VIRGINIA TECH HOSTS BC FOR HOMECOMING

- Virginia Tech enjoys back-to-back home games for the first time this season. The Hokies are coming off a 49-28 loss on Thursday night vs. Georgia Tech (10/25).
- VT will host a resurgent Boston College squad that registered a 27-14 home win vs. No. 25 Miami (10/26) and has won three of its last four contests.
- Virginia Tech owns a three-game winning streak against the Eagles and has held BC to 10 points or fewer in each of those contests.
- In two wins vs. BC under head coach Justin Fuente, the Hokies have outscored the Eagles by a 72-10 margin.
- Fuente is seeking his 50th career head coaching win (26 with Memphis, 23 with Virginia Tech).

KEY STATS TO WATCH ON HOKIES, EAGLES

- Virginia Tech is 15-2 under Justin Fuente when scoring 30 points, including a 7-0 mark in ACC contests.
- Boston College has lost 11 of its last 15 games when allowing 30+ points.
- Dating back to 2010, Virginia Tech is 27-2 when holding foes to 17 points or fewer at home, including a 14-2 mark vs. ACC foes.
- BC is 2-24 under Steve Addazio when scoring 17 points or fewer, including a 1-12 mark on the road.
- In their last two meetings with BC the Hokies have converted 44.1% (15 of 34) of their third-down opportunities, while limited the Eagles to a 25.0% (8 of 32) third-down conversion rate.
- Hokies' WR Eric Kumah caught four passes for 53 yards in last year's 23-10 win at BC (10/7/17) with all four of those receptions coming on third down and resulting in first downs.
- Tech WR Sean Savoy also enjoyed a breakout game in last season's win against the Eagles, setting career highs with nine catches for 139 yards with a 53-yard TD.

HOKIES NEED A FAST START VS. EAGLES

- Virginia Tech is 20-0 under Fuente when leading at halftime, including a 3-0 mark in 2018. Tech has trailed or been tied at the half in all three of its losses this season.
- The Hokies have outscored Boston College by a 38-3 margin in the first half the past two years and have permitted just one TD in those four quarters of play.
- Virginia Tech has allowed 53 points (13.3 ppg) in its four wins and hasn't permitted more than 20 points in any of those contests. In three losses VT has permitted 47.7 ppg.
- Virginia Tech owns a +86 scoring advantage in 2018 (139+ scored/53+ allowed) in its four victories.
- The Hokies own a +45 point scoring advantage in the first half (130 scored/85 allowed).
- Boston College owns a +58 scoring edge in the first half (185 scored /127 allowed).

MORE SCORING STATS ON TECH. BOSTON COLLEGE

- Since Bud Foster took over the reins of Virginia Tech's vaunted Lunch Pail Defense in 1996, no FBS team owns more sacks (830.0) or has forced more INTs (378).
- The Hokies have won 23 straight contests when holding foes to 21 points or fewer dating back to 2015.
- Since Fuente's arrival in 2016, Tech owns 12 ACC wins, holding 11 of those 12 foes to 21 points or fewer. The lone outlier was a 39-36 win at Pitt (10/27/16).
- VT is 38-5 (.884) at Lane Stadium in ACC play when holding foes to 21 or fewer, including seven straight wins.
- Boston College is 3-31 under head coach Steve Addazio when being held to 21 points or fewer, including a string of seven straight losses dating back to last season.
- Dating back to 2011, Boston College owns a 5-45 mark when being held to 21 points or fewer, including an 0-4 record vs. Virginia Tech and a 2-21 record on the road.
- Boston College has allowed 23.0 ppg in its six wins in 2018. BC shut out Miami in the second half of last week's contest after holding a 17-14 halftime lead against the Hurricanes.

HAZELTON. OTHERS STEPPING UP IN PASSING GAME

- Ball State transfer Damon Hazelton owns three 100-yard receiving games and is tied for the ACC lead with six TD catches.
- Hazelton tied WR Isaiah Ford for the longest streak in school history by registering a TD catch in the first five games of 2018.
 He has caught a TD in every game but Tech's 22-19 win at UNC (10/13)
- The Baltimore native ranks fourth in the ACC, averaging 85.1 receiving ypg., while his 5.0 catches per game are tied for sixth.
- TE Dalton Keene had four catches for 66 yards in last year's game at Boston College (10/7/17). Keene has six catches for 110 yards with two TDs in VT's last three contests.
- WR Tre Turner hauled in his first career TD on a 46-yard pass vs. GT (10/25). He has six catches for 121 yards in his last three games.
- WR Eric Kumah is second on the VT squad with 22 catches for 322 yards. He and Keene are tied for second on the team with a

ON THE JOB TRAINING FOR THE #LPD

- Through the first seven games of 2018, 70.1% (54 of 77) of Tech's defensive starts have been made by underclassmen.
- Only three juniors or seniors have started every game on defense for the Hokies in 2018 - DT Ricky Walker, DB Reggie Floyd and DE Houshun Gaines.

