win over Manhattan (Dec. 22). She played in 17 consecutive games before missing the final three games with tendonitis.

Brady played strong defense while recording two points, four rebounds, an assist and a block in 16 minutes off the bench against the Jaspers. She hit the first three-pointer of her career and added two assists and her first career steal in the win over lowa (Dec. 28). Brady's three gave Nebraska a 30-27 second-quarter lead, and the Huskers led the rest of the way.

She sparked a 10-0 first-quarter run at Michigan State with two points, two steals and two rebounds to help Nebraska lead for much of the game against the Spartans before falling in OT on New Year's Eve in East Lansing.

Brady scored a career-high seven points and knocked down a career-best two threes while adding two rebounds in nine minutes off the bench at Rutgers (Jan. 12).

She scored five points in a 10-0 secondquarter run that sparked Nebraska in a rally from a 25-point first-half deficit against No. 18 Indiana (Feb. 9). The Huskers eventually tied the game in the fourth quarter.

Brady scored eight points and had eight rebounds in an exhibition win over Rogers State (Nov. 2). An opponent fell on Brady inside the paint late in the game, contacting her head and shoulder area.

BEFORE NEBRASKA

The final piece of Nebraska's three-player recruiting class, Brady came to Nebraska after completing her senior season at Hamilton Heights Christian Academy in Chattanooga, Tenn. She was ranked as the No. 106 player overall in the 2019 class by Prospects Nation.

The Lady Hawks finished the season No. 18 in the final USA Today Super 25 rankings with a 22-3 overall record. Hamilton Heights Christian

SOPHOMORE (2022-23)

Allison Weidner (pronounced WIDE-ner) joins fellow sophomores Alexis Markowski and Maddie Krull as native Nebraskans on the Cornhusker roster in 2022-23.

Weidner opened the season with 19 points and a career-high nine rebounds in a win over Omaha (Nov. 7). She made a career-high nine field goals in just 11 attempts, including a three-pointer.

FRESHMAN (2021-22)

Weidner averaged 7.2 points, 3.7 rebounds and 2.2 assists while playing in all 33 games for the Huskers as a true freshman in 2021-22. As a starter in nine games, Weidner averaged 9.3 points, 4.4 rebounds and 3.0 assists.

She erupted for a career-high 23 points and a career-best three threes in a 93-70 win over Minnesota (Feb. 20). Weidner added a teamhigh 16 points, including two free throws with 5.5 seconds left to seal NU's 76-73 win over No. 10 Michigan (March 4). She scored 14 first-half points in a win over Purdue (Jan. 30). She matched it with 14 points in a win over Penn State (Feb. 3), including 10 in the fourth quarter to help the Huskers turn a one-point lead into a 15-point win.

She had 11 points in NU's win over No. 5 Indiana (Feb. 14). Weidner made her first career start in place of an injured Sam Haiby at Iowa (Jan. 16). Weidner finished with eight points,

three rebounds, five assists and a block. She added eight points at Maryland (Feb. 6).

Weidner had nine points in a win over Maine (Nov. 9), before adding 11 points, eight rebounds and five assists against Prairie View A&M (Nov. 11). She added eight points, eight rebounds and eight assists in a win over NC Central (Nov. 20). She had 10 points, five boards, three assists and two steals in a win over Drake (Dec. 19).

Weidner had seven points in a win over No. 8 Michigan (Jan. 4), before adding nine points against No. 22 Iowa (Jan. 9).

HIGH SCHOOL

Weidner finished her high school career with 2,282 points, 741 assists and 629 steals. Her point total ranked No. 3 in Nebraska history, while she became just the 13th player in the state to score 2,000 points. The star from Humphrey St. Francis was a four-time first-team Class D2 All-State pick for Coach Bryan Reichmuth. A first-team all-class, all-state choice by the Omaha World-Herald and the Lincoln Journal Star as a junior and senior, Weidner led the state in scoring (25.0 ppg) and assists (6.4 apg) while ranking second in steals (6.4 spg). She added 7.0 rebounds. Weidner scored 71 points over three state tournament wins to lead Humphrey St. Francis to the title.

As a junior, Weidner averaged 25.2 points, 6.1 rebounds, 6.5 assists and 7.3 steals. She led the Flyers to a state runner-up finish as a Class D2 All-Tournament team choice. She scored a state tournament-best 83 points over three games as a junior. She led St. Francis to a Class D2 state runner-up finish as a freshman and claimed her first all-tournament honor. Weidner also guided the Flyers to a state bid as a sophomore in 2019.

As a junior in 2020, Weidner nearly notched a quadruple-double with 28 points, 10 assists, 10 steals and 9 rebounds against Elkhorn Valley. She had a triple-double with 29 points, 12 rebounds and 10 steals against Fullerton. In the 2020 state tournament, she had a career-high 39 points against Mullen. She also had 38 points against Howells/Dodge She led the state in assists in 2018 and 2019, and in steals in 2019.

