• Purdue begins its slate of traditional three-game weekend series with its rivalry showdown vs. Indiana while making a trip to Bloomington for the sixth consecutive season. This year marks the first time in the longstanding series, which dates back to 1888, that the rivals will play a weekend series in the month of March.

• Purdue has struggled with situational hitting while scoring a league-low 17 runs over the first eight games. Strike-outs have not been big issue, ranking 10th with 68 at the plate. But the Boilermakers are batting just .143 with runners in scoring position and are 0-for-8 with the bases loaded. With a runner on third and less than two outs, they've scored that runner in only four of 10 opportunities.

- Just the second Boilermaker this century to pitch on Opening Day in four straight seasons, earning the start each of the last two years.
- Recognized as the team's co-Pitcher of the Year honoree in 2019.
- Ranks among the top 10 in program history in fewest hits per 9 innings (6.64, 2nd), strikeouts per 9 innings (9.79, 2nd) & WHIP (1.22, 7th).
- Posted a rare 10-strikeout game as a reliever in 2019 at Northwestern.
- Moved to Purdue's Friday starter role for the final weekend of April in 2019 after serving as the bullpen's fireman for the first 2 months.
- In Big Ten play in 2019, led the league with a .163 batting average against and ranked second with a 1.67 ERA in league play.
- Just the seventh pitcher in team history to reach 100 career strikeouts as a sophomore & his 73 Ks were the most ever by a Purdue sophomore; his 10.89 Ks per 9 innings mark in 2019 is a program record (minimum 60 innings).
- 2018 Big Ten All-Freshman Team as a starting pitcher, moving into the weekend rotation in mid-March and making five starts in Big Ten play.
- Surrendered only 21 hits in 41 innings, with only four hits going for extra bases, an impressive mark of 4.6 hits per 9 innings that ranked second in program history; Enjoyed his productive freshman season while making 15 of his 18 appearances and working 32 1/3 of his 41 innings away from home.
- First-team all-conference in football, basketball & baseball as a senior at CHS.
- Recorded 127 Ks as a junior & 124 Ks as a senior, leading the state both years.

- JUCO All-Star honoree gave up only 18 hits and 12 walks while earning 4 victories & pitching two complete games as a sophomore.
- Appeared in 7 games for USC during the 2019 campaign, giving up only 1 extra-base hit while registering a 3.86 ERA.
- Struck out the only batter he faced in the 8th inning vs. UCLA in a game played at Dodger Stadium.
- Played baseball & basketball at Pinnacle High School on the Northeast Side of Phoenix, helping Pinnacle win the 2018 Arizona Class 6A state title in basketball.
- Pitched for USA Baseball's 17U National Team Development Program as a junior while posting a 3.32 ERA & 42 strikeouts in 31 innings during HS season.
- Named to Perfect Game's All-West Coast first team & honorable mention All-American as a senior; PG ranked him as Arizona's No. 2 pitcher in his class.

- Struck out 10 of the 20 batters he faced in 2021 season debut vs. Nebraska, becoming just the 7th Boilermaker (& only starting pitcher) since 2005 to strike out 50% of batters faced with a minimum 5 Ks.
- Has remained stingy with the hits allowed, conceding no more than 4 in any of his first 6 starts as a Boilermaker while averaging just 5.8 hits per 9 innings allowed.
- In 2020, became Purdue's first true freshman since 2013 to debut as a starting pitcher during the season-opening weekend.
- Shined vs. No. 23 North Carolina inside U.S. Bank Stadium last season, surrendering only a first-inning single over 6 shutout innings.
- Earned his first collegiate win in front of a large contingent of friends & family when he pitched 5 innings of 1-run ball Sunday at Western Kentucky; Purdue scored 9 runs in the top of the first that day (last game before the shut down).
- Four-year letterwinner at Dickson County High School west of Nashville.
- Played first base and pitched, earning region and team MVP honors as a senior.
- Ranked as the No. 2 right-hander among his class in Tennessee by Perfect Game.
- Visited and committed to Purdue while pitching at a tournament in Westfield, Indiana, in the summer of 2018.
- Helped his high school team improve from 7-27 as a freshman to 19-18 as a senior.
- Also played for the Knights Baseball club for six years.
- Helped the Knights qualify for the Connie Mack World Series in New Mexico.