THE TALE OF THE TURNOVER TAPE

- VT is tied for fourth in the ACC with a +4 (11 takes/7 gives) turnover margin in 2018. BC leads the ACC with 19 takeaways and 13 INTs and is second in the ACC at +7 (19 takes/12 gives).
- In six ACC home wins during the Fuente era, Virginia Tech is +9 (13 takes/4 gives). In three ACC home losses since 2016, the Hokies are -5 (1 take/6 gives).
- Despite the wide scoring margin in Tech's last two wins vs.
 Boston College, the two teams are even in turnovers at two apiece.

#LPD MUST STOP DILLON. BC GROUND GAME

- Virginia Tech has limited its foes to 108.5 net rushing ypg in its four wins, holding three of those opponents to under 100 team net rushing yards and allowing only two rushing TDs.
- The Hokies have permitted 13 rushing scores in their three losses and allowed 256.3 net rushing ypg in those contests
- BC owns an 9-2 record when RB A.J. Dillon records a 100-yard rushing game, including a 4-0 mark in 2018. Dillon ran 32 times for 149 yards with one TD vs. Miami (10/26).
- In BC's six wins this season with Dillon in the lineup, he has averaged 148.4 rushing ypc with seven TD runs. Dillon leads the ACC, averaging 133.5 rushing ypg.
- In BC's two losses in 2018, the Eagles have averaged 102.5 rushing ypg with two TDs.
- The Hokies have outgained Boston College on the ground by a 332-197 margin (67.5 ypg) in the last two meetings, scoring three rushing TDs while allowing none.
- Tech RB Steven Peoples leads the squad in rushing (65.4 ypg) and owns five of the squad's 13 rushing TDs.

ADDITIONAL STATISTICAL TIDBITS ON VT. BC

- Tech is fourth in passer rating (148.2), fifth in the ACC in pass offense (261.9 ypg) and seventh in total offense (436.7 ypg).
- The Hokies lead the ACC in Red Zone offense, scoring on 95.7% of their possessions (17 TDs/5 FGs on 23 RZ trips).
- At UNC (10/13), The #LPD allowed seven Red Zone trips, but only managed one TD, fumbled once and kicked four FGs.
- LB Rayshard Ashby leads all ACC underclassmen with 62 tackles and is third overall, averaging 8.9 tackles per game.
- VT ranks third in the ACC with a 40.2-yard net punting average.
- DE Houshun Gaines leads Tech with 4.5 sacks. Gaines and DB Kahlil Ladler are tied for fourth in the ACC with two fumble recoveries.
- Boston College's defense leads the ACC with 28.0 sacks, a mark that ranks fourth in the nation. Eagles DL Wyatt Ray is tied for the ACC lead with 9.0 sacks on the season.

THAT'S WHAT WE'RE TALKING ABOUT, WILLIS!

- QB Ryan Willis made his initial start for VT (in place of an injured QB Josh Jackson) at Duke (9/29) and responded by throwing for 332 yards and a career-high three TDs to earn ACC QB of the Week honors after leading Tech to a 31-14 victory.
- Willis guided VT on an epic 18-play, 98-yard game winning TD drive to lead the Hokies to a 22-19 comeback win at UNC (10/13), throwing for 221 yards with two TDs.
- His two 300-yard passing games at VT are just two shy of tying the school record of four set by QB Logan Thomas (2011-13).

INSIDE THE SERIES: VIRGINIA TECH VS. BOSTON COLLEGE

- Saturday marks the 27th game between Virginia Tech and Boston College with the Hokies leading the all-time series, 18-8.
- The last time Virginia Tech faced a ranked Boston College team was 10 years ago in the 2008 ACC Championship Game, a 30-12 win for the Hokies over the No. 18 Eagles.
- Of the 34 shutouts in the Bud Foster Era, three have come against Boston College. Tech's three shutouts of BC since 1987 are tied with Temple for the most of any opponent.
- The Hokies look to win consecutive meetings in Blacksburg against the Eagles for the first time since the 2009 and 2011 seasons.
- The series dates back to 1993 and the Hokies have won eight of their 10 meetings against the Eagles.
- This will only be Virginia Tech's second-ever homecoming game played in November. The other one was a 23-21 loss to Florida State on Nov. 5, 1977.