Weidner was also a first-team all-stater in volleyball while leading St. Francis to a state

runner-up finish as a junior in 2019. She was an honorable-mention Class D2 all-state choice and led the Flyers to a third-place finish as a sophomore in 2018. She guided Humphrey St. Francis to state in 2020.

Minnesota (2/20/22)

On the track, Weidner swept Class D2 state titles in the 400 and 800-meter runs in 2018, 2019 and 2021. She added two more state titles on the 3,200-meter relay team as a sophomore and senior. She helped the 1,600-meter relay to a state runner-up finish as a freshman. Weidner took sixth in the triple jump as a senior.

She earned 11 letters across basketball, volleyball and track at St. Francis, capturing a total of 10 individual or team state championships.

Weidner earned Academic All-State honors in basketball (winter 2021) and volleyball (fall 2019). She was a two-year National Honor Society member.

GRADUATE (2022-23)

Sam Haiby (pronounced HY-bee) suffered a knee injury on Sept. 12, which was originally thought to be season ending. However, after undergoing surgery on Oct. 27, Haiby's prognosis was upgraded significantly, and she is expected to return to the court this season. No timeline for her return has been set.

SENIOR (2021-22)

Haiby averaged 11.0 points, 4.5 rebounds, 3.9 assists and 1.4 steals in her fourth season at Nebraska. She had a season-high 20 points to go with six rebounds and three steals against Gonzaga in the NCAA Tournament (March 18). She added 19 points and a career-high six steals at Michigan State (Dec. 30) and 18 points against No. 22 Iowa (Jan. 9).

Haiby led NŪ with 16 points, including nine in the fourth period, in a win over No. 10 Michigan (March 4). She added 15 points and eight boards against No. 12 lowa (March 5). Haiby scored 10 of her 14 points in the fourth quarter to lead NU to a win over No. 5 Indiana (Feb. 14). She added 14 points, six rebounds and five assists in a win over Minnesota (Feb. 20).

She scored 13 of her 15 points after halftime to help NU to a 67-62 win over Creighton (Nov. 17). She added 15 points in a 64-56 win at San Diego (Nov. 27) and had 15 more in an 89-68 run past Drake (Dec. 19).

SAM HAIBY

5-9 Graduate Guard Moorhead, Minnesota (Moorhead)

Haiby scored 10 of her 13 points in the fourth quarter to rally NU to a 70-67 win at Minnesota (Dec. 6). She had 10 points, six rebounds, four assists and three steals in a 79-58 win over No. 8 Michigan (Jan. 4). She ranks No. 8 in assists (414) and No. 15 on NU's all-time scoring list (1,381) and is the only Husker in history to achieve the combined career milestones of 1,000 points, 500 rebounds (532) and 400 assists.

JUNIOR (2020-21)

Haiby was second-team All-Big Ten with team bests of 16.8 points, 4.4 assists and 1.2 steals while adding 6.8 rebounds. She had a career-high 33 points to go with nine boards in a win over Illinois (Dec. 10) and had 28 points against Iowa (Feb. 11). She had 27 points and nine rebounds at No. 15 Michigan (Jan. 7).

She scored in double figures 21 times, including 10 20-point games and three double-doubles. Haiby had 25 points and a career-high 12 boards against Minnesota (Jan. 19). She had 24 points, nine rebounds and six assists against No. 7 Maryland (March 11), becoming the 35th Husker to score 1,000 points.

She had 24 points against Wisconsin (Jan. 28), 22 at Illinois (Jan. 25) and Minnesota (Feb. 24), and 20 against Rutgers (Feb. 7) and Colorado (March 20). She got her first double-double with 11 points and a career-high 12 boards in a win at No. 23 Michigan State (Jan. 10). She had 11 points, a career-high 10 assists and eight boards in a win over No. 15 Ohio State (Jan. 16). She had 19 points and the gamewinner as time expired in a 65-63 win over No. 15 Northwestern (Dec. 31). Her shot was ESPN's Top Plav.

SOPHOMORE (2019-20)

Haiby was ranked second in scoring (10.0 ppg) and assists (3.3 apg) and led NU in steals (1.5 spg). She had a season-high 28 points in a 90-85 OT win at Missouri (Nov. 10). Haiby had 20 points, five rebounds

and four steals in a win over ORU (Dec. 14). She had 19 points at Michigan State (Dec. 31) and 18 in a win over Michigan (Jan. 19). She added 17 points and eight boards in a win over No. 24 Minnesota (Jan. 4). Haiby had 17 points against Creighton (Nov. 24) and 11 with seven assists in a win over Wisconsin (Jan. 9).

FRESHMAN (2018-19)

Haiby was NU's No. 2 scorer, averaging 10.0 points, 3.0 rebounds and 2.6 assists off the bench. She scored double figures 15 times, including a season-high 20 points at Washington State (Nov. 16). She had her best Big Ten effort with 17 points against Indiana (Feb. 3). She also had 17 at Creighton (Dec. 2). She was the Big Ten Freshman of the Week after averaging 15.0 points at Purdue (Jan. 31) and Indiana (Feb. 3).

