- Three-year letterwinner has been part of the program since the fall of 2017.
- Made 12 of his 14 career starts on weekends.
- Returned from Tommy John Surgery, which he underwent in May 2018, in less than a year, working 2 scoreless innings vs. Butler on April 16, 2019 in a game televised live by FS1.
- Was Purdue's top pitcher in April this season, highlighted by working 18 1/3 innings of 3-run ball in starts vs. Michigan State and Illinois (2).
- Worked 8 scoreless innings vs. Illinois at Alexander Field this year, becoming the only Boilermaker to accomplish the feat since 2017.
- Worked 11 consecutive scoreless innings across five appearances to begin his career.
- Pitched 15 innings of 3-run ball over his

first three appearances of 2020, going 5 innings in each outing and striking out a career-high 7 vs. NC State's prolific offense.

- Had the honor of being the first Boilermaker out of the bullpen this year.

- Two-year Opening Day starter at first base after joining the program in the fall of 2019 as a transfer from Paradise Valley College.
- Came to Purdue as a third baseman but has made all but 1 start as a Boilermaker at first base, where he has been the team's top performer defensively the last 2 years.
- Hit the first walk-off home run by a Boilermaker since 2006 when he capped the 7-run ninth inning vs. Rutgers with a 3-run blast.
- Recorded an RBI in the season-opening win each of his 2 seasons, driving in Purdue's first run of the 2020 campaign with a hit in his first at-bat as a Boilermaker.
- Delivered RBI doubles in wins vs. Michigan State and Ohio State this season.

- Connected for an RBI double vs. Duke ace Bryce Jarvis, who was selected 18th overall in the 2020 MLB Draft.

- Played in a team-high 18 games off the bench this year.

- Two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree has compiled a 3.26 GPA while majoring in Selling & Sales Management.

- Selected for the Buster Posey Award Watch List all 3 seasons.

- His 4-for-4 game in the 2019 win vs. Xavier, a night in which he had 3 XBH and scored all 4 runs, remains one of the most impressive offensive performances in the history of Alexander Field.

- Enjoyed a monster series vs. Hofstra to open 2020, finishing the 4 games 7-for-14 with 3 XBH, 3 RBI and 6 runs.

- His seventh-inning home run accounted for the only runs in Purdue's series-opening win vs. Michigan State in 2019.

- Posted a 15-game hit streak in 2019, which remains the longest by a Boilermaker since 2011.

- Four-year member of the weekend rotation, making all but one of his 28 career starts on weekends.
- Career mark of 9.46 strikeouts per 9 innings is a program record, minimum 125 innings.
- Also set a single-season Ks per 9 benchmark (10.89) in 2019, minimum 60 innings.
- Just the seventh pitcher in team history to register his 100th career strikeout as a sophomore, reaching the century mark in a May 3 shutout win vs. Michigan State.
- In 2019, led the league with a .163 batting average against in Big Ten play.
- Joined former big leaguer Jay Buentge as the only Boilermakers this century to pitch on Opening Day in 4 straight seasons.
- Recognized as the team's Pitcher of the Year in 2019 after his 73 Ks were the most ever by a sophomore.
- Had a rare 10-strikeout game as a reliever at Northwestern in 2019.
- 2018 Big Ten All-Freshman Team selection as a starting pitcher.
- Three-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree graduated this month with a 3.24 GPA and degree in Financial Counseling & Planning.

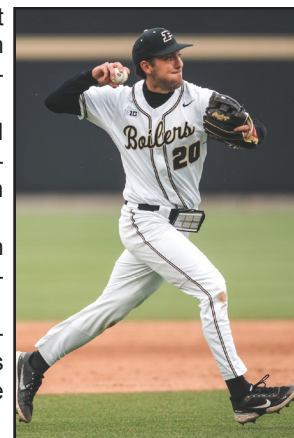

- Became the only Boilermaker since 2001 to homer in five consecutive weekends this season.
- Was part of both sets of back-to-back home runs in the win at Ohio State this year, becoming just the second Boilermaker to do it since 2001.
- Unanimous selection to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team in 2018.
- Represented Purdue on the Chapel Hill Regional All-Tournament Team after a 7-for-11 showing while racking up 3 XBH and 5 RBI with no strikeouts.
- Posted multi-homer games as a freshman and senior; his 7 homers in 2018 are the most by a Purdue freshman in the BB-COR bat era (2011-present).
- Just the 14th Boilermaker since 2000 to homer in 4 straight years.
- Hit Purdue's first home run of the 2018, 2019 and 2021 seasons.
- Currently riding a career-best 11-game hit streak.

