The Nebraska softball team travels to East Lansing, Mich., to take on Michigan State in a three-game series, April 8-10. Fans can listen to the games on the Huskers Radio Network or Huskers.com with the call by Matt Coatney. All games will also be streamed live on BTN+ (subscription required).

Nebraska has won its last 10 games with an offense that leads the Big Ten in numerous categories including runs, hits, home runs, RBIs, total bases, slugging percentage, walks and on-base percentage. Sophomore Billie Andrews has been a force on offense, leading the conference in home runs, RBIs, total bases, slugging percentage and walks. Junior-transfer Mya Felder leads the Big Red with a .422 batting average, tallying 35 hits, five doubles, three homers and 20 RBIs.

In the circle, seniors Olivia Ferrell and Courtney Wallace have been leaders through 34 games. Ferrell (13-4) holds a 2.11 ERA with 115 strikeouts through 102.2 innings. Wallace (11-4) has a 3.60 ERA through 95.1 innings and has tossed 67 strikeouts.

Michigan State (20-17, 1-6 Big Ten) opened Big Ten Conference play against No. 11 Northwestern, dropping the series, 0-3. The Spartans hosted Ohio State in week two of conference play, picking up one win, but falling 1-2 in the series. In a midweek matchup, the Spartans faced in-state rival No. 21 Michigan. MSU fell to the Wolverines, 6-1.

### LEADING OFF...

- The Huskers (5-0) are the only undefeated team in conference play in the Big Ten.
- Nebraska ranks first in the conference in runs (221), hits (289), home runs (55), RBIs (204), total bases (512), slugging percentage (.555), walks (133) and on-base percentage (.407).
- NU also leads the conference in home runs per game with 1.62.
- Nebraska travels to Michigan State for the first time since 2014. NU is 3-0 at MSU.
- The Big Red is looking for their 11th consecutive win. This would be the longest win streak since 2014 when NU tallied 11 at the beginning of conference play.
- The Huskers currently average 6.5 runs per game which is on track for one of the highest averages in school history. The current record was set in 2015 when NU averaged 6.90 runs per game.
- Nebraska's .973 fielding percentage is currently on pace to tie the school record of .973 set in 2006.
- **Mya Felder** has recorded a hit in the last 11 games. She looks to extend her hitting streak this weekend.
- **Billie Andrews** leads the Big Ten Conference in slugging percentage (.923), home runs (17), RBIs (38), runs scored (39) and walks (28).

### HUSKERS TO WATCH



**Billie Andrews** leads the Big Ten in home runs with 17. She also holds a .385 batting average with 40 hits and 37 RBIs. She has started all 34 games at shortstop.



**Olivia Ferrell** is 13-4 in the circle with a 2.11 ERA. The senior has tallied 115 strikeouts through 102.2 innings. Ferrell has tossed 10 complete games and three shutouts.

**NEBRASKA 2022 SEASON NOTEBOOK**

- Nebraska's roster features 18 players from **seven** different states.
- There are seven players who are Nebraska natives.
- **Rhonda Revelle** is in her 30th season leading her alma mater in 2022. Revelle is the second-longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle owns 1,045 wins at Nebraska. She is the all-time wins leader (male or female) in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach **Lori Sippel** is in her 33rd year at Nebraska. Sippel is the longest-tenured female assistant coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,349 of Nebraska's 1,526 all-time victories (88 percent).
- In her 14th season, assistant coach **Diane Miller** rounds out the Husker coaching staff. Miller has helped Nebraska's offense set more than 40 school records.
- **Courtney Wallace** received NFCA All-Region honors after her performance during the 2021 season. Wallace earned NFCA All-Midwest Region second team honors.
- **Billie Andrews** had a standout freshman season in 2021. The Gretna, Neb., native, was one of only two freshmen named to the 18-player All-Big Ten first team. Andrews will look to repeat those honors during the 2022 season.
- Fifth year senior **Olivia Ferrell** took advantage of the NCAA waiver for an extra year of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

- The roster features three newcomers including two freshmen and one transfer.
- NU added two freshmen catchers to the roster. **Mckinley Malecha** and **Ava Bredwell** are both expected to add depth to the position.
- **Mya Felder**, an Oregon-transfer, joins the Huskers after receiving NFCA All-Pacific Region honors after her 2021 season with Oregon.
- Nebraska will travel to seven different states during the 2022 season including Iowa, New Mexico, California, Kansas, Michigan, Wisconsin and Ohio.
- The Big Red will host 16 games at Bowlin Stadium in 2022. The schedule will feature only 14 home dates as two of the dates will be doubleheaders.

- The Huskers travel to East Lansing, Mich., for the first time since 2014.
- Nebraska has only played at Michigan State three times, claiming a win in each game.
- The Spartans were held scoreless in NU's only trip to East Lansing.
- The Big Red currently averages 6.5 runs per game which is on track for one of the highest averages in school history. The current record was set in 2015 when NU averaged 6.90 runs per game.
- Nebraska is 16-0 when hitting more than one homer in a game.
- **Mya Felder** is hitting .472 (17-for-36) with three doubles and two homers in 11 road games this season.
- **Mya Felder** has recorded a hit in the 11 games. She looks to extend her hitting streak this weekend.
- **Olivia Ferrell** is 5-2 with a 1.43 ERA in seven starts on the road.
- **Billie Andrews, Sydney Gray** and **Kaylin Kinney** have all slugged two home runs in one game this season.
- **Abbie Squier** has recorded two homers in a single, twice this season.