BEFORE NEBRASKA

Haiby was ranked as the No. 122 player in the country by Prospects Nation and No. 125 by Blue Star.

One of the top players in talent-rich Minnesota in 2021-22, Callin Hake (pronounced CAL-in HAKE), joined the Nebraska women's basketball program for the 2022-23 season.

The 5-8 guard from Victoria, Minn., opened her Husker career with three points, three rebounds, one assist and one steal in a win over Omaha (Nov. 7).

During her high school career, Hake scored more than 2,000 points and pulled down more than 500 rebounds at Chanhassen High School.

As a senior, Hake averaged 22.2 points per game and finished her career as Chanhassen's all-time leading scorer and rebounder. Hake was ranked as the No. 7 player in Minnesota and No. 64 player in the nation by Prep Girls Hoops. She was also rated as the No. 98 player in the country by Jr. All-Star National Rankings. She was invited to the U16 Team USA tryouts in Colorado Springs.

Hake signed her National Letter of Intent to join the Huskers on the opening day of the signing period on Nov. 10, 2021. Hake originally made her commitment to join the Huskers in July of 2020.

"Callin is a versatile guard that can bring a lot of things to our team on the basketball court," Nebraska Coach Amy Williams said. "I love that she is committed to playing hard on both ends of the court. Not only is Callin the perfect fit for us on the court, but she fits our family. She is not afraid to work and understands how to be a great teammate."

A four-time first-team All-Metro West Conference selection for the Storm, Hake was also a four-time Chanhassen team most valuable player. She captured Metro West Player-of-the-Year honors as a senior in 2021-22 after averaging 22.2 points per game. She became Chanhassen's first career 2,000-point scorer after a 26-point, 12-rebound performance against Cooper on Jan. 31, 2022. That performance followed a then-career-high and Chanhassen-record 37-point effort in a win over Waconia (Jan. 30). She topped that mark with 38 points in a win over New Prague (Feb. 18).

A McDonald's All-America Midwest nominee, Hake earned honorable-mention All-Metro accolades from the Minneapolis Star-Tribune as a senior. She was also named to the Metro West Conference All-Defensive Team before capping her high school career by playing in the Minnesota Girls Basketball Coaches Association All-Star Series. She claimed the MGBCA Three-Point Championship by draining 14 three-pointers in 45 seconds.

As a junior in a COVID-shortened 2020-21 season, Hake averaged 21.5 points per game. She averaged 22.2 points per game as a sophomore and 20.4 points per contest as a freshman at Class 4A Chanhassen.

She entered her junior season with high school career totals of 1,633 points, 442 rebounds, 147 steals and 120 assists. She added 599 points as a senior to finish with 2,232 career points

Hake has spent six years competing for the UAA Minnesota Fury, helping the team to a national runner-up finish. She was a first-team Minnesota AAU all-state selection in 2021.

SOPHOMORE (2022-23)

Kendall Moriarty is working to play a greater role on the court for the Huskers after getting her first experiences in NCAA Division I basketball as a true freshman at Nebraska in 2021-22.

She opened her sophomore season with three points, two rebounds and two assists in 17 minutes in a win over Omaha (Nov. 7).

FRESHMAN (2021-22)

Moriarty saw action in 30 of NU's 33 games, averaging 1.5 points and shooting 48.8 percent (20-41) from the field as a true freshman in 2021-22. She produced back-to-back strong Big Ten efforts, including career highs of six points, two rebounds and her first career steal in a win over Wisconsin (Jan. 27).

It followed five points and a career-high four assists in a career-high 20 minutes at Iowa (Jan. 16). She had career highs with six points and two rebounds in a win over NC Central (Nov. 20).

Moriarty scored five points, including a three-pointer, while adding two assists and a steal in a win over Minnesota (Feb. 20). She also knocked down a three-pointer against Gonzaga in the NCAA Tournament (March 18).

The 6-1 guard from Wheaton, Ill., had five points and an assist in a win over Alabama A&M (Nov. 14). She hit her first career three-pointer in NU's win over Creighton (Nov. 17).

Moriarty scored four points and had an assist in a win over Prairie View A&M (Nov. 11), after opening her Husker career with two points and two rebounds in a victory over Maine (Nov. 9).

The first commit to Nebraska's top-25 recruiting class, Kendall Moriarty was ranked among the nation's top 100 players by Prospects

Nation (74), All-Star Girls Report (77) and Prep Girls Hoops (100). She was also ranked as high as the No. 12 guard prospect in the country by Prospects Nation. She hit 43.1 percent of her three-pointers

She hit 43.1 percent of her three-pointers while also leading Benet Academy in steals and deflections as a junior 2019-20. She led Benet to a No. 1 ranking in Illinois and a No. 23 team rank nationally at one point as a junior. In 2019, Moriarty was invited to the USA 16U National Team trials, advancing to the top 68.

