

THE OPENING TIP

- · Purdue will open its 123rd season of collegiate basketball Wednesday, when it heads to Melbourne, Florida, for the Space Coast Challenge.
- The Boilermakers will meet Liberty while Clemson and Mississippi State will meet on the other side of the bracket.
- This marks the first of two trips to the Sunshine State during the first month of the season as the Boilermakers will travel to Miami for the ACC / Big Ten Challenge on Dec. 8. It also marks the second straight year that Purdue has played its multi-team event in Florida after it played in the Emerald Coast Classic (Destin) last year, falling to Florida State in the title game.
- The entire tournament will be broadcast on CBS Sports Network with Dave Ryan and Bob Wenzel on the call. On the radio waves, Wednesday's broadcast will begin at 5 p.m. ET, with the Purdue Basketball Pregame Show. Rob Blackman and Bobby Riddell will handle the call on the Purdue Sports Network.

THE NOTES TO KNOW

- 1) Purdue begins the season in search of its 25th Big Ten Championship, having won two of the last four regular-season titles. The Boilermakers are the all-time leader in Big Ten regular-season championships, two ahead of rival Indiana (22).
- 2) The Boilermakers return three starters (Eric Hunter Jr., Sasha Stefanovic and Trevion Williams) from last year's team that showed promising glimpses, but struggled with consistency en route to a 16-15 record.
- 3) A year ago, Purdue became the first team since 1997 Florida to beat three top-25 teams by at least 25 points (Virginia, Michigan St., Iowa).
- 4) Purdue returns 83 combined starts from last season. In 10 previous seasons that Purdue returned at least 74 starts from the previous campaign, the Boilermakers posted a combined 222-110 record with eight NCAA Tournament appearances (missed in 2006 and 2014).
- 5) Purdue is not ranked in the AP preseason top 25 poll for the first time since the 2014-15 season.
- 6) Purdue is 14-1 under head coach **Matt Painter** in season openers, having won seven straight openers by a combined 30.3 points per game. Purdue has won its last six openers by at least 22 points.
- 7) As many as seven players could see their first career action this week. Redshirt freshmen **Brandon Newman** and **Mason Gillis** and freshmen **Jaden Ivey, Zach Edey, Ethan Morton, Chase Martin** and **Carson Barrett** could all see action for the first time. Gillis will be suiting up for the first time in 985 days since March 17, 2018 (junior season at New Castle H.S.).
- 8) Painter has won four tournaments at Purdue (2009 Big Ten, 2010 Paradise Jam, 2015 Hall of Fame Tipoff, 2016 Cancun Challenge).

- move Matt Painter to 15-1 in season openers at Purdue.
- move Purdue into the title game of the Space Coast Classic.
- improve Purdue to 9-2 all-time against the Atlantic Sun Conference.
- be Purdue's first season-opening win away from Mackey Arena since the 2001-02 season (def. Valparaiso, 73-69).

A PURDUE LOSS WOULD ...

- · be its first in a season opener since the 2012-13 opener (loss to Bucknell, 70-65).
- drop Purdue to the third-place game in the Space Coast Classic.

UP NEXT

- Purdue opens its home campaign on Tuesday, Dec. 1, when Oakland visits Mackey Arena for the first time since Nov. 2010.
- The Boilermakers own a 2-O series lead against the Golden Grizzlies.
- Oakland is led by legendary head coach Greg Kampe, who is in his 37th year at Oakland, amassing almost 700 wins.
- Last year's team posted a 14-19 overall record and an 8-10 record in the Horizon League.
- Following the Oakland game, Purdue hosts Valparaiso on Friday, Dec. 4. in Mackey Arena.

ABOUT THE BOILERMAKERS

- · Purdue welcomes back three starters from last year's team that finished 16-15 overall and 9-11 in the Big Ten Conference.
- As many as seven players could be seeing their first collegiate action
- Head coach Matt Painter returns his top three scorers from the previous year for the first time since the 2013-14 season.
- Purdue has no seniors on its roster for the first time in recorded school history.

INSIDE THE MATCHUP

- Purdue's contest with Liberty marks the first contest with the Flames in school history.
- This marks the third straight year that Purdue has faced a school from Virginia after the Boilermakers lost to Virginia in the 2019 Elite Eight, then defeated VCU and Virginia a year ago. Liberty is located in Lynchburg, Virginia.
- Purdue freshman Ethan Morton (Butler, Pa.) and Liberty freshman Isiah Warfield (Monaco, Pa.) were both part of the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette's Boys Fab 5 a year ago.

SUCCESS IN REGULAR-SEASON TOURNAMENTS

- Purdue has had a lot of success in regular-season tournaments over the last six years, but is looking for its first tournament title since the 2016 Cancun Challenge.
- The Boilermakers have finished runner-up in each of the last two regular-season tournaments (Charleston Classic; Emerald Coast Classic).
- Purdue is 19-5 in regular-season tournaments since the 2014 Maui Invitational (six events). The Boilermakers won the 2015 Hall of Fame Tipoff Classic and the 2016 Cancun Challenge in that span.

- In each of those 11 seasons that Purdue won by at least 25 points or more, the Boilermakers advanced to the NCAA Tournament.
- Going even further back, in the last 16 occurrences dating back to the 1982-83 opener that the Boilermakers won their opener by 25 or more points, Purdue reached the NCAA Tournament.

QUICK STARTS ARE THE KEY

 Purdue has started 3-0 or better in 20 of the last 41 seasons dating to the 1979-80 campaign. Nineteen of those 20, 3-0 starts have resulted in a postseason tournament, 16 of which were NCAA Tournament trips. The Boilermakers have started 3-0 or better 10 times (in 15 seasons) under head coach Matt Painter, making the NCAA Tournament in all but one of those 10 seasons (2013-14).

- The Boilermakers will have 10 underclassmen (sophomore or younger), will have the fewest amount of upperclassmen (5) in the Big Ten and will be the only league team to have fewer than two seniors on its roster, sporting a grand total of ZERO seniors on its roster.

- With five Sweet 16 appearances, 11 NCAA Tournament berths, three Big Ten regular-season championships, a Big Ten Tournament title, an Elite Eight and
 an international gold medal on his résumé, 15th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest young minds in all of college
 haskethall
- · He was voted by his peers as the NABC National Coach of the Year after leading a team that started with a 6-5 record to the 2019 Elite Eight.
- Painter was named the 2019 Big Ten Coach of the Year and has led Purdue to three straight Sweet 16 appearances.
- Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in October of 2018, agreeing to a two-year extension that will keep him in West Lafayette through
