The Nebraska softball team (34-20) travels to Stillwater, Okla. for the NCAA Regionals, May 19-21. This marks the second-consecutive season that the Huskers reached the NCAA Tournament and the 26th appearance in program history. NU will take on No. 21 Wichita State on Friday, May 19. Sixth-seeded Oklahoma State, who holds a No. 9 ranking in the latest NFCA Coaches Poll, will host UMBC on Friday at 3 p.m. Friday's game will start at 6 p.m. (CT) with live television coverage from ESPNU. Fans can also listen to the game live on the Huskers Radio Network and Huskers.com with the call from Nate Rohr.

This marks Nebraska's second-consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament and 26th time in program history. This also marks Rhonda Revelle's 22nd trip to the NCAA Tournament as Nebraska's head coach.

Nebraska's offense holds the second-best batting average in the Big Ten with a .308 and is ranked in the top five in the conference in hits (443), doubles (85), home runs (57) and slugging percentage (.495). Freshman Katelyn Caneda has led the Big Red offense through the regular season, holding a .373 batting average. Junior Billie Andrews has added 63 hits, 45 runs and 15 home runs.

Senior Courtney Wallace (23-14) has been a leader in the circle for Nebraska, appearing in 206.0 innings. She has tallied 126 strikeouts while pitching 20 complete games. Wallace is second in the Big Ten victories with 23. Sarah Harness (10-5) has added 103.1 innings of work, adding 91 strikeouts for the Huskers.

LEADING OFF...

- The Huskers are currently second in the Big Ten Conference in batting average (.308).
- NU's offense is in the top five in the conference in hits (443), doubles (85), home runs (57) and slugging percentage (.495).
- Nebraska's pitching staff is third in the Big Ten in shutouts with 12. This marks the most shutouts in a season for an NU team since 2014, when the Huskers tallied 18.
- The Huskers are 25-3 when holding opponents to two runs or less.
- NU has held 19 opponents to one run or less.
- **Katelyn Caneda** is ninth in the Big Ten with a .373 batting average, a number that leads the team. Caneda is second in batting average among freshmen in the Big Ten.
- **Billie Andrews** is second in the Big Ten with 15 homers. This marks her second season with 15+ home runs.
- **Billie Andrews** is fourth in the conference in hits with 63.
- **Billie Andrews** has hit five of her 11 home runs in the lead off at-bat.
- **Courtney Wallace** is second in the Big Ten with 23 victories in the circle.

- Nebraska is second in the conference in batting average (.307) and 33rd in the nation.
- The Huskers are third in the Big Ten in shutouts with 12 and are ranked 63rd in the NCAA.
- NU ranks fourth in the Big Ten and 31st in the nation with a .494 slugging percentage.
- **Katelyn Caneda** is ninth in the conference with a .373 batting average, a mark that leads the Big Red.
- **Billie Andrews** is second in the Big Ten with 15 home runs.
- **Brooke Andrews** is 10th in the Big Ten with 44 RBIs.
- **Billie Andrews** is fourth in total hits in the conference.
- **Courtney Wallace** is first in the conference and 10th nationally in innings pitched with 205.0 innings of work.
- **Courtney Wallace** is second in the Big Ten with 23 victories. She ranks 11th in the NCAA as Brianna Pratt of Miami (OH) leads the nation with 30 wins.

NEBRASKA QUICK HITS

- Eight of **Brooke Andrews'** 11 home runs came in the fourth inning or later this season.
- **Billie Andrews** and **Brooke Andrews** have recorded a home run in the same game five times during their careers at Nebraska.
- **Billie Andrews** has tallied 15 home runs this season. She is now sixth all-time in Nebraska history in career homers with 42.
- **Andrews** is one of 12 returning players in the NCAA who hit 20 or more home runs last season.
- **Sarah Harness** recorded a no-hitter against New Mexico on Feb. 24, 2023. It marked the first no-hitter by a Nebraska pitcher since 2016.
- **Sarah Harness** has tallied 91 strikeouts this season and has combined for over 500 in her career including her three seasons at Southern Illinois.
- **Mya Felder** is the only returning Big Ten player who received All-Big Ten, All-Defensive and All-Tournament honors in 2022.
- **Courtney Wallace** is one of six returning Rawlings/NFCA Gold Glove recipients from last season.

BIG RED RECORDS

- Nebraska has tallied 85 doubles this season, a number that is tied for third-most in school history.
- The Huskers have added 149 extra-base hits this season, a mark that is fourth in NU history.
- **Courtney Wallace** has recorded the most wins in a season since 2014 when Tatum Edwards finished the season with a 24-13 record.
- **Wallace** has moved to 10th all-time in school history with 57 career wins in the circle.
- **Wallace** is also 10th all-time in NU history in innings pitched with 616.0 innings of work.
- **Wallace** is tied for sixth all-time in school history in career saves with nine.
- **Billie Andrews** has tallied 42 career home runs, a total that ranks sixth all-time in NU history.
- **Andrews** is tied for 10th all-time in extra-base hits with 68.
- **Andrews** became the third Husker to record two seasons with 15 or more homers joining Ali Viola and Taylor Edwards as the only NU players to do so.

