The Nebraska softball team (31-14, 12-5 Big Ten) travels to Evanston, Ill., for a three-game series against No. 22 Northwestern (30-10, 15-2) this weekend, April 28-30. Game one is set for Friday, April 28, at 4 p.m. (CT). On Saturday, April 29, the Huskers and the Wildcats face off at 1 p.m. with the final game set for Sunday, April 30, at 1 p.m.

Fans can listen to all three games live on the Huskers Radio Network and Huskers.com with the call from Nate Rohr. The first two games will be streamed live on BTN+ (subscription required). Game three will have live television coverage from the Big Ten Network.

Northwestern and Nebraska have been the top two Big Ten teams the past two seasons. The Wildcats claimed the 2022 regular season title while the Huskers earned the Big Ten Tournament title. The programs finished 1-2 in last year's Big Ten standings, and they enter this weekend 1-2 in the standings again. Northwestern has won 75 games the past two seasons while Nebraska has won 73 games. The Huskers and Wildcats are two of only 22 teams nationally - and the only Big Ten teams - with 70 or more wins since the start of the 2022 season.

Nebraska's offense is currently in the top three in the Big Ten in batting average (.318), doubles (78), home runs (48), hits (393) and slugging percentage (.553). Freshman Katelyn Caneda leads the Big Red offense with a .393 batting average and has tallied 53 hits including seven doubles, one triple, two home runs and 32 RBI. In the circle, Courtney Wallace (21-8) has appeared in 173.2 innings while tallying 110 strikeouts.

LEADING OFF...

- The Huskers are currently second in the Big Ten Conference in batting average (.318).
- NU's offense is in the top five in the conference in runs (241), hits (393), doubles (78), home runs (48), RBI (222), slugging percentage (.553) and on base percentage (.376).
- Nebraska's pitching staff is second in the Big Ten in shutouts with 11. This marks the most shutouts in a season for an NU team since 2014, when the Huskers tallied 18.
- The Huskers are 30-4 when scoring more than two runs in a game this season.
- NU has held 18 opponents to one run or less.
- **Katelyn Caneda** is sixth in the Big Ten with a .393 batting average, a number that leads the team. Caneda is 10th nationally in batting average among freshmen.
- **Billie Andrews** and **Brooke Andrews** are tied for fifth in the Big Ten, both with 11 home runs.
- **Billie Andrews** (55) and **Katelyn Caneda** (53) are fifth and seventh in the conference in total hits.
- **Billie Andrews** has hit five of her 11 home runs in the lead off at-bat.
- **Courtney Wallace** leads the Big Ten with 21 victories in the circle.

HUSKERS TO WATCH



Katelyn Caneda holds a team-best .393 batting average and has added 53 hits and 32 RBI. Caneda has started conference play with a .379 batting average and a .431 slugging percentage.



Brooke Andrews has provided a timely spark for the Huskers. Andrews is hitting .404 in conference play with 21 hits, six homers and 21 RBI.

- Nebraska is second in the conference in batting average (.318) and 21st in the nation.
- The Huskers are second in the Big Ten in shutouts with 11 and are ranked 27th in the NCAA.
- NU ranks third in the Big Ten and 26th in the nation with a .509 slugging percentage.
- **Katelyn Caneda** is sixth in the conference with a .393 batting average, a mark that leads the Big Red.
- **Billie Andrews** and **Brooke Andrews** are fourth in the Big Ten with 11 home runs this season.
- **Billie Andrews** and **Katelyn Caneda** are fifth and seventh in total hits in the conference.
- **Courtney Wallace** has recorded the most victories in the circle in the Big Ten with 21. She ranks sixth in the NCAA as Megan Faraimo of UCLA leads the nation with 24 wins.

NORTHWESTERN BY THE NUMBERS

- The Wildcats currently lead the Big Ten standings with a 15-2 record, their only losses coming from Iowa and Michigan.
- Northwestern holds a team batting average of .279, a number that ranks sixth in the Big Ten.
- The Wildcats Skyler Shellmeyer who holds a .342 batting average with 41 hits and 19 RBI.
- Jordyn Rudd, 2022 Gold Glove Award recipient, leads NU with 34 RBI. She has started every game behind the plate.
- The Wildcats have a team ERA of 2.96, which ranks eighth in the conference.
- A First Team All-American, Danielle Williams leads Northwestern in the circle. The fifth-year senior has appeared in 92.2 innings and holds a 12-1 record. Williams has tallied 128 strikeouts this season while allowing 35 earned runs.
- Lauren Boyd has added 81.2 innings of work and leads the Wildcats with a 1.63 ERA. The junior holds a 7-3 record with one save.

