The Nebraska softball team hosts Minnesota in Lincoln, Neb. this weekend, April 15-17. The Huskers will face the Gophers in game one on Friday starting at 5 p.m. This game will be broadcasted live on the Big Ten Network. Game two is set for Saturday at 1 p.m. while the final game of the series will be Sunday at 12 p.m. Saturday and Sunday's game will be streamed live on BTN+ (subscription required). Fans can follow the action live on the Huskers Radio Network and Huskers.com with the call from Nate Rohr and Mattie Fowler Burkhardt.

Nebraska has won its last 15 games with an offense that leads the Big Ten in numerous categories including runs, hits, home runs, RBIs, total bases, slugging percentage, walks and on-base percentage. Sophomore Billie Andrews has been a force on offense, leading the conference in home runs, runs scored, RBIs and walks. Junior-transfer Mya Felder leads the Big Red with a .402 batting average, tallying 40 hits, six doubles, three homers and 26 RBIs. Olivia Ferrell leads in the circle with 15 victories, holding a 2.00 ERA through 115.2 innings.

Minnesota (19-15-1) is 5-4 in conference play. The Gophers are coming off of a 2-1 series win over Iowa. UM opened Big Ten competition at Rutgers, claiming the series 2-1. In week two, the Gophers fell to Illinois, dropping the series, 1-2. Minnesota is coming off of a midweek matchup with South Dakota State where the Gophers picked up the win after a walk-off homer in the eighth inning.

LEADING OFF...

- The Huskers (10-0) are the only undefeated team in conference play in the Big Ten.
- Nebraska ranks first in the conference in runs (261), hits (346), home runs (61), RBIs (244), total bases (604), slugging percentage (.561), walks (144) and on-base percentage (.408).
- NU also leads the conference in home runs per game with 1.57.
- Minnesota travels to Nebraska for the first time since 2019. The Gophers lead in Lincoln 12-5.
- Nebraska's .974 fielding percentage is currently on pace to break the school record of .973 set in 2006.
- The Big Red is looking for its 11th consecutive conference victory. This would be the longest conference win-streak for the Huskers since joining the Big Ten in 2012.
- The Huskers currently average 6.7 runs per game which is on track for one of the highest averages in school history. The current record was set in 2015 when NU averaged 6.90 runs per game.
- **Mya Felder** currently holds a .402 batting average. She looks to be the first Husker to have a batting average above .400 since 2016 and only the fifth NU player in history.

Olivia Ferrell is 15-4 in the circle with a 2.00 ERA. The senior has tallied 123 strikeouts through 115.2 innings. Ferrell has tossed 11 complete games and four shutouts.

NEBRASKA 2022 SEASON NOTEBOOK

- Nebraska's roster features 18 players from **seven** different states.
- There are seven players who are Nebraska natives.
- **Rhonda Revelle** is in her 30th season leading her alma mater in 2022. Revelle is the second-longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle owns 1,050 wins at Nebraska. She is the all-time wins leader (male or female) in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach **Lori Sippel** is in her 33rd year at Nebraska. Sippel is the longest-tenured female assistant coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,354 of Nebraska's 1,531 all-time victories (88 percent).
- In her 14th season, assistant coach **Diane Miller** rounds out the Husker coaching staff. Miller has helped Nebraska's offense set more than 40 school records.
- **Courtney Wallace** received NFCA All-Region honors after her performance during the 2021 season. Wallace earned NFCA All-Midwest Region second team honors.
- **Billie Andrews** had a standout freshman season in 2021. The Gretna, Neb., native, was one of only two freshmen named to the 18-player All-Big Ten first team. Andrews will look to repeat those honors during the 2022 season.
- Fifth year senior **Olivia Ferrell** took advantage of the NCAA waiver for an extra year of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

- The roster features three newcomers including two freshmen and one transfer.
- NU added two freshmen catchers to the roster. **Mckinley Malecha** and **Ava Bredwell** are both expected to add depth to the position.
- **Mya Felder**, an Oregon-transfer, joins the Huskers after receiving NFCA All-Pacific Region honors after her 2021 season with Oregon.
- Nebraska will travel to seven different states during the 2022 season including Iowa, New Mexico, California, Kansas, Michigan, Wisconsin and Ohio.
- The Big Red will host 16 games at Bowlin Stadium in 2022. The schedule will feature only 14 home dates as two of the dates will be doubleheaders.