HEAD COACH GREG GOFF

Greg Goff joined Purdue baseball as an assistant coach in July 2017 and was promoted to head coach in June 2019. The 2021 season will be his 16th as a collegiate head coach.

Previously a head coach at four universities, Goff succeeded his friend and longtime colleague Mark Wasikowski, who returned to the University of Oregon as the Ducks' new head coach in June 2019.

Goff has previously served as the head coach at Campbell University (2008-14), Louisiana Tech University (2015-16) and the University of Alabama (2017) as well as Division II University of Montevallo (2004-07). He also helped lead the Boilermakers to a memorable 38-win season in 2018, punctuated by the program's third NCAA Regional bid in program history. Purdue finished second in the Big Ten standings and was also the runner-up at the Big Ten Tournament in Goff's first year with the program.

Along with bringing an upbeat personality to the dugout and contagious energy to his role as the first-base coach, Goff helped numerous Boilermakers develop offensively the last two years. He played a leading role in coaching the base running and outfield defense. He also filled in as the program's pitching coach for a few games during a 2018 home sweep of Michigan while Steve Holm was with his wife for the birth of their second child. Purdue has compiled a 28-15 record at Alexander since Goff joined the coaching staff, headlined by a program-record 13-game home win streak to close the 2018 campaign. That represents Purdue's best two-year mark at home since 2011 to 2012.

In his first two years at Purdue, Goff helped develop and organize new community events for the program like the preseason fan fest and first pitch dinner. Both events proved very popular and helped generate preseason interest going into the new campaign. He has also served as the director of Purdue baseball camps.

Twenty-six Boilermakers registered a grade-point average of 3.0 or better during the 2019 fall semester. During the 2016-17 school year, Alabama's 3.259 team GPA established a program record.

Over 40 Purdue players completed at least 10 hours of community service during the 2019 fall semester as part of the program's increased emphasis in that aspect of the student-athlete experience. As a team, Goff's team logged over 450 hours of community service during the first half of the 2019-20 school year.

Goff and his wife, Tina, are the parents of four daughters: Kara, Kiley, Kolby and Kenzie. Kara plays softball at Louisiana Tech and Kiley joined Purdue softball for the 2020-21 school year.

SIX 40-WIN SEASONS

- As a head coach, Goff's teams have won over 40 games six times. Campbell was one of only eight Division I programs to win 40-plus games for three straight years from 2012 to 2014, posting 131 total victories during that span. The Camels enjoyed a historic 49-10 campaign in 2013.
- He also won 42 games in his final season at Louisiana Tech, helping lead the Bulldogs to an NCAA Regional bid.
- Montevallo was a DII College World Series qualifier in 2006 under his guidance. As an assistant coach at Delta State, the Statesmen also qualified for the DII College World Series in 1994 and 1996.

ENDED NCAA REGIONAL DROUGHTS AT CAMPBELL & LOUISIANA TECH

- In Goff's final season at Campbell (2014), the Camels qualified for their first NCAA Regional in 24 years. Two years later, he led Louisiana Tech to its first Regional bid in 29 years. The 2014 Camels and 2016 Bulldogs both won at least one game in their Regionals, with La Tech coming through the loser's bracket to reach a Regional final at Mississippi State.

HISTORY OF TURNAROUNDS

- Goff's teams have had a losing record only five times in his 14 years as a head coach. Four of those five seasons were his first at a respective university. He has led his teams to some impressive turnarounds.
- In just two seasons, Louisiana Tech went from 15-35 the year before Goff's arrival to 42-20 in 2016, ending a 29-year NCAA Regional drought in the process. At Campbell, he inherited a team that was 11-45 in 2007. But under Goff, the Camels posted a winning record (27-24) in his second season and won 40 games by his fifth year (2012).
- Purdue's win total also jumped from 29-27 in 2017 to 38-21 in Goff's first year on the staff in 2018.

COACHING HONORS

- Goff was named the South Central Region Coach of the Year by the American Baseball Coaches Association at both Louisiana Tech (2016) and Montevallo (2006). He was the 2013 Big South Coach of the Year at Campbell after leading his team to a school-record 49 wins and a conference title. Montevallo won a combined 100 games over his final two seasons, posting a new single-season record both years.

