HUSKERS TRAVEL TO NEW MEXICO FOR TROY COX CLASSIC

The Nebraska softball team travels to Las Cruces, New Mexico, for the Troy Cox Classic. The tournament is hosted by New Mexico State and will take place at the NM State Softball Complex. The Huskers will play a total of five games from Feb. 17-20.

On Thursday, Nebraska will play host school New Mexico State at 4 p.m. CT. The game will be streamed live on the WAC Digital Network.

On Friday, the Huskers compete against Southeastern Louisiana at 12:30 p.m. CT.

On Saturday, NU plays UT Arlington (12:30 p.m. CT) and Northern Colorado (3 p.m. CT). The Huskers conclude the tournament against Iowa State on Sunday at 10 a.m. CT.

All games will be broadcasted live on the Huskers Radio Network which is available at Huskers.com.

SCOUTING THE OPPONENTS

New Mexico State finished the 2021 season with a 31-21 and started their 2022 season, 0-3.

Southeastern finished the 2021 season with a 28-23 record, and started the 2022 season at the Lion Classic, finishing 3-0.

UT Arlington is coming off of a 17-34 finish from 2021. UTA started their 2022 season at the Aggie Classic, finishing with a 0-4 record.

Northern Colorado enters the 2022 season after earning a 12-27 record in 2021. UNC opened their season in Phoenix, Ariz., going 1-4 on the weekend.

The Huskers will face Iowa State for the second time this year. The Cyclones reached the NCAA Regionals in 2021, finishing the season with a 34-23 record. ISU went 4-1 at the UNI-Dome Classic in the first week of competition.

- Nebraska's roster features 18 players from **seven** different states.
- There are seven players who are Nebraska natives.
- **Rhonda Revelle** is in her 30th season leading her alma mater in 2022. Revelle is the second-longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.

- Revelle owns 1,022 wins at Nebraska. She is the all-time wins leader (male or female) in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach **Lori Sippel** is in her 33rd year at Nebraska. Sippel is the longest-tenured female assistant coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.

- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,326 of Nebraska's 1,503 all-time victories (88 percent).

- In her 14th season, assistant coach **Diane Miller** rounds out the Husker coaching staff. Miller has helped Nebraska's offense set more than 40 school records.

- **Courtney Wallace** received NFCA All-Region honors after her performance during the 2021 season. Wallace earned NFCA All-Midwest Region second team honors.

- **Billie Andrews** had a standout freshman season in 2021. The Gretna, Neb., native, was one of only two freshmen named to the 18-player All-Big Ten first team. Andrews will look to repeat those honors during the 2022 season.

- Fifth year senior **Olivia Ferrell** took advantage of the NCAA waiver for an extra year of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

- The roster features three newcomers including two freshmen and one transfer.

- NU added two freshmen catchers to the roster. **Mckinley Malecha** and **Ava Bredwell** are both expected to add depth to the position.

- **Mya Felder**, an Oregon-transfer, joins the Huskers after receiving NFCA All-Pacific Region honors after her 2021 season with Oregon.

- Sophomore **Abbie Squier** received the first weekly Big Ten honor of the season. Squier was named the Co-Big Ten Player of the Week for her performance at the UNI-Dome Classic.

- The Huskers faced their first non-conference opponent since March 8, 2020 at the UNI-Dome Classic. NU is set to face 25 non-conference opponents during the 2022 season.

- Nebraska will travel to eight different states during the 2022 season including Iowa, New Mexico, Arkansas, California, Kansas, Michigan, Wisconsin and Ohio.

- The Big Red will host 17 games at Bowlin Stadium in 2022. The schedule will feature only 15 home dates as two of the dates will be doubleheaders.

NU SET FOR 56-GAME SCHEDULE

Nebraska is scheduled to play 56 games in 2022, including 17 home games, 22 away games and 17 games at a neutral site.

HUSKERS TRAVEL TO EIGHT STATES

Nebraska will travel to eight states this season, playing games in Iowa, New Mexico, Arkansas, California, Kansas, Michigan, Wisconsin and Ohio.

NU SET FOR 10 GAMES AGAINST 2021 NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAMS

Nebraska is slated to play nine teams that advanced to the 2021 NCAA Tournament last season. Northern Iowa, Iowa State, South Dakota State, Wichita State, Boston, Central Florida, Long Beach State, Stanford, Michigan and Minnesota all advanced to the NCAA Regionals in 2021.

The Huskers will see Northern Iowa, Iowa State and South Dakota their first weekend of play at the UNI Dome Tournament.

NU faces Wichita State at Bowlin Stadium for the first home game of the season.

Nebraska will face Boston, Central Florida and Long Beach State at the Judi Garman Classic in California.

The Huskers host Stanford for one game at Bowlin Stadium on March 22.

NU will face Big Ten foes Michigan on the road and host Minnesota for three-game conference series.

HOME SWEET HOME

Nebraska will have 17 home games at Bowlin Stadium in 2022. The schedule will feature only 15 home dates, as two of the dates will be doubleheaders.

MICHIGAN STATE HOSTS BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

The 2022 Big Ten Tournament is set for May 12-14 at Michigan State's Secchia Stadium. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings will compete in the tournament, with the top four seeds earning a bye.

The 2022 Women's College World Series will be held at ASA Hall of Fame Stadium in Oklahoma City for the 24th straight season and the 31st time overall.

