The Nebraska softball team will face Omaha in a midweek doubleheader this Wednesday, March 15 in Omaha, Neb. The first game is set for 4 p.m. while game two is set to begin at approximately 6:30 p.m.

Fans can listen to the game live on the Huskers Radio Network and Huskers.com with the call from Nate Rohr. It will also be streamed live on omavs.com/watch.

The Huskers (16-8) are coming off of a 2-2 weekend at the Shocker Classic with an offense that leads the Big Ten in the numerous categories including batting average (.321), hits (204), doubles (47) and slugging percentage (.519). Junior Billie Andrews leads the conference with nine home runs and is in the top five in slugging percentage (.780), hits (30) and doubles (7).

In the circle, Courtney Wallace has been a leader through the first half of the season. Wallace (9-4) has appeared in the circle for 70.2 innings while tallying 44 strikeouts. Sarah Harness (6-3) has added 47.1 innings of work and striking out 54 batters.

Omaha (13-6) went 3-1 last weekend at the Bulldog Invitational. The Mavericks are led by Lynsey Tucker on offense, who has a team-best .390 batting average while Kamryn Meyer (5-4) leads in the circle.

LEADING OFF...

- The Huskers currently lead the Big Ten Conference in batting average (.321). They are one of only two teams with a batting average above .300.
- Nebraska's offense leads the conference in hits (204), doubles (47) and slugging percentage (.519).
- NU's pitching staff leads the conference with eight shutouts. The Huskers are just one shutout away from matching the 2022 shutout total (9).
- The Huskers are 14-1 when scoring more than two runs in a game this season.

- NU has held 11 opponents to one run or less through the first 24 games.
- Billie Andrews leads the conference with nine home runs and is in the top five in slugging percentage (.780), hits (30) and doubles (7).
- Billie Andrews has hit four of her nine home runs in the lead off at-bat.
- Courtney Wallace is second in the Big Ten with nine victories in the circle.

NEBRASKA BY THE NUMBERS

- The Huskers lead the Big Ten in shutouts with eight and are ranked 18th in the NCAA.
- NU has tallied a conference-best 47 doubles, a number that ranks fifth in the nation.
- Nebraska is leading the Big Ten in batting average (.321) and is one of only two teams with a batting average above .300.
- The Huskers are also leading the conference in hits (204) and slugging percentage (.519).
- Billie Andrews is first in the conference and sixth in the NCAA in home runs with nine to start the season.
- Billie Andrews and Caitlynn Neal both are tied for second-most doubles in the conference with seven this season.
- Ava Bredwell has tallied 21 runs through 24 games. She has the third-most runs in the Big Ten.
- Courtney Wallace has recorded the second-most wins in the conference with nine. She
 is also 16th in the NCAA.
- Wallace has recorded three shutout wins this season, a mark that is first in the Big Ten and 15th in the nation.

OPPONENTS BY THE NUMBERS

- Omaha currently leads the Summit League in batting average (.258), doubles per game (1.95), on base percentage (.353), scoring (4.37), stolen bases per game (1.16) and triple per game (0.26).
- The Mavericks lead their conference with a 1.96 ERA.
- Kamryn Meyer leads Omaha in the circle with a 1.28 ERA and 89 strikeouts. Both rank first in the Summit League.
- On offense, Lynsey Tucker leads the Mavericks with a .390 batting average. The senior has tallied 23 hits including four doubles and six RBI. Tucker has also added 10 runs.
- Rachel Weber adds a .328 batting average. The graduate student has notched 20 hits including a team-best four home runs and 20 RBI.

HUSKER QUICK HITS

- **Billie Andrews** has tallied nine home runs this season, she is now seventh all-time in Nebraska history in career homers with 36.
- Andrews is one of 12 returning players in the NCAA who hit 20 or more home runs last season.
- **Sarah Harness** recorded a no-hitter against New Mexico on Feb. 24, 2023. It marked the first no-hitter by a Nebraska pitcher since 2016.
- Mya Felder is the only returning Big Ten player who received All-Big Ten, All-Defensive and All-Tournament honors in 2022.
- Courtney Wallace is one of six returning Rawlings/NFCA Gold Glove recipients from last season.

NU SET FOR 55-GAME SCHEDULE

Nebraska is scheduled to play 55 games in 2023, including 14 home games, 18 away games and 23 games at neutral sites.

HUSKERS TRAVEL TO NINE STATES

Nebraska will travel to nine states this season, playing games in Texas, Florida, New Mexico, Arizona, Kansas, Iowa, Maryland, Indiana and Illinois.