2016 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

- The consensus 2016 ACC Coach of the Year, Fuente was also named the top first-year FBS head coach in the nation by the Football Writers Association of America, sharing that honor with USC's Clay Helton.
- Tech finished the 2016 season ranked No. 16 in both the AP Poll and the Coaches Poll, marking the highest final mark for the Hokies since 2010 (No. 16 AP, No. 15 Coaches).
- Virginia Tech, Penn State, Colorado, West Virginia and Western Michigan all finished in the AP Top 25 after getting zero votes in the AP Preseason Poll.
- Tech's 10 wins were the team's most since 2011 and the most ever by a first-year Virginia Tech head coach, surpassing the previous mark of nine wins by C.P. Miles in 1905.

- Named Virginia Tech's head coach on Nov. 29, 2015 after orchestrating one of the more dramatic program resurrections in recent college football history at Memphis.
- The Hokies are in their third season under Fuente in 2018, who has compiled a 23-11 record in Blacksburg, the most wins by any Tech coach in his first two campaigns.
- Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson is the only other active ACC head coach who can boast as many victories in his first two seasons at a conference school than Fuente (19).
- With 19 wins in his first two seasons at Tech, Fuente owns more victories than every Tech coach has accumulated in his first three seasons with the exception of B.C. Cubbage, who guided the program to 21 victories from 1921-23.
- The Hokies have finished back-to-back seasons in the final AP Poll for the first time since 2010-11. The Hokies will be seeking to conclude three straight seasons in the AP Top 25 for the first time since doing it eight consecutive years under Frank Beamer (2004-11).
- Fuente is one of only six FBS head coaches to register nine or more wins each of the past four seasons.
- Tech concluded the 2017 season with a 9-4 mark, finishing the year No. 24 in the AP Top 25 and No. 25 in the Amway USA Today Coaches Poll.
- Tech extended its streak of consecutive bowl appearances to 25 straight seasons in 2017 under Fuente, the longest active streak recognized by the NCAA. Should Tech earn its 26th straight bowl berth in 2018, that mark that would give VT sole possession of the third-longest streak in NCAA history.
- The Hokies have won 14 consecutive Commonwealth Cup games over Virginia, including both matchups under Fuente
- Tech has won 19 consecutive games during Fuente's tenure when leading at halftime.
- VT owns a 7-2 mark under Fuente in games immediately following a loss.
- Fuente's well-deserved reputation for his work with quarterbacks became apparent once again in 2017 as QB Josh Jackson orchestrated the most prolific season of any freshman in Tech history.
- Jackson's 2,991 passing yards were a VT freshman record and the most of any FBS freshman in 2017, while his 20 TDs and 135.2 rating were second among FBS



freshmen behind Georgia QB Jake Fromm (24 TDs, 160.1 ranking).

- Tech's traditionally stout Lunch Pail Defense also lived up to its reputation in 2017, pitching three shutouts.
- The #LPD finished the 2017 season fourth in the FBS in scoring defense (14.8 ppg) and posted an FBS-best three shutouts, while only Michigan (26.1%) held foes to a lower third-down conversion rate than VT (25.2).
- Virginia Tech continued its special teams success under Fuente as the Hokies tied for second in the FBS with six blocked kicks, finished second with 413 punt return yards and the led the nation in fewest return yards allowed with 335
- In total, the Hokies registered five return scores in 2017 (two punt return TDs, two INT return TDs and one fumble return TD).





- Even though the namesake is no longer the big whistle in Blacksburg, Virginia Tech's BeamerBall philosophy has not waned under third-year head coach Justin Fuente.
- There have been 149 non-offensive touchdowns and 144 blocked kicks by Virginia Tech since Frank Beamer's first season as head coach in 1987.
- Under Fuente, the Hokies have scored nine non-offensive touchdowns three punt return touchdowns, two fumble return touchdowns, two interception return touchdowns, one blocked punt return and one blocked field goal return.
- Since Fuente's hiring, the Hokies are tied for eighth in Power Five with seven combined punt return, interception return and fumble return touchdowns.
- The Hokies have blocked more kicks over the last three seasons under Fuente (11) than the previous five seasons combined (9).



BEAMER NAMED TO COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

- Former Virginia Tech head coach Frank Beamer was named College Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2018 in his initial year of eligibility.
- The induction is set for Dec. 4 in New York City.
- The winningest coach in Virginia Tech history, Beamer's 280 victories rank sixth overall in FBS history and are the 13th most by a college football coach at any NCAA division.
- He led the Hokies to their first ever national title game appearance as part of an impressive streak of 23 consecutive bowl berths in his final 23 seasons.
- Under Beamer, the Hokies posted five top-10 finishes and became one of only six programs in college football history to go to a bowl game in at least 20-straight seasons.
- A five-time conference Coach of the Year, Beamer won three BIG EAST titles and added four ACC titles in five conference championship game appearances.
- A monument of Beamer was unveiled at Moody Plaza prior to the Notre Dame game on Oct. 6. The naming of the Beamer-Lawson Indoor Practice Facility was also approved on Oct. 6.