BEFORE BECOMING A HEAD COACH

- Goff has coached 10 future big leaguers and over 50 MLB Draft picks, highlighted by Cy Young award winner Brandon Webb while he was the pitching coach at Kentucky (2000-03). Longtime big leaguer and World Series champion Joe Blanton also pitched for Goff at Kentucky.
- Along with his years as the pitching coach at Kentucky, Goff served as an assistant at Southeast Missouri State (1998-99) and his alma mater Delta State (1994-97) before becoming a head coach for the first time in the summer of 2003 at Montevallo. It was at SEMO in the late 1990s where he first worked with Wasikowski. They helped lead the Redhawks to an NCAA Regional in 1998.

INDIANA-PURDUE SERIES TRENDS

- Alexander Field and Bart Kaufman Field both opened in 2013. But in the years since, 11 of the 15 Indiana-Purdue games have been played in Bloomington. Due in part to schedule quirks related to Big Ten expansion, the Hoosiers didn't make their first appearance at Alexander until April 2017. They were the second to last league rival to play there – only Illinois went longer before its first appearance.
- Then with last year's shutdown, Purdue lost out on another home series with IU; the Hoosiers were scheduled to visit Alexander the weekend of May 8 to 10. But not before playing a midweek game in Bloomington the first Wednesday of March. The schools had agreed to play a non-conference game at the opposite site of that year's scheduled weekend series. The Big Ten is not playing non-conference/midweek games this year.
- Location has played a big factor in the Indiana-Purdue rivalry in recent years. The Boilermakers won their final series at IU's Sembower Field in May 2010, but are 1-12 in Bloomington since Bart Kaufman Field opened in 2013. That mark includes losses to Nebraska and Maryland at the 2017 Big Ten Tournament.
- Purdue has won 12 of the last 15 meetings with IU away from Bloomington dating back to the 2008 Big Ten Tournament in Ann Arbor. Since the final day of the 2004 regular season, the Boilermakers are 17-4 against the Hoosiers in games played outside of Bloomington. But since 2008, IU is 14-4 against Purdue at home.
- Six of the last eight rivalry games in Bloomington dating back to 2016 have been either one-run affairs or decided in the ninth/extra innings. The only non-qualifiers during that stretch were one-sided wins for IU – 14-1 in the middle game of the 2018 series and 17-3 last year in the midweek meeting before the shutdown.

MICHIGAN SERIES NOTABLES

- **Ben Nisle** homered Sunday for the second day in a row, going deep in consecutive games for the second time as a Boilermaker (first since March 2018). He finished the series 6-for-15 with four extra-base hits and did not strikeout in any of his 16 plate appearances.
- **Skyler Hunter** drew a career-high three walks, extending his reached base safely streak in Big Ten play to 14 consecutive games. He also recorded his second outfield assist of the series. The center fielder threw out a runner at third base on a fly out in the fourth inning, registering his ninth career outfield assist. It proved to be a key out because an RBI double followed. Meanwhile, Hunter has more walks (7) than strikeouts (6) over the first eight games. Entering the season, the switch-hitter had drawn just 51 walks in 177 career games.
- Purdue scored more runs Sunday than it had in its previous six games combined. Nine of the team's 17 tallies over the first eight games have been scored as part of three-run innings. The Boilermakers held the lead Sunday for the first time since the ninth inning walk-off to finish their season-opening victory. Purdue pitchers had gone 55 consecutive innings without working with a lead.

SIMINGTON STREAKING EARLY

- **Miles Simington** enters the weekend riding a nine-game hit streak dating back to the finale of the abbreviated 2020 campaign. He's the first Boilermaker to hit safely every game of consecutive four-game series since Skyler Hunter did it at Cal State Northridge and Santa Clara on the 2017 spring break trip.
- This weekend, Simington is looking to become just the eighth Boilermaker since 2001 to open the season with a double-figure hit streak. Hunter owns the longest after beginning his sophomore campaign with a hit in 13 straight games. Purdue's longest hit streak (at any point in a season) since the move to Alexander Field in 2013 is 15 straight games by Zac Fascia late in the 2019 campaign.

NISLE JOINS SELECT COMPANY WITH HOME RUNS VS. MICHIGAN

- Ben Nisle homered in consecutive games for the second time in his career in the final two games of the Michigan series. He had actually been the last Boilermaker to accomplish the feat, back in a March 2018 series at Tulane during the spring break trip. But Nisle joined even more select company by going deep for the fourth consecutive year and hitting Purdue's first home run of a season for the third time in his career. Nisle is the only Boilermaker this century to accomplish the latter feat. Over the last 20 years, only 14 Boilermakers have homered in four straight seasons.