NEBRASKA QUICK HITS

- Minnesota travels to Nebraska for the first time since 2019. The Gophers are 12-5 in Lincoln.
- The Gophers claimed the last series, 3-1, in 2021.
- Nebraska is 17-0 when hitting more than one homer in a game.
- The Huskers .561 slugging percentage is on-track to blow past the previous record of .505 which was set in 2015.
- **Cam Ybarra** is hitting .500 (17-for-34) with three doubles, one triple and two homers in 10 home games this season.
- **Billie Andrews** has tallied six home runs at Bowlin Stadium in 2022.
- **Olivia Ferrell** is 4-1 in four starts at home with a 1.96 ERA and 31 strikeouts.
- **Billie Andrews, Sydney Gray** and **Kaylin Kinney** have all slugged two home runs in one game this season.
- **Billie** and **Brooke Andrews** have recorded homers in the same game three times this season.
- **Abbie Squier** has recorded two homers in a single, twice this season.

- Nebraska ranks first in the conference in runs (261), hits (346), home runs (61), RBIs (244), total bases (604), slugging percentage (.561), walks (144) and on-base percentage (.408).
- **Billie Andrews** leads the Big Ten in home runs (18), runs scored (45), RBIs (45) and walks (29).
- Second in the conference, **Billie Andrews** holds a .870 slugging average.
- **Billie Andrews** is also fifth in the Big Ten in stolen bases with 14.
- **Billie Andrews** (47), **Cam Ybarra** (45), and **Sydney Gray** (43) are fifth, seventh and 10th in the Big Ten in hits.
- **Mya Felder** is 10th in the conference with a .402 batting average.
- **Cam Ybarra** is tied for second in triples in the Big Ten with three.
- **Olivia Ferrell** is tied for second in the conference with 15 victories.
- **Courtney Wallace** is second in the Big Ten with five saves.

BIG RED RECORDS

- The Huskers set a new Nebraska record with 35 home runs through the first 20 games of the season. The previous record was 28 in 2016.
- **Billie Andrews** set the record for most homers as an individual through 20 games with 13. The record was previously held by MJ Knighten who had 12 in the first 20 games in 2016.
- **Billie Andrews** also set the Nebraska sophomore record for most home runs in a season with 18. The previous record was held by Ali Viola who had 15 in 1996.
- **Billie Andrews** is tied for third for most home runs in a season with Taylor Edwards (2011 & 2014) with 18. The current record is held by Ali Viola who smashed 22 homers in 1998.
- **Billie Andrews** had the third-longest streak for games with a hit in Nebraska history after tallying at least one hit through 23 games from Feb. 12-March 19.
- **Billie Andrews** tied the school record twice after drawing four walks in a single game. She tied the record in the first two games in the Rutgers series.

NEBRASKA BY THE NUMBERS

62 NCAA TOURNAMENT WINS
Nebraska has won 62 games in its 24 NCAA Tournament appearances (62-52). The Huskers 62 all-time wins ranks second.

30 ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS
A total of 22 Huskers have combined to earn 30 CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, the second-most in softball NCAA history.

27 ALL-AMERICANS
Nebraska has produced 27 All-Americans, including eight first-team selections, seven two-time picks and two three-time All-Americans.

24 NCAA TOURNAMENTS
The Huskers have made 24 appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including 13 straight from 1995 to 2007. Nebraska's 24 postseason appearances rank second in the Big Ten.

21 REVELLE ALL-AMERICANS
Rhonda Revelle has guided 13 players to a total of 21 All-America honor in her first 29 seasons as Nebraska's head coach.

19 CONFERENCE TITLES
Nebraska has won a total of 19 conference championships. The Huskers won 12 Big Eight titles, six Big 12 crowns and captured their first Big Ten title in 2014.

15 TOP-25 RANKINGS
Nebraska has been ranked in the final NFCA poll in 15 of the 27 years the poll has existed. The Huskers were one of only six teams nationally to be ranked in the final poll in each of the first 12 years it existed (1995 to 2006).

14 REVELLE ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS
Rhonda Revelle has produced 14 academic All-Americans at Nebraska. That total ranks fourth among all softball head coaches in NCAA history.

7 WCWS APPEARANCES
Nebraska has advanced to the Women's College World Series seven times to rank 14th in NCAA history.

4 SOFTBALL OLYMPIANS
Four former Huskers have competed in the Olympics, with a pair of former players competing in each of the last two Olympics.

NEBRASKA REACHES 60 HOME RUN MARK

The Big Red have already tallied 61 homers through 39 games of the season. This marks the fourth time in school history Nebraska has hit at least 60 home runs. 2016 was the last time the Huskers reached the 60 home-run mark, finishing the season with 65. In 2014, the Huskers set a school record with 73 homers in a season.