NU SET FOR 26 GAMES AGAINST 2022 NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAMS

Nebraska is slated to play 14 teams that reached the 2022 NCAA Tournament last season including South Dakota State, Oklahoma State, UCLA, Virginia Tech, Texas A&M, Arkansas, Weber State, Arizona, Wichita State, Missouri State, Michigan, Wisconsin, Northwestern and Ohio State.

The Huskers will see South Dakota State their first weekend of play at the Houston Invitational.

NU faces Oklahoma State, UCLA, Virginia Tech, Texas A&M and Arkansas at the TaxAct Clearwater Invitational.

Nebraska will see Weber State and Arizona in the third week of the season at the Hillenbrand Invitational.

At the Wichita State Round Robin Tournament, NU will face Wichita State and Missouri State twice each.

The Big Red will host lowa State for a midweek matchup.

The Huskers will play three-game series vs. Michigan, Wisconsin, Northwestern and Ohio State during the conference regular season schedule.

HOME SWEET HOME

Nebraska will have 14 home games at Bowlin Stadium in 2023.

ILLINOIS HOSTS BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

The 2023 Big Ten Tournament is set for May 10-13 at Illinois' Eichelberger Field. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings will compete in the tournament, with the top four seeds earning a bye.

The 2023 Women's College World Series will be held at ASA Hall of Fame Stadium in Oklahoma City for the 25th straight season and the 32nd time overall.

CANEDA EARNS BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONORS

Katelyn Caneda was named from was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week Monday following a big performance in the Huskers' perfect 5-0 weekend at the Hillenbrand Invitational.

A Cerritos, Calif., native, Caneda produced three multi-hit games and tallied three extra-base hits. She finished the weekend 8-for-17 (.471) with two doubles, one home run, five RBIs and four runs scored, averaging more than one hit and one RBI per game.

Caneda was crucial in Nebraska's win over No. 16 Arizona. The freshman went 2-for-4 with two runs and one RBI. She added her second home run of the season with a solo shot in the seventh inning to help the Huskers run past the Wildcats, 10-3.

Caneda is batting .360 on the season (18-for-50) with 12 RBIs, eight runs, two doubles and two home runs. The freshman has started all 20 games at second base for the Big Red this year.

PITCHING STAFF STARTS STRONG IN THE CIRCLE

The Nebraska pitching staff has had a strong start to the 2023 season. Courtney Wallace and Sarah Harness have made impressive starts, both earning Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors once this season. Kaylin Kinney added a strong start, but she is currently sidelined due to a hand injury. As a pitching staff, the Huskers lead the conference in shutouts with eight. Nebraska is one shutout away from matching the 2022 season total of nine.

Harness earned Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors on Monday, Feb. 27, after posting a 2-0 record last weekend, starting two games and holding opponents scoreless through 11.0 innings. She gave up only one hit while striking out 12 over the weekend.

Harness fired the 40th no-hitter in school history and the first since 2016 in a win 5-0 win over New Mexico State (Feb. 24). She was just one out away from the fourth perfect game in program history, as the Aggies' only base runner reached on a two-out error in the bottom of the seventh inning.

Senior right-hander Courtney Wallace was named the Big Ten Pitcher on Monday, Feb. 13. Wallace was honored after posting a 3-0 record with a 0.00 ERA and three shutouts at the Houston Invitational last weekend. She opened the series with a one-hit shutout over Lamar, helping the Huskers to an 8-0 five-inning victory. Against Houston, Wallace held the Cougars to five hits while striking out five in NU's 7-0 win. In the final game of the weekend, Wallace blanked previously unbeaten Virginia, leading the Big Red to a 2-0 victory.

Wallace only gave up 12 hits over 19.0 innings and did not allow an extra-base hit, limiting opposing hitters to a paltry .174 average. She added 14 strikeouts and only three runners advanced past second base in her three complete games. Wallace was the only pitcher in the conference to record three wins in the opening weekend of the season. She ranked first in the nation in shutout victories, wins and ERA after the first weekend of the season.

BOWLIN STADIUM



The 2023 season marks the 22nd season Nebraska has called Bowlin Stadium home. The stadium's inaugural season was in 2002.

One of the top facilities in the country, Bowlin Stadium features seating for 2,530 fans, an underground system that heats the field, a large video board, FieldTurf and a padded wall.. Just past the right field fence is the Alex Gordon Training Complex, a spacious indoor facility that is large enough for Nebraska to take live batting practice inside the complex. The clubhouse features a locker room, players' lounge, training room and coaches' offices.

Nebraska has won nearly 70 percent of its games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers have hosted four NCAA Regionals at Bowlin Stadium and ranked in the top 25 nationally in attendance 14 times, including four seasons ranked in the top 10.