NEBRASKA RETURNERS EXPECTED TO MAKE IMPACT IN LINEUP

Nebraska hit .250, scored 190 runs and slugged 37 homeruns in 2021 against a difficult conference-only schedule. The Huskers return 14 to the roster, all of which are expected to be impactful in the lineup.

- **Billie Andrews** will continue to be a leader for the Huskers offensively. The first-team All-Big Ten selection ranked 5th in the Big Ten in RBIs (31), 6th in runs (32) and 7th in home runs (7) in 2021. Andrews tallied 5 hits and two home runs in the opening weekend of the 2022 season.
- The NFCA All-Midwest Region selection, **Courtney Wallace**, will serve as a leader of the 2022 team. Wallace recorded 17 strikeouts in the first weekend and notched a triple to start the 2022 season.
- Although expected to spend most of her time in the circle, **Olivia Ferrell** can make an impact offensively as well. The fifth-year senior averages a .211, tallying 27 hits and 19 RBIs during her career at NU. Ferrell recorded two hits and two walks on offense at the UNI-Dome Classic to start the 2022 season.
- **Brooke Andrews** is a versatile player from Gretna, Neb., that will help the Big Red. Andrews added 20 hits and 14 RBIs for NU in 2021. Andrews made her first career-start at second base at the UNI-Dome Classic. The junior also recorded two doubles and five hits through five games of the 2022 season.
- Sophomore **Sydney Gray** returns to the lineup after suffering a season-ending injury at the start of 2021. In just 15 games, Gray tallied 15 hits, five doubles, one homerun and 8 RBIs. Gray was impactful in the first tournament of 2022, recording five hits including one double and one home run.
- **Peyton Glatter** started 33 games last season and is expected to be a constant in lineup this year. Glatter tallied 19 RBIs on 20 hits and finished the season reaching base safely in a career-high eight straight games. Glatter recorded a team-high three doubles at the UNI-Dome Classic.
- Sophomore **Kaylin Kinney** started 20 games as the designated player in 2021. Kinney will most likely play a critical role as the DP this season after notching 20 hits, four homeruns and 11 RBIs last year. Kinney made her first start in the circle this season against Iowa State, recording five strikeouts.
- **Abbie Squier**, a Lincoln, Neb., native, made 10 starts as a freshmen in the outfield and is looking to make an impact offensively this year. The sophomore had a standout performance to start the 2022 season, recording the first two home runs of her career.
- Earning 21 starts last season, **Caitlynn Neal** is expected to see time in the outfield and in the circle. Neal started all five games in center field for the Huskers at the UNI-Dome Classic.
- Senior **Anni Raley** will lead the Huskers behind the plate as the projected starting catcher. Raley adds offensive experience, hitting .245 and with 7 RBIs in 2021. Raley started all five games as the catcher for the Huskers at the UNI-Dome Classic.
- **Cam Ybarra** is expected to be a leader offensively for the Huskers in 2022. The senior holds a career .263 batting average including 124 hits, 34 doubles and nine home runs.
- A 2022 captain, **Karlee Seevers** will be a leader for the Big Red. Seevers recorded a run against Omaha at the UNI-Dome Classic.
- **Camyl Armendariz** is a versatile returner who is prepared to help the Huskers wherever she is needed. In 2021, the La Verne, Calif., native, made one start and added eight runs for the Big Red.
- Sophomore **Abbey Newlun** adds depth to the infielder group. The Woodlands, Texas, native, added to a team season-high 10 walks, against Omaha on Feb. 11, 2022.

SQUIER NAMED CO-BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Sophomore outfielder Abbie Squier was named the first Big Ten Player of the Week for the 2022 season as she shared the honor with Northwestern's Rachel Lewis.

Squier was recognized for an outstanding opening weekend at the UNI Dome Classic in Cedar Falls, Iowa. Squier hit .500 in five games with one double, two homers and four RBIs. Her two home runs were the first of her career. Squier also had a .938 slugging percentage and a .579 on base percentage. The sophomore started all five games in left field.

A Lincoln native, Squier went 1-for-4 in two games on opening, recording her first career home run against Northern Iowa. On Saturday, the sophomore was 4-for-8 including one double against Iowa State. On the final day of the weekend, Squier was 2-for-4 with a two-run homer against South Dakota State.

This was Squier's first Big Ten weekly award of her career. The last Nebraska player to be named Big Ten Player of the Week was Kaylin Kinney on May 5, 2021.

FERRELL RETURNS FOR FIFTH YEAR

Olivia Ferrell is taking advantage of the NCAA waiver for an extra year of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The fifth-year Husker is contributing both offensively and defensively in 2022. At the UNI-Dome Classic, Ferrell showcased her ability to be a leader on both sides of the ball.

- Ferrell recorded two hits and two walks against South Dakota State.
- In the circle, Ferrell pitched 9.2 innings recording 10 strikeouts and allowing only 10 hits.

BOWLIN STADIUM



The 2022 season marks the 21st season Nebraska has called Bowlin Stadium home. The stadium's inaugural season was in 2002.

One of the top facilities in the country, Bowlin Stadium features seating for 2,500 fans, an underground system that heats the field and a large video board. Just past the right field fence is the Alex Gordon Training Complex, a spacious indoor facility that is large enough for Nebraska to take live batting practice inside the complex. The clubhouse features a locker room, players' lounge, training room and coaches' offices.

Nebraska has won nearly 70 percent of its games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers have hosted four NCAA Regionals at Bowlin Stadium and ranked in the top 25 nationally in attendance 14 times, including four seasons ranked in the top 10.


