### NEBRASKA vs. CREIGHTON

The Nebraska softball team (30-13, 10-4 Big Ten) hosts Creighton in its final non-conference matchup of the season on Wednesday, April 19 at 6 p.m. (CT). The Bluejays come into the midweek game with an 18-24 record and are 4-11 in Big East play.

Fans can listen to the game live on the Huskers Radio Network and Huskers.com with the call from Nate Rohr and Mattie Fowler Burkhardt. The game will also be streamed live on BTN+ (subscription required).

Nebraska currently leads the Big Ten with a .321 batting average and 368 hits. The Huskers are ranked among the top five in runs (229), doubles (73), home runs (214), scoring (5.33), on-base percentage (.379) and slugging percentage (.520).

Freshman Katelyn Caneda leads the Big Red offense with a .398 batting average and has tallied 49 hits including seven doubles, one triple, two home runs and 31 RBI. Junior Billie Andrews has added 51 hits while tallying 11 home runs and 37 runs.

In the circle, Courtney Wallace (19-8) has appeared in 156.2 innings while tallying 101 strikeouts. Sarah Harness (10-4) has added 78.2 innings of work, striking out 82 batters.

### LEADING OFF...

- The Huskers currently lead the Big Ten Conference in batting average (.321) and hits (368).
- NU's offense is in the top five in the conference in doubles (73), triples (6), RBI (214) and slugging percentage (.521).
- Nebraska's pitching staff is second in the Big Ten in shutouts with 11. This marks the most shutouts in a season for an NU team since 2014, when the Huskers tallied 18.
- The Huskers are 28-3 when scoring more than two runs in a game this season.
- NU has held 17 opponents to one run or less.
- **Katelyn Caneda** is sixth in the Big Ten with a .398 batting average, a number that leads the team. Caneda is seventh nationally in batting average among freshmen.
- **Billie Andrews** and **Brooke Andrews** are third in the Big Ten, both with 11 home runs.
- **Billie Andrews** (51) and **Katelyn Caneda** (49) are fourth and fifth in the conference in total hits.
- **Billie Andrews** has hit five of her 11 home runs in the lead off at-bat.
- **Courtney Wallace** leads the Big Ten with 19 victories in the circle.

### HUSKERS TO WATCH



**Katelyn Caneda** holds a team-best .398 batting average and has added 49 hits and 31 RBI. Caneda has started conference play with a .391 batting average and a .457 slugging percentage.



**Brooke Andrews** has been a leader with timely hits during the last 15 games. Andrews has hit seven of her 11 home runs while tallying 22 RBI.

## NEBRASKA BY THE NUMBERS

- Nebraska is first in the conference in batting average (.321) and is 15th in the nation.
- The Huskers are second in the Big Ten in shutouts with 11 and are ranked 25th in the NCAA.
- NU ranks second in the Big Ten and 22nd in the NCAA with a .520 slugging percentage.
- **Katelyn Caneda** is fifth in the Big Ten with a .398 batting average, a mark that leads the Big Red.
- **Billie Andrews** and **Brooke Andrews** are third in the conference with 11 home runs this season.
- **Billie Andrews** and **Katelyn Caneda** are fourth and fifth in the Big Ten in total hits.
- **Courtney Wallace** has recorded the most wins in the Big Ten with 19. She is also sixth in the NCAA.
- **Courtney Wallace** is also third in the conference with three saves, a number that is 31st in the nation.

## CREIGHTON BY THE NUMBERS

- Creighton leads the Big East in home runs per game (0.81) and slugging percentage (.439).
- On offense, the Bluejays are in the top five in the conference in batting average (.286), doubles (60), on base percentage (.365) and scoring (4.52).
- Lily West leads the Bluejays with 45 hits, a number that ranks third in the conference.
- Cayla Nielson holds a .353 batting average which leads the team this season.
- Alyssa Gappa has tallied 10 home runs, the most by a Bluejay during 2023. Gappa has added 12 doubles, 24 runs and 26 RBI.
- Kailey Wilson leads Creighton with 30 RBI. She has tallied 36 hits with 11 doubles and nine homers.
- Natalia Puchino has tallied 91 strikeouts, a number that ranks third in the Big East. Puchino leads Creighton with an 11-11 record, 125.1 innings pitched and 10 complete games.

## HUSKER QUICK HITS

- **Sarah Harness** recorded her 500th career strikeout this year. The junior has tallied 82 strikeouts this season and has combined for over 500 including her three seasons at Southern Illinois.
- **Billie Andrews** and **Brooke Andrews** have recorded a home run in the same game five times during their careers at Nebraska.
- **Billie Andrews** has tallied 11 home runs this season, she is now seventh all-time in Nebraska history in career homers with 38.
- **Andrews** is one of 12 returning players in the NCAA who hit 20 or more home runs last season.
- **Sarah Harness** recorded a no-hitter against New Mexico on Feb. 24, 2023. It marked the first no-hitter by a Nebraska pitcher since 2016.
- **Mya Felder** is the only returning Big Ten player who received All-Big Ten, All-Defensive and All-Tournament honors in 2022.
- **Courtney Wallace** is one of six returning Rawlings/NFCA Gold Glove recipients from last season.

