HUSKERS READY FOR WOOO PIG CLASSIC

The Nebraska softball team is set for the Wooo Pig Classic in Fayetteville, Ark., this Sunday, Feb. 27 through Monday, Feb. 28. The Huskers will play four games starting with a 10 a.m. CT match up against Kansas. This is the first of three meetings that NU will have with KU this season. The Big Red will face Louisville after the completion of game one on Sunday. The game is set to start at 12:15 p.m. CT. On Monday, Nebraska will face the Cardinals for a second time during the weekend at 9:30 a.m. CT. The Huskers will close out the tournament against host school Arkansas at 2 p.m. CT. This game will be streamed live on SECN+.

SCOUTING THE OPPONENTS

Kansas (6-4) is coming off of a 2-3 showing at the Texas A&M Tournament. The Jayhawks claimed wins against Stephen F. Austin and Missouri State, but fell to Pittsburgh and lost twice to Texas A&M.

As a team, KU is hitting .300 but has three hitters batting at least .360. Cheyenne Hornbuckle has a team-high .435 average, while Macy Omli and Lyric Moore are hitting .382 and .368 respectively. Kasey Hamilton is expected to be the leader in the circle, who has made six appearances and holds a 2-2 record.

Louisville (7-3) went 3-2 in its second weekend of play at the T-Mobile Tournament. The Cardinals claimed wins over Florida A&M and two games against Villanova. Louisville fell to No. 4 Florida and No. 14 Drake.

As a team, the Cardinals are hitting .295. Carmyn Greenwood leads with a team-high .444 batting average. She has recorded 16 hits including four home runs through 10 games. Chardonay Harris has led the Cardinals in the circle, making eight appearances and recording 16 strikeouts. The senior is currently 3-2 and holds a 4.58 ERA. The Huskers could also face Taja Felder, younger sister of current NU player,

Mya Felder.

No. 10 Arkansas (7-3) hosted the Razorback Invitational last weekend, finishing 4-1. The Razorbacks added wins against Illinois, Wichita State and Longwood before falling to Illinois on Sunday. Arkansas ended the weekend with a win against Western Illinois.

As a team, the Razorbacks are hitting .308 with two hitters batting at least .400. Danielle Gibson has a team-high .556 average while Sam Torres holds a .429 average. Mary Haff will lead Arkansas in the circle. She currently holds a 2.86 ERA and 4-2 record.

- Nebraska's roster features 18 players from **seven** different states.
- There are seven players who are Nebraska natives.
- **Rhonda Revelle** is in her 30th season leading her alma mater in 2022. Revelle is the second-longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.

- Revelle owns 1,026 wins at Nebraska. She is the all-time wins leader (male or female) in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach **Lori Sippel** is in her 33rd year at Nebraska. Sippel is the longest-tenured female assistant coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.

- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,330 of Nebraska's 1,507 all-time victories (88 percent).

- In her 14th season, assistant coach **Diane Miller** rounds out the Husker coaching staff. Miller has helped Nebraska's offense set more than 40 school records.

- **Courtney Wallace** received NFCA All-Region honors after her performance during the 2021 season. Wallace earned NFCA All-Midwest Region second team honors.

- **Billie Andrews** had a standout freshman season in 2021. The Gretna, Neb., native, was one of only two freshmen named to the 18-player All-Big Ten first team. Andrews will look to repeat those honors during the 2022 season.

- Fifth year senior **Olivia Ferrell** took advantage of the NCAA waiver for an extra year of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

- The roster features three newcomers including two freshmen and one transfer.

- NU added two freshmen catchers to the roster. **Mckinley Malecha** and **Ava Bredwell** are both expected to add depth to the position.

- **Mya Felder**, an Oregon-transfer, joins the Huskers after receiving NFCA All-Pacific Region honors after her 2021 season with Oregon.

- Sophomore **Abbie Squier** received the first weekly Big Ten honor of the season. Squier was named the Co-Big Ten Player of the Week for her performance at the UNI-Dome Classic.

- **Sydney Gray** earned the second Big Ten honor of the season as she was named the Co-Big Ten Player of the Week for her performance at the Troy Cox Classic.

- Nebraska will travel to eight different states during the 2022 season including Iowa, New Mexico, Arkansas, California, Kansas, Michigan, Wisconsin and Ohio.

- The Big Red will host 17 games at Bowlin Stadium in 2022. The schedule will feature only 15 home dates as two of the dates will be doubleheaders.

NU SET FOR 55-GAME SCHEDULE

Nebraska is scheduled to play 55 games in 2022, including 17 home games, 22 away games and 16 games at a neutral site.

HUSKERS TRAVEL TO EIGHT STATES

Nebraska will travel to eight states this season, playing games in Iowa, New Mexico, Arkansas, California, Kansas, Michigan, Wisconsin and Ohio.

NU SET FOR 10 GAMES AGAINST 2021 NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAMS

Nebraska is slated to play nine teams that advanced to the 2021 NCAA Tournament last season. Northern Iowa, Iowa State, South Dakota State, Wichita State, Boston, Central Florida, Long Beach State, Stanford, Michigan and Minnesota all advanced to the NCAA Regionals in 2021.

The Huskers will see Northern Iowa, Iowa State and South Dakota their first weekend of play at the UNI Dome Tournament.

NU faces Wichita State at Bowlin Stadium for the first home game of the season.

Nebraska will face Boston, Central Florida and Long Beach State at the Judi Garman Classic in California.

The Huskers host Stanford for one game at Bowlin Stadium on March 22.

NU will face Big Ten foes Michigan on the road and host Minnesota for three-game conference series.

