The Nebraska softball team (27-13, 7-4 Big Ten) will travel to Bloomington to take on Indiana in a three-game series this weekend, April 14-16. Game one is set for 5 p.m. (CT) on Friday, April 14. The Huskers and the Hoosiers (31-12, 9-2 Big Ten) will face off at 1 p.m. (CT) on Saturday, April 15 with the final game set for Sunday, April 16, at 11 a.m. (CT).

Nebraska is ranked among the best offensively in the Big Ten. The Huskers are among the top five in batting average (.323), runs (205), hits (333), doubles (65), home runs (44), RBI (192) and slugging percentage (.515).

Freshman Katelyn Caneda leads the Big Ten offense with a .405 batting average and has tallied 45 hits including seven doubles, one triple, two home runs and 27 RBI. Junior Billie Andrews has also added 45 hits while tallying 11 home runs and 32 runs.

In the circle, Courtney Wallace (17-8) has appeared in 141.2 innings while tallying 90 strikeouts. Sarah Harness (9-4) has added 74.2 innings of work, striking out 77 batters.

Nebraska is slated to play 14 teams that reached the 2022 NCAA Tournament last season including South Dakota State, Oklahoma State, UCLA, Virginia Tech, Texas A&M, Arkansas, Weber State, Arizona, Wichita State, Missouri State, Michigan, Wisconsin, Northwestern and Ohio State.

The Huskers will see South Dakota State their first weekend of play at the Houston Invitational.

The junior's batting average gets better as the innings go. She is hitting .316 in the fifth inning with six hits including two doubles and two home runs.

In the sixth inning, Andrews is hitting .438 with three homers and 10 RBI while adding a .571 batting average in the seventh.

CANEDA STARTS FRESHMAN SEASON OFF STRONG

Katelyn Caneda has had an impressive start to her first season as a Husker. The freshman has started every game this season at second base, and currently leads the Big Red with a .405 batting average.

Caneda is fourth in the Big Ten Conference in batting average and has the second-best amongst freshmen. The only freshman to hold a better average is Indiana's Taryn Kern, who is hitting .434. Caneda is also sixth nationally among freshmen.

A Cerritos, Calif., native, Caneda has produced 16 multi-hit games. Caneda has added 18 runs, seven doubles, one triple, two home runs and 27 RBI. The freshman holds a .541 slugging percentage and a .446 on-base percentage. She has also stolen three bases.

Caneda was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week March 6, 2023, after a big performance for the Huskers' perfect 5-0 weekend at the Hillenbrand Invitational. The freshman hit .471 with eight hits and five RBIs on the weekend.

BOWLIN STADIUM



The 2023 season marks the 22nd season Nebraska has called Bowlin Stadium home. The stadium's inaugural season was in 2002.

One of the top facilities in the country, Bowlin Stadium features seating for 2,530 fans, an underground system that heats the field, a large video board, FieldTurf and a padded wall.. Just past the right field fence is the Alex Gordon Training Complex, a spacious indoor facility that is large enough for Nebraska to take live batting practice inside the complex. The clubhouse features a locker room, players' lounge, training room and coaches' offices.

Nebraska has won nearly 70 percent of its games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers have hosted four NCAA Regionals at Bowlin Stadium and ranked in the top 25 nationally in attendance 14 times, including four seasons ranked in the top 10.

SCOUTING THE INDIANA HOOSIERS (31-12, 9-2)

Indiana is coming off a series loss to Minnesota, ending a historic 23-game win streak for the Hoosiers. IU claimed game one against the Gophers, 9-3, before falling 5-6 and 5-8 in game two and three. IU is 30-11 overall and 9-2 in Big Ten play this season.

Nebraska and Indiana share seven common opponents this season including Arkansas, Arizona, Wisconsin, Maryland, Purdue, Ohio State and Michigan.

The Hoosiers finished non-conference play with a 21-9 record.

In week one of Big Ten play, Indiana swept Maryland. The Hoosiers picked up three straight wins including a game two run-rule victory.

Indiana added two conference victories, sweeping a midweek doubleheader against Purdue.

The Hoosiers swept Ohio State in a three-game series week two of Big Ten play.

Indiana leads the Big Ten with a .329 batting average, a number that ranks 10th in the NCAA.

The Hoosiers lead the conference in doubles (74), home runs per game (1.36), on-base percentage (.433), slugging percentage (.572) and stolen bases per game (1.98).

Indiana held a historic 23-game win streak from March 5-April 8.

Freshman Taryn Kern has led the Hoosiers on offense with a .434 batting average, 1.009 slugging percentage and 0.596 on-base percentage.

Kern leads the conference in slugging percentage, on-base percentage, RBI (50), home runs (17), hit by pitch (14) and walks (30).

Briana Copeland leads the Hoosiers with a 15-0 record in the circle. Her 15 wins are the third-most in the Big Ten.

Heather Johnson has added three saves, the third-most in the conference this season.
