The Nebraska softball team is set to make its 25th appearance in the NCAA Tournament at the NCAA Stillwater Regional. The Huskers will face North Texas in game one on Friday, May 20, at 5 p.m. (CT) at Cowgirl Stadium.

Fans can listen to the action live on the Huskers Radio Network and Huskers.com with the call from Nate Rohr. The game will also be streamed live on ESPN+ (subscription required). Tickets are available at <http://okstate.com/ncaasoftball>.

The Huskers will face North Texas (35-14) in game one of the NCAA Stillwater Regional. The Mean Green received an automatic bid to their first NCAA Tournament after claiming the CUSA Tournament title. UNT had five players receive all-conference honors from the CUSA for their performances throughout the year.

No. 7 Oklahoma State (41-12) received an automatic bid after claiming the Big 12 Tournament title, winning over No. 1 Oklahoma, 4-3, in eight innings. This marks the third consecutive season in which the Cowgirls earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and the second straight season in which OSU secured a top-eight national seed.

Oklahoma State will face Fordham (30-20) who also received an automatic bid after winning the Atlantic 10 Tournament title. This marks the Rams 10th trip to the NCAA Tournament and first appearance since 2019.

LEADING OFF...

- Nebraska is 16th in the nation in slugging percentage (.536), 18th in doubles (83), and 19th in scoring (6.20) and batting average (.315).
- The Huskers' .971 fielding percentage is currently chasing the school record of .973 which was set in 2006.
- NU currently holds a team batting average of .315. This looks to be one of the highest team averages since 2015 (.337).
- Nebraska's defense is ranked 15th in the nation in double plays per game.
- The Huskers finished regular-season conference play with the best batting average (.328) and best ERA (2.36).
- This marks the first NCAA Tournament appearance for Nebraska since 2016 when the Huskers finished their season at the NCAA Columbia Regional.
- **Billie Andrews** is 13th in the nation in home runs (19).
- **Courtney Wallace** (17) and **Olivia Ferrell** (19) have both recorded career-high victories in the circle this season.
- **Mya Felder** and **Cam Ybarra** were the only Big Ten Conference players to receive All-Conference, All-Defensive and All-Tournament honors.
- **Abbie Squier** has been hit by a pitch a team-high nine times.

HUSKERS TO WATCH



Billie Andrews leads Nebraska in runs (52), home runs (19), RBIs (49), total bases (122), slugging percentage (.713), walks (35) and stolen bases (17).



Olivia Ferrell is 19-7 in the circle with a 2.09 ERA. The senior has tallied 155 strikeouts through 164.0 innings. Ferrell has tossed 16 complete games and five shutouts.

NEBRASKA 2022 SEASON NOTEBOOK

- Nebraska's roster features 18 players from **seven** different states.
- There are seven players who are Nebraska natives.

• **Rhonda Revelle** is in her 30th season leading her alma mater in 2022. Revelle is the second-longest serving female head coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.

• Revelle owns 1,060 wins at Nebraska. She is the all-time wins leader (male or female) in the history of Nebraska Athletics.

• Associate Head Coach **Lori Sippel** is in her 33rd year at Nebraska. Sippel is the longest-tenured female assistant coach in the history of Nebraska Athletics.

• Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,364 of Nebraska's 1,541 all-time victories (88 percent).

• In her 14th season, assistant coach **Diane Miller** rounds out the Husker coaching staff. Miller has helped Nebraska's offense set more than 40 school records.

• **Courtney Wallace** received NFCA All-Region honors after her performance during the 2021 season. Wallace earned NFCA All-Midwest Region second team honors.

• **Billie Andrews** had a standout freshman season in 2021. The Gretna, Neb., native, was one of only two freshmen named to the 18-player All-Big Ten first team. Andrews will look to repeat those honors during the 2022 season.

• The roster features three newcomers including two freshmen and one transfer.

NEBRASKA QUICK HITS

- The Huskers will travel to Stillwater, Okla., for their 25th NCAA Tournament appearance and first since 2016.
- Nebraska is 20-1 when hitting two or more home runs in a game.
- The Huskers .536 slugging percentage is on-track to blow past the previous record of .505 which was set in 2015.
- NU has recorded 18 come-from-behind wins this season.
- **Billie and Brooke Andrews** have recorded home runs in the same game three times this season.
- **Billie Andrews, Sydney Gray** and **Kaylin Kinney** have all slugged two home runs in one game this season.
- **Abbie Squier** and **Sydney Gray** have recorded two homers in a single game, twice this season.
- **Mya Felder** led the Big Red on offense at the Big Ten Tournament, finishing 4-for-10 with one double.
- **Courtney Wallace** finished the Big Ten Tournament 2-0 with a 0.54 ERA. Wallace pitched 13 innings, holding opponents to one earned run.

