TEAM

• Purdue captains - Hudson Card, Gus Hartwig, Nic Scourton, and TJ Sheffield.

- Purdue lost the toss. Syracuse elected to receive.
- The Boilermakers have 21 points off four takeaways on the season after engineering a 10-play, 66-yard TD drive in the third quarter following Cam Allen's interception.
- With the loss, Purdue is now 16-17-2 all-time against current ACC opponents, and 21-19-3 when including future ACC programs.

OFFENSE

• Hudson Card threw for a career-high 323 yards, completing 32-of-46 passes with one touchdown and one interception.

- · Card also rushed for a touchdown late in the third quarter, his second straight game with a score on the ground.
- Adbur-Rahmaan Yaseen amassed career highs in receiving yards (114) and catches (10) as the team's leading receiver, totaling 35 yards after the catch.
- It was the first 100-yard receiving game of his career as his previous best was 77 yards against Illinois on Sept. 25, 2021.
- Yaseen is the first Boilermaker to haul in double digit receptions this season and the first since Charlie Jones caught 13 against Michigan in the Big Ten Championship Game.
- Deion Burks caught his third touchdown pass of the season on a two-yard reception from Hudson Card in the second quarter. He finished the day with four catches for 51 yards.
- Burks caught a 23-yard pass in the 2nd quarter and a 21-yard pass in the 3rd quarter, marking four receptions of 20-plus yards this season.
- Tyrone Tracy Jr. had a one-yard rushing score in the fourth quarter, his third of the season. He led the team with 38 yards on the ground on 10 attempts.
- Max Klare made five catches for 65 yards, beating the career high he set last game by one yard.
- · Devin Mockobee was limited to just 31 yards on 12 carries on the night.

DEFENSE

• Dillon Thieneman finished with a team-high 14 tackles, becoming the first Purdue freshman since Ja'Whaun Bentley in 2014 to post multiple double-digit tackle games.

- · Kydran Jenkins recorded his third sack of the season, an 11-yard loss that forced a Syracuse FG attempt that was missed in the second quarter. He leads the team with three sacks this season.
- Nic Scourton notched his second sack of the season, forcing a stop on third down in the last drive of the first half.
- The Boilermakers totaled three sacks in the first half, their most in a half since last season's game against Iowa (Nov. 5, 2022). They would finish the game with four total.
- Cam Allen hauled in his second interception of the season and 12th of his career. He now owns the third-most in school history.
- Allen also tallied his first tackle-for-loss since Sept. 10, 2022 against Indiana State.
- Sanoussi Kane tallied a season-high eight tackles, the second-highest total of his career (high of nine at Illinois, Nov. 12, 2022)
- OC Brothers made an impact all across the field, amassing six tackles, a sack, two tackles-for-loss and two pass breakups.
- It was the first time in Brothers' career that he had multiple tackles-for-loss in the same game.
- Scotty Humpich recorded a sack late in the game, his first since the opening game of last season against Penn State (Sept. 1, 2022).
- The Boilermaker defense has forced an interception in seven straight games, dating back to last season's win over Illinois (Nov. 12, 2022).

SPECIAL TEAMS

Hudson Miller and Zion Steptoe combined for a stop on the Syracuse 13-yard line on a kickoff late in the fourth quarter, holding the Orange to an 11-yard return.
 Jack Ansell only needed to punt twice on the night, averaging 44 yards a boot.