- Head coach Justin Fuente and the Hokies pay homage to Frank Beamer and Virginia Tech's legacy of excellence on special teams by selecting a special teams player of the week who will wear No. 25.
- With Coach Beamer's blessing, his retired No. 25 was worn by a player who exemplified the role special teams played during Virginia Tech's rise to national prominence.

GAME-WINNING DRIVE LIFTS VT

- The Hokies' 18 play, 98-yard game-winning touchdown drive at North Carolina (10/13) is tied for the fourth-longest drive in program history and stands as the longest game-winning drive in program history.
- North Carolina was ready to put the game away, driving to the Tech one-yard line midway through the fourth quarter. But then Tyree Rodgers forced a fumble from UNC tailback Michael Carter that Jovonn Quillen recovered at the Tech 2 with 6:13 remaining in the game.
- The drive took 18 plays, tied for the third most in a TD drive in Tech history, in 5:54 that ended with a one-yard TD grab by TE Dalton Keene.

HOKIES ARE ROAD WARRIORS

- The Hokies were the only team in the FBS this season to play its first three conference games on the road.
- Tech went 3-0 in those ACC contests, its first 3-0 start in league play since 2013 and its sixth time starting 3-0 since joining the ACC.
- The last time Tech started conference play with three road contests was 1993, the season that kicked off Tech's streak of 25-consecutive bowl berths.

HOKIES STOP ANOTHER STREAK

- In its history, Virginia Tech has been known to stop some of their ranked opponents' significant streaks.
- This season, the Hokies halted yet another streak:

Significant Streaks Stopped by the Hokies

Texas (12/31/95): 28-10 win in the 1995 Sugar Bowl snapped a nine-game win streak. **Texas A&M** (9/21/02): 13-3 win broke the Aggies' 29-game non-conference win streak. **Miami** (11/1/03): 31-7 victory snapped their 39-game regular season win streak.

Ohio State (9/6/14): 35-21 upset in broke its 25-game regular season win streak.

North Carolina (10/8/16): 34-3 drubbing over the Tar Heels broke their nine-game home win

Duke (9/29/18): 31-14 win broke the Blue Devils' seven-game win streak dating back to 2017.

HOKIES RESPOND UNDER FUENTE

- Virginia Tech's 1-0 mentality under head coach Justin Fuente can be seen in how the Hokies respond following losses.
- After the win at North Carolina (10/13), Tech is now 9-1 under Fuente in games that follow a loss.
- The Hokies have lost back-to-back games only once in two and a half seasons under Fuente which was a 28-10 loss at No. 9 Miami (11/4/17) and a 28-22 defeat at Georgia Tech (11/11/17).

WILLIS ALREADY SETTING RECORDS

- Redshirt junior Ryan Willis is already etching his name in the Virginia Tech record book through his first three starts as a Hokie.
- Willis is the first Tech QB since Logan Thomas in 2013 to throw for more than 300 yards in back-to-back games.
- He's also the first Hokie signal caller to throw for 300+ yards in his first two starts.
- In his first start since Nov. 11 2016 at Baylor as a Kansas Jayhawk, Willis threw for 332 yards on 17 of 27 passing with a career high three touchdown passes in Virginia Tech's 31-14 win at No. 22 Duke (9/29).
- Willis' 332 passing yards were the most for a QB making his first start at Virginia Tech.
- The win marked Willis' first career win as a starter and his third career 300-yard passing game.
- Willis was only the second Virginia Tech quarterback to make his first two starts with the Hokies against ranked teams; joining Bryan Randall in 2002 vs. No. 14 LSU and No. 16 Marshall.

HAZELTON MAKING AN IMPACT

- Expected to make an instant impact at wideout for the Hokies entering the 2018 season, Ball State transfer Damon Hazelton has lived up to the hype through the first half of the season.
- Hazelton's six TD catches are tied for the most in the ACC and his 85.1 receiving yards per game rank fourth in the ACC.
- He has three 100-yard receiving games, tied for the second most in the conference.

- Hazelton put up 100-yard receiving games in back-to-back weeks (vs. W&M, at ODU) and scored a touchdown in his first five games as a Hokie.
- Against Notre Dame (10/6), Hazelton tied WR Isaiah Ford's program record of five consecutive games with a receiving TD (list below).
- He registered his first 100-yard receiving game as a Hokie vs. William & Mary (9/8) and his first catch in a VT uniform was a 10-yard TD catch vs. Florida State (9/3).
- The Baltimore native racked up 51 catches for 505 yards in 11 games for Ball State as a true freshman.
- He transferred from Ball State and was recommended to Tech wide receivers coach Holmon Wiggins by Texas A&M wide receivers coach Aaron Moorehead, who coached wide receivers for the Hokies from 2013-14.
- He sat out last season due to NCAA transfer rules, redshirted, and made friends with New York Giants wide receiver Odell Beckham, Jr. while working out with trainer Jamal Liggin.