HUSKERS MAKE MARK IN RECORD BOOK WITH SIX GRAND SLAMS

The 2022 Nebraska softball team has already made its mark tallying six grand slams through 39 games. At the Troy Cox Classic, the Big Red smashed three grand slams. The Huskers had two against Northern Colorado, one from Cam Ybarra and one from Billie Andrews. Against Southeastern Louisiana, Olivia Ferrell added one of her own. Kaylin Kinney had the first grand slam at home this season with a deep ball over the fence against Wichita State. Ybarra smashed her second grand slam of the season with one at Michigan State. Caitlynn Neal added the sixth of the season in the doubleheader against Iowa.

MYA FELDER CHASING .400 BATTING AVERAGE

Mya Felder currently holds a .402 batting average. The junior transfer is on track to finish the season as one of only five Huskers to hold a .400 batting average or higher throughout a season. Tobin Echo-Hawk leads in Nebraska history, finishing the 1994 season with a .439 batting average. She also finished the 1995 season above .400, earning a .405 batting average. Ali Viola holds three of the top four averages after Echo-Hawk. Viola had a .437 batting average in 1995, a .424 batting average in 1997 and a .421 batting average in 1996. MJ Knighten finished the 2015 season with the fifth-best batting average in Nebraska with a .412. Kiki Stokes finished two seasons above a .400. She finished with a .407 batting average in 2015 and a .409 in 2016.

BIG RED BATS SHOWING IMPROVEMENT

The Nebraska offense has shown improvement this season despite losing Tristan Edwards, who led NU in batting average, slugging percentage and on-base percentage and tied for the team-lead in home runs.

- Despite playing 5 fewer games than a season ago, Nebraska has already produced more hits, runs, doubles, triples, home runs and RBIs.
- Nebraska's batting average, slugging percentage and on-base percentage have all increased since 2021.

Ferrell has tallied 15 while Wallace has added 13. The others schools to do so are No. 5 UCLA and USC Upstate. For UCLA, Megan Faraimo has 15 wins while Holly Azevedo has earned 13. USC Upstate's Hannah Houge has amassed 23 wins in the circle and Alyssa Kelly has added 14.

DOUBLE PLAYS FUEL HUSKER DEFENSE

NU is among the top defensive teams in the country. With 18 double plays through 39 games, the Huskers rank 14th in the nation. Nebraska leads the Big Ten averaging 0.46 double plays per game. Minnesota, who has totaled 15 double plays and average 0.43 per game, is second in the conference.

BOWLIN STADIUM



The 2022 season marks the 21st season Nebraska has called Bowlin Stadium home. The stadium's inaugural season was in 2002.

One of the top facilities in the country, Bowlin Stadium features seating for 2,500 fans, an underground system that heats the field and a large video board. Just past the right field fence is the Alex Gordon Training Complex, a spacious indoor facility that is large enough for Nebraska to take live batting practice inside the complex. The clubhouse features a locker room, players' lounge, training room and coaches' offices.

Nebraska has won 70 percent of its games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers have hosted four NCAA Regionals at Bowlin Stadium and ranked in the top 25 nationally in attendance 14 times, including four seasons ranked in the top 10.

SCOUTING THE MINNESOTA GOPHERS (19-15-1)

Minnesota comes into the weekend with a 19-15-1 record and 5-4 Big Ten Conference record. The Gophers are coming off of a 2-1 series victory over Iowa.

In the first weekend of conference play, Minnesota claimed the series over Rutgers despite dropping game one. In week two, the Gophers fell to Illinois, 1-2.

The Gophers are coming off of a midweek matchup with South Dakota State where UM claimed the win, 9-8, after a walk-off homer in the eighth inning.

Nebraska and Minnesota shared in common six nonconference opponents. The Gophers faced UCF in the opening weekend of the season, claiming the victory, 3-1. At the Niner Invitational, Minnesota faced Northern Iowa twice, winning both. The Gophers also faced Wichita State at the Niner Invitational, losing, 4-0. Minnesota saw Tulsa in the OSU-Tulsa Invitational, winning 5-4. UM faced Drake at the Bevo Classic, winning 8-0 in six innings. Most recently, Minnesota took on South Dakota State, picking up their 19th victory.

- The Gophers hit .382 (89-for-233) when the fist to bat in an inning.
- **Autumn Pease** leads Minnesota in the circle with a 10-8 record and a 4.30 ERA. Pease has tallied 110 strikeouts through 112.1 innings.

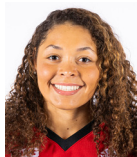

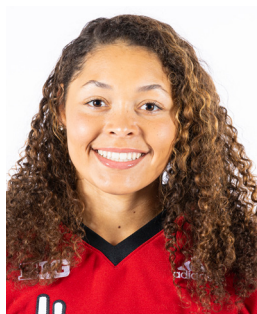
