The Nebraska softball team is set to host Rutgers in a three-game series in Lincoln, Neb. this April 1-3 at Bowlin Stadium. Fans can listen to the games on the Huskers Radio Network or Huskers.com with the call by Nate Rohr and Mattie Fowler Burkhardt. All games will also be streamed live on BTN+ (subscription required).

Nebraska (22-9) has won the last seven games with an offense that leads the Big Ten in numerous categories including runs, hits, home runs, RBIs, total bases, slugging percentage and on-base percentage. Billie Andrews is the conference and national leader in home runs with 17. Andrews is also the Big Ten leader in RBIs (37), total bases (96), home runs per game (0.55), RBIs per game (1.19) and slugging percentage (.932). Junior-transfer Mya Felder leads the Huskers with a .425 batting average, tallying 31 hits, five doubles, two homers and 17 RBIs.

In the circle, seniors Olivia Ferrell and Courtney Wallace have been leaders throughout the first half of the season. Ferrell (12-4) holds a 2.24 ERA with 109 strikeouts through 96.2 innings. Wallace (10-4) has a 3.60 ERA through 89.1 innings and has tossed 64 strikeouts.

Rutgers (23-12) opened Big Ten Conference play against Minnesota, dropping the series, 2-1. The Scarlet Knights claimed a midweek victory in an in-state matchup against Monmouth, winning 11-3. This will be Rutgers first time traveling to Lincoln to take on the Huskers.

NEBRASKA 2022 SEASON NOTEBOOK

- Nebraska's roster features 18 players from **seven** different states.
- There are seven players who are Nebraska natives.
- Rhonda Revelle is in her 30th season leading her alma mater in 2022. Revelle is the second-longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle owns 1,042 wins at Nebraska. She is the all-time wins leader (male or female) in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach Lori Sippel is in her 33rd year at Nebraska. Sippel is the longest-tenured female assistant coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,346 of Nebraska's 1,523 all-time victories (88 percent).
- In her 14th season, assistant coach **Diane Miller** rounds out the Husker coaching staff. Miller has helped Nebraska's offense set more than 40 school records.
- Courtney Wallace recevied NFCA All-Region honors after her performance during the 2021 season. Wallace earned NFCA All-Midwest Region second team honors.
- Billie Andrews had a standout freshman season in 2021. The Gretna, Neb., native, was one of only two freshmen named to the 18-player All-Big Ten first team. Andrews will look to repeat those honors during the 2022 season.
- Fifth year senior Olivia Ferrell took advantage of the NCAA waiver for an extra year of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

- The roster features three newcomers including two freshmen and one transfer.
- NU added two freshmen catchers to the roster. Mckinley Malecha and Ava Bredwell are both expected to add depth to the position.
- Mya Felder, an Oregon-transfer, joins the Huskers after receiving NFCA All-Pacific Region honors after her 2021 season with Oregon.
- Nebraska will travel to seven different states during the 2022 season including lowa, New Mexico, California, Kansas, Michigan, Wisconsin and Ohio.
- The Big Red will host 16 games at Bowlin Stadium in 2022. The schedule will feature only 14 home dates as two of the dates will be doubleheaders.
- Sophomore Abbie Squier received the first weekly Big Ten honor of the season.
 Squier was named the Co-Big Ten Player of the Week for her performance at the UNI-Dome Classic.
- Sydney Gray earned the second Big Ten honor of the season as she was named the Co-Big Ten Player of the Week for her performance at the Troy Cox Classic.
- Billie Andrews was named Big Ten Player of the Week after notching five homers in the first weekend at Bowlin Stadium.

Right-handed pitcher Olivia Ferrell has been a force in the circle for Nebraska this season. The senior has claimed 12 victories and recorded three shutouts. Ferrell has pitched 10 complete games and averages 1.13 strikeouts per inning pitched. The Elkhorn, Neb., native, has only gotten better through five years for the Big Red.

In 2021, Ferrell struck out 100 batters while walking 50 for a 2:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio. The last pitcher to have better than a 2:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio was Elkhorn, Neb., native, Ashley Hagemann in 2012. The right-handed pitcher in her senior season tallied 320 strikeouts and 146 walks.

Ferrell continues to develop as a strong leader in circle. The senior currently has better than a 3:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio with 109 strikeouts and only 32 walks through 96.2 innings. Hagemann was also last pitcher to achieve this. In 2011, Hagemann struck out 344 batters and walked 108 in her junior season in the circle.

BOWLIN STADIUM



The 2022 season marks the 21st season Nebraska has called Bowlin Stadium home. The stadium's inaugural season was in 2002.

One of the top facilities in the country, Bowlin Stadium features seating for 2,500 fans, an underground system that heats the field and a large video board. Just past the right field fence is the Alex Gordon Training Complex, a spacious indoor facility that is large enough for Nebraska to take live batting practice inside the complex. The clubhouse features a locker room, players' lounge, training room and coaches' offices.

Nebraska has won 70 percent of its games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers have hosted four NCAA Regionals at Bowlin Stadium and ranked in the top 25 nationally in attendance 14 times, including four seasons ranked in the top 10.



SCOUTING THE RUTGERS SCARLET KNIGHTS (23-12)

Rutgers come into the game with a 23-12 record after starting Big Ten play with a 1-2 series loss against Minnesota.

Nebraska and Rutgers share one non-conference opponent this season in New Mexico State. Both the Huskers and Scarlet Knights recorded wins against the Aggies.

- Rutgers has had its best start to a season since 1981. The Scarlet Knights opened 2022
 at 10-3 which is the best start for the program since 1981. In 1981, Rutgers finished 28-3
 overall having opened the season at 28-1 and advancing to the AIAW College World
 Series.
- The Scarlet Knights surpassed its win total from 2021 three weeks into the season. Rutgers
 picked up win number nine on Feb. 25 in a 3-2 eight-inning victory over Siena during The
 Spring Games.
- Rutgers put together an eight-game win streak from Feb. 18-26, the longest for the Scarlet Knights since 1994. During the eight-game win streak, Rutgers went 5-0 at the Pirate Clash picking up a win over host ECU along with a pair of victories against Wagner and Colgate. The previous streak had RU winning 10 games between April 5-18, 1994.
- Kristen Butler enters her fourth season as the head coach of the Scarlet Knights.
- Gabrielle Callaway was named Co-Big Ten Player of the Week after hitting .714 (5-for-7) including three doubles and a grand slam with three runs and seven RBIs againt Minnesota.
- Rutgers has earned Big Ten Weekly honors this season including two-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week Maddie Lawson and Big Ten Co-Player of the Week Kyleigh Sand.
- **Kyleigh Sand** leads the Scarlet Knights with a batting average of .407 and 46 hits. The Louisiana Lafayette-transfer set a career-high with four hits against St. Peter's on March 18, 2022.
- Two-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week, **Maddie Lawson** has had a strong start to her collegiate career. Lawson hit .500 (8-for-16) during the Pirate Clash, leading Rutgers to a 5-0 weekend. She has also recorded four three-hit games this season.
- Gabrielle Callaway leads RU with 5 home runs through 35 games. Callaway has started every game for the Scarlet Knights at first base since 2020.
- In the circle, **Jaden Vickers** leads the Scarlet Knights with a 14-3 record including three shutouts and a 3.46 ERA. The junior has a career record of 16-12.
- Ashley Hitchcock has tallied 9 wins in the circle with three shutotus and two saves. In 2021,