HUSKER QUICK HITS

- Eight of **Brooke Andrews'** 11 home runs came in the fourth inning or later this season.
- **Billie Andrews** and **Brooke Andrews** have recorded a home run in the same game five times during their careers at Nebraska.
- **Billie Andrews** has tallied 11 home runs this season. She is now seventh all-time in Nebraska history in career homers with 38.
- **Andrews** is one of 12 returning players in the NCAA who hit 20 or more home runs last season.
- **Sarah Harness** recorded a no-hitter against New Mexico on Feb. 24, 2023. It marked the first no-hitter by a Nebraska pitcher since 2016.
- **Sarah Harness** has tallied 85 strikeouts this season and has combined for over 500 in her career including her three seasons at Southern Illinois.
- **Mya Felder** is the only returning Big Ten player who received All-Big Ten, All-Defensive and All-Tournament honors in 2022.
- **Courtney Wallace** is one of six returning Rawlings/NFCA Gold Glove recipients from last season.

NU SET FOR 52-GAME SCHEDULE

Nebraska is scheduled to play 52 games in 2023, including 13 home games, 19 away games and 20 games at neutral sites.

HUSKERS TRAVEL TO NINE STATES

Nebraska will travel to nine states this season, playing games in Texas, Florida, New Mexico, Arizona, Kansas, Iowa, Maryland, Indiana and Illinois.

NU SET FOR 26 GAMES AGAINST 2022 NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAMS

Nebraska is slated to play 14 teams that reached the 2022 NCAA Tournament last season including South Dakota State, Oklahoma State, UCLA, Virginia Tech, Texas A&M, Arkansas, Weber State, Arizona, Wichita State, Missouri State, Michigan, Wisconsin, Northwestern and Ohio State.

The Huskers will see South Dakota State their first weekend of play at the Houston Invitational.

NU faces Oklahoma State, UCLA, Virginia Tech, Texas A&M and Arkansas at the TaxAct Clearwater Invitational.

Nebraska will see Weber State and Arizona in the third week of the season at the Hillenbrand Invitational.

At the Wichita State Round Robin Tournament, NU will face Wichita State and Missouri State twice each.

The Big Red will host Iowa State for a midweek matchup.

The Huskers will play three-game series vs. Michigan, Wisconsin, Northwestern and Ohio State during the conference regular season schedule.

HOME SWEET HOME

Nebraska will have 13 home games at Bowlin Stadium in 2023.

ILLINOIS HOSTS BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

The 2023 Big Ten Tournament is set for May 10-13 at Illinois' Eichelberger Field. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings will compete in the tournament, with the top four seeds earning a bye.

WALLACE MAKES HER MARK IN NEBRASKA HISTORY

Courtney Wallace has been an important part of Nebraska's pitching staff over the past five seasons. The Omaha, Neb., native has already set career-highs in wins, appearances, complete games and strikeouts this season. She continues to climb the ranks in Nebraska history in numerous categories.

With nine career saves, Wallace is tied for sixth all-time in Nebraska history along with Peaches James (2001-04) and Kaylan Jablonski (2015-18). Associate Head Coach Lori Sippel holds the record with 16 from 1985-88.

Wallace entered the top 10 as she has now tallied 55 career victories, tied for 10th all-time with Donna Dearthoff (1985-88). Jenny Voss (1997-2000) holds the record with 110 wins.

With over 584.2 innings of work in the circle, Wallace is tied for 10th all-time with Sandy Wolterman (1981-84) in inning pitched. Voss holds the record for innings pitched with 1,073.0.

WALLACE PROVIDING LEADERSHIP IN THE CIRCLE

Courtney Wallace, a two-time captain, has been a leader in the circle for the Huskers this season. The fifth-year senior has made appearances in 36 of NU's 46 games with 173.2 innings of work.

Wallace has made appearances in 16 of NU's 17 conference games in 2023 and has had a decision in 14 of the 17 games. Wallace is 9-3 with two saves in the Big Ten so far.

CANEDA HAVING STRONG FRESHMAN CAMPAIGN

Katelyn Caneda has had an impressive start to her first season as a Husker. The freshman has started every game this season at second base, and currently leads the Big Red with a .393 batting average.

Caneda is sixth in the Big Ten Conference in batting average and has the second-best average among freshmen. The only freshman to hold a better average is Indiana's Taryn Kern, who is hitting .420. Caneda is also 10th nationally among freshmen.

BOWLIN STADIUM



The 2023 season marks the 22nd season Nebraska has called Bowlin Stadium home. The stadium's inaugural season was in 2002.

One of the top facilities in the country, Bowlin Stadium features seating for 2,530 fans, an underground system that heats the field, a large video board, FieldTurf and a padded wall. Just past the right field fence is the Alex Gordon Training Complex, a spacious indoor facility that is large enough for Nebraska to take live batting practice inside the complex. The clubhouse features a locker room, players' lounge, training room and coaches' offices.

Nebraska has won nearly 70 percent of its games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers have hosted four NCAA Regionals at Bowlin Stadium and ranked in the top 25 nationally in attendance 14 times, including four seasons ranked in the top 10.

Jordyn Rudd, 2022 Gold Glove Award recipient, leads NU with 34 RBI. She has started every game behind the plate.