She earned second-team Illinois Class 4A all-state honors for the second straight season in 2021, after leading Benet to a fourth consecutive ESCC league title. Moriarty was Benet's leading scorer as a senior, averaging 13 points per game. She led Benet to a final No. 2 ranking in the state of Illinois by both the Associated Press and MaxPreps.

"Kendall was our first commit in the 2021 class, and she fits perfectly into all aspects of our program," Nebraska Coach Amy Williams said. "She is a long, tough, gritty player with great versatility. She is a talented scorer, but her willingness to do all the dirty work on the court is what separates her. She is a great teammate and will lay it on the line for her team to win."

HIGH SCHOOL

Moriarty earned second-team IBCA Class 4A All-State honors as a junior and senior at Benet Academy. She also claimed All-Area honors from both the Naperville Sun and the Daily Herald DuPage County, while leading Benet to four consecutive ESCC Conference titles and earning all-conference honors.

As a senior, Moriarty was Benet's leading scoring at 13 points per game in 2020-21. She averaged 11 points per game while hitting 43.1 percent of her three-pointers in 2019-20. She led Benet Academy in three-point percentage and overall field goal percentage (.458). An elite defender, she also led the team in steals and deflections as both a junior and senior.

She also played volleyball and soccer as a freshman at Benet Academy.

SOPHOMORE (2022-23)

Annika (pronounced AH-nick-ah) Stewart got her third season as a Husker off to a strong start with 10 points, seven rebounds, an assist, a steal and a block in just 15 minutes in a victory over Omaha (Nov. 7). Stewart hit 2-of-3 three-pointers, as one of 10 Huskers to hit at least one three in the win over the Mavs.

One of the hardest working Huskers off the court, Stewart was the program's Lifter of the Year in 2021-22, while also earning Academic All-Big Ten accolades.

FRESHMAN (2021-22)

Stewart continued to be a contributor in her second season at Nebraska, averaging 5.1 points and 2.1 rebounds over 27 games.

Stewart erupted for a career-high 21 points and added a career-best three blocks in a win over Wyoming (Dec. 22). She tied her previous career high with 15 points in 12 minutes in a win over NC Central (Nov. 20).

She was bothered by back pain late in the season, but still contributed a huge 12-point effort in 10 minutes off the bench in a Big Ten quarterfinal win over No. 10 Michigan (March 4). She opened the year with 12 points and five boards in a win over Maine (Nov. 9). She had 10 points and five rebounds in a win over Drake (Dec. 19).

FRESHMAN (2020-21)

As a true freshman, Stewart shattered the Nebraska freshman record for three-point field goal percentage (.446). She sank at least one

three in each of NU's last nine games, hitting 14-of-23 (.609) during the stretch.

She played in all 26 games and averaged 6.4 points and 3.0 rebounds with nine games in double figures, including a season-high 15 points in nine minutes in a win over NCAA Tournament-qualifier Idaho State (Dec. 6).

She capped her season with 11 points on 3-of-4 three-point shooting against Colorado in the Postseason WNIT in Memphis (March 20).

Stewart had 13 points on 5-of-6 shooting at Minnesota (Feb. 24) and 10 points on 4-of-5 shooting in a win over Penn State (Feb. 21).

In her debut, Stewart had 12 points, seven rebounds, an assist, a block and two steals in 16 minutes in a win over Oral Roberts (Dec. 4). She hit her first five shots, including a pair of threes.

Stewart finished with 13 points, five rebounds, two assists and a block in a win over Wisconsin (Jan. 28), after pumping in 12 points on a career-high three threes at Illinois (Jan. 25). Stewart hit two threes in a one-minute span in the fourth quarter to give NU the lead for good.

Stewart scored 12 points at Rutgers (Feb. 7). She had 10 points and six boards at Creighton (Dec. 14). She had seven points, including a fourth-quarter three in a win over No. 15 Northwestern (Dec. 31). She added eight points and six boards in a Postseason WNIT win over UT Martin (March 19).

BEFORE NEBRASKA

Stewart averaged 20.0 points and 8.1 rebounds while hitting 65.6 percent of her two-point field goal attempts, 41.5 percent (39-94) of her threes and 89.5 percent (51-57) of her free throws as a senior. She led Wayzata to a 24-5 record with three of its losses coming to national No. 1 Hopkins. In the third meeting, Stewart had 27 points in the 6-4A sectional championship game against Hopkins and Gatorade National High School Player of the Year Paige Bueckers.

Over the final 12 games, Stewart averaged 25 points. She opened the 4A playoffs with 27 points in a win over Armstrong, before scoring a season-high 36 points in a semifinal win over St. Louis Park and Husker teammate Kendall Coley. Wayzata finished No. 3 in the state.

Stewart earned first-team Class 4A All-State honors, while also earning first-team All-Lake Conference honors. She was also All-Metro.

