HUSKERS FACE TOREROS IN TUESDAY DOUBLE HEADER

The Nebraska softball team (15-7) is set for a Tuesday double header with the San Diego Toreros (11-17). The Toreros are led by former Husker standout MJ Knighten in her second season as the head coach.

The first game will start at 5 p.m. CT at the USD Softball Complex. The second game is set to start at approximately 7:30 p.m. ČT or 30 minutes after the conclusion of game one.

The games will be broadcasted live on the Huskers Radio Network and Huskers.com with the call from Nate Rohr.

The Huskers are coming off of a 4-1 weekend at the Cal State Fullerton and Long Beach State Tournament. NU picked up its first win after a walk-off two-run homer from Cam Ybarra lifted the Big Red to a 10-9 win over Sacramento State. In the second game of the weekend, Nebraska faced Cal State Fullerton, winning 3-1. On day two, NU faced Boston University, winning 5-2 with the help of a sixth-inning

rally that tallied three home runs from Peyton Glatter, Brooke Andrews and Billie Andrews.

On day three, the Huskers fell to Central Florida, 7-3. Closing out the weekend, Nebraska claimed a 9-0 victory over host Long Beach State.

SCOUTING THE OPPONENTS

San Diego (11-17) is coming off of a 2-2 finish at the Torero Classic. USD opened the weekend with a 9-7 win over CSUN before falling to Weber State, 3-1. The Toreros picked up their second win with a 2-1 victory over CSUN, but fell to San Diego State, 4-3, to finish the weekend.

USD is led by redshirt junior Alexia Torculas who holds a .299 batting average. The Salinas, Calif., native has tallied 26 hits including two doubles, one triple and six RBIs. Senior Noelle Hee has also lifted the offense, hitting 2 home runs and notching 17 RBIs.

In the circle for San Diego, redshirt junior Madison Earnshaw has led with a record of 5-5. The San Carlos, Calif., native has thrown three complete games, striking out 43. Earnshaw has also earned two saves. Courtney Rose (4-6) has also been a leader in the circle, tallying two saves and 72 strikeouts.

MJ Knighten, former Husker who played at Nebraska from 2014-17, will lead the Toreros in the first match up between the two schools.

NEBRASKA 2022 SEASON NOTEBOOK

- Nebraska's roster features 18 players from **seven** different states.
- There are seven players who are Nebraska natives.
- Rhonda Revelle is in her 30th season leading her alma mater in 2022. Revelle is the second-longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle owns 1,035 wins at Nebraska. She is the all-time wins leader (male or female) in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach Lori Sippel is in her 33rd year at Nebraska. Sippel is the longest-tenured female assistant coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,339 of Nebraska's 1,516 all-time victories (88 percent).
- In her 14th season, assistant coach **Diane Miller** rounds out the Husker coaching staff. Miller has helped Nebraska's offense set more than 40 school records.
- Courtney Wallace recevied NFCA All-Region honors after her performance during the 2021 season. Wallace earned NFCA All-Midwest Region second team honors.
- Billie Andrews had a standout freshman season in 2021. The Gretna, Neb., native, was one of only two freshmen named to the 18-player All-Big Ten first team. Andrews will look to repeat those honors during the 2022 season.

- Fifth year senior **Olivia Ferrell** took advantage of the NCAA waiver for an extra year of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The roster features three newcomers including two freshmen and one transfer.
- NU added two freshmen catchers to the roster. Mckinley Malecha and Ava Bredwell are both expected to add depth to the position.
- Mya Felder, an Oregon-transfer, joins the Huskers after receiving NFCA All-Pacific Region honors after her 2021 season with Oregon.
- Sophomore **Abbie Squier** received the first weekly Big Ten honor of the season. Squier was named the Co-Big Ten Player of the Week for her performance at the UNI-Dome Classic.
- Sydney Gray earned the second Big Ten honor of the season as she was named the Co-Big Ten Player of the Week for her performance at the Troy Cox Classic.
- Billie Andrews was named Big Ten Player of the Week after notching five homers in the first weekend at Bowlin Stadium.
- Nebraska will travel to seven different states during the 2022 season including lowa, New Mexico, California, Kansas, Michigan, Wisconsin and Ohio.
- The Big Red will host 17 games at Bowlin Stadium in 2022. The schedule will feature only 15 home dates as two of the dates will be doubleheaders.

HUSKERS TRAVEL TO SEVEN STATES

Nebraska will travel to eight states this season, playing games in Iowa, New Mexico, California, Kansas, Michigan, Wisconsin and Ohio.

NU SET FOR 10 GAMES AGAINST 2021 NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAMS

Nebraska is slated to play nine teams that advanced to the 2021 NCAA Tournament last season. Northern Iowa, Iowa State, South Dakota State, Wichita State, Boston, Central Florida, Long Beach State, Stanford, Michigan and Minnesota all advanced to the NCAA Regionals in 2021.

The Huskers will see Northern Iowa, Iowa State and South Dakota their first weekend of play at the UNI Dome Tournament.

