The Nebraska softball team travels to Madison, Wis., this weekend, April 22-24, for a three-game series with Wisconsin. The Huskers will face the Badgers in game one on Friday, starting at 3 p.m. (CT). Game two is set for Saturday at 1 p.m. (CT) while the final game of the series will be Sunday at 1 p.m (CT). All three games will be streamed live on BTN+ (subscription required). Fans can follow the action live on the Huskers Radio Network and Huskers.com with the call from Nate Rohr.

The Huskers have won their last 18 games with an offense that leads the Big Ten in numerous categories including batting average, runs, hits, home runs, RBIs, total bases, slugging percentage, walks and on-base percentage. Junior transfer Mya Felder leads the Big Red with a .411 batting average, tallying 46 hits, six doubles, four homers and 29 RBIs. Olivia Ferrell leads in the circle with 17 victories, holding a 1.82 ERA through 127.0 innings. Courtney Wallace has added 13 wins in the circle, appearing in 110.0 innings and striking out 79 batters.

Wisconsin (23-11) is 8-4 in conference play. The Badgers are coming off of a three-game series sweep over the Michigan State Spartans. UW also claimed the series sweep over Iowa in week one. The Badgers picked up their third Big Ten series with a 2-1 victory over Indiana. In the Badgers only series lost this season thus far, UW fell to Illinois in three straight games.

LEADING OFF...

- The Huskers (13-0) are the only undefeated team in conference play in the Big Ten.
- Nebraska ranks first in the conference in batting average (.329), hits (382), home runs (67), RBIs (271), total bases (663), slugging percentage (.572), walks (152) and on-base percentage (.414).
- NU also leads the conference in home runs per game with 1.60.
- The Big Red travels to Madison, Wis., for the first time since 2019. NU is 8-3 at Wisconsin.
- Nebraska's .972 fielding percentage is currently on chasing the school record of .973 set in 2006.
- The Big Red is looking for its 14th consecutive conference victory. This would mark the longest conference win-streak for the Huskers since finishing 16-0 in the Big 12 in 1998.
- The Huskers currently average 6.9 runs per game which is on track to tie the school record of 6.9 set in 2015.
- NU currently holds a team batting average of .329. This looks to be one of the highest team-averages since 2015 (.337).
- **Mya Felder** currently holds a .411 batting average. She looks to be the first Husker to have a batting average above .400 since 2016 and only the fifth NU player in history.

NEBRASKA 2022 SEASON NOTEBOOK

- Nebraska's roster features 18 players from **seven** different states.
- There are seven players who are Nebraska natives.
- **Rhonda Revelle** is in her 30th season leading her alma mater in 2022. Revelle is the second-longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle owns 1,053 wins at Nebraska. She is the all-time wins leader (male or female) in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach **Lori Sippel** is in her 33rd year at Nebraska. Sippel is the longest-tenured female assistant coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,357 of Nebraska's 1,534 all-time victories (88 percent).
- In her 14th season, assistant coach **Diane Miller** rounds out the Husker coaching staff. Miller has helped Nebraska's offense set more than 40 school records.
- **Courtney Wallace** received NFCA All-Region honors after her performance during the 2021 season. Wallace earned NFCA All-Midwest Region second team honors.
- **Billie Andrews** had a standout freshman season in 2021. The Gretna, Neb., native, was one of only two freshmen named to the 18-player All-Big Ten first team. Andrews will look to repeat those honors during the 2022 season.
- Fifth year senior **Olivia Ferrell** took advantage of the NCAA waiver for an extra year of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

- The roster features three newcomers including two freshmen and one transfer.
- NU added two freshmen catchers to the roster. **Mckinley Malecha** and **Ava Bredwell** are both expected to add depth to the position.
- **Mya Felder**, an Oregon-transfer, joins the Huskers after receiving NFCA All-Pacific Region honors after her 2021 season with Oregon.
- Nebraska will travel to seven different states during the 2022 season including Iowa, New Mexico, California, Kansas, Michigan, Wisconsin and Ohio.
- The Big Red will host 16 games at Bowlin Stadium in 2022. The schedule will feature only 14 home dates as two of the dates will be doubleheaders.

NEBRASKA QUICK HITS

- The Huskers travel to Madison, Wis., for the first time since 2019. NU is 8-3 at Wisconsin.
- The Badgers have claimed the last three series (2018, 2019 & 2021).
- Nebraska is 19-0 when hitting two or more home runs in a game.
- The Huskers .572 slugging percentage is on-track to blow past the previous record of .505 which was set in 2015.
- NU has recorded 15 come-from-behind wins this season, including eight during the 18-game win streak.
- **Billie and Brooke Andrews** have recorded home runs in the same game three times this season.
- **Billie Andrews, Sydney Gray** and **Kaylin Kinney** have all slugged two home runs in one game this season.
- **Abbie Squier** and **Sydney Gray** have recorded two homers in a single, twice this season.
- **Billie Andrews** is hitting .407 (22-for-54) with one double, one triple and five home runs on the road through 16 away games this season.
- **Olivia Ferrell** is 7-2 in eight starts on the road with a 1.35 ERA and 52 strikeouts.

