HUSKERS READY FOR ROCK CHALK CHALLENGE

The Nebraska softball team (15-9) is set for the Rock Chalk Challenge in Lawrence, Kan., March 18-20. The Huskers will face three opponents in five games over the weekend.

On Saturday, March 19, NU will face Tulsa at 10 a.m. CT. Following game one, Nebraska will take on South Dakota at 12:30 p.m. CT.

On Sunday, March 20, the Huskers will face the Coyotes at 10 a.m. CT followed by a 12:30 p.m. CT matchup with the Golden Hurricane.

NU was originally set to take on Kansas as well but due to weather the schedule was condensed to two days.

The Huskers are coming off of a 4-3 record in California, claiming wins against Cal State Fullerton, Sacramento State, Boston University and Long Beach State. NU fell to No. 25 Central Florida and San Diego.

SCOUTING THE OPPONENTS

Tulsa (8-14) is coming off of a 2-2 weekend at the Texas Tech Invitational picking up two wins against Texas A&M - Corpus Christi and falling to Texas Tech twice.

The Golden Hurricane has faced two ranked opponents this season. In the first weekend of the season, Tulsa faced the then No. 19 Louisiana, falling 8-0. At the Texas Classic, the Golden Hurricane faced No. 23 Texas, dropping the first game 14-1 and the second game 5-1.

South Dakota (13-7) is coming off of a 1-3 weekend at the Memphis Tournament, picking up a win against Memphis, but falling to Central Arkansas, Southeastern Louisiana and Memphis. The Coyotes were set to face No. 10 Oklahoma State, but the game was canceled due to snow and frigid temperatures.

The Coyotes have faced one ranked

opponent this season. At the Bearkat Classic, South Dakota took on then-ranked No. 25 Wichita State, winning 3-0.

NEBRASKA 2022 SEASON NOTEBOOK

- Nebraska's roster features 18 players from **seven** different states.
- There are seven players who are Nebraska natives.
- **Rhonda Revelle** is in her 30th season leading her alma mater in 2022. Revelle is the second-longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle owns 1,035 wins at Nebraska. She is the all-time wins leader (male or female) in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach **Lori Sippel** is in her 33rd year at Nebraska. Sippel is the longest-tenured female assistant coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,339 of Nebraska's 1,516 all-time victories (88 percent).
- In her 14th season, assistant coach **Diane Miller** rounds out the Husker coaching staff. Miller has helped Nebraska's offense set more than 40 school records.
- **Courtney Wallace** received NFCA All-Region honors after her performance during the 2021 season. Wallace earned NFCA All-Midwest Region second team honors.
- **Billie Andrews** had a standout freshman season in 2021. The Gretna, Neb., native, was one of only two freshmen named to the 18-player All-Big Ten first team. Andrews will look to repeat those honors during the 2022 season.
- Fifth year senior **Olivia Ferrell** took advantage of the NCAA waiver for an extra year of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The roster features three newcomers including two freshmen and one transfer.
- NU added two freshmen catchers to the roster. **Mckinley Malecha** and **Ava Bredwell** are both expected to add depth to the position.
- **Mya Felder**, an Oregon-transfer, joins the Huskers after receiving NFCA All-Pacific Region honors after her 2021 season with Oregon.
- Sophomore **Abbie Squier** received the first weekly Big Ten honor of the season. Squier was named the Co-Big Ten Player of the Week for her performance at the UNI-Dome Classic.
- **Sydney Gray** earned the second Big Ten honor of the season as she was named the Co-Big Ten Player of the Week for her performance at the Troy Cox Classic.
- **Billie Andrews** was named Big Ten Player of the Week after notching five homers in the first weekend at Bowlin Stadium.
- Nebraska will travel to seven different states during the 2022 season including Iowa, New Mexico, California, Kansas, Michigan, Wisconsin and Ohio.
- The Big Red will host 17 games at Bowlin Stadium in 2022. The schedule will feature only 15 home dates as two of the dates will be doubleheaders.

NU SET FOR 54-GAME SCHEDULE

Nebraska is scheduled to play 54 games in 2022, including 17 home games, 22 away games and 15 games at a neutral site.

HUSKERS TRAVEL TO SEVEN STATES

Nebraska will travel to eight states this season, playing games in Iowa, New Mexico, California, Kansas, Michigan, Wisconsin and Ohio.

NU SET FOR 10 GAMES AGAINST 2021 NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAMS

Nebraska is slated to play nine teams that advanced to the 2021 NCAA Tournament last season. Northern Iowa, Iowa State, South Dakota State, Wichita State, Boston, Central Florida, Long Beach State, Stanford, Michigan and Minnesota all advanced to the NCAA Regionals in 2021.

