TEAM

• Captains: Gus Hartwig, Devin Mockobee, Kydran Jenkins, Mo Omonode

• Purdue won the toss. Elected to receive. Northwestern kicked off to the north.

• The Boilermakers were penalized twice for a season-low 20 penalty yards.

OFFENSE

- Purdue attempted a season-high 41 passes.
- Hudson Card made his first start after missing the last two games.
- Card threw for 267 yards on 21-of-37 passing with one touchdown.
- · Jahmal Edrine scored Purdue's first touchdown on a six-yard pass from Card in the second quarter. It was Edrine's second score as a Boilermaker.
- · CJ Smith made his debut at wide receiver and was targeted on the first play of the game. He posted a career day with four catches for 55 yards.
- Purdue got eight receptions and 98 yards out of its tight ends on Saturday. Max Klare caught six passes for 78 yards, and Drew Biber added two receptions for 20 yards.
- Max Klare led the team in receiving for the sixth time in eight games this season.
- Shamar Rigby completed a pass for the first time in his career, an eight-yard wide receiver toss in the fourth.
- Devin Mockobee ran for 29 yards on 10 carries and one score. His touchdown was his team-high third of the year on the ground and moved him into sole control of 11th on Purdue's career list with 18 scores.

DEFENSE

- Dillon Thieneman led the team with nine tackles, six solos, and added a pass breakup.
- Kydran Jenkins tallied a half sack in the fourth quarter. He now has 5.5 on the year and 22 for his career, good for sixth in Purdue history. It also gave him 40 career tackles-for-loss. He is the 12th Boilermaker to cross the 40-TFL plateau.
- Cole Brevard combined with Jenkins for the half sack, adding to his sack column for the first time this season.
- Smiley Bradford forced his first career fumble in the second quarter.
- Antonio Stevens intercepted a pass for the first time in his career. It was the fourth Purdue interception of the year and the first by a player aside from Kyndrich Breedlove.
- Hudson Miller made his first career start.

SPECIAL TEAMS

• Spencer Porath connected kicks of 27 and 24 yards for his sixth and seventh makes of the year. He tied Larry Sullivan for fourth on the freshman season charts.

• Keelan Crimmins punted three times for a 46.3-yard average. He boomed a long of 55 yards for his seventh punt over 50 yards on the year with two inside the 20-yard line, giving him eight this season.
