THE MATCHUP

The Nebraska wrestling team heads to Detroit for the 2022 NCAA Championships in the quest for a national title. The three-day event will consist of six sessions beginning Thursday morning at the Little Caesar's Arena.

Eight grapplers compose the field for Nebraska at this year's national championship. Seven earned automatic bids as a result of their finishes at the Big Ten Championships, including Ridge Lovett (149), Peyton Robb (157), Bubba Wilson (165), Mikey Labriola (174), Taylor Venz (184), Eric Schultz (197) and Christian Lance (285). Chad Red Jr. earned an at-large bid.

Last Time Out: Nebraska finished seventh at the 2022 Big Ten Championships with 75.5 points. Schultz led the team with second-place finish as seven Huskers finished in the top seven.



2020-21 RECAP

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Nebraska scored 38 points en route to a 12th-place finish at the 2021 NCAA Championships. Mikey Labriola finished third at 174 pounds, earning All-American honors for the third time in his career. Chad Red. Jr (141 pounds) also earned All-America honors, placing sixth.

BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Huskers placed third at the 2021 Big Ten Championships. Ridge Lovett (2nd place -- 149), Taylor Venz (2nd place -- 184) and Eric Schultz (2nd place -- 197) were the top individual finishers for Nebraska. Mikey Labriola (174 pounds) was the next highest individual as he placed third.

REGULAR SEASON

Nebraska finished the season ninth in the final national dual rankings with a 7-1 record. The Huskers finished the conference-only slate with six-straight dual wins. NU posted a 4-1 record against opponents who finished in the Top 25 at the NCAA Championships.

NEBRASKA FINISHES SEVENTH AT BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Nebraska wrestling team finished seventh at the 2022 Big Ten Championships with 75.5 points for the program's 10th top-seven finish at the event. The Huskers were led by a second-place finish from Eric Schultz (197), and NU clinched seven automatic bids to the NCAA Championships.

ALL-AMERICANS BACK FOR MORE

Six Huskers who were named All-Americans following the 2019-20 season return to the national champion stage once more. Nebraska's returning First-Team All-Americans include Chad Red Jr., Taylor Venz and Eric Schultz. Mikey Labriola earned Second-Team All-America honors and Ridge Lovett and Peyton Robb both earned Honorable Mention All-America accolades. Last season, Red Jr. became the third four-time All-American in Husker history and Labriola earned his third career All-American nod.

RED JR. EYES FIFTH ALL-AMERICAN HONOR

Heading into the 2022 NCAA Championships, Chad Red Jr. leads the Huskers with four previous All-American finishes at the national championship tournament. He earned his highest finish last season, coming in sixth place for the Huskers. He is a combined 14-8 at the tournament in three outings. He enters this year's post-season competition with a 12-6 overall record.

LOVETT CARRIES BIG CONFERENCE SUCCESS INTO NCAAS

Following a fourth-place finish at the Big Ten Championships, Ridge Lovett will take his second trip to the NCAA Championships. During the regular season, he tallied a 20-3 overall record and a 10-1 mark in conference dual competition.

ROBB MAKES SECOND-STRAIGHT TRIP TO NCAAS

Following a fifth-place finish at the 2022 Big Ten Championships, Peyton Robb will take his second trip to the NCAA Championships this season. The sophomore is 13-8 on the year and 5-4 in the conference.

WILSON SET FOR FIRST NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS OUTING

Bubba Wilson makes his first trip to the NCAA Championships this weekend after earning an automatic bid with a sixth-place finish at the Big Ten Championships. The redshirt-freshman is 13-13 on the year and 5-5 in conference play.

LABRIOLA AIMS TO EXTEND 2021-22 SUCCESS INTO THE POSTSEASON

Mikey Labriola earned a fifth-place finish at the Big Ten Championships this season to automatically qualify for the NCAA Championships. This is his third trip to the tournament after finishing fourth in 2018 and third last season. He finished the 2021-22 regular season with a 19-3 record and now hold a career record of 101-34.

VENZ READY FOR ANOTHER NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP TRIP

Taylor Venz makes his fourth trip to the NCAA Championships this season after earning his fifth bid with a fifth-place finish at the Big Ten Championships. The senior is 11-6 at the NCAA Championships and earned his best finish in 2018, coming in fourth.

SCHULTZ AIMS TO EXTEND WINNING SEASON

Eric Schultz, who finished second at the conference championship, enters the NCAA Championships as the highest seeded Husker at No. 3 at 197 pounds. Schultz continued his winning ways into the postseason, picking up two wins in his first two matches, but ultimately fell in the title match. He has qualified for five NCAA Championships in his career and has an overall record of 14-8 at the event and a career-high finish of sixth.

LANCE MAKES SECOND NCAA TRIP

As the Huskers' starter at heavyweight this season, Christian Lance has earned himself a spot in the Nebraska NCAA Championships lineup for the second time. Lance has a 16-8 overall record and 5-5 in conference competition.

2021 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Former Husker wrestler Jordan Burroughs won his fifth World Championship, defeating Mohammad Nokhodilari of Iran, 5-1, in the men's freestyle 79 kg final at the World Wrestling Championships on Monday. Burroughs tied John Smith's U.S. freestyle record of six World and Olympic Championships combined.

In the 79 kg final, Burroughs took the early 3-0 lead with a double-leg takedown followed closely by another double. The victory gave Burroughs his fifth World Championship gold medal, joining his titles in 2011, 2013, 2015 and 2017.

At 70 kg, fellow former Husker James Green cruised to his first match victory, defeating Korea's Seungchul Lee by a 10-0 technical fall. The story in Green's second round was similar as he advanced to the quarterfinals with a 10-0 technical fall over Germany's Shamil Ustaev.

In the quarterfinals, Green lost a hard-fought match to Azerbaijan's Turan Bayramov 6-5 and was eliminated from competition.

Burroughs' medal was the second gold medal of the day for the United States, as former Omaha Skutt and Iowa wrestler Thomas Gilman defeated Iran's Alireza Sarlak in the 57 kg championship match.
