9-0 Overall

- · Michigan won the toss and elected to defer to the second half.
- The Boilermakers' 13 points were the most scored against Michigan in a game this season.

6-0 Big Ten

- Purdue became the first team to outrush Michigan this season, finishing with 125 net rushing yards to the Wolverines' 110. It was the lowest rushing total allowed to Michigan on the year.
- · Purdue outscored Michigan 6-3 in the second quarter, the fourth time the Wolverines have been outscored in a quarter this season.
- Andrew Sowinski and Antonio Stevens made their first starts of the season. The game was also Stevens' first career start.
- Gus Hartwig moved from his regular starting slot at center and earned his first snaps of the season at right tackle on a drive in the third quarter.

OFFENSE

- The Boilermakers became the only team to score multiple times in the red zone against Michigan this season. The Wolverines entered the game allowing just 13 points in the red zone through their first
- In the final minute of the game, Hudson Card connected on a 24-yard touchdown pass to Deion Burks. The scoring play was Burks' sixth touchdown catch of the season and Card's ninth touchdown pass
- Mershawn Rice caught a 43-yard pass from Hudson Card on a third down in the second quarter, the longest reception of his career.
- Tyrone Tracy Jr. matched the longest run of his career with a 24-yard carry up the middle in the fourth quarter.
- Tracy was Purdue's leading rusher, finishing with 11 carries for 61 yards, averaging 5.5 yards per carry.
- Jayden Dixon-Veal led the team with four catches, matching his career high.
- Burks and Rice tied for the team lead with 43 receiving yards apiece.
- Card completed 12 of 28 passes for 144 yards and a touchdown, also rushing five times for 26 yards.

DEFENSE

- · Purdue did not allow a touchdown pass from Michigan quarterback J.J. McCarthy, becoming the first team to hold him scoreless this season.
- · Nic Scourton paced the defense with a career-best two sacks, closing the first half with a sack for a loss of 18 yards and another in the fourth quarter for a loss of nine.
- Botros Alisandro led the defense with a career-high seven tackles, six solos.
- · Sanoussi Kane finished with a season-best two pass breakups. He now has a career-high five pass deflections on the year.
- Kane's first pass deflection of the night came on a third down in the red zone, holding Michigan to a field goal attempt in the first quarter.
- Cole Brevard recorded his first career sack by bringing down McCarthy for a seven-yard loss in the second quarter.
- In his first collegiate start, Antonio Stevens finished with a career-high four tackles, all solos.
- · Kydran Jenkins and Nic Scourton stuffed Michigan running back Kalel Mullings short on a fourth-and-one, forcing a turnover on downs in the second quarter.
- Dillon Thieneman knocked away a pass on a third-and-eight to force a punt in the third quarter, his second career pass deflection.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- · Jack Ansell booted a 37-yard punt that deflected off Michigan defensive back Quinten Johnson and was recovered by Antonio Stevens, setting the Boilermaker offense up at the Wolverines' 34-yard line.
- Ben Freehill turned the muffed punt into three points, converting his second field goal of the season on a 32-yard kick.
- Freehill knocked through his third field goal of the year on a 31-yard kick in the final minute before the break.
- · Ansell finished with a season-high eight punts for 339 yards (42.5 average).
- Brendan Cropsey recorded his first punts of the season, booting two for 74 yards.