HOKIES WINNING IN FIELD POSITION

- Joey Slye's big leg was a weapon for Virginia Tech the past four seasons but redshirt freshman Jordan Stout has seamlessly carried on the Hokies' success in winning the hidden yardage battle.
- 40 of the Honaker, Virginia native's 42 kickoffs have gone for touchbacks, a percentage that leads the FBS.
- Between Stout and punter Oscar Bradburn, Tech's opponents have only 96 return yards this season and their average drive starts at the 27-yard line, compared to the 31-yard line for the Hokies.

FOSTER WITH RETURNING STARTERS

- With only three starters back on defense, it's been a while since defensive coordinator Bud Foster has had a defensive unit this inexperienced when looking at career starts.
- The Hokies' 55 career returning starts are the fewest since the 2000 squad brought back 42 starts. The last time Tech brought back four starters on defense was also 2000.
- Foster's fewest defensive starters since becoming defensive coordinator in 1996 was three following the National Championship game season in 1999.

FARLEY FIGHTS THROUGH ADVERSITY

- It's been a long and tumultuous road for redshirt freshman DB Caleb Farley, who has two interceptions in three starts at cornerback for Virginia tech.
- After racking up 78 yards of total offense (61 receiving yards, 17 rushing yards) in the 2017 spring game, Farley tore his ACL on the first day of fall camp that kept him out the remainder of the season.
- Off the field, Farley dealt with another major blow personally in January 2018 when his mother succumbed to nearly a decade-long battle with cancer.
- Farley, who cornerbacks coach Brian Mitchell called a "borrowed wide receiver", moved from wideout to cornerback in the spring and is listed as a second-string corner and is expected to return punts and kicks.

ECU VS. VT: THE GAME THAT WASN'T

- The Hokies' week three contest vs. East Carolina was the first canceled game for Virginia Tech since its season opener vs. Georgia Tech in 2000.
- Tech went on to go 11-1 that season with a victory over Clemson in the 2001 Gator Bowl.
 Ironically enough, the Hokies' week three opponent that season was also East Carolina.

LPD LEADS TECH IN WIN AT FSU

- Virginia Tech's dominating 24-3 victory at Florida State was the Hokies' first win in Tallahassee since Nov. 16, 1974.
- The Hokies improved to 100-1 under Bud Foster at defensive coordinator when they hold opponents to 10 points or fewer.
- It was only the fifth time since 1996 under Foster and the third time on the road that the Hokies held a ranked opponent to three points or less.
- It marked the first time in program history that Virginia Tech opened with ranked opponents in back-to-back seasons and won both games after dropping its previous 10 matchups.
- The Hokies held the Seminoles to their lowest point total at home since 2008 when FSU also put up three points against Wake Forest.
 Justin Fuente moved to 4-0 all-time against
- Willie Taggart as a head coach.

THE BELL COW LEADS THE LPD

- With all of the talent on last year's Lunch Pail Defense that finished fourth in the nation in scoring defense and featured seven players currently on NFL rosters, defensive coordinator Bud Foster still called senior defensive tackle Ricky Walker the "Bell Cow" of his unit.
- After playing in 11 games as a true freshman, Walker took a redshirt year and came in 2016 as a redshirt sophomore where he racked up 28 tackles, 6.5 TFLs and four pass breakups.
- Last year was a career year for Walker who posted 41 tackles, 12.5 TFLs and 4.5 sacks in 13 starts.
- His performance helped him earn All-ACC Honorable Mention honors.
- Walker earned his degree in sociology in May and became a father over the summer.
- Walker's brother, Rijo, was a four-year letterwinner at UVA and is currently works on the staff with the College Football Playoff as its team operations coordinator.

O-LINE TECH'S VETERAN UNIT

- The most experienced position group for the Hokies is the offensive line, who returned 51 career starts between Kyle Chung (16), Yosuah Nijman (22) and Braxton Pfaff (13).
- Chung and Pfaff started and played in all 13 games last season while Nijman posted eight starts before an injury ended his season.
- For his senior season, Nijman (6'7", 314) will play at right tackle for the first time in his career.
- Chung, who was granted a sixth year of eligibility during the offseason, moved from right tackle to left guard.
- It won't be Chung's first go-around working inside as he started two games at center vs. Tennessee in the Battle at Bristol and the following game vs. Boston College in 2016.
- Chung is the son of Eugene Chung, an All-American for the Hokies in 1991 and a first-round draft pick of the New England Patriots. He's currently an assistant coach with the Philadelphia Eagles.

