The Nebraska softball team hosts the Iowa Hawkeyes at Bowlin Stadium for a doubleheader on Tuesday, April 12. The first game is set to start at 3 p.m. followed by 5:30 game two start. Fans can listen to the games on the Huskers Radio Network or Huskres.com with the call by Nate Rohr and Mattie Fowler Burkhardt. Both games will be broadcasted live on the Big Ten Network.

Nebraska has won its last 13 games with an offense that leads the Big Ten in numerous categories including runs, hits, home runs, RBIs, total bases, slugging percentage, walks and on-base percentage. Sophomore Billie Andrews has been a leading force on the offense, leading the conference in home runs and walks and is among the top three in slugging percentage, runs scored and RBIs.

In the circle, senior Olivia Ferrell has been a leader through 37 games. The senior is ranked fifth in the Big Ten with a 2.00 ERA, third in wins with 15 and seventh in strikeouts with 123. Courtney Wallace (11-4) has added 71 strikeouts through 99.1 innings with a 3.59 ERA, adding depth to the pitching staff.

Iowa (18-18, 1-8 Big Ten) is coming off of a 1-2 series against Minnesota where the Hawkeyes picked up their first conference win in game two of the three-game series. Iowa opened Big Ten Conference play with 0-3 series losses to Wisconsin and Maryland.

LEADING OFF...

- The Huskers (8-0) are the only undefeated team in conference play in the Big Ten.
- Nebraska ranks first in the conference in runs (239), hits (320), home runs (58), RBIs (221), total bases (563), slugging percentage (.550), walks (139) and onbase percentage (.402).
- NU leads the conference in double plays per game with 0.46.
- Iowa will take on Nebraska in Lincoln for the 11th time in program history.
- The Big Red is looking for its 14th and 15th consecutive wins. This would mark the longest consecutive win-streak since NU had 23-game win streak in 2002.

- NU is looking for their eighth and ninth consecutive Big Ten win. This would match the longest win-streak in the Big Ten era. The Huskers had a 10-game win streak in 2014.
- Nebraska's .975 fielding percentage is currently on pace to tie the school record of .973 set in 2006.
- Abbie Squier has recorded a hit in the last 12 games. She looks to extend her hitting streak on Tuesday.
- Billie Andrews leads the Big Ten Conference in home runs (17) and walks (29) while ranking among the top three in slugging percentage (.887), runs scored (42) and RBIs (41).

NEBRASKA 2022 SEASON NOTEBOOK

- Nebraska's roster features 18 players from **seven** different states.
- There are seven players who are Nebraska natives.
- Rhonda Revelle is in her 30th season leading her alma mater in 2022. Revelle is the second-longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle owns 1,048 wins at Nebraska. She is the all-time wins leader (male or female) in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach Lori Sippel is in her 33rd year at Nebraska. Sippel is the longest-tenured female assistant coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,352 of Nebraska's 1,529 all-time victories (88 percent).
- In her 14th season, assistant coach **Diane Miller** rounds out the Husker coaching staff. Miller has helped Nebraska's offense set more than 40 school records.
- Courtney Wallace recevied NFCA All-Region honors after her performance during the 2021 season. Wallace earned NFCA All-Midwest Region second team honors.
- Billie Andrews had a standout freshman season in 2021. The Gretna, Neb., native, was one of only two freshmen named to the 18-player All-Big Ten first team. Andrews will look to repeat those honors during the 2022 season.
- Fifth year senior **Olivia Ferrell** took advantage of the NCAA waiver for an extra year of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

- The roster features three newcomers including two freshmen and one transfer.
- NU added two freshmen catchers to the roster. Mckinley Malecha and Ava Bredwell are both expected to add depth to the position.
- Mya Felder, an Oregon-transfer, joins the Huskers after receiving NFCA All-Pacific Region honors after her 2021 season with Oregon.
- Nebraska will travel to seven different states during the 2022 season including lowa, New Mexico, California, Kansas, Michigan, Wisconsin and Ohio.
- The Big Red will host 16 games at Bowlin Stadium in 2022. The schedule will feature only 14 home dates as two of the dates will be doubleheaders.

- **Billie Andrews** is tied for fifth for most home runs in a season with Christie McCoy who notched 17 in 1998. The current record is held by Ali Viola who smashed 22 homers in 1998
- **Billie Andrews** had the third-longest streak for games with a hit in Nebraska history after tallying at least one hit through 23 games from Feb. 12-March 19.

BOWLIN STADIUM



The 2022 season marks the 21st season Nebraska has called Bowlin Stadium home. The stadium's inaugural season was in 2002.

One of the top facilities in the country, Bowlin Stadium features seating for 2,500 fans, an underground system that heats the field and a large video board. Just past the right field fence is the Alex Gordon Training Complex, a spacious indoor facility that is large enough for Nebraska to take live batting practice inside the complex. The clubhouse features a locker room, players' lounge, training room and coaches' offices.

Nebraska has won 70 percent of its games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers have hosted four NCAA Regionals at Bowlin Stadium and ranked in the top 25 nationally in attendance 14 times, including four seasons ranked in the top 10.



SCOUTING THE IOWA HAWKEYES (18-18)

Iowa comes into the Tuesday doubleheader with a 18-18 record (1-8 Big Ten) after claiming its first Big Ten win in game two over the Minnesota Gophers. The Hawkeyes eventually dropped the series, 1-2.

The Hawkeyes opened conference play hosting Wisconsin. The Hawkeyes fell to the Badgers 0-3.

In week two of conference play, the Hawkeyes traveled to Maryland, dropping three games to the Terrapins.

Iowa and Nebraska shared five common non-conference opponents this season in South Dakota State, San Diego, Kansas, Wichita State and Drake. The Hawkeyes picked up wins against South Dakota State, San Diego, Kansas and Drake, but fell to Wichita State.

- These two games will mark the 40th and 41st meeting between the two teams.
- The Hawkeyes will travel to Lincoln for the 11th time in program history.
- lowa is led by Head Coach Renee Gillispie who is in her fourth season with the Hawkeyes.
- **Nia Carter** leads the Hawkeyes with a .431 batting average. Carter has tallied 47 hits with two doubles, two triples and 15 RBIs.
- In the Big Ten Conference, **Nia Carter** is third in batting average (.431), seventh in on-base percentage (0.496) and fourth in hits (47).
- Tristin Doster and Denali Loecker have both smashed five homers this season.
- Brylee Klosterman has tallied eight doubles through 36 games, the most from an Iowa player in 2022.
- Denali Loecker holds a 3.57 ERA with nine wins in the circle. Loecker has pitched four complete games and three shutouts.

A 14-run second inning powered the 19th-ranked Huskers to an 18-0 five-inning victory over Iowa as NU completed a three-game sweep of the Hawkeyes in front of a season-high 1,161 fans. The 18 runs were the most Nebraska has ever scored in a conference game and marked the first-most runs in any game in program history. 