# HEAD COACH GREG GOFF

Greg Goff joined Purdue baseball as an assistant coach in July 2017 and was promoted to head coach in June 2019. The 2021 season will be his 16th as a collegiate head coach.

Previously a head coach at four universities, Goff succeeded his friend and longtime colleague Mark Wasikowski, who returned to the University of Oregon as the Ducks' new head coach in June 2019.

Goff has previously served as the head coach at Campbell University (2008-14), Louisiana Tech University (2015-16) and the University of Alabama (2017) as well as Division II University of Montevallo (2004-07). He also helped lead the Boilermakers to a memorable 38-win season in 2018, punctuated by the program's third NCAA Regional bid in program history. Purdue finished second in the Big Ten standings and was also the runner-up at the Big Ten Tournament in Goff's first year with the program.

Along with bringing an upbeat personality to the dugout and contagious energy to his role as the first-base coach, Goff helped numerous Boilermakers develop offensively the last two years. He played a leading role in coaching the base running and outfield defense. He also filled in as the program's pitching coach for a few games during a 2018 home sweep of Michigan while Steve Holm was with his wife for the birth of their second child. Purdue has compiled a 28-15 record at Alexander since Goff joined the coaching staff, headlined by a program-record 13-game home win streak to close the 2018 campaign. That represents Purdue's best two-year mark at home since 2011 to 2012.

In his first two years at Purdue, Goff helped develop and organize new community events for the program like the preseason fan fest and first pitch dinner. Both events proved very popular and helped generate preseason interest going into the new campaign. He has also served as the director of Purdue baseball camps.

Twenty-six Boilermakers registered a grade-point average of 3.0 or better during the 2019 fall semester. During the 2016-17 school year, Alabama's 3.259 team GPA established a program record.

Over 40 Purdue players completed at least 10 hours of community service during the 2019 fall semester as part of the program's increased emphasis in that aspect of the student-athlete experience. As a team, Goff's team logged over 450 hours of community service during the first half of the 2019-20 school year.

Goff and his wife, Tina, are the parents of four daughters: Kara, Kiley, Kolby and Kenzie. Kara plays softball at Louisiana Tech and Kiley joined Purdue softball for the 2020-21 school year.

## SIX 40-WIN SEASONS

- As a head coach, Goff's teams have won over 40 games six times. Campbell was one of only eight Division I programs to win 40-plus games for three straight years from 2012 to 2014, posting 131 total victories during that span. The Camels enjoyed a historic 49-10 campaign in 2013.
- He also won 42 games in his final season at Louisiana Tech, helping lead the Bulldogs to an NCAA Regional bid.
- Montevallo was a DII College World Series qualifier in 2006 under his guidance. As an assistant coach at Delta State, the Statesmen also qualified for the DII College World Series in 1994 and 1996.

## ENDED NCAA REGIONAL DROUGHTS AT CAMPBELL & LOUISIANA TECH

- In Goff's final season at Campbell (2014), the Camels qualified for their first NCAA Regional in 24 years. Two years later, he led Louisiana Tech to its first Regional bid in 29 years. The 2014 Camels and 2016 Bulldogs both won at least one game in their Regionals, with La Tech coming through the loser's bracket to reach a Regional final at Mississippi State.

## HISTORY OF TURNAROUNDS

- Goff's teams have had a losing record only five times in his 14 years as a head coach. Four of those five seasons were his first at a respective university. He has led his teams to some impressive turnarounds.
- In just two seasons, Louisiana Tech went from 15-35 the year before Goff's arrival to 42-20 in 2016, ending a 29-year NCAA Regional drought in the process. At Campbell, he inherited a team that was 11-45 in 2007. But under Goff, the Camels posted a winning record (27-24) in his second season and won 40 games by his fifth year (2012).
- Purdue's win total also jumped from 29-27 in 2017 to 38-21 in Goff's first year on the staff in 2018.