HUSKERS IN THE RANKS

- Nebraska's 75 home runs this season is 16th in the NCAA.
- The Huskers rank 19th in the nation in batting average (.315) and scoring per game (6.20).
- The Big Red averages 1.39 home runs per game which is 22nd in the NCAA.
- Nebraska ranks first in the Big Ten in batting average (.315), hits (468), home runs (75), RBIs (311), total bases (796) and slugging percentage (.536).
- **Courtney Wallace** is 33rd in the NCAA with three saves.
- **Olivia Ferrell** and **Courtney Wallace** are sixth and seventh in the Big Ten in victories (19 and 17).
- **Mya Felder** has the sixth-best batting average (.395) in the Big Ten.
- **Billie Andrews** is 13th in the nation in home runs with 19.
- **Billie Andrews** is second in the Big Ten in RBIs (49) and home runs (19).
- **Billie Andrews** leads the conference in assists with 111.
- **Mya Felder** and **Cam Ybarra** lead the Big Ten in fielding double plays with 20 and 18.

BIG RED RECORDS

- The Huskers set a new Nebraska record with 35 home runs through the first 20 games of the season. The previous record was 28 in 2016.
- Nebraska set a new record with 75 homers in a season. The previous record was 73 set in 2014.
- **Billie Andrews** set the record for most homers as an individual through 20 games with 13. The record was previously held by MJ Knighten who had 12 in the first 20 games in 2016.
- **Billie Andrews** also set the Nebraska sophomore record for most home runs in a season with 19. The previous record was held by Ali Viola who had 15 in 1996.
- **Billie Andrews** is third for most home runs in a season with 19. The current record is held by Ali Viola who smashed 22 homers in 1998.
- **Billie Andrews** had the third-longest streak for games with a hit in Nebraska history after tallying at least one hit through 23 games from Feb. 12-March 19.
- **Billie Andrews** tied the school record twice after drawing four walks in a single game. She tied the record in the first two games in the Rutgers series.

NEBRASKA BY THE NUMBERS

62 NCAA TOURNAMENT WINS
Nebraska has won 62 games in its 24 NCAA Tournament appearances (62-52). The Huskers 62 all-time wins ranks second.

30 ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS
A total of 22 Huskers have combined to earn 30 CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, the second-most in softball NCAA history.

27 ALL-AMERICANS
Nebraska has produced 27 All-Americans, including eight first-team selections, seven two-time picks and two three-time All-Americans.

25 NCAA TOURNAMENTS
The Huskers have made 25 appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including 13 straight from 1995 to 2007. Nebraska's 25 postseason appearances rank second in the Big Ten.

21 REVELLE ALL-AMERICANS
Rhonda Revelle has guided 13 players to a total of 21 All-America honor in her first 29 seasons as Nebraska's head coach.

20 CONFERENCE TITLES
Nebraska has won a total of 20 conference championships. The Huskers won 12 Big Eight titles, six Big 12 crowns and two Big Ten titles with the latest in 2022.

15 TOP-25 RANKINGS
Nebraska has been ranked in the final NFCA poll in 15 of the 27 years the poll has existed. The Huskers were one of only six teams nationally to be ranked in the final poll in each of the first 12 years it existed (1995 to 2006).

14 REVELLE ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS
Rhonda Revelle has produced 14 academic All-Americans at Nebraska. That total ranks fourth among all softball head coaches in NCAA history.

7 WCWS APPEARANCES
Nebraska has advanced to the Women's College World Series seven times to rank 14th in NCAA history.

4 SOFTBALL OLYMPIANS
Four former Huskers have competed in the Olympics, with a pair of former players competing in each of the last two Olympics.

TEAM SLUGGING PERCENTAGE ON PACE FOR NU BEST

The 2022 season has marked one of the best offensive teams in school history. The Huskers currently hold a .536 slugging percentage which is on track to smash the previous record of a .505 slugging percentage which was set as the school record in 2015. 2015 marked the only time in Nebraska history that a team finished above a .500 slugging percentage.

DOUBLE PLAYS FUEL HUSKER DEFENSE

NU is among the top defensive teams in the country. With 26 double plays through the regular season, the Huskers have the 12th-most in the NCAA. Nebraska also leads the Big Ten averaging 0.48 double plays per game.

Fordham has recorded 13 double plays this year while North Texas and Oklahoma State have each tallied 12 double plays this season.