After coming off the bench as an eighth grader, Stewart averaged 15.2 points and 7.1 rebounds as a freshman for Bishop Ryan. She earned all-region and all-conference honors. She totaled 1,675 points, 836 rebounds, 130 blocks and 119 three-pointers in her five high school seasons combined.

She played summer club basketball for North Tartan - the same program as Sam Haiby.

The 5-9 guard from Sacramento, Calif., made the most of her time off the court by completing her bachelor's degree in just three years. She earned her degree in August of 2022 as a criminology and criminal justice major.

SOPHOMORE (2021-22)

Dillard missed her second straight season at Nebraska after suffering a knee injury in preseason practice.

Off the court, she earned Academic All-Big Ten honors and an Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar Award before claiming her bachelor's degree from Nebraska in August of 2022.

REDSHIRT (2020-21)

Dillard came to Nebraska after spending her first collegiate season at Texas Tech. The 5-9 guard from Sacramento, Calif., was expected to add an athletic presence to the Husker backcourt at both ends of the floor.

Unfortunately, Dillard was bothered by a hip injury late in the summer and was limited during the fall. She underwent season-ending surgery on Dec. 15.

Early in the season, Dillard scored nine points in just nine minutes in a win over Florida A&M (Nov. 18). She established her career high with three threes against the Rattlers. She also grabbed a career-high four rebounds and dished out a career-best two assists against FAMU.

SOPHOMORE (2022-23)

Kendall Coley opened her third season at Nebraska with a strong effort, producing five points, three rebounds, a career-high four assists and a block in a win over Omaha (Nov. 7).

One of the top recruits in the nation in the Class of 2021, Coley enrolled early at Nebraska (January 2021) because of disruptions to the high school season in Minnesota caused by the pandemic.

After beginning her career on the wing in 2020-21, Coley made the move to power forward last season to provide depth behind All-Big Ten teammate Isabelle Bourne.

FRESHMAN (2021-22)

Coley was a contributor in her second season at Nebraska, averaging 2.4 points and 1.7 rebounds over 27 games in 2021-22. Coley put up career highs of 11 points, seven rebounds and two blocked shots in a win over North Carolina Central (Nov. 20).

She produced her first career double-figure scoring effort with 10 points and seven rebounds in a career-high 19 minutes in a win over Prairie View A&M (Nov. 11). She added eight big points to go with two rebounds, an assist and a block in NU's 86-60 win at Wake Forest in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge (Dec. 1). Coley had seven points on perfect shooting to go along with two rebounds and a steal in NU's 79-58 win over No. 8 Michigan (Jan. 4).

She opened the season with six points, a rebound and an assist in a win over Maine (Nov. 9), before adding three points and four boards

in a win over Alabama A&M (Nov. 14). She was a disruptor on defense with two blocks and a steal to go with three points and three boards in a win over Creighton (Nov. 17).

Coley hit 9-of-22 three-pointers (.409) and 85.7 percent (12-14) of her free throws.

FRESHMAN (2020-21)

Coley came to Nebraska as the top-ranked player in a top-25 recruiting class for the Huskers. The 6-2 wing from Minneapolis was ranked as one of the top-50 players in the nation by All-Star Girls Report (36), Prospects Nation (39) and ESPN Hoopgurlz (49) in 2021, while adding a No. 52 ranking from Blue Star.

She committed to NU in April of 2020 after averaging 15.5 points, 7.4 rebounds and 3.7 assists as a junior at St. Louis Park High School. Coley graduated in mid-January and enrolled early at NU after her high school season was delayed for two months by the pandemic.

Śhe joined the Huskers on Jan. 19 and went through her first practice on Jan. 21. She was in uniform but did not play in NU's win at Illinois (Jan. 25). She played her first game in a win over Wisconsin (Jan. 28) and saw action at Rutgers (Feb. 7) and vs. Iowa (Feb. 11).

Coley had two points, a rebound and an assist in 10 minutes against No. 9 Maryland (Feb. 14). She hit her first three-pointer, grabbed two rebounds and added a block in a win over Penn State (Feb. 21). She followed with a season-high six points on 2-for-2 three-point shooting at Minnesota (Feb. 24). She added six points on two threes and grabbed a season-high four rebounds against the Gophers in a Big Ten Tournament win in Indianapolis (March 10). Coley hit both of her threes in an 18-3 Husker surge midway through the first half to take control of the game.

Coley added a three-pointer while playing 13 minutes off the bench in NU's Postseason WNIT win over UT Martin (March 19).

HIGH SCHOOL

Coley averaged 15.5 points, 7.4 rebounds and 3.7 assists as a junior at St. Louis Park High School to earn All-Metro West honors. The honorable-mention All-Minnesota selection was

JUNIOR (2022-23)

A two-time honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection and three-time team captain, Isabelle Bourne returns to lead the Huskers in 2022-23. The 6-2 forward from Canberra, Australia, opened her fourth season as a Husker with game highs of 21 points and nine rebounds in just 23 minutes in a 64-point win over Omaha (Nov. 7).

