The Nebraska softball team is set to travel to East Lansing, Mich., for the Big Ten Tournament this week, May 11-14. The Huskers go in as a No. 2 seed, receiving a bye for the first round of the tournament. NU will take on the winner of Penn State and Indiana on Thursday, May 12 at 10 a.m. (CT). All tournament games will be boadcasted live on the Big Ten Network. Fans can listen to the action live on the Huskers Radio Network, Huskers.com and select Huskers Radio Network affiliates with the call from Nate Rohr.

The Huskers go in to the tournament as the No. 2 seed, the highest-seed since NU claimed the regular-season title and a No. 1 seed during the 2014 season. Nebraska will either face No. 7 Penn State or No. 10 Indiana, who are set to play on Wednesday, May 11, at 10 a.m. (CT).

Nebraska is coming off of a 2-1 series win over the Indiana Hoosiers. After being held scoreless in game one, the Big Red went on to outscore Indiana 12-6 in the final two games. A walk-off single from Mya Felder in the bottom of the eighth in game three, highlighted an impressive regular season for the Huskers.

The Huskers have yet to face Penn State this season. The Nittany Lions are 13-10 in conference play with series wins against Purdue, Indiana and Rutgers.

- Nebraska ranks first in the conference in batting average (.320), hits (450), home runs (74), RBIs (303), total bases (768), slugging percentage (.546) and on-base percentage (.399).
- Nebraska's .970 fielding percentage is currently chasing the school record of .973 which was set in 2006.
- NU currently holds a team batting average of .320. This looks to be one of the highest team averages since 2015 (.337).
- NU's defense is ranked 13th in the nation in double plays per game (0.49). The Huskers lead the conference with 25 double plays through the regular season.

- Nebraska ranks first in the conference and 18th in the nation in home runs per game averaging 1.45.
- The Big Red is 15th in the nation in slugging percentage with a .546 average.
- The Huskers finished regular-season conference play with the best batting average (.328) and best ERA (.236).
- Billie Andrews is first in the conference in total bases (120) and second in the conference in home runs (19).
- Courtney Wallace (15) and Olivia Ferrell (18) have both recorded career-high totals in the circle this season.

NEBRASKA 2022 SEASON NOTEBOOK

- Nebraska's roster features 18 players from **seven** different states.
- There are seven players who are Nebraska natives.
- Rhonda Revelle is in her 30th season leading her alma mater in 2022. Revelle is the second-longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle owns 1,057 wins at Nebraska. She is the all-time wins leader (male or female) in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Associate Head Coach Lori Sippel is in her 33rd year at Nebraska. Sippel is the longest-tenured female assistant coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,361 of Nebraska's 1,538 all-time victories (88 percent).
- In her 14th season, assistant coach **Diane Miller** rounds out the Husker coaching staff. Miller has helped Nebraska's offense set more than 40 school records.
- Courtney Wallace recevied NFCA All-Region honors after her performance during the 2021 season. Wallace earned NFCA All-Midwest Region second team honors.
- Billie Andrews had a standout freshman season in 2021. The Gretna, Neb., native, was one of only two freshmen named to the 18-player All-Big Ten first team. Andrews will look to repeat those honors during the 2022 season.
- Fifth year senior Olivia Ferrell took advantage of the NCAA waiver for an extra year of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

- The roster features three newcomers including two freshmen and one transfer.
- NU added two freshmen catchers to the roster. Mckinley Malecha and Ava Bredwell are both expected to add depth to the position.
- Mya Felder, an Oregon-transfer, joins the Huskers after receiving NFCA All-Pacific Region honors after her 2021 season with Oregon.
- Nebraska will travel to seven different states during the 2022 season including lowa, New Mexico, California, Kansas, Michigan, Wisconsin and Ohio.
- The Big Red will host 16 games at Bowlin Stadium in 2022. The schedule will feature only 14 home dates as two of the dates will be doubleheaders.

Nebraska has been ranked in the final NFCA poll in 15 of the 27 years the poll has existed. The Huskers were one of only six teams nationally to be ranked in the final poll in each of the first 12 years it existed (1995 to 2006).

REVELLE ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Rhonda Revelle has produced 14 academic All-Americans at Nebraska. That total ranks fourth among all softball head coaches in NCAA history.

WCWS APPEARANCES

Nebraska has advanced to the Women's College World Series seven times to rank 14th in NCAA history.

Four former Huskers have competed in the Olympics, with a pair of former players competing in each of the last two Olympics.

TEAM SLUGGING PERCENTAGE ON PACE FOR NU BEST

The 2022 season has marked one of the best offensive teams in school history. The Huskers currently hold a .546 slugging percentage which is on track to smash the previous record of a .505 slugging percentage which was set as the school record in 2015. 2015 marked the only time in Nebraska history that a team finished above a .500 slugging percentage.