HUSKERS IN THE RANKS

- Nebraska ranks first in the conference in batting average (.329), hits (382), home runs (67), RBIs (271), total bases (663), slugging percentage (.572), walks (152) and on-base percentage (.414).
- The Big Red ranks eighth in the NCAA in scoring per game (6.90).
- NU averages 1.60 home runs per game, ranking ninth in the nation.
- The Huskers .329 batting average is 11th in the NCAA.
- **Billie Andrews** leads the Big Ten in home runs (18) and walks (31).
- Third in the conference, **Billie Andrews** holds a .805 slugging average.
- **Billie Andrews** is also fifth in the Big Ten in stolen bases with 14.
- **Mya Felder** is seventh in the conference with a .411 batting average.
- **Cam Ybarra** is tied for third in triples in the Big Ten with three.
- **Olivia Ferrell** is second in the conference with 17 victories.
- **Courtney Wallace** is second in the Big Ten with five saves.

BIG RED RECORDS

- The Huskers set a new Nebraska record with 35 home runs through the first 20 games of the season. The previous record was 28 in 2016.
- **Billie Andrews** set the record for most homers as an individual through 20 games with 13. The record was previously held by MJ Knighten who had 12 in the first 20 games in 2016.
- **Billie Andrews** also set the Nebraska sophomore record for most home runs in a season with 18. The previous record was held by Ali Viola who had 15 in 1996.
- **Billie Andrews** is tied for third for most home runs in a season with Taylor Edwards (2011 & 2014) with 18. The current record is held by Ali Viola who smashed 22 homers in 1998.
- **Billie Andrews** had the third-longest streak for games with a hit in Nebraska history after tallying at least one hit through 23 games from Feb. 12-March 19.
- **Billie Andrews** tied the school record twice after drawing four walks in a single game. She tied the record in the first two games in the Rutgers series.

NEBRASKA BY THE NUMBERS

62 NCAA TOURNAMENT WINS
Nebraska has won 62 games in its 24 NCAA Tournament appearances (62-52). The Huskers 62 all-time wins ranks second.

30 ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS
A total of 22 Huskers have combined to earn 30 CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, the second-most in softball NCAA history.

27 ALL-AMERICANS
Nebraska has produced 27 All-Americans, including eight first-team selections, seven two-time picks and two three-time All-Americans.

24 NCAA TOURNAMENTS
The Huskers have made 24 appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including 13 straight from 1995 to 2007. Nebraska's 24 postseason appearances rank second in the Big Ten.

21 REVELLE ALL-AMERICANS
Rhonda Revelle has guided 13 players to a total of 21 All-America honor in her first 29 seasons as Nebraska's head coach.

19 CONFERENCE TITLES
Nebraska has won a total of 19 conference championships. The Huskers won 12 Big Eight titles, six Big 12 crowns and captured their first Big Ten title in 2014.

15 TOP-25 RANKINGS
Nebraska has been ranked in the final NFCA poll in 15 of the 27 years the poll has existed. The Huskers were one of only six teams nationally to be ranked in the final poll in each of the first 12 years it existed (1995 to 2006).

14 REVELLE ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS
Rhonda Revelle has produced 14 academic All-Americans at Nebraska. That total ranks fourth among all softball head coaches in NCAA history.

7 WCWS APPEARANCES
Nebraska has advanced to the Women's College World Series seven times to rank 14th in NCAA history.

4 SOFTBALL OLYMPIANS
Four former Huskers have competed in the Olympics, with a pair of former players competing in each of the last two Olympics.

FELDER CHASING .400 BATTING AVERAGE

Mya Felder currently holds a .411 batting average. The junior transfer is on track to finish the season as one of only five Huskers to hold a .400 batting average or higher throughout a season. Tobin Echo-Hawk leads in Nebraska history, finishing the 1994 season with a .439 batting average. She also finished the 1995 season above .400, earning a .405 batting average. Ali Viola holds three of the top four averages after Echo-Hawk. Viola had a .437 batting average in 1995, a .424 batting average in 1997 and a .421 batting average in 1996. MJ Knighten finished the 2015 season with the fifth-best batting average in Nebraska with a .412. Kiki Stokes finished two seasons above a .400. She finished with a .407 batting average in 2015 and a .409 in 2016.

BILLIE ANDREWS CLIMBING IN NEBRASKA SEASON RECORDS

Billie Andrews continues to climb the record book at Nebraska. She is tied for third-most homers in a season with 18. Andrews broke the sophomore record for home runs in a season after her 16th homer this year.