HOME SWEET HOME

Nebraska will have 17 home games at Bowlin Stadium in 2022. The schedule will feature only 15 home dates, as two of the dates will be doubleheaders.

MICHIGAN STATE HOSTS BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

The 2022 Big Ten Tournament is set for May 12-14 at Michigan State's Secchia Stadium. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings will compete in the tournament, with the top four seeds earning a bye.

OKC HOSTS WCWS

The 2022 Women's College World Series will be held at ASA Hall of Fame Stadium in Oklahoma City for the 24th straight season and the 31st time overall.

BIG RED HITS BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK HOMERS AGAINST NMSU

The Huskers hit back-to-back-to-back home runs against New Mexico State on Thursday, Feb. 17, 2022. Courtney Wallace started it off in the top of the fourth inning with a deep ball over the center field fence. Camyl Armendariz followed it up with a smashed ball of her own over the left field fence to mark the first hit of her career. Billie Andrews added the third homer of the inning, notching it over the right center field fence.

This marks the first time a Nebraska softball team has done so in 20 years. The last time the Huskers recorded back-to-back-to-back homers was in the top of the second inning against California on March 17, 2002. Nebraska would go on to win the game, 4-3.

HUSKERS MAKE MARK IN RECORD BOOK WITH THREE GRAND SLAMS

The 2022 Nebraska softball team has already made its mark in the record book with three grand slams at the Troy Cox Classic.

On Saturday, Feb. 19, the Huskers faced Northern Colorado, tallying four home runs. Cam Ybarra added the first grand slam of the year against the Bears. Ybarra hit a deep ball over the right center field fence in the top of the second inning to mark the first grand slam of the day. Billie Andrews added her own grand slam to the mix in the top of the fifth inning. The sophomore hit one over the right center field fence also, to make it two on the day, and the season. On Sunday, Feb. 20, NU took on Southeastern Louisiana. Olivia Ferrell smashed one over the left center field fence to bring in four runs and mark the third grand slam of the weekend.

After just 10 games, the 2022 Huskers are tied for fourth in total grand slams in a season in Nebraska history.

BOWLIN STADIUM



The 2022 season marks the 21st season Nebraska has called Bowlin Stadium home. The stadium's inaugural season was in 2002.

One of the top facilities in the country, Bowlin Stadium features seating for 2,500 fans, an underground system that heats the field and a large video board. Just past the right field fence is the Alex Gordon Training Complex, a spacious indoor facility that is large enough for Nebraska to take live batting practice inside the complex. The clubhouse features a locker room, players' lounge, training room and coaches' offices.

Nebraska has won nearly 70 percent of its games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers have hosted four NCAA Regionals at Bowlin Stadium and ranked in the top 25 nationally in attendance 14 times, including four seasons ranked in the top 10.

In the second weekend of play, the Jayhawks competed in the Texas A&M Tournament. KU went 2-3 on the weekend, counting wins against Stephen F. Austin and Missouri State. Kansas fell to Pittsburgh and lost to Texas A&M twice.

The Jayhawks have 14 returning players including six starters from last year's team, which went 22-26. Two of the returners, Shelby Gayre and Cheyenne Hornbuckle were part of a three-way tie for leading the Big 12 in fielding percentage at a perfect 1.000.

In the circle, Kasey Hamilton will lead for the Jayhawks. The sophomore currently holds a 2-2 record, pitching 18 innings. She has tallied 16 strikeouts and allowed 23 hits. Hamilton led the team in strikeouts with 59 in 2021. She was named to the All-Big 12 Freshman team. Hamilton earned five victories including nine starts, pitched four complete games including one solo shutout and also recorded two saves.

ARKANSAS (7-3)

No. 10 Arkansas opened the 2022 season at the Puerto Vallarta College Challenge, finishing 3-2 on the weekend. The Razorbacks picked up wins against Rutgers, Memphis and Long Beach State but fell to No. 7 Washington twice.

The Razorbacks hosted the Razorback Invitational during the second weekend of the season. Arkansas went 4-1, tallying wins against Illinois, Wichita State, Longwood and Western Illinois. The Razorbacks fell to Illinois on the final day of the tournament, 8-6.

Arkansas is coming off of a strong 2021 campaign, going 43-11, claiming the SEC title and reaching the NCAA Super Regionals. Seniors Danielle Gibson and Mary Haff are expected to be lead returners for the Razorbacks. Gibson slugged her way through the 2021 season, slashing .355/.408/.721 with 15 home runs and 51 RBIs to pick up NFCA Second-Team All-America honors. She also added All-SEC second team and SEC All-Defensive Team accolades to help Arkansas to its first-ever SEC title in 2021.

In the circle, Haff will lead the Razorbacks. She earned SEC co-Pitcher of the Year along with NFCA First-Team All-America and All-SEC honors. Haff went 26-7 last season with five saves and a 1.55 ERA over 40 appearances and 25 starts. Haff leads the Razorbacks with a 4-2 record through 10 games, notching 28 strikeouts while walking only five batters.

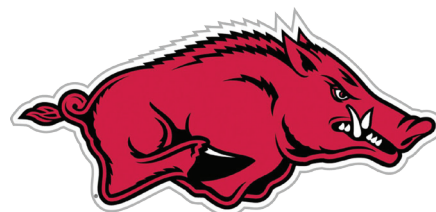

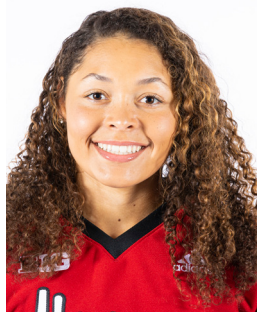