FELDER CHASING .400 BATTING AVERAGE

Mya Felder currently holds a .394 batting average. The junior transfer looks to finish the season as one of only five Huskers to hold a .400 batting average or higher at the conclusion of the season. Tobin Echo-Hawk leads in Nebraska history, finishing the 1994 season with a .439 batting average. She also finished the 1995 season above .400, earning a .405 batting average. Ali Viola holds three of the top four averages after Echo-Hawk. Viola had a .437 batting average in 1995, a .424 batting average in 1997 and a .421 batting average in 1996. MJ Knighten finished the 2015 season with the fifth-best batting average in Nebraska with a .412. Kiki Stokes finished two seasons above a .400. She finished with a .407 batting average in 2015 and a .409 in 2016.

BREDWELL SHOWCASING STANDOUT PERFORMANCES AS A FRESHMAN

Ava Bredwell was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week Monday, April 18, following a big week in the Huskers' perfect 5-0 week over Iowa and Minnesota.

A Shawnee, Kan., native, Bredwell produced at least one hit in each of the five games and multiple hits in three contests. She finished the week 9-for-14 (.643) with one triple, six RBIs and six runs scored, averaging more than one hit, one RBI and one run per game.

In game one of the doubleheader against Iowa, Bredwell went 2-for-3 with a career-high five RBIs. In game two, Bredwell added two more hits, finishing the doubleheader 4-for-5. In the weekend sweep of Minnesota, Bredwell finished 5-for-9. In game one, Bredwell had one hit and one run. In game two, Bredwell finished 1-for-2 with one RBI and one run. The freshman finished the weekend going 3-for-4 in the finale, scoring twice.

Bredwell is batting .329 on the season (27-for-82) with 15 RBIs, 25 runs, three doubles, two triples and two home runs. The freshman has made 34 starts for the Big Red this year, and the Huskers are 28-6 in her 34 starts.

BILLIE ANDREWS CLIMBING IN NEBRASKA SEASON RECORDS

Billie Andrews continues to climb the record book at Nebraska. She has recorded the third-most homers in a season with 19. Andrews broke the sophomore record for home runs in a season after her 16th homer this year.

NEBRASKA PITCHING STAFF LEADS IN BIG TEN PLAY

The Huskers have been dominate in the circle against Big Ten competition throughout the season. At the conclusion of regular season conference play, Nebraska held the best ERA in the Big Ten with a 2.36. This includes holding opponents to a league-best 67 runs and only 48 earned runs.

Olivia Ferrell has been a leader in the circle for Nebraska. The senior holds a 2.09 ERA in Big Ten play, fifth-best in the conference. Ferrell has tallied a 7-2 record through 63.2 innings.

Kaylin Kinney has added depth to the Husker pitching staff. The sophomore holds a 2.12 ERA in conference play, the sixth-best in the conference. Kinney is 4-0 in the circle against Big Ten opponents and has held opponents to a league-best 10 earned runs.

DOUBLE PLAYS FUEL HUSKER DEFENSE

NU is among the top defensive teams in the country. With 25 double plays through the regular season, the Huskers have the fifth-most in the NCAA. Nebraska also leads the Big Ten averaging 0.49 double plays per game.

BOWLIN STADIUM



The 2022 season marks the 21st season Nebraska has called Bowlin Stadium home. The stadium's inaugural season was in 2002.

One of the top facilities in the country, Bowlin Stadium features seating for 2,500 fans, an underground system that heats the field and a large video board. Just past the right field fence is the Alex Gordon Training Complex, a spacious indoor facility that is large enough for Nebraska to take live batting practice inside the complex. The clubhouse features a locker room, players' lounge, training room and coaches' offices.

Nebraska has won 70 percent of its games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers have hosted four NCAA Regionals at Bowlin Stadium and ranked in the top 25 nationally in attendance 14 times, including four seasons ranked in the top 10.



Penn State comes into the tournament with some momentum having won its final Big Ten series, claiming the win over Illinois after picking up wins in two of the three games.

The Nittany Lions are hitting .244 as a team and are led by Cassie Lindmark. Lindmark has started all 52 games and is hitting .399. She has 61 hits, 22 runs, 15 doubles, seven home runs and 24 RBIs. She leads the team in onbase percentage (.511). Lindmark also leads the team in walks with 17 and has been hit by a pitch a total of 19 times.

Ally Kurland holds the second-best batting average with a .308 with 29 runs, 52 hits, 17 doubles, 16 home runs and 43 RBIs.