NEBRASKA SERIES NOTABLES

- The Boilermakers won their season opener in their last at-bat for the second year in a row. But it was their first walk-off win since March 2019 vs. Penn State at Alexander. The program's last neutral-site walk-off was a few weeks earlier vs. NJIT in Marion, North Carolina.
- Purdue racked up 46 strikeouts over 32 innings in the series, a total believed to be a team record for a four-game set. Since 2001, it's only the second 40-strikeout performance in a four-game series. The 16 Ks Sunday, including 10 vs. 20 batters faced by **Jett Jackson**, matched the third highest total in program history.
- **Trent Johnson** (7), **Cory Brooks** (5) and **Jackson Smeltz** (3) teamed up for 15 strikeouts, matching the fourth most in team history (at the time) and the top total since setting program record with 18 in a 10-inning game at Indiana in April 2018. Smeltz struck out the side in the ninth inning to set up the walk-off victory in the bottom half of the frame.
- **Miles Simington** (5-for-11) and **Zac Fascia** (4-for-12) hit safely in all four games of the series. Simington reached base safely a team-high eight times for the weekend. **Skyler Hunter** (3-for-14, 3 BB) and Mason Gavre (2-for-11, 2 BB) also reached base safely in all four games.
- In the opener and finale of the series, redshirt freshman **Jack Firestone** drew a walk as a pinch hitter late in a close game. Friday he walked in front of **Zac Fascia's** walk-off sac fly and Sunday he worked a base on balls in the seventh inning to give Purdue two on with one out.
- **Jett Jackson** has only surrendered 15 hits in 23 1/3 innings over five career appearances as a Boilermaker, all starts. Meanwhile, his 10 Ks Sunday were just three shy of his season total in 19 innings last season.
- Purdue lost a four-game series after winning the opener for the first time since April 2008 at Indiana. Admittedly, four-game series have been somewhat rare since the Big Ten went to a 24-game conference schedule, and traditional three-game weekend series, in 2009.
- The Boilermakers were shutout in consecutive games for the first time since March 2019 at Jacksonville State and Ball State. They were blanked in back-to-back contests by the same opponent for the first time since February 2017 at Arkansas-Little Rock.
- Purdue snapped a seven-game losing streak vs. Nebraska that dated back to March 2016. It was the Boilermakers' first win vs. the Huskers as the "home" team since they became conference rivals beginning in 2012.
- Purdue improved to 7-4 in season openers dating back to 2011. Six of those seven victories have come in neutral-site affairs.
- The Huskers scored four of their five runs on home runs, all to right field. The Boilermakers won a game in which the opposition went deep three times for the first time since game 3 of the abbreviated 2020 campaign (vs. Hofstra).
- **Trent Johnson** became Purdue's first pitcher since Jay Buente (2003-06) to pitch in four consecutive season openers.

FASCIA ON BUSTER POSEY AWARD WATCH LIST FOR THIRD TIME

- Zac Fascia has returned as a fifth-year senior this season and again earned a spot on the initial watch list for the Buster Posey Award. Fascia is part of the first watch list for the third consecutive season. A year ago, the watch list was released on March 10 and the season was shut down two days later due to the coronavirus pandemic.
- Fascia has thrown out 24 base stealers in his 54 games behind the plate since joining the Boilermakers. He gunned down a Big Ten-high 18 base stealers in 2019 and also worked with a pitching staff that set team records for strikeouts (477) and strikeouts per nine innings (9.10).
- During Purdue's season-opening series with Nebraska, Fascia hit safely in all four games and delivered the game-winning RBI with a sacrifice fly in the walk-off win Friday. He was also behind the plate Friday and Sunday as Purdue racked up 31 of its 46 strikeouts, which is believed to be a program record for a four-game series. The Boilermakers had 15 Ks on Friday and 16 Sunday. Both totals rank among the top five in program history.
- The Brampton, Ontario, native was selected by the New York Mets in the 37th round of the 2018 MLB Draft after his sophomore season at Indian Hills College in Iowa, where he was a two-time Region XI Defensive Player of the Year. He had opportunities to move on the professional ranks again in 2019, but wanted to return for his senior season at Purdue. That season ultimately was cut short, but the eligibility extensions allowed him to return.