NU SET FOR 52-GAME SCHEDULE

Nebraska is scheduled to play 52 games in 2023, including 13 home games, 19 away games and 20 games at neutral sites.

HUSKERS TRAVEL TO NINE STATES

Nebraska will travel to nine states this season, playing games in Texas, Florida, New Mexico, Arizona, Kansas, Iowa, Maryland, Indiana and Illinois.

NU SET FOR 26 GAMES AGAINST 2022 NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAMS

Nebraska is slated to play 14 teams that reached the 2022 NCAA Tournament last season including South Dakota State, Oklahoma State, UCLA, Virginia Tech, Texas A&M, Arkansas, Weber State, Arizona, Wichita State, Missouri State, Michigan, Wisconsin, Northwestern and Ohio State.

The Huskers will see South Dakota State their first weekend of play at the Houston Invitational.

NU faces Oklahoma State, UCLA, Virginia Tech, Texas A&M and Arkansas at the TaxAct Clearwater Invitational.

Nebraska will see Weber State and Arizona in the third week of the season at the Hillenbrand Invitational.

At the Wichita State Round Robin Tournament, NU will face Wichita State and Missouri State twice each.

The Big Red will host Iowa State for a midweek matchup.

The Huskers will play three-game series vs. Michigan, Wisconsin, Northwestern and Ohio State during the conference regular season schedule.

HOME SWEET HOME

Nebraska will have 13 home games at Bowlin Stadium in 2023.

ILLINOIS HOSTS BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

The 2023 Big Ten Tournament is set for May 10-13 at Illinois' Eichelberger Field. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings will compete in the tournament, with the top four seeds earning a bye.

BROOKE ANDREWS HAVING STANDOUT JUNIOR SEASON

In her fourth year at Nebraska, Brooke Andrews has had a strong start to the 2023 season. The junior has set numerous season-bests already this year. Andrews has tallied 51 hits, nine doubles, one triple, 11 home runs and 44 RBI. These all mark season-highs for the junior and match most of her previous totals from the first three seasons combined.

FIVE HUSKERS EARN ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS

Freshman Katelyn Caneda led five Huskers who were honored on Wednesday, when the conference announced its postseason awards. Caneda (second base) earned First Team All-Big Ten, All-Defensive and All-Freshman honors, the only player in the conference to receive a spot on all three teams.

Billie Andrews (shortstop) and Brooke Andrews (outfield) joined Caneda, each earning a spot on the First Team All-Big Ten team. This marks the first All-Big Ten honor for Brooke Andrews while Billie Andrews earned all-conference accolades for the third straight season. Billie and Brooke Andrews are the third set of sisters in the Big Ten to receive First Team All-Big Ten honors in the same year and the second from Nebraska. Tatum and Taylor Edwards were both named all-conference first team in 2013 and 2014 while Michigan's sisters Kari and Karla Kunnen both earned first team honors in 1993.

Mya Felder (first base) joined Caneda on the All-Defensive team. This marked Felder's second consecutive year being named to the All-Defensive team. Nebraska was the only Big Ten team to place two players on the All-Defensive team.

Abbey Newlun rounded out Nebraska's honorees, as she was announced as the Huskers' Big Ten Sportsmanship recipient.

NEBRASKA RECORDS 12 SHUTOUTS THIS SEASON

The Nebraska pitching staff has tallied 12 shutouts this season. The last season the Huskers recorded more than 12 shutouts in a season was in 2014 when NU finished with 18 shutouts on the season. Courtney Wallace currently leads the Big Red with five shutouts, a personal best for the fifth-year senior.

WALLACE MAKES HER MARK IN NEBRASKA HISTORY

Courtney Wallace has been an important part of Nebraska's pitching staff over the past five seasons. The Omaha, Neb., native has already set career-highs in wins, appearances, games started, complete games, innings pitched, shutouts and strikeouts this season. She continues to climb the ranks in Nebraska history in numerous categories.

With nine career saves, Wallace is tied for sixth all-time in Nebraska history along with Peaches James (2001-04) and Kaylan Jablonski (2015-18). Associate Head Coach Lori Sippel holds the record with 16 from 1985-88.

Wallace entered the top 10 as she has tallied 57 career victories. Jenny Voss (1997-2000) holds the record with 110 wins.

With 616.0 innings of work in the circle, Wallace is now 10th all-time in innings pitched. Voss holds the record for innings pitched with 1,073.0.

BOWLIN STADIUM



The 2023 season marks the 22nd season Nebraska has called Bowlin Stadium home. The stadium's inaugural season was in 2002.

One of the top facilities in the country, Bowlin Stadium features seating for 2,530 fans, an underground system that heats the field, a large video board, FieldTurf and a padded wall.. Just past the right field fence is the Alex Gordon Training Complex, a spacious indoor facility that is large enough for Nebraska to take live batting practice inside the complex. The clubhouse features a locker room, players' lounge, training room and coaches' offices.

Nebraska has won nearly 70 percent of its games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers have hosted four NCAA Regionals at Bowlin Stadium and ranked in the top 25 nationally in attendance 14 times, including four seasons ranked in the top 10.