She owns career totals of 864 points and 456 rebounds. She is poised to become just the 22nd Nebraska women's basketball player to achieve the combined career milestones of 1,000 points and 500 rebounds.

Bourne (who also goes by Issie - sounds like IZZY) joins Jaz Shelley, Alexis Markowski, Allison Weidner and Sam Haiby as returning starters for the Huskers in 2022-23.

SOPHOMORE (2021-22)

Bourne averaged 11.1 points and 4.5 rebounds to earn honorable-mention All-Big Ten recognition for the second straight year.

She opened with 17 points and five boards in a win over Maine (Nov. 9).

Bourne scored in double figures for 10 straight games (Feb. 1-March 3), including 20

points in a win over Northwestern (Feb. 27). She added 15 in the Big Ten Tournament win over Illinois (March 3) and closed the tournament with 16 against No. 12 Iowa (March 5). Bourne also had 14 points in a win at Wisconsin (Feb. 23), which followed 17 in a win over Minnesota (Feb. 20). She got 15 points and seven boards at Penn State (Feb. 17) and 10 points in a win over No. 5 Indiana (Feb. 14). She had 17 points and seven boards at Illinois (Feb. 12) and 12 points at No. 21 Ohio State (Feb. 10). She got 11 points at No. 17 Maryland and 14 in wins over Penn State (Feb. 3) and Purdue (Jan. 30), 15 at Iowa (Jan. 16) and 11 in a win over No. 8 Michigan (Jan. 4).

SOPHOMORE (2020-21)

Bourne was honorable-mention All-Big Ten in her first season as a starter, averaging 13.6 points, 7.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists while seeing time at power forward and on the wing

Bourne had a third straight double-double with a season-high 22 points and 11 rebounds in a win over Penn State (Feb. 21). It followed 21 points and a career-high 17 boards in a win at No. 24 Northwestern (Feb. 17). She earned College Sports Madness National and Conference Player-of-the-Week honors and her first Big Ten Player-of-the-Week award (Feb. 22).

She opened the three-game double-double stretch with 17 points, 10 boards and a career-high five assists vs. No. 9 Maryland (Feb. 14).

Bourne had 22 points, seven rebounds and four assists at Purdue (Dec. 23). She opened Big Ten play with 21 points and eight boards in a win over Illinois (Dec. 10). She had 18 points, seven rebounds and three assists in NU's 68-64 win at No. 23 Michigan State (Jan. 10).

Bourne had 14 points, nine rebounds and a season-high three blocks in a win over ORU (Dec. 4). She had 16 points and six rebounds at No. 15 Indiana (Dec. 20), before notching her first career double-double with 11 points and 10 boards in a win over No. 15 Northwestern (Dec. 31). She had a double-double with 11 points and 12 boards in a win over Rutgers (Jan. 3).

FRESHMAN (2019-20)

Bourne averaged 5.9 points and 4.4 rebounds while playing all 30 games. She closed with season highs of 16 points and five blocks against Michigan (March 5). She finished with four double-figure scoring efforts in Big Ten play.

In 2017, Bourne led Australia's U17 team to gold at the Oceania Championship in Guam with 19 points, 9.8 rebounds and 2.6 assists. She won gold and MVP honors at the 2017 FIBA Under-18 Asia Cup 3-on-3 tournament in Mongolia. She was also named to the Gems squad for the 2018 FIBA Under-18 Asian Championships.

PERSONAL

The daughter of Trent and Ann Bourne, Isabelle has an older sister, Callie, who is a quard at Idaho State. Her oldest sister, Emma, also plays in the Canberra Capitals Academy. A communication studies major, Bourne was a 2021 Big Ten Distinguished Scholar and earned Academic All-Big Ten honors in 2021 and 2022. She is a six-time Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll selection and a two-time member of the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team.

Alexis Markowski was the 2022 Big Ten Freshman of the Year and has been named to preseason watch lists for the Naismith Trophy and the Lisa Leslie Award along with being named first-team preseason All-Big Ten.
The 6-3 post opened 2022-23 with 13 points

and eight rebounds while adding an assist, a block and a steal in a 64-point win over Omaha (Nov. 7).

FRESHMAN (2021-22)

Markowski was the Big Ten Freshman of the Year and the only unanimous choice by the league coaches to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team. She was also a second-team All-Big Ten selection after winning eight Big Ten Freshmanof-the-Week awards.

The only Power Five freshman to average 12.0 points (12.8 ppg) and 6.0 rebounds (8.0 rpg) Markowski averaged 15.4 points, 9.1 rebounds and 1.3 steals and 0.8 blocks in 20 games as a starter. She was the USBWA National Freshman of the Week (Jan. 11) after averaging 17.0 points

and 7.5 rebounds while making her first career starts against top-25 Michigan and Iowa teams.