BOSTON - Virginia Tech quarterback Josh Jackson threw for 322 yards and a touchdown, and the Hokies' defense held Boston College in check, all in leading No. 16 Virginia Tech to a 23-10 victory over the Eagles in an ACC game played at Alumni Stadium on Saturday evening.

With the win, the Hokies moved to 5-1 overall, 1-1 in the ACC, and they beat Boston College for the eighth time in the past 10 meetings. The Eagles fell to 2-4 overall, 0-3 in league play.

Tech survived an early interception and got on the board midway through the first quarter on a 53-yard touchdown pass from Jackson to Sean Savoy. The two teams later traded field goals before the Hokies opened some breathing room on Travon McMillian's 23-yard touchdown run with 6:19 left in the first half to take a 17-3 lead.

The Hokies only added two more Joey Slye field goals for the remainder of the game, but that was all they needed, as Tech's defense allowed just a fourth-quarter score the remainder of the evening. The Hokies held the Eagles to 320 held them to 2 of 15 on third-down conversions. At one stretch in the second half, BC went three-and-out on five straight possessions.

Jackson led Tech, completing 22 of 33 for 322 yards, with a touchdown and an interception. The Hokies finished with 431 yards of offense.

LANE STADIUM

LANE STADIUM - HOME OF THE HOKIES

Rising high into the mountainous sky of the New River Valley, Virginia Tech's Lane Stadium enters its 53rd year of football competition in 2017. The Tech football team has enjoyed over two decades of success, going to 24 straight bowl games and winning 10 or more games eight straight seasons from 2004-11. A big part of that success is the home-field advantage the Hokies enjoy at Lane Stadium/Worsham Field.

Sitting at roughly 2,057 feet above sea level, the stadium is the second-highest among all FBS schools in the eastern United States, trailing only Appalachian State (3,300). Completed in 1965, Lane Stadium/Worsham Field has gone through numerous changes, renovations and additions. But through it all, it has always been regarded as one of the finest places to watch – and toughest places for opponents to play – a college football game.

THE HOKIE STONE

Before each home football game, Virginia Tech football players and coaching staff enter Lane Stadium through a tunnel. On the stadium-side entrance to Worsham Field, they pass beneath a Hokie Stone, which they touch for good luck and is flanked by these words: "For those who have passed. For those to come ... Reach for Excellence.

ENTER SANDMAN

The history behind Virginia Tech's use of Metallica's "Enter Sandman" started during the 2000 season. That summer, Tech added a new scoreboard to Lane Stadium and the athletics marketing team decided to use the song for an entrance video. The group considered "Welcome to the Jungle" by Guns N' Roses and "Sirius" by the Alan Parsons Project before settling on "Enter Sandman." As the song played on one chilly evening prior to the team's entrance, members of the Marching Virginians began to jump up and down in rhythm in an effort to stay warm. The Lane Stadium crowd followed suit and the jumping hasn't stopped since.

Virginia Tech jumped out to a quick lead and never relinquished it, rolling to a 24-3 victory over Florida State at Doak Campbell Stadium on Monday night in an ACC game that marked the season opener for both squads.

With the victory, Virginia Tech, ranked No. 20 in the Associated Press poll, snapped a six-game losing streak to the Seminoles in Tallahassee. Florida State came in ranked No. 19.

The Hokies played a strong first half, taking a 17-3 lead into the locker room. A Josh Jackson touchdown pass to Damon Hazelton and a field goal by Brian Johnson on the Hokies' first two possessions gave them a 10-0 lead.

Tech's special teams made the biggest play of the first half when tight end Chris Cunningham blocked the punt of FSU punter Logan Tyler. Tech's Eric Kumah caught the deflection and ran it three yards into the end zone for a touchdown, which gave the Hokies the 17-3 cushion.

Tech then put the game away late in the fourth quarter when Jackson threw a 49-yard touchdown pass to Kuman with 5: 11 remaining.

Jackson threw for 207 yards and two touchdowns. Tech's defense forced five turnovers, recorded four sacks and held Florida State to just 94 yards rushing.

GAME NOTES

- Kumah's blocked punt return for a score marked the Hokies' first since Anthony Shegog returned one for a touchdown in Tech's win at Purdue in 2015.
- Cunningham's blocked punt marked the Hokies' 11th blocked kick under Justin Fuente and the ninth non-offensive touchdown.
- Tech brought 14 true freshmen on the trip and two of them started left tackle Christian Darrisaw and long snapper Oscar Shadley.
- Caleb Farley intercepted two passes and had a sack in his collegiate debut.
- Tech's defense recorded 14 tackles for a loss. Trevon Hill had three tackles for a loss and two sacks.