ANDREWS LOOKS TO REACH SEASON MILESTONE

Billie Andrews has produced historic numbers this season. She looks to join a prestigious list of Nebraska alumni in the record book. Andrews is approaching a total of 50 in hits, runs and RBIs. Only four Huskers have done so. MJ Knighten reached 50 in each category in 2015 and 2016. Kiki Stokes also added at least 50 hits, 50 runs and 50 RBIs in 2015. Hailey Decker did so in 2014, and Ali Viola tallied at least 50 in all three categories in 1996.

ANDREWS AT THE TOP NATIONALLY IN HOME RUNS

Andrews currently leads the Big Ten Conference with 18 home runs this season and is tied for third in the nation behind Jocelyn Alo who has 21 homers on the year and Addison Barnard who has tallied 20.

BREDWELL SHOWCASING STANDOUT PERFORMANCES AS A FRESHMAN

Ava Bredwell was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week Monday, April 18, following a big week in the Huskers' perfect 5-0 week over Iowa and Minnesota.

A Shawnee, Kan., native, Bredwell produced at least one hit in each of the five games and multiple hits in three contests. She finished the week 9-for-14 (.643) with one triple, six RBIs and six runs scored, averaging more than one hit, one RBI and one run per game.

In game one of the doubleheader against Iowa, Bredwell went 2-for-3 with a career-high five RBIs. In game two, Bredwell added two more hits, finishing the doubleheader 4-for-5.

In the weekend sweep of Minnesota, Bredwell finished 5-for-9. In game one, Bredwell had one hit and one run. In game two, Bredwell finished 1-for-2 with one RBI and one run. The freshman finished the weekend going 3-for-4 in the finale, scoring twice.

Bredwell is batting .366 on the season (26-for-71) with 15 RBIs, 23 runs, two doubles, two triples and two home runs. The freshman has made 29 starts for the Big Red this year, and the Huskers are 26-3 in her 29 starts.

TEAM SLUGGING PERCENTAGE ON PACE FOR NU BEST

The 2022 season has marked one of the best offensive teams in school history. The Huskers currently hold a .572 slugging percentage which is on track to smash the previous record of a .505 slugging percentage which was set as the school record in 2015. 2015 marked the only time in Nebraska history that a team finished above a .500 slugging percentage.

BOWLIN STADIUM



The 2022 season marks the 21st season Nebraska has called Bowlin Stadium home. The stadium's inaugural season was in 2002.

One of the top facilities in the country, Bowlin Stadium features seating for 2,500 fans, an underground system that heats the field and a large video board. Just past the right field fence is the Alex Gordon Training Complex, a spacious indoor facility that is large enough for Nebraska to take live batting practice inside the complex. The clubhouse features a locker room, players' lounge, training room and coaches' offices.

Nebraska has won 70 percent of its games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers have hosted four NCAA Regionals at Bowlin Stadium and ranked in the top 25 nationally in attendance 14 times, including four seasons ranked in the top 10.

SCOUTING THE WISCONSIN BADGERS

Wisconsin comes into the weekend 23-11 on the season with an 8-4 Big Ten record. The Badgers are coming off of a 3-0 series win over Michigan State. UW was set to take on Minnesota in a doubleheader, but it was postponed due to weather.

In the first week of conference play, Wisconsin traveled to Iowa. The Badgers claimed the series, 3-0. In week two, UW played host to Indiana, taking the series, 2-1. Wisconsin dropped its first conference series at Illinois, falling in all three games to the Fighting Illini.

Nebraska and Wisconsin shared in common two non-conference opponents. The Badgers faced the then-No. 25 Central Florida at the St. Pete Clearwater Elite Invitational. UW claimed the win, 9-1, in five innings. The Badgers saw Northern Colorado in the Colorado State/Northern Colorado Tournament. Wisconsin earned the 5-4 victory in nine innings.

- **Head Coach Yvette Healy** enters her 14th season as the head coach of the Badgers.
- UW is 15-7 against non-conference opponents this season.
- Wisconsin has won eight of the last 10 meetings between the two teams.
- The Badgers are tied for fourth place in the Big Ten standings after four weekends of league play.
- UW will have faced two of the top three Big Ten teams after seeing Illinois in a three game series and taking on Nebraska this weekend.
- Wisconsin has two players with batting averages above .400. **Kayla Konwent** leads with a .452 while **Ally Miklesh** holds a .410.
- The Badgers lead the conference averaging 0.32 triples per game.
- UW is third in the Big Ten in double plays per game, averaging 0.41.
- **Kayla Konwent** has also tallied 42 hits, eight doubles, eight home runs and 25 RBIs.
- A senior from Salem, Wis., **Kayla Konwent** also leads the team in slugging percentage (.796), walks (28) and on-base percentage (.598).

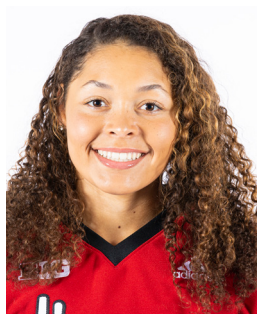