## COACHING HONORS

- Goff was named the South Central Region Coach of the Year by the American Baseball Coaches Association at both Louisiana Tech (2016) and Montevallo (2006). He was the 2013 Big South Coach of the Year at Campbell after leading his team to a school-record 49 wins and a conference title. Montevallo won a combined 100 games over his final two seasons, posting a new single-season record both years.

## BEFORE BECOMING A HEAD COACH

- Goff has coached 10 future big leaguers and over 50 MLB Draft picks, highlighted by Cy Young award winner Brandon Webb while he was the pitching coach at Kentucky (2000-03). Longtime big leaguer and World Series champion Joe Blanton also pitched for Goff at Kentucky.
- Along with his years as the pitching coach at Kentucky, Goff served as an assistant at Southeast Missouri State (1998-99) and his alma mater Delta State (1994-97) before becoming a head coach for the first time in the summer of 2003 at Montevallo. It was at SEMO in the late 1990s where he first worked with Wasikowski. They helped lead the Redhawks to an NCAA Regional in 1998.

Around the league, Iowa's Ben Norman (12-for-12) is the only other player to reach double figures while remaining perfect on the season.

• Bolton has become the third Boilermaker since 2001 to reach the double-figure mark without being thrown out. Only eight Boilermakers since 2001, including **Ben Nisle** this year and assistant coach **Harry Shipley** (in 2016), have swiped at least five bases in a season without being thrown out. Stephen Talbott did it in both of his underclassman seasons and Bolton has matched Talbott's 17-for-17 showing in 2011 when Talbott was an All-Big Ten outfielder.

## BOILERMAKERS ALL OVER THE BASE PATHS IN MINNEAPOLIS

- Purdue posted a remarkable .474 team on-base percentage in the Minnesota series, racking up 39 free passes (30 walks, 9 HBP) to go along with 51 hits. It was a big reason why the Boilermakers scored 46 runs, their most in a four-game series since a March 2008 sweep of Western Illinois (47) at Lambert Field.
- Six Purdue players with a minimum 10 plate appearances had an OBP of .500+ – **Tyler Powers** (.909), **Ryan Howe** (.714), **Ben Nisle** (.600), **Mike Bolton Jr.** (.526), **Miles Simington** (.524) and **Evan Albrecht** (.500). Powers and Howe joined Cam Thompson (vs Iowa) as Boilermakers with a .700+ OBP in a series this season. They also accomplished the feat for the second time in their careers, joining Bryce Bonner as the only Boilermakers to do it twice since 2016.

## GRAND SLAM NOTABLES

## NISLE'S EXTRA-BASE HITS ADD UP TO 1.000 OPS

• **Ben Nisle** has already become the only Boilermaker since 2001 to homer in five consecutive weekends. He nearly made it six straight weekends but his drive to deep left field in the series finale at Maryland hit off the top of the wall for a double, his third double of the series in College Park. He had two more doubles at Minnesota.

• With nine extra-base hits, a .795 slugging percentage and .569 OBP during his current 11-game hit streak, Nisle improved his chances of posting a 1.000 OPS this season. With 22 extra-base hits in 39 games, he has compiled an extra-base hits per game mark (.564) that is among the best by any Boilermaker since 2001. With Purdue only scheduled to play 43 games this season, the per-game rate (along with slugging percentage and OPS) is the fairest way to provide context to the remarkable season Nisle is having.

## SIMINGTON STREAKS INTO THE 20s

• **Miles Simington** became the 23rd Boilermaker since 2001 to record a reached base safely streak of at least 20 games. He's was on base in 21 straight from March 26 to May 11. For the season, he's reached base safely in 33 of Purdue's first 35 games this season. The outfielder recorded 10 multi-hit efforts (all two-hit games) during the 21-game streak while only going hitless three times. Three of those multi-hit efforts were two-double games.

## SUNDAY SLUGFEST NOTABLES FROM 16-15 WIN AT OHIO STATE

- The finale of the Purdue-Ohio State series May 2 in Columbus was a 31-run slugfest that featured some wild back and forth scoring surges.

...Ohio State scored the first five runs

...Purdue answered with consecutive four-run innings while scoring eight in a row

...Ohio State responded with seven straight runs to go back in front 12-8

...Purdue scored eight unanswered runs to build a 16-12 lead

...The Boilermakers hung on for the 16-15 victory after OSU scored the final three runs and left the tying run on the third base as the final out was recorded by **Jackson Smeltz**.

