The Nebraska softball team is set to host Creighton in Lincoln, Neb., this Tuesday, March 29. The game will start 4 p.m. (CT) at Bowlin Stadium. Fans can listen to the game on the Huskers Radio Network or Huskers.com with the call by Nate Rohr and Mattie Fowler Burkhardt. It will also be streamed live on BTN+ (subscription required).

Nebraska (21-9) has won the last six games with an offense that leads the Big Ten in numerous categories including hits, runs, home runs, RBIs, total bases, slugging percentage and on base percentage. Billie Andrews leads the Big Ten with a .950 slugging percentage, a combined 1.437 on base and slugging percentage and home runs with 17. Junior-transfer Mya Felder leads the Huskers with a .417 batting average, tallying 30 hits, four doubles, two homers and 16 RBIs.

In the circle, seniors Olivia Ferrell and Courtney Wallace have been leaders throughout the first half of the season. Ferrell (11-4) holds a 2.37 ERA with 101 strikeouts through 91.2 innings. Wallace (10-4) has a 3.60 ERA through 89.1 innings and has tossed 64 strikeouts.

Creighton (13-11) opened Big East play last weekend against Providence, claiming the series, 2-1. Emma Rosonke leads the Bluejay offense, holding a .373 batting average including 22 hits and seven homers. Kailey Wilson has added five homers and 17 RBIs with a .368 batting average. In the circle, Mikayla Santa Cruz holds a 5-6 record and a 3.84 ERA while Kate Mullally (3-1) has a 2.65 ERA.

- Nebraska ranks first in the conference in on-base percentage (.398).
- The Huskers are also first in the Big Ten in slugging percentage (.541).
- NU averages 1.57 home runs per game, a number that is at the top of the conference.
- Billie Andrews set the sophomore school record for home runs in a season with 17.
- Billie Andrews leads the nation in home runs (17) and home runs per game (0.57).
- Billie Andrews leads the conference in slugging percentage (.950), on base and slugging percentage combined (1.437), home runs (17) and RBIs (36).

- **Cam Ybarra** has tallied three triples this season, a number that ranks third in the Big Ten.
- Sydney Gray is second in the conference in walks with 21.
- Sydney Gray is third in the conference in RBIs (28).
- Olivia Ferrell has tallied 36 batters striking out looking, ranking first in the Big Ten.
- Olivia Ferrell is tied for third-most wins in the Big Ten with 11.
- Courtney Wallace has tallied five saves which is fifth in the conference.

Billie Andrews leads the nation in home runs with 17, a total that is two more above the rest. Andrews holds a .396 batting average with 40 hits and 36 RBIs.

Olivia Ferrell is 11-4 in the circle with a 2.37 ERA. The senior has tallied 101 strikeouts through 91.2 innings. Ferrell has tossed nine complete games and two shutouts.

NEBRASKA 2022 SEASON NOTEBOOK

- Nebraska's roster features 18 players from **seven** different states.
- There are seven players who are Nebraska natives.
- Rhonda Revelle is in her 30th season leading her alma mater in 2022. Revelle is the second-longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle owns 1,041 wins at Nebraska. She is the all-time wins leader (male or female) in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach **Lori Sippel** is in her 33rd year at Nebraska. Sippel is the longest-tenured female assistant coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,345 of Nebraska's 1,522 all-time victories (88 percent).
- In her 14th season, assistant coach **Diane Miller** rounds out the Husker coaching staff. Miller has helped Nebraska's offense set more than 40 school records.
- **Courtney Wallace** received NFCA All-Region honors after her performance during the 2021 season. Wallace earned NFCA All-Midwest Region second team honors.
- Billie Andrews had a standout freshman season in 2021. The Gretna, Neb., native, was one of only two freshmen named to the 18-player All-Big Ten first team. Andrews will look to repeat those honors during the 2022 season.
- Fifth year senior **Olivia Ferrell** took advantage of the NCAA waiver for an extra year of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

- The roster features three newcomers including two freshmen and one transfer.
- NU added two freshmen catchers to the roster. **Mckinley Malecha** and **Ava Bredwell** are both expected to add depth to the position.
- **Mya Felder**, an Oregon-transfer, joins the Huskers after receiving NFCA All-Pacific Region honors after her 2021 season with Oregon.
- Sophomore **Abbie Squier** received the first weekly Big Ten honor of the season. Squier was named the Co-Big Ten Player of the Week for her performance at the UNI-Dome Classic.
- Sydney Gray earned the second Big Ten honor of the season as she was named the Co-Big Ten Player of the Week for her performance at the Troy Cox Classic.
- Billie Andrews was named Big Ten Player of the Week after notching five homers in the first weekend at Bowlin Stadium.
- Nebraska will travel to seven different states during the 2022 season including lowa, New Mexico, California, Kansas, Michigan, Wisconsin and Ohio.
- The Big Red will host 17 games at Bowlin Stadium in 2022. The schedule will feature only 15 home dates as two of the dates will be doubleheaders.

BOWLIN STADIUM



The 2022 season marks the 21st season Nebraska has called Bowlin Stadium home. The stadium's inaugural season was in 2002.

One of the top facilities in the country, Bowlin Stadium features seating for 2,500 fans, an underground system that heats the field and a large video board. Just past the right field fence is the Alex Gordon Training Complex, a spacious indoor facility that is large enough for Nebraska to take live batting practice inside the complex. The clubhouse features a locker room, players' lounge, training room and coaches' offices.

Nebraska has won nearly 70 percent of its games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers have hosted four NCAA Regionals at Bowlin Stadium and ranked in the top 25 nationally in attendance 14 times, including four seasons ranked in the top 10.