### NU SET FOR 55-GAME SCHEDULE

Nebraska is scheduled to play 55 games in 2023, including 14 home games, 18 away games and 23 games at neutral sites.

### HUSKERS TRAVEL TO NINE STATES

Nebraska will travel to nine states this season, playing games in Texas, Florida, New Mexico, Arizona, Kansas, Iowa, Maryland, Indiana and Illinois.

### NU SET FOR 26 GAMES AGAINST 2022 NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAMS

Nebraska is slated to play 14 teams that reached the 2022 NCAA Tournament last season including South Dakota State, Oklahoma State, UCLA, Virginia Tech, Texas A&M, Arkansas, Weber State, Arizona, Wichita State, Missouri State, Michigan, Wisconsin, Northwestern and Ohio State.

The Huskers will see South Dakota State their first weekend of play at the Houston Invitational.

NU faces Oklahoma State, UCLA, Virginia Tech, Texas A&M and Arkansas at the TaxAct Clearwater Invitational.

Nebraska will see Weber State and Arizona in the third week of the season at the Hillenbrand Invitational.

At the Wichita State Round Robin Tournament, NU will face Wichita State and Missouri State twice each.

The Big Red will host Iowa State for a midweek matchup.

The Huskers will play three-game series vs. Michigan, Wisconsin, Northwestern and Ohio State during the conference regular season schedule.

### HOME SWEET HOME

Nebraska will have 14 home games at Bowlin Stadium in 2023.

### ILLINOIS HOSTS BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

The 2023 Big Ten Tournament is set for May 10-13 at Illinois' Eichelberger Field. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings will compete in the tournament, with the top four seeds earning a bye.

### OKC HOSTS WCWS

The 2023 Women's College World Series will be held at ASA Hall of Fame Stadium in Oklahoma City for the 25th straight season and the 32nd time overall.

Brooke Andrews has provided the Nebraska offense a spark over the last couple of weeks, especially in the fourth inning and later. Eight of Andrews' 11 homers have come in the fourth inning or later.

Andrews is hitting .350 in the fourth inning and has tallied seven hits including three home runs. She is hitting .333 in the fifth inning with seven hits including three doubles and two home runs.

In the sixth inning, Andrews is hitting .500 with three homers and 10 RBI while adding a .500 batting average in the seventh.

## WALLACE PROVIDING LEADERSHIP IN THE CIRCLE

Courtney Wallace has provided leadership in the circle for the Huskers during the 2023 season. Wallace has made appearances in 34 of NU's 43 games with 156.2 innings of work.

Wallace has made appearances in the last 21 consecutive games. This marks the most-consecutive appearances by a Husker since Ashley Hagemann appeared in 24 straight at the end of the 2011 season. She added six more games in 2012 to bring her combined consecutive appearances to 30.

The fifth-year senior has appeared in every conference game this season and has had a decision in 12 of the 14 games. Wallace is 7-3 with two saves in the Big Ten so far.

## CANEDA STARTS FRESHMAN SEASON OFF STRONG

Katelyn Caneda has had an impressive start to her first season as a Husker. The freshman has started every game this season at second base, and currently leads the Big Red with a .398 batting average.

Caneda is fifth in the Big Ten Conference in batting average and has the second-best average among freshmen. The only freshman to hold a better average is Indiana's Taryn Kern, who is hitting .417. Caneda is also seventh nationally among freshmen.

### BOWLIN STADIUM



The 2023 season marks the 22nd season Nebraska has called Bowlin Stadium home. The stadium's inaugural season was in 2002.

One of the top facilities in the country, Bowlin Stadium features seating for 2,530 fans, an underground system that heats the field, a large video board, FieldTurf and a padded wall. Just past the right field fence is the Alex Gordon Training Complex, a spacious indoor facility that is large enough for Nebraska to take live batting practice inside the complex. The clubhouse features a locker room, players' lounge, training room and coaches' offices.

Nebraska has won nearly 70 percent of its games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers have hosted four NCAA Regionals at Bowlin Stadium and ranked in the top 25 nationally in attendance 14 times, including four seasons ranked in the top 10.

# SCOUTING THE CREIGHTON BLUEJAYS

Creighton (18-24, 4-11 Big East) is coming off a series loss to Georgetown, finishing the weekend 1-2.

Nebraska and Creighton share five common opponents this season in Texas A&M Commerce, New Mexico, New Mexico State, Kansas City and Omaha.

Creighton leads the Big East in home runs per game (0.81) and slugging percentage (.439).

On offense, the Bluejays are in the top five in the conference in batting average (.286), doubles (60), on base percentage (.365) and scoring (4.52).

Lily West leads the Bluejays with 45 hits, a number that ranks third in the conference.

Cayla Nielson holds a .353 batting average which leads the team this season.

Alyssa Gappa has tallied 10 home runs, the most by a Bluejay during 2023. Gappa has added 12 doubles, 24 runs and 26 RBI.

Kailey Wilson leads Creighton with 30 RBI. She has tallied 36 hits with 11 doubles and nine homers.

Natalia Puchino has tallied 91 strikeouts, a number that ranks third in the Big East. Puchino leads Creighton with an 11-11 record, 125.1 innings pitched and 10 complete games.
