The Nebraska softball team (32-17, 12-8 Big Ten) closes the regular season with a three-game series against Ohio State at Bowlin Stadium in Lincoln, Neb. Game one is set for Friday, May 5 at 5:30 p.m. (CT). On Saturday, May 6, the Huskers and the Buckeyes face off at 1 p.m. with the final game set for Sunday, May 7, at 12 p.m.

Following Saturday's game, Nebraska will honor its senior class with an on-field ceremony for Mya Felder and Courtney Wallace.

Fans can listen to all three games live on the Huskers Radio Network and Huskers.com with the call from Nate Rohr. All three games will also be streamed live on BTN+ (subscription required).

Nebraska and Ohio State are currently fourth and fifth, respectively, in the Big Ten standings. The Huskers hold an all-time record of 15-9 against the Buckeyes, claiming three of the four series since joining the conference.

Nebraska's offense is currently in the top three in the Big Ten in batting average (.312), home runs (55), hits (412) and slugging percentage (.509). Freshman Katelyn Caneda leads the Big Red offense with a .396 batting average and has tallied 57 hits including eight doubles, one triple, two home runs and 33 RBI. In the circle, Courtney Wallace (21-11) has appeared in 183.1 innings while tallying 119 strikeouts.

#### **LEADING OFF...**

- The Huskers are currently second in the Big Ten Conference in batting average (.311).
- NU's offense is in the top five in the conference in runs (260), hits (411), doubles (82), home runs (55), slugging percentage (.508) and on base percentage (.373).
- Nebraska's pitching staff is second in the Big Ten in shutouts with 11. This marks the most shutouts in a season for an NU team since 2014, when the Huskers tallied 18.
- The Huskers are 24-2 when holding opponents to two runs or less.
- NU has held 18 opponents to one run or less.

- Katelyn Caneda is fifth in the Big Ten with a .396 batting average, a number that leads the team. Caneda is 11th nationally in batting average among freshmen.
- Billie Andrews is second (14) and Brooke Andrews is seventh (11) in home runs in the Big Ten.
- Billie Andrews (59) and Katelyn Caneda (57) are fourth and fifth in the conference in total hits.
- Billie Andrews has hit five of her 11 home runs in the lead off at-bat.
- Courtney Wallace is second in the Big Ten with 21 victories in the circle.

- Nebraska is second in the conference in batting average (.312) and 28th in the nation.
- The Huskers are second in the Big Ten in shutouts with 11 and are ranked 36th in the NCAA
- NU ranks second in the Big Ten and 26th in the nation with a .508 slugging percentage.
- Katelyn Caneda is sixth in the conference with a .396 batting average, a mark that leads the Big Red.
- **Billie Andrews** is second in the Big Ten with 14 home runs. **Brooke Andrews** is seventh in the conference with 11 homers.
- Brooke Andrews is fifth in the Big Ten with 44 RBIs.
- Billie Andrews and Katelyn Caneda are fourth and fifth in total hits in the conference.
- Courtney Wallace is second in the Big Ten with 21 victories. She ranks 10th in the NCAA as Megan Faraimo of UCLA leads the nation with 26 wins.

#### **OHIO STATE BY THE NUMBERS**

- Ohio State is currently fifth in conference standings with a 10-10 Big Ten record.
- The Buckeyes hold a team batting average of .310, a number that ranks third in the Big Ten behind Nebraska (.311) and Indiana (.320).
- Ohio State is in the top five in multiple offensive categories in the conference including doubles (83), home runs per game (0.96), on base percentage (.391), scoring (5.96), and slugging percentage (.505).
- OSU holds a 3.92 ERA which ranks 11th in the Big Ten.
- Sophomore Melina Wilkison leads the Buckeyes with a .394 batting average, tallying 63 hits, 49 runs and 44 RBI. Wilkison has added 11 homers, 13 doubles and seven triples.
- Wilkison is in the top five among Big Ten players in batting average (.396), hits (63), RBIs per game (0.92), runs per game (1.02), slugging percentage (.774), and triples (7).
- Junior right-handed pitcher Allison Smith has led Ohio State in the circle with 168.1 innings of work. Smith holds a 16-11 record, a 3.08 ERA and has tallied 194 strikeouts.

#### **HUSKER QUICK HITS**

- Eight of Brooke Andrews' 11 home runs came in the fourth inning or later this season.
- Billie Andrews and Brooke Andrews have recorded a home run in the same game five times during their careers at Nebraska.
- **Billie Andrews** has tallied 14 home runs this season. She is now tied for sixth all-time in Nebraska history in career homers with 41.
- Andrews is one of 12 returning players in the NCAA who hit 20 or more home runs last season
- **Sarah Harness** recorded a no-hitter against New Mexico on Feb. 24, 2023. It marked the first no-hitter by a Nebraska pitcher since 2016.
- Sarah Harness has tallied 86 strikeouts this season and has combined for over 500 in her career including her three seasons at Southern Illinois.
- Mya Felder is the only returning Big Ten player who received All-Big Ten, All-Defensive and All-Tournament honors in 2022.
- Courtney Wallace is one of six returning Rawlings/NFCA Gold Glove recipients from last season.