Josh Jackson threw a touchdown pass and ran for a touchdown and Steven Peoples rushed for two touchdowns, as No. 12 Virginia Tech blasted in-state foe William & Mary 62-17 in a non-conference game at Lane Stadium on Saturday in a game that marked the Hokies' home opener.

The Hokies (2-0) showed no hangover coming off their huge win over Florida State on Monday night, scoring on 10 straight possessions during one stretch of the game and never punting. They racked up more than 400 yards offense in the first 30 minutes alone, and not to be outdone, Tech's defense held William & Mary to 100 first-half yards and just three first downs.

Peoples scored on runs of 6 and 4 yards and Jackson scored on an 8-yard run. Jackson, who played the entire first half and one series in the second, completed 12 of 16 for 217 yards and threw a 39-yard touchdown pass to Damon Hazelton.

The Hokies finished with 586 yards of total offense. William & Mary had 266, led by quarterback Shon Mitchell's 208 yards passing.

Hazelton caught four passes for a career-high 107 yards for the Hokies.

Despite Steven Peoples' career-best rushing performance, Virginia Tech struggled for much of the afternoon against in-state foe Old Dominion, and the No. 13 Hokies fell 49-35 to the Monarchs in a nonconference game at Ballard Stadium.

Peoples rushed for 156 yards on 20 carries and scored on runs of 87 yards and 1 yard. Quarterback Josh Jackson threw two touchdown passes.

But the Hokies struggled against ODU's offense, led by backup quarterback Blake LaRussa. The 5-foot-11 LaRussa completed 30 of 49 for 495 yards and threw touchdown passes of 14, 4, 25 and 29 yards. He also rushed for a touchdown on a day in which ODU's offense finished with 632 yards.

The Hokies led 28-21 with 32 seconds left in the third quarter, but ODU scored on its next two possessions, taking a 35-28 lead – its first lead of the game.

Things got worse for Tech, as Jackson went down with a lower leg injury on the first play of the ensuing drive. Backup quarterback Ryan Willis led the Hokies on a 75-yard march that ended with a touchdown pass, tying the game at 35.

But the Hokies simply had no answer for ODU. LaRussa polished off a 75-yard drive with 5:11 left and Jeremy Cox's 40-yard touchdown run sealed the win.

Making his first start as a Hokie, quarterback Ryan Willis threw for 332 yards and three touchdowns to lead Virginia Tech to a 31-14 bounce-back victory over No. 22 Duke in an ACC game played Saturday night at Wallace Wade Stadium.

Playing in place of injured starter Josh Jackson, Willis looked like a veteran, throwing the ball accurately and making good decisions, as the Hokies rebounded from a loss to ODU last Saturday. He completed 17 of 27 in the game.

Willis, who transferred from Kansas in 2017, made a beautiful throw over Damon Hazelton's outside shoulder for a 27-yard touchdown pass on the first play of the second quarter to give the Hokies a 10-7 lead, and Tech never trailed again. The Hokies padded their score on their next possession when tight end Dalton Keene hauled in a short pass from Willis and broke several tackles en route to a 67-yard touchdown. Those two scores in a three-minute span enabled the Hokies to take control of the game.

Duke cut the lead to 24-14 on a 1-yard run by Deon Jackson with 13:47 left in the game, but Willis and the Hokies answered. A 75-yard drive ended with a 10-yard touchdown pass from Willis to Phil Jackson.

Tech finished with 413 yards of offense. The Hokies' defense held Duke to 327 yards and sacked Duke's Daniel Jones three times.

GAME NOTES

- Tech beat a ranked team for the fourth time in Justin Fuente's tenure as the head coach (UNC in 2016, West Virginia in 2017, FSU 2018).
- The 300-yard passing game marked the third of Willis' career. He twice went over 300 yards during his two years at Kansas.
- Hazelton's touchdown reception in the second quarter gave him a touchdown reception in all four games this season.
- After missing the ODU game with injuries, both left tackle Christian Darrisaw and safety Divine Deablo returned to their starting roles.
- Patterson's 10-vard touchdown catch was the first receiving TD of his career.
- Steven Peoples scored on a 6-yard run in the third quarter and now has scored a touchdown in three straight games.

Despite another solid performance from quarterback Ryan Willis and a big game from receiver Damon Hazelton, Virginia Tech struggled to stop Notre Dame's offense in the second half, falling to the No. 6 Irish 45-23 in a non-conference game played Saturday night at Lane Stadium.