**BIG RED RECORDS**

- The Huskers set a new Nebraska record with 35 home runs through the first 20 games of the season. The previous record was 28 in 2016.
- **Billie Andrews** set the record for most homers as an individual through 20 games with 13. The record was previously held by MJ Knighten who had 12 in the first 20 games in 2016.
- **Billie Andrews** also set the Nebraska sophomore record for most home runs in a season with 17. The previous record was held by Ali Viola who had 15 in 1996.
- **Billie Andrews** is tied for fifth for most home runs in a season with Christie McCoy who notched 17 in 1998. The current record is held by Ali Viola who smashed 22 homers in 1998.
- **Billie Andrews** had the third-longest streak for games with a hit in Nebraska history after tallying at least one hit through 23 games from Feb. 12-March 19.
- **Billie Andrews** tied the school record twice after drawing four walks in a single game. She tied the record in the first two games in the Rutgers series.

**NEBRASKA REACHES 50 HOME RUN MARK**

The Big Red have already tallied 55 homers through the first 34 games of the season. This marks the eighth time in school history Nebraska has hit at least 50 home runs. 2016 was the last time the Huskers reached the 50 home run mark, finishing the season with 65. In 2014, the Huskers set a school record with 73 homers in a season.

**BILLIE ANDREWS AT THE TOP NATIONALLY IN HOME RUNS**

Billie Andrews currently leads the Big Ten Conference with 17 home runs this season and is tied for second in nation behind Addison Barnard who has tallied 18.

**ANDREWS AVERAGING AT LEAST 1.0 RUN, RBI AND HIT PER GAME**

### FERRELL FANNING BATTERS AT EFFICIENT RATE

Right-handed pitcher Olivia Ferrell has been a force in the circle for Nebraska this season. The senior has claimed 13 victories and recorded three shutouts. Ferrell has pitched 10 complete games and averages 1.25 strikeouts per inning pitched. The Elkhorn, Neb., native, has only gotten better through five years for the Big Red.

In 2021, Ferrell struck out 100 batters while walking 50 for a 2:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio. The last pitcher to have better than a 2:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio was Elkhorn, Neb., native, Ashley Hagemann in 2012. The right-handed pitcher in her senior season tallied 320 strikeouts and 146 walks.

Ferrell continues to develop as a strong leader in circle. The senior currently has better than a 3:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio with 115 strikeouts and only 34 walks through 102.2 innings. Hagemann was also last pitcher to achieve this. In 2011, Hagemann struck out 344 batters and walked 108 in her junior season in the circle.

### BIG RED BATS SHOWING IMPROVEMENT

The Nebraska offense has shown improvement this season despite losing Tristan Edwards, who led NU in batting average, slugging percentage and on-base percentage and tied for the team-lead in home runs.

- Despite playing 10 fewer games than a season ago, Nebraska has already produced more hits, runs, doubles, triples, home runs and RBIs.
- Nebraska's batting average, slugging percentage and on-base percentage have all increased since 2021.

### BOWLIN STADIUM



The 2022 season marks the 21st season Nebraska has called Bowlin Stadium home. The stadium's inaugural season was in 2002.

One of the top facilities in the country, Bowlin Stadium features seating for 2,500 fans, an underground system that heats the field and a large video board. Just past the right field fence is the Alex Gordon Training Complex, a spacious indoor facility that is large enough for Nebraska to take live batting practice inside the complex. The clubhouse features a locker room, players' lounge, training room and coaches' offices.

Nebraska has won 70 percent of its games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers have hosted four NCAA Regionals at Bowlin Stadium and ranked in the top 25 nationally in attendance 14 times, including four seasons ranked in the top 10.

**SCOUTING THE MICHIGAN STATE SPARTANS (20-17)**

Michigan State comes in the weekend with a 20-17 record (1-6 Big Ten) after starting conference play with a 0-3 series loss at No. 11 Northwestern.

In week two of conference play, the Spartans hosted Ohio State, picking up their first Big Ten win, but dropping the series, 1-3.

Facing its in-state rival, Michigan State traveled to Michigan for a midweek matchup on Wednesday, April 6. The Spartans fell to the Wolverines, 6-1.

Nebraska and Michigan State did not share any common non-conference opponents this season.

- The Huskers travel to East Lansing for the first time since 2014. NU is undefeated when playing at Michigan State.
- Nebraska held the Spartans scoreless through three games in its only trip to East Lansing.
- **Jacquie Joseph** enters her 29th year as head coach of the Spartans. Coach Joseph faced the Huskers three times when she was the head coach at Bowling Green, dropping all three matchups.
- **Ashley Miller** leads the conference with a 0.97 ERA. She also leads in innings pitched (122.1) and has only allowed one home run all season.
- **Ashley Miller** has totaled 172 strikeouts this season, the eight-most strikeouts in a season in Spartan history.
- **Camryn Wincher** leads the Spartans with a .351 batting average, adding 40 hits including seven doubles and one home run as well as 18 RBIs.
- **Alexis Barroso** adds strength on offense, holding a .350 batting average with 35 hits and 21 RBIs.
- **Zaquai Dumas** has smashed six homers this season, a number that leads the Spartans.
- **Courtney Callahan** leads MSU on base with nine stolen bases on the year.
- In the Big Ten, **Jessica Mabrey** is second in walks with 25. Mabrey is only behind Billie Andrews who has been walked 28 times.