## NU SET FOR 26 GAMES AGAINST 2022 NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAMS

Nebraska is slated to play 14 teams that reached the 2022 NCAA Tournament last season including South Dakota State, Oklahoma State, UCLA, Virginia Tech, Texas A&M, Arkansas, Weber State, Arizona, Wichita State, Missouri State, Michigan, Wisconsin, Northwestern and Ohio State.

The Huskers will see South Dakota State their first weekend of play at the Houston Invitational.

NU faces Oklahoma State, UCLA, Virginia Tech, Texas A&M and Arkansas at the TaxAct Clearwater Invitational.

Nebraska will see Weber State and Arizona in the third week of the season at the Hillenbrand Invitational.

At the Wichita State Round Robin Tournament, NU will face Wichita State and Missouri State twice each.

The Big Red will host lowa State for a midweek matchup.

The Huskers will play three-game series vs. Michigan, Wisconsin, Northwestern and Ohio State during the conference regular season schedule.

#### **WALLACE MAKES HER MARK IN NEBRASKA HISTORY**

Courtney Wallace has been an important part of Nebraska's pitching staff over the past five seasons. The Omaha, Neb., native has already set career-highs in wins, appearances, complete games and strikeouts this season. She continues to climb the ranks in Nebraska history in numerous categories.

With nine career saves, Wallace is tied for sixth all-time in Nebraska history along with Peaches James (2001-04) and Kaylan Jablonski (2015-18). Associate Head Coach Lori Sippel holds the record with 16 from 1985-88.

Wallace entered the top 10 as she has now tallied 55 career victories, tied for 10th all-time with Donna Deardorff (1985-88). Jenny Voss (1997-2000) holds the record with 110 wins.

With 593.1 innings of work in the circle, Wallace is now 10th all-time in innings pitched. Voss holds the record for innings pitched with 1,073.0.

#### WALLACE PROVIDING LEADERSHIP IN THE CIRCLE

Courtney Wallace, a two-time captain, has been a leader in the circle for the Huskers this season. The fifth-year senior has made appearances in 36 of NU's 46 games with 173.2 innings of work.

Wallace has made appearances in 19 of NU's 20 conference games in 2023 and has had a decision in 15 of the 20 games. Wallace is 9-6 with two saves in the Big Ten this season.

#### CANEDA HAVING STRONG FRESHMAN CAMPAIGN

Katelyn Caneda has had an impressive start to her first season as a Husker. The freshman has started every game this season at second base, and currently leads the Big Red with a .396 batting average.

Caneda is fifth in the Big Ten Conference in batting average and has the second-best average among freshmen. The only freshman to hold a better average is Indiana's Taryn Kern, who is hitting .423. Caneda is also 11th nationally among freshmen.

#### **BOWLIN STADIUM**



The 2023 season marks the 22nd season Nebraska has called Bowlin Stadium home. The stadium's inaugural season was in 2002.

One of the top facilities in the country, Bowlin Stadium features seating for 2,530 fans, an underground system that heats the field, a large video board, FieldTurf and a padded wall.. Just past the right field fence is the Alex Gordon Training Complex, a spacious indoor facility that is large enough for Nebraska to take live batting practice inside the complex. The clubhouse features a locker room, players' lounge, training room and coaches' offices.

Nebraska has won nearly 70 percent of its games at Bowlin Stadium. The Huskers have hosted four NCAA Regionals at Bowlin Stadium and ranked in the top 25 nationally in attendance 14 times, including four seasons ranked in the top 10.



#### SCOUTING THE OHIO STATE BUCKEYES

Ohio State (30-18, 10-10 Big Ten) is coming off a series loss to Minnesota. The Buckeyes dropped all three games to the Gophers. This marked their second series loss this season after falling 1-2 at Indiana during the second week of Big Ten play. OSU is currently fifth in the Big Ten standings.

Nebraska and Ohio State share four common opponents this season in CSUN, Michigan, Indiana and Purdue.

The Buckeyes hold a team batting average of .310, a number that ranks third in the Big Ten behind Nebraska (.311) and Indiana (.320).

Ohio State is in the top five in multiple offensive categories in the conference including doubles (83), home runs per game (0.96), on base percentage (.391), scoring (5.96), and slugging percentage (.505).

OSU holds a 3.92 ERA which ranks 11th in the Big Ten.

Sophomore Melina Wilkison leads the Buckeyes with a .394 batting average, tallying 63 hits, 49 runs and 44 RBI. Wilkison has added 11 homers, 13 doubles and seven triples.

Wilkison is in the top five among Big Ten players in batting average (.396), hits (63), RBIs per game (0.92), runs per game (1.02), slugging percentage (.774), and triples (7).

Junior right-handed pitcher Allison Smith has led Ohio State in the circle with 168.1 innings of work. Smith holds a 16-11 record, a 3.08 ERA and has tallied 194 strikeouts.
