The Nebraska softball team travels to Ann Arbor, Mich., this weekend for a three-game Big Ten Conference series with the No. 19 Michigan Wolverines. The teams will open conference play with a game on Friday at 5:30 p.m. (CT) followed by a game on Saturday at 1 p.m. (CT). The series finale is set for 2 p.m. (CT) on Sunday.

Friday's game will be broadcasted live on FS1 while Sunday's game will be on the Big Ten Network. Saturday's game will be available on BTN+ (subscription required). Fans can also listen to the live broadcast for all three games on the Huskers Radio Network or Huskers.com with the call from Nate Rohr. Live updates will be available on Twitter (@HuskerSoftball).

Nebraska (19-9) has won five of its last seven games with an offense that leads the Big Ten in numerous categories including hits, runs, RBIs, home runs, on base percentage and batting average. Sophomore Billie Andrews has led offensively with a .415 batting average and 16 home runs. Junior-transfer Mya Felder holds a .400 batting average, adding 26 hits and 16 RBIs.

In the circle, seniors Olivia Ferrell and Courtney Wallace have been leaders through the first half of the season. Ferrell (10-4) holds a 2.35 ERA with 96 strikeouts through 86.1 innings. Wallace (9-4) has a 3.64 ERA through 80.2 innings and has tossed 59 strikeouts.

QUICK HITTERS

- Nebraska (19-9) will face No. 19 Michigan (18-7), the first ranked opponent of the season.
- Nebraska ranks first in the conference with a .311 batting average.
- The Huskers also rank first in the Big Ten in home runs per game (1.54), on base percentage (.404), scoring (6.18), and walks (110).
- **Billie Andrews** set the sophomore school record for home runs in a season with 16.
- **Billie Andrews** leads the nation in home runs (16), home runs per game (0.57) and total bases (92).
- **Billie Andrews** leads the conference in hits (39), RBIs (25), RBIs per game (1.25) and slugging percentage (0.979).
- **Cam Ybarra** has tallied three triples this season, a number that ranks third in the Big Ten.
- **Sydney Gray** is second in the conference in walks per game with 0.75.
- **Sydney Gray** is fourth in the conference in total bases (57) and fifth in home runs (7) and on base percentage (0.495).
- **Olivia Ferrell** ranks fifth in the conference with 10 wins while **Courtney Wallace** ranks seventh with nine.

HUSKERS TO WATCH



Billie Andrews leads the nation in home runs with 16, a total that is three more above the rest. Andrews holds a .415 batting average with 39 hits and 35 RBIs.



Olivia Ferrell is 10-4 in the circle with a 2.35 ERA. The senior has tallied 96 strikeouts through 86.1 innings. Ferrell has tossed nine complete games and two shutouts.

NEBRASKA 2022 SEASON NOTEBOOK

- Nebraska's roster features 18 players from **seven** different states.
- There are seven players who are Nebraska natives.
- **Rhonda Revelle** is in her 30th season leading her alma mater in 2022. Revelle is the second-longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle owns 1,039 wins at Nebraska. She is the all-time wins leader (male or female) in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach **Lori Sippel** is in her 33rd year at Nebraska. Sippel is the longest-tenured female assistant coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,343 of Nebraska's 1,520 all-time victories (88 percent).
- In her 14th season, assistant coach **Diane Miller** rounds out the Husker coaching staff. Miller has helped Nebraska's offense set more than 40 school records.
- **Courtney Wallace** received NFCA All-Region honors after her performance during the 2021 season. Wallace earned NFCA All-Midwest Region second team honors.
- **Billie Andrews** had a standout freshman season in 2021. The Gretna, Neb., native, was one of only two freshmen named to the 18-player All-Big Ten first team. Andrews will look to repeat those honors during the 2022 season.
- Fifth year senior **Olivia Ferrell** took advantage of the NCAA waiver for an extra year of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The roster features three newcomers including two freshmen and one transfer.
- NU added two freshmen catchers to the roster. **Mckinley Malecha** and **Ava Bredwell** are both expected to add depth to the position.
- **Mya Felder**, an Oregon-transfer, joins the Huskers after receiving NFCA All-Pacific Region honors after her 2021 season with Oregon.
- Sophomore **Abbie Squier** received the first weekly Big Ten honor of the season. Squier was named the Co-Big Ten Player of the Week for her performance at the UNI-Dome Classic.
- **Sydney Gray** earned the second Big Ten honor of the season as she was named the Co-Big Ten Player of the Week for her performance at the Troy Cox Classic.
- **Billie Andrews** was named Big Ten Player of the Week after notching five homers in the first weekend at Bowlin Stadium.
- Nebraska will travel to seven different states during the 2022 season including Iowa, New Mexico, California, Kansas, Michigan, Wisconsin and Ohio.
- The Big Red will host 17 games at Bowlin Stadium in 2022. The schedule will feature only 15 home dates as two of the dates will be doubleheaders.