FELDER CHASING .400 BATTING AVERAGE

Mya Felder currently holds a .395 batting average. The junior transfer looks to finish the season as one of only five Huskers to hold a .400 batting average or higher at the conclusion of the season. Tobin Echo-Hawk leads in Nebraska history, finishing the 1994 season with a .439 batting average. She also finished the 1995 season above .400, earning a .405 batting average. Ali Viola holds three of the top four averages after Echo-Hawk. Viola had a .437 batting average in 1995, a .424 batting average in 1997 and a .421 batting average in 1996. MJ Knighten finished the 2015 season with the fifth-best batting average in Nebraska with a .412. Kiki Stokes finished two seasons above a .400. She finished with a .407 batting average in 2015 and a .409 in 2016.

BILLIE ANDREWS CLIMBING IN NEBRASKA SEASON RECORDS

Billie Andrews continues to climb the record book at Nebraska. She has recorded the third-most homers in a season with 19. Andrews broke the sophomore record for home runs in a season after her 16th homer this year.

BREDWELL NAMED BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

Freshman catcher Ava Bredwell was named the 2022 Big Ten Freshman of the Year. Bredwell is the first Husker to receive conference Freshman of the Year honors since Ali Viola was named the 1995 Big Eight Freshman of the Year. Bredwell is only the third catcher to be named the Big Ten Freshman of the Year since the award began in 1985. Bredwell also earned a spot on the All-Freshman Team.

SEVEN HUSKERS EARN ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS

Seven Huskers earned recognition on an All-Big Ten team, tying Northwestern for the most selections in the league this season.

Ava Bredwell was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Year and earned a spot on the All-Freshman Team.

Abbie Squier (outfield) and Cam Ybarra (second base) were both named to the All-Big Ten first team. Earning second-team All-Big Ten honors were Mya Felder (first base), Billie Andrews (shortstop) and Olivia Ferrell (pitcher). This marks the first All-Big Ten honor for Squier, Ybarra, Felder and Ferrell while Andrews earned all-conference accolades for the second straight season. Nebraska's five All-Big Ten selections marked its most since the 2014 Big Ten champion Husker had six players earn All-Big Ten recognition.

Felder, Ybarra and Squier were also named to the Big Ten All-Defensive team, along with pitcher Courtney Wallace. There were only four Big Ten players who earned a spot on an All-Big Ten team and on the All-Defensive team, and three of those players were from Nebraska (Felder, Ybarra and Squier). With four selections to the All-Defensive team, Nebraska became the first Big Ten team to place four players on the All-Defensive team since the team was created in 2013.

Karlee Seevers rounded out Nebraska's honorees, as she was announced as the Huskers' Big Ten Sportsmanship recipient.

YBARRA AND FELDER LEAD CONFERENCE HONORS

Only two players earned a spot on an All-Big Ten team, All-Defensive team and All-Tournament team. Those two were Cam Ybarra and Mya Felder from Nebraska.

Cam Ybarra was named First-Team All-Big Ten after an impressive Big Ten season. The senior held a .384 batting average through conference play with 28 hits and 13 RBIs. Ybarra also held a .964 fielding percentage. The Mission Viejo, Calif., native, was a part of every scoring play in the Big Ten Tournament Title game and was named the Most Outstanding Player of the tournament.

Mya Felder earned Second-Team All-Big Ten honors, holding a .392 batting average with 31 hits and 19 RBIs through conference play. The junior held a .994 fielding percentage and recorded 154 putouts against Big Ten opponents. Felder hit a team-best .400 at the Big Ten Tournament, finishing 4-for-10 on the weekend.

BOWLIN STADIUM



The 2022 season marks the 21st season Nebraska has called Bowlin Stadium home. The stadium's inaugural season was in 2002.

One of the top facilities in the country, Bowlin Stadium features seating for 2,500 fans, an underground system that heats the field and a large video board. Just past the right field fence is the Alex Gordon Training Complex, a spacious indoor facility that is large enough for Nebraska to take live batting practice inside the complex. The clubhouse features a locker room, players' lounge, training room and coaches' offices.

Nebraska has won 70 percent of its games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers have hosted four NCAA Regionals at Bowlin Stadium and ranked in the top 25 nationally in attendance 14 times, including four seasons ranked in the top 10.

NEBRASKA REACHES 40-WIN MARK

The Huskers reached the 40-win mark after claiming the Big Ten Tournament Title. The last time the Big Red reached the 40-win mark was in 2014 when the Huskers went 44-18.

Nebraska finished the conference season with a 17-5 record, the second most wins in conference play in school history. 17 wins in Big Ten play was the most wins since the Huskers tallied 17 in 2015 (this does not include the 2021 conference-only schedule).

HUSKER OFFENSE AMONG BEST IN EXTRA-BASE HITS

The Big Red offense has recorded a total of 166 extra-base hits this season. The 2022 team is currently second in school history in extra-base hits in a year behind the 2014 squad who tallied 173. The Huskers are also among the best in the NCAA as they sit 15th in total extra-base hits.