Markowski posted six 20-point games including 22 in a Big Ten Tournament win over Illinois (March 3), and had six double-doubles.

She had 16 points and 12 rebounds in a win over Northwestern (Feb. 27). She had 10 points and a career-high 15 rebounds in a win over No. 5 Indiana (Feb. 14). She had 23 points and 15 boards at No. 21 Ohio State (Feb. 10). Markowski had her first career 20-point game and seven rebounds in a 79-58 win over No. 8 Michigan in her first career start (Jan. 4). She added 23 points and seven boards at Penn State (Feb. 17). She had 15 points and nine boards in a win over Minnesota (Feb. 20) and 14 points and eight boards vs. No. 22 Iowa (Jan. 9)

She erupted for a career-high 27 points on 10-of-12 shooting (6-of-7 3FG) at Iowa (Jan. 16). Her effort included 16 first-quarter points as she outscored the Hawkeyes 16-14 to help NU to a 30-14 lead. She had 23 points, including 20 in the second half, in a win over Purdue (Jan. 30).

She led NU with 17 points, seven rebounds and a career-high three steals at No. 6 Indiana (Jan. 13). Markowski followed with 16 points and a career-high 15 rebounds in a win over Rutgers (Feb. 1), before leading NU with 18 points in a win over Penn State (Feb. 3). She scored double figures in 18 of NU's last 21 games, including 10 points and nine rebounds against Gonzaga in the NCAA Tournament (March 18).

Markowski notched her first double-double with 17 points and 10 boards off the bench in a run past Indiana State (Dec. 11). She added a second straight double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds in a win over Drake (Dec. 19).

She had 15 points in a win over Wisconsin (Jan. 27) and 14 in a win over Prairie View A&M (Nov. 11). She added 11 points in 12 minutes in a win over Creighton (Nov. 17) and had 11 points and six boards at Michigan State (Dec. 30).

HIGH SCHOOL

Markowski was the Nebraska Gatorade and MaxPreps State High School Player of the Year after averaging 23.3 points, 13 rebounds and two blocks while leading Lincoln Pius X to a second straight Class A state title in 2021. She averaged 23.7 points and 19.3 rebounds in three state tournament wins for the 25-0 Thunderbolts.

Markowski scored a Pius X school-record 42 in a win over Fremont (Jan. 2, 2021). The state's leading rebounder, she had 16 double-doubles and pulled down 20 or more boards four times. In a state semifinal win over Omaha Central, she had 30 points and a season-high 27 rebounds in

a 47-38 win. She added 27 points and 19 boards in the title game win over Fremont.

Markowski finished with school records of 1,484 and 867 rebounds over 76 games (19.5 ppg, 11.4 rpg). She missed her freshman season (2017-18) with a foot injury.

She played club for the Nebraska Lasers and was coached by her father, former Husker men's basketball player Andy Markowski, who is also an assistant coach at Lincoln Pius X.

The daughter of Andy and Jaime Markowski, Alexis was born July 13, 2003, in Toledo, Ohio. Alexis has two younger sisters, Adison and Ava, and a younger brother, Jake.

Alexis' father, Andy, was a 6-8 forward for the Husker men's basketball team from 1994-95 to 1998-99. He was a two-time team captain (1998, 1999) and was a member of four Nebraska postseason tournament teams, helping the Huskers to the 1998 NCAA Tournament and the 1996 NIT championship. He was also a threetime first-team Academic All-Big 12 selection.

A business administration major, Alexis earned a spot on the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll in the fall of 2021. She was also a member of the 2022 Tom Osborne Citizenship

SOPHOMORE (2022-23)

Maddie Krull returned home to Nebraska to play for her dream school after helping South Dakota to an NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearance in her second year with the Coyotes in 2021-22.

The Millard South High School graduate opened her Husker career with 18 points, including a career-high-tying four three-pointers in a win over Omaha (Nov. 7). Krull hit 7-of-9 shots overall and added two assists in her first college game as a non-starter.

Krull's tenacity and intelligence create great fits as a starter or off the bench in an experienced Husker backcourt.

FRESHMAN (SOUTH DAKOTA, 2021-22)

Krull started all 35 games for a South Dakota team that advanced to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen. For the season, Krull averaged 6.8 points, 4.0 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 1.3 steals in 31.5 minutes per game.

A tough, talented and versatile guard all over the court, Krull had 13 points, three rebounds and four assists while playing the full 40 minutes in USD's first-round NCAA Tournament victory over Ole Miss.

She added six points, seven rebounds, two assists and three steals to help the Coyotes to a 61-47 upset of No. 7 Baylor (March 20) to

advance to propel them to the Sweet Sixteen.

For the season, Krull scored in double figures 10 times, including her first career double-double with 12 points and a career-high 11 rebounds in an overtime win over Pittsburgh (Nov. 27) at the Paradise Jam in the Virgin Islands.