The Hokies trailed by just a point at halftime, 17-16, after Willis connected with Hazelton for a 3-yard touchdown with 12 seconds left in the first half. But Notre Dame made several big plays in the second half to pull away.

The Irish scored touchdowns on four of their first five possessions of the second half, including on their first two possessions the third quarter (a 97-yard touchdown run by Dexter Williams and a 40-yard touchdown pass from quarterback lan Book to Miles Boykin). The latter score gave the Irish a 31-16 lead with 4:59 left in the third quarter.

Notre Dame all but sealed the game early in the fourth quarter when an 11-play, 64-yard drive ended with a 5-yard touchdown pass from Book to Boykin that gave the Irish a 38-16 lead with 9:08 remaining.

Tech cut into that lead when Willis threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to Eric Kuman with 5:40 remaining, but Notre Dame answered with a 31-yard touchdown run by Williams to account for the final margin.

GAME NOTES

- Hazelton recorded his third 100-yard receiving game of the season and now has caught at least one touchdown pass in all five of the Hokies' games this season, tying Isaiah Ford's program record.
- Hazelton's 12 receptions tied a career high. He caught 12 in a game while playing at Ball State before transferring to Tech.
- Willis became the first Tech quarterback since Logan Thomas in 2013 to throw for at least 300 yards in back-to-back games.
- Willis' 52 pass attempts were the most by a Tech quarterback since Michael Brewer threw the ball 56 times in a 28-21 loss to East Carolina in 2014.

Virginia Tech quarterback Ryan Willis threw a touchdown pass to Dalton Keene with 19 seconds left to lift the Hokies to a 22-19 victory over North Carolina in an ACC game played Saturday night at Kenan Stadium.

North Carolina was ready to put the game away, driving to the Tech 1 midway through the fourth quarter. But the Hokies' Tyree Rodgers forced a fumble from North Carolina tailback Michael Carter that Jovonn Quillen recovered at the Tech 2 with 6:13 remaining in the game.

Willis then led Tech on a 98-yard march, with the Hokies converting on third down on four occasions and on fourth down once. The drive ended with Willis connecting with Keene on a 1-yard touchdown with 19 seconds left. The Hokies went for two points and Willis hit Hazelton, giving the Hokies a 22-19 lead.

North Carolina had one final chance, but couldn't advance the ball past midfield.

Willis paced the Tech offense with 309 total yards. He completed 20 of 36 for 221 yards, with two touchdowns and two interceptions. He also rushed for 88 yards on 15 carries.

The Tar Heels finished with 522 yards. Carter led the way, rushing for 165 yards.

GAME NOTES

- All three of the Hokies' conference wins this season have come on the road.
- The Hokies have beaten the Tar Heels three straight times and in five of the past six meetings.
- Keene now has caught touchdown passes in two of the Hokies' past three games.
- Sean Savoy's 13-yard touchdown reception marked his first of the season and the third of his career. His last TD reception came against Georgia Tech last year.
- Savoy's six receptions are the most for him this season and the second-most for him in his career. He caught nine passes in the Hokies' win over BC last year.

Despite two passing touchdowns and one rushing score from quarterback Ryan Willis, Virginia Tech struggled to slow down Georgia Tech's rushing attack and fell 49-28 to the Yellow Jackets in an ACC game played Thursday night at Lane Stadium.

With the loss, the Hokies dropped to 4-3 overall, 3-1 in the ACC. Georgia Tech moved to 4-4, 2-3.

The key play in the game came midway through the second quarter when the Hokies, leading 21-14, forced Georgia Tech to punt. But Virginia Tech punt returner Sean Savoy muffed the punt, and Georgia Tech recovered at the Virginia Tech 12. Two plays later, Jordan Mason scored on a 5-yard run to tie the game at 21 with 6:57 left in the first half.

That touchdown was the first of four consecutive touchdowns scored by the Yellow Jackets, as Georgia Tech's ground game was in full throttle. Behind quarterback Tobias Oliver – starting in place of injured Taquon Marshall – the Yellow Jackets rushed for 465 yards and registered 35 first downs. Oliver finished with 40 carries for 215 yards and three touchdowns.

The Hokies finished with 323 yards of offense. Willis completed 15 of 22 for 201 yards and two touchdowns, and he also rushed for 22 yards and a score.

GAME NOTES

- Willis now has thrown at least two touchdown passes in each of his four starts. He has 10 touchdown passes and just three interceptions on the season.
- Damon Hazleton's 41-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter marked his team-best sixth touchdown catch of the season.
- Hazelton's 81 yards receiving marked the fifth time in seven games this season that he has recorded at least 50 yards in receiving.
- Tre Turner's 46-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter marked the first touchdown catch of his career. It also marked the longest reception of his career.