NU faces Wichita State at Bowlin Stadium for the first home game of the season.

Nebraska will face Boston, Central Florida and Long Beach State at the Judi Garman Classic in California.

The Huskers host Stanford for one game at Bowlin Stadium on March 22.

NU will face Big Ten foes Michigan on the road and host Minnesota for three-game conference series.

HOME SWEET HOME

Nebraska will have 17 home games at Bowlin Stadium in 2022. The schedule will feature only 15 home dates, as two of the dates will be doubleheaders.

MICHIGAN STATE HOSTS BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

The 2022 Big Ten Tournament is set for May 12-14 at Michigan State's Secchia Stadium. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings will compete in the tournament, with the top four seeds earning a bye.

HUSKERS MAKE MARK IN RECORD BOOK WITH FOUR GRAND SLAMS

The 2022 Nebraska softball team has already made its mark tallying four grand slams through 22 games.

At the Troy Cox Classic, the Big Red smashed three grand slams. On Saturday, Feb. 19, the Huskers faced Northern Colorado, tallying four home runs. Cam Ybarra added the first grand slam of the year against the Bears. Ybarra hit a deep ball over the right center field fence in the top of the second inning to mark the first grand slam of the day.

Billie Andrews added her own grand slam to the mix in the top of the fifth inning. The sophomore hit one over the right center field fence also, to make it two on the day, and the season. On Sunday, Feb. 20, NU took on Southeastern Louisiana. Olivia Ferrell smashed one over the left center field fence to bring in four runs and mark the third grand slam of the weekend.

Kaylin Kinney added another grand slam against Wichita State in Bowlin Stadium, the first of her career. Kinney also recorded a two-run homer for a career-high six RBIs, the RBIs by a Husker in any game this season.



BIG RED HITS BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK HOMERS AGAINST NMSU

The Huskers hit back-to-back-to-back home runs against New Mexico State on Thursday, Feb. 17, 2022. Courtney Wallace started it off in the top of the fourth inning with a deep ball over the center field fence. Camyl Armendariz followed it up with a smashed ball of her own over the left field fence to mark the first hit of her career. Billie Andrews added the third homer of the inning, notching it over the right center field fence.

This marks the first time a Nebraska softball team has done so in 20 years. The last time the Huskers recorded back-to-back homers was in the top of the second inning against California on March 17, 2002. Nebraska would go on to win the game, 4-3.

ANDREWS EARNS BIG TEN CONFERENCE RECOGNITION

Sophomore infielder Billie Andrews was named Big Ten Player of the Week on Tuesday, March 8, by the Big Ten Conference. Andrews was recognized for an outstanding weekend in the home-opening series against Wichita State and South Dakota State. Andrews hit .500 in four games with five home runs. Andrews tallied 10 RBIs, a 1.750 slugging percentage and a .625 on-base percentage. The sophomore started all four games at shortstop and helped Nebraska to a 3-1 record in four games against 2021 NCAA Tournament teams.

The Gretna, Neb., native, homered in all four games last week and has hit a home run in five consecutive games overall. After homering in the first game against Wichita State, Andrews was 2-for-3 in the second game against the Shockers, tallying three RBIs and one home run. On Saturday, Andrews was 2-for-4 in the first game against South Dakota State, recording two home runs and three RBIs. She finished the weekend with another home run in the rematch with the Jackrabbits.

Three different Husker sophomore have been named the Big Ten Player of the Week through the first four weeks of the season, as Abbie Squier was honored on Feb. 14 and Sydney Gray won the award on Feb. 21.

NU SLUGGERS LEAD BIG TEN OFFENSIVE STATS

Nebraska has put up big numbers through the first 22 games of the season. Billie Andrews, Cam Ybarra and Sydney Gray have all been in the ranks for their success at the plate. They have combined for 25 home runs, 75 RBIs and 47 runs.

Billie Andrews, a first-team All-Big Ten selection in 2021, started right where she left over. The Gretna, Neb., native, currently holds a .459 batting average and has tallied 14 home runs, a nation leading total.

Cam Ybarra currently holds a .413 batting average. Ybarra has notched 26 hits with five doubles, three triples and four home runs, including a walk-off homer in the win against Sacramento State.

Sydney Gray returns to the 2022 roster after suffering a season-ending injury in 2021. The Tucson, Ariz., native, has held a .391 batting average, including 27 hits and 25 RBIs.

BOWLIN STADIUM



The 2022 season marks the 21st season Nebraska has called Bowlin Stadium home. The stadium's inaugural season was in 2002.

One of the top facilities in the country, Bowlin Stadium features seating for 2,500 fans, an underground system that heats the field and a large video board. Just past the right field fence is the Alex Gordon Training Complex, a spacious indoor facility that is large enough for Nebraska to take live batting practice inside the complex. The clubhouse features a locker room, players' lounge, training room and coaches' offices.

Nebraska has won nearly 70 percent of its games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers have hosted four NCAA Regionals at Bowlin Stadium and ranked in the top 25 nationally in attendance 14 times, including four seasons ranked in the top 10.