HUSKERS IN THE RANKS

- The Huskers are currently ranked No. 1 in the Big Ten Conference with a .311 batting average.
- Ranking first in the Big Ten Conference, the Big Red averages 1.50 homers per game. This average ranks 15th in the NCAA.
- The Huskers also lead the conference with 42 homers on the season, a number that ranks eighth in the nation.
- NU is No. 1 in the Big Ten Conference with a .408 on-base percentage.
- The Big Red is first in slugging percentage in the conference with a 0.552.
- Nebraska has been walked 110 times this season. This numbers leads the Big Ten and is ninth in the nation.
- The Huskers bring in 5.93 runs per game, ranking second in the conference.

NEBRASKA QUICK HITS

- **Billie Andrews** leads the nation with 16 home runs on the season, a total that is three above the players in second.
- The sophomore also ranks No. 1 in the NCAA in home runs per game with an average of 0.59.
- **Andrews** also ranks first in total bases with 91.
- The Gretna, Neb., native ranks first in the Big Ten Conference in slugging percentage (1.011).
- **Andrews** is also ranked first in the conference in RBIs with 1.30 per game.
- **Cam Ybarra** ranks second in the conference in triples with 3 and triples per game (0.18).
- **Sydney Gray** ranks fourth in the Big Ten with seven home runs.
- In the game against Northern Colorado, **Olivia Ferrell** made her 100th career appearance in the circle.
- **Billie Andrews, Sydney Gray, Abbie Squier** and **Kaylin Kinney** have all slugged two home runs in one game this season.
- Against New Mexico State, **Camyl Armendariz** smashed her first career hit, a home run, to help the Huskers to a 14-4 win.
- **Courtney Wallace** set a career-high with 10 strikeouts against Central Florida.
- In the game against Long Beach State, **Olivia Ferrell** matched her career-high with 10 strikeouts.

BIG RED RECORDS

- The Huskers set a new Nebraska record with 35 home runs through the first 20 games of the season. The previous record was 28 in 2016.
- **Billie Andrews** set the record for most homers as an individual through 20 games with 13. The record was previously held by MJ Knighten who had 12 in the first 20 games in 2016.
- **Andrews** also set the Nebraska sophomore record for most home runs in a season with 16. The previous record was held by Ali Viola who had 15 in 1996.

HUSKERS MAKE MARK IN RECORD BOOK WITH FOUR GRAND SLAMS

The 2022 Nebraska softball team has already made its mark tallying four grand slams through 22 games.

At the Troy Cox Classic, the Big Red smashed three grand slams. On Saturday, Feb. 19, the Huskers faced Northern Colorado, tallying four home runs. Cam Ybarra added the first grand slam of the year against the Bears. Ybarra hit a deep ball over the right center field fence in the top of the second inning to mark the first grand slam of the day.

Billie Andrews added her own grand slam to the mix in the top of the fifth inning. The sophomore hit one over the right center field fence also, to make it two on the day, and the season. On Sunday, Feb. 20, NU took on Southeastern Louisiana. Olivia Ferrell smashed one over the left center field fence to bring in four runs and mark the third grand slam of the weekend. Kaylin Kinney added another grand slam against Wichita State in Bowlin Stadium, the first of her career. Kinney also recorded a two-run homer for a career-high six RBIs, the RBIs by a Husker in any game this season.

BOWLIN STADIUM



The 2022 season marks the 21st season Nebraska has called Bowlin Stadium home. The stadium's inaugural season was in 2002.

One of the top facilities in the country, Bowlin Stadium features seating for 2,500 fans, an underground system that heats the field and a large video board. Just past the right field fence is the Alex Gordon Training Complex, a spacious indoor facility that is large enough for Nebraska to take live batting practice inside the complex. The clubhouse features a locker room, players' lounge, training room and coaches' offices.

Nebraska has won nearly 70 percent of its games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers have hosted four NCAA Regionals at Bowlin Stadium and ranked in the top 25 nationally in attendance 14 times, including four seasons ranked in the top 10.