She put up a season-high 16 points to go along with four assists, two rebounds and a career-high two blocked shots in a 73-71 win at Creighton (Dec. 16). Krull also knocked down a career-best four three-pointers on just five attempts against the eventual NCAA Elite Eightqualifying Jays.

She closed her USD career with five points, seven rebounds and an assist in a 52-49 loss to No. 12 Michigan in Wichita (March 26).

FRESHMAN (SOUTH DAKOTA, 2020-21)

A member of the Summit League All-Newcomer Team as a true freshman at South Dakota, Krull helped the Coyotes win the Summit League Tournament title and advance to the 2021 NCAA Tournament.

One of five Coyotes to play in all 25 games, she became the first freshman starter at USD since 2016. She ranked fourth on the team by averaging 9.2 points per game, while adding 3.8 rebounds and 2.4 assists per game.

She scored in double figures 13 times, including her first career 20-point game with 20 points in a win over North Dakota State (Feb. 27). She also put up 15 points on three other occasions during Summit League action.

Krull made an instant impact by scoring 12 points on 6-of-9 shooting in her first collegiate game in a loss to No. 1 South Carolina (Nov. 28). She had 14 points and a season-best eight rebounds in a win over ORU (Feb. 21). She also went viral with an ankle-breaker highlight that was twice featured in NCAA's Top 5 plays.

She ranked second among the Coyotes with 59 assists on the season, including a season-high six against Denver (Jan. 3).

Krull also accumulated enough college credit to earn an associate degree along with her high school diploma.

OUTLOOK (2022-23)

Maggie Mendelson won gold medals for U.S. age group national teams in both basketball and volleyball before competing as a Husker. She spent time training with the Nebraska basketball team in the summer of 2022 after graduating from Fremont High School in Utah a year early. She won gold for the U.S. Under 19 National Volleyball Team at the Pan American Cup before spending the fall season with perennial national power Nebraska volleyball team.

In the summer of 2021, Mendelson won gold as a member of the U.S. Under 16 National Basketball at the FIBA Americas Championship.

HIGH SCHOOL

As a basketball player at Fremont High School, Mendelson led the Silverwolves to the 2021 state title with a perfect 26-0 record as a sophomore. She averaged 14.3 points, 8.9 rebounds, 1.6 assists, 1.5 steals and 1.9 blocks while starting every game. She collected 15 points and 14 rebounds in the state title game.

In her final high school season as a junior, Mendelson led the Silverwolves back to the 2022 UHSAA/Mountain America Girls Basketball State Championship game, averaging 17.5 points and 9.1 rebounds over 26 games. In the state title game, Mendelson had 25 points and six steals in a 67-65 double-overtime loss to Lone Peak at BYU (March 5). Fremont finished 24-3.

Mendelson had 14 points and seven boards in a state semifinal win over Westlake (March 3), after putting up 19 points and 15 rebounds in a victory over Bingham (March 1).

MAGGIE MENDELSON 44

6-3 Sophomore Center/Forward Lincoln, Nebraska (Lincoln Pius X)

As a freshman, Mendelson averaged 8.0 points, 5.6 rebounds, 0.7 assists, 0.3 steals and 1.6 blocks per game.

She was a three-time letterwinner in volleyball and passed the 1,000 career kills milestone in two and a half years. In 2021, Mendelson totaled 407 kills on .294 hitting with 59 aces and earned third-team AVCA All-America and first-team All-Region 1 honors. She was the Utah Gatorade High School Player of the Year.

As a sophomore, Mendelson was an outside hitter who helped Fremont to third place at the state tournament and a Region 1 championship. She had 417 kills on .312 hitting and earned 6A first-team all-state recognition by the Deseret News, Region 1 Most Valuable Player and All-Area MVP by the Standard-Examiner for the second straight year.

She hit .387 as a freshman for the Region 1 champion Silverwolves while finishing with 369 kills and 101 blocks. She was a top-20 finalist for Prep Volleyball's National Freshman of the Year and earned a spot on the publication's special mention list for high school All-Americans. In July 2020, Prep Volleyball slotted her No. 2 on its Top 150 list.

Mendelson was named to the 25 Underclassmen to Watch List (2021) by Volleyball Magazine, the AVCA's Phenom List (2020, 2021) and Prep Volleyball's Frosh 59. She played club volleyball for the Utah Hive, which won the Triple Crown SLC tournament.

"I chose Nebraska because of the relationship I have built with the coaches," Mendelson said. "They believe I can play both sports, and I appreciate the tradition of those programs at Nebraska."

Since 2000, four student-athletes -- Greichaly Cepero, Laura Pilakowski, Alicia Ostrander and Allie Havers -- have been on the rosters for both volleyball and basketball at Nebraska. Volleyball All-Americans Cepero and Pilakowski were starters in both sports in the same season (2002-03). Havers, a two-year starter on the basketball team (2015-16, 2016-17) later played for the volleyball team in its indoor (2017) and beach (2018) seasons.