- Purdue scored four runs in the third, fourth and seventh innings. They scored at least four times in consecutive innings and in three different frames in the same game for the first time since a May 2018 win vs. Purdue Fort Wayne. The final score that night at Alexander Field was 27-3, marking the program's only other game with a combined 30 runs of the BBCOR bat era (2011-present).

- The 15 runs were the most surrendered in a victory since defeating Boston University 36-16 in March 1991. The 31 combined runs were the most in a game featuring Purdue since a 22-14 loss (36) at Missouri in March 2010.

- **Ben Nisle** (2), **Miles Simington** and **Zac Fascia** all went deep as the Boilermakers hit four home runs in a game for the first time since a March 2017 win at Southeast Missouri State. Nisle posted his second career multi-homer game and the first by a Boilermaker since Jacson McGowan in April 2018 at Maryland. He was part of both set of back-to-back jacks. Nisle has homered in five consecutive weekends.

- As of April 22, the Boilermakers had only one set of back-to-back home runs since the start of the 2011 season – McGowan and Nisle vs. Houston at an NCAA Regional in June 2018. Purdue has now done it three times in its last six games. Meanwhile, the 2021 team joined the 2003 and 2010 Boilermakers as the only teams since 2001 with three sets of back-to-back jacks in the same season.

- Nisle joined Daniel Underwood (4, 2000-03) and Ryne White (3, 2006-08) as the only Boilermakers since 2001 to be part of three sets of back-to-back home runs. Nisle is also the first Boilermaker with multiple multi-homer games in his career since Cameron Perkins had four from 2010 to 2012.

#### NOTABLES FROM 4-0 WEEKEND IN CHAMPAIGN

• Purdue was two outs away from losing its first game of the weekend in 1-0 fashion. By the time the bus headed east along I-74 back to Greater Lafayette on Monday, the Boilermakers had posted their first 4-0 weekend since March 2017 and become the first Big Ten team to sweep a three-team weekend pod this season. They beat Michigan State twice and Illinois twice.

• **Miles Simington** and **Zac Fascia** homered in the first two innings, powering Purdue to an early lead and 20-6 victory vs. Illinois on Monday to punctuate the perfect 4-0 weekend. The 20 runs were the program's most since scoring 27 in a May 2018 blow-out of Purdue Fort Wayne at Alexander Field. Purdue had not scored 20 in a Big Ten game since a 25-8 win at Indiana in April 2006.

• Including a game-tying run Saturday in the 11-inning walk-off vs. Michigan State, the Boilermakers scored 13 runs in the ninth inning in Champaign and have registered 33 ninth inning runs in their first 25 games. That's the program's third most since 2001.

• **Evan Albrecht** recorded both RBI in the 2-1 win vs. MSU as Purdue won in walk-off fashion for the third time (most since 2017) this season. All three victories have come in three different stadiums. Also in all three walk-offs, **Ben Nisle** has scored the game-winning run and **Jackson Smeltz** has been the winning pitcher. **Miles Simington** delivered a go-ahead two-run double with the bases loaded in the ninth inning of the Sunday win vs. Illinois.

• **Calvin Schapira** pitched into the ninth inning in Purdue's weekend opener vs. MSU, surrendering just one run while striking out seven for the third time this season. It was the longest outing by a Boilermaker since Tanner Andrews' complete game on the opening day of the 2018 Big Ten Tournament.

• Purdue won a series vs. the Illini in Champaign for the first time since May 2010 and swept them for the first time since taking both games of a double-header in April 1988. Entering the weekend, the Boilermakers were 1-11 in Champaign since 2013.

• Purdue won three of four in the season series with MSU. By winning the final three meetings this year, it marked the first time since May 2005 (vs. Iowa) that Purdue rallied to win a four-game regular-season series vs. any opponent after losing the first game. Including a Big Ten Tournament matchup, the Boilermakers also won three straight vs. MSU in 2009 after dropping the series opener in East Lansing.