The Huskers will see Northern Iowa, Iowa State and South Dakota their first weekend of play at the UNI Dome Tournament.

NU faces Wichita State at Bowlin Stadium for the first home game of the season.

Nebraska will face Boston, Central Florida and Long Beach State at the Judi Garman Classic in California.

The Huskers host Stanford for one game at Bowlin Stadium on March 22.

NU will face Big Ten foes Michigan on the road and host Minnesota for three-game conference series.

HOME SWEET HOME

Nebraska will have 17 home games at Bowlin Stadium in 2022. The schedule will feature only 15 home dates, as two of the dates will be doubleheaders.

MICHIGAN STATE HOSTS BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

The 2022 Big Ten Tournament is set for May 12-14 at Michigan State's Secchia Stadium. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings will compete in the tournament, with the top four seeds earning a bye.

OKC HOSTS WCWS

The 2022 Women's College World Series will be held at ASA Hall of Fame Stadium in Oklahoma City for the 24th straight season and the 31st time overall.

HUSKERS IN THE RANKS

- The Huskers are currently ranked No. 1 in the Big Ten Conference with a .316 batting average.
- Averaging 1.68 home runs per game, the Big Red ranks No. 1 in the Big Ten Conference.
- NU is ranked No. 1 in the Big Ten Conference in runs per game, averaging 6.77.
- Nebraska holds a .417 on base percentage which ranks No. 1 in the Big Ten Conference.
- NU has dominated in slugging percentage with a .566, ranking No. 1 in the Big Ten and No. 16 nationally.
- The Huskers have tallied 95 walks through 22 games, a number that ranks first in the Big Ten and ninth nationally.
- Averaging 0.23 triples per game, NU ranks third in the Big Ten.

NEBRASKA QUICK HITS

- **Billie Andrews** ranks first nationally with 14 home runs.
- The sophomore also ranks No. 1 in the NCAA with 0.64 home runs per game.
- Andrews also ranks first in runs per game with an average of 1.36.
- Andrews currently holds a 21-game hitting streak.
- Andrews entered the week as the only player in the country with 30 hits, 30 runs and 30 RBIs.
- **Cam Ybarra** ranks first in the conference in triples with 3 and triples per game (0.18).
- In the game against Northern Colorado, **Olivia Ferrell** made her 100th appearance in the circle.
- **Sydney Gray** ranks third in the Big Ten with seven home runs.
- **Billie Andrews, Sydney Gray** and **Kaylin Kinney** have all slugged two home runs in one game this season.
- Against New Mexico State, **Camyl Armendariz** smashed her first career hit, a home run to help the Huskers to a 14-4 win.
- **Courtney Wallace** set a career-high with 10 strikeouts against Central Florida.
- In the game against Long Beach State, **Olivia Ferrell** matched her career-high with 10 strikeouts.

HUSKERS MAKE MARK IN RECORD BOOK WITH FOUR GRAND SLAMS

The 2022 Nebraska softball team has already made its mark tallying four grand slams through 22 games.

At the Troy Cox Classic, the Big Red smashed three grand slams. On Saturday, Feb. 19, the Huskers faced Northern Colorado, tallying four home runs. Cam Ybarra added the first grand slam of the year against the Bears. Ybarra hit a deep ball over the right center field fence in the top of the second inning to mark the first grand slam of the day.

Billie Andrews added her own grand slam to the mix in the top of the fifth inning. The sophomore hit one over the right center field fence also, to make it two on the day, and the season. On Sunday, Feb. 20, NU took on Southeastern Louisiana. Olivia Ferrell smashed one over the left center field fence to bring in four runs and mark the third grand slam of the weekend.

Kaylin Kinney added another grand slam against Wichita State in Bowlin Stadium, the first of her career. Kinney also recorded a two-run homer for a career-high six RBIs, the RBIs by a Husker in any game this season.

The Huskers have slugged 35 homers through the first 20 games of the season. The 2022 squad has already reached the highest mark in school history for most homers through 20 games.



BOWLIN STADIUM



The 2022 season marks the 21st season Nebraska has called Bowlin Stadium home. The stadium's inaugural season was in 2002.

One of the top facilities in the country, Bowlin Stadium features seating for 2,500 fans, an underground system that heats the field and a large video board. Just past the right field fence is the Alex Gordon Training Complex, a spacious indoor facility that is large enough for Nebraska to take live batting practice inside the complex. The clubhouse features a locker room, players' lounge, training room and coaches' offices.

Nebraska has won nearly 70 percent of its games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers have hosted four NCAA Regionals at Bowlin Stadium and ranked in the top 25 nationally in attendance 14 times, including four seasons ranked in the top 10.