**PITCHERS EXCELLED IN OFFENSIVE BALLPARK WHILE PURDUE SCORED 36 RUNS**

• Perhaps overshadowed by the 20-run outburst April 19 at Illinois, Purdue's first in a Big Ten game since 2006, was the fact that the pitching staff surrendered only 24 hits over 38 innings during the 4-0 weekend in Champaign. The staff racked up 30-plus strikeouts in a four-game weekend for the third time this year, but this time the Boilermakers did it while giving up only 14 runs. The opposition's hits and runs totals were both the fewest in a four-game weekend since Purdue won three of four vs. Cal State Northridge (6 runs on 24 hits) at Alexander Field to close the 2016 season. Most impressively, the pitching staff did it in a ballpark that produced 90 runs over the course of the six games played at Illinois Field the weekend of April 16 to 19.

### THREE LEFTIES HOMER IN SAME GAME FOR FIRST TIME IN AT LEAST 20 YEARS

- Purdue's 20-run outburst April 19 at Illinois was made possible in part by three different Boilermakers going deep to right field with runners on base. **Miles Simington, Zac Fascia** and **Jeremy Schork**, all left-handed hitters, each connected for their first home runs of the season. It marked the first time since April 2017 that three different Purdue players homered in a game. The Boilermakers did it again in the ninth inning of the April 23 game vs. Illinois at Alexander Field. In the BBCOR bat era (since 2011), it has only happened eight times. Meanwhile, going back to 2001, another game could not be found in which three lefties all went deep.
- Schork joined **Cam Thompson** as Boilermakers to hit a grand slam this season. Both slams came in the ninth inning and are a big reason why Purdue has scored 38 runs (including 13 during the 4-0 weekend in Champaign) in the ninth inning this year, already the program's third most since 2001. The Boilermakers had not hit multiple grand slams in a season since 2016. Dating back to Simington's grand slam during the opening weekend of the abbreviated 2020 campaign, each of Purdue's last three grand slams have doubled as the first home run for that Boilermaker.

### THE GOOD STRIKEOUTS

- Led by **Trent Johnson's** 10 strikeouts over six innings April 11 vs. Penn State, Purdue racked up 39 Ks over 35 innings in the four games in East Lansing. That's the program's third most in a four-game weekend since 2001. The Boilermakers already set what is believed to be a team record with 46 strikeouts in the season-opening, four-game series vs. Nebraska.
- Johnson's career mark of 9.75 strikeouts per nine innings is best all-time among Boilermakers with a minimum 125 career innings. With 10-strikeout outings vs. Northwestern (2019) and Penn State, he's also just the ninth Purdue pitcher since 2001 with multiple double-figure strikeout totals. As a team, the Boilermakers only had one individual 10-K performance from 2013 to 2018.
- **Jett Jackson** struck out 10 vs. Nebraska in his season debut this year. Jackson and Johnson have teamed up to give the Boilermakers two different pitchers with a 10-K performance in the same season for the first time since 2010.

## STRUGGLES PERSIST IN BIG TEN RUBBER GAMES

• The Boilermakers had an opportunity to win four of their first five series this season, but they dropped a rubber game in three straight weekend once three game series began March 19 to 21. Since mid-April 2019, the program has lost six straight Big Ten rubber games. Purdue has also lost 10 of its last 11 Big Ten rubber games since mid-April 2017 and is just 8-26 in Big Ten rubber games since the beginning of the 2010 campaign. Coincidentally, Purdue went 5-0 in Big Ten rubber games in 2009

## NINTH-INNING MAGIC DURING HOME-OPENING WEEKEND

• Purdue's home-opening weekend was highlighted by Saturday's memorable ninth-inning comeback, which produced the ninth walk-off win in Alexander Field history. The seven-run rally in the bottom of the ninth was the program's most prolific do-or-die inning at home in the last 20 years. An April 2008 win vs. Minnesota at Lambert Field, which was a seven-inning affair as part of a Saturday doubleheader, marked the only other time the Boilermakers scored at least four runs in the final frame for a walk-off win. Coincidentally, Purdue also scored six times in the bottom of the sixth of the seven-inning nightcap that day to rally for a 7-5 win, eventually sweeping the series with Minnesota on Sunday.

• **Mason Gavre's** three-run homer Saturday was the program's first walk-off home run since Ryne White hit a solo shot in the ninth inning of an April 2006 win vs. Illinois State at Lambert Field. **Ben Nisle** also scored the game-winning run in the Opening Day walk-off vs. Nebraska. He's the first Boilermaker since Milo Beam in 2017 to score the winning run in multiple walk-offs in the same season.
