VIRGINIA TECH RETURNS TO ACC PLAY

- Virginia Tech returns to ACC play with a road trip to North Carolina (10/13).
- The Hokies are coming off a 45-23 home loss vs. Notre Dame (10/6). Tech trailed by a 17-16 margin at halftime before the Irish broke off 21 unanswered points.
- North Carolina is coming off a bye following a 47-10 loss at Miami (9/27).
- The Hokies are 8-1 under Justin Fuente in their next game following a loss.
- Tech's last road trip resulted in a 31-14 win at Duke (9/29) and it will be deja vu all over again as the Hokies will stay in the same Chapel Hill, NC hotel for this trip.
- VT has outscored the Tar Heels by a combined 93-10 margin in two previous contests under Fuente.
- Virginia Tech's most recent trek to Kenan Stadium resulted in a 34-3 win (10/8/16) in a game played amidst Hurricane Matthew.
- The Hokies are 7-3 in ACC road games under Fuente, including three straight wins dating back to a 10-0 victory at UVA (11/24/17).
- UNC has lost five of its last six home ACC games dating back to the 2016 campaign.
- Saturday's contest will mark VT's third straight ACC road game to open the 2018 season. The Hokies won't play an ACC foe at home until facing Georgia Tech (10/25).

#SACKSBURG = HOME OF THE #LPD

- Since Bud Foster took over the reins of Virginia Tech's vaunted Lunch Pail Defense in 1996, no FBS team owns more sacks (827.0) or has forced more INTs (378).
- The Hokies have won 22 straight contests when holding foes to 21 points or fewer dating back to 2015.
- The Tar Heels have lost 11 straight games when being held to 21 points or fewer dating back to 2016, including three setbacks this season.
- Since Fuente's arrival in 2016, Tech owns 11 ACC wins, holding 10 of those 11 foes to 21 points or fewer. The lone outlier was a 39-36 win at Pitt (10/27/16).
- Dating back to 1996, Virginia Tech is 40-4 when forcing three or more INTs.
- DT Ricky Walker opened the scoring in last year's 59-7 win vs. UNC (10/21/17) with a 12-yard fumble return TD, while S Reggie Floyd had a 69-yard INT return TD.
- LB Rayshard Ashby leads all ACC freshman and is tied for fourth in the league, averaging 8.0 tackles per game.
- DE Houshun Gaines is tied for seventh in the ACC with 3.5 sacks.

FRANK BEAMER - HALL OF FAME HOKIE

- Iconic former Virginia Tech head coach Frank Beamer will be enshrined into the College Football Hall of Fame in December as a first-ballot member of the Class of 2018.

DOMINATE THEIR STATE

- Virginia Tech owns a 7-0 record against teams from the state of North Carolina under Fuente.
- A total of 13 players on the current Virginia Tech roster hail from the state of North Carolina.
- VT owns a combined 32-7 record in ACC play against teams from the state of North Carolina: 13-2 vs. Duke, 11-3 vs. UNC, 4-1 vs. NCSU and 4-1 vs. Wake Forest
- The Hokies will play 10 of their 11 final regular season games in Virginia or North Carolina. Tech's only scheduled trip outside the region is an ACC contest at Pitt (11/10).

VT AT ITS BEST WHEN POUNDING IT ON THE GROUND

- Tech has outgained UNC by a 370-to-127 margin on the ground in the last two meetings, running for three TDs and allowing none, meaning the Hokies posted 243 more rushing yards in those games.
- VT owns a +299-yard rushing differential (498 gained/199 allowed), in its three wins with eight rushing TDs and two allowed.
- RB Steven Peoples ranks ninth in the ACC in rushing (73.2 ypg).
- UNC has a -69-yard rushing differential (540 gained/609 allowed) in 2018 with three rushing TDs and seven allowed.
- The #LPD ranks second in the ACC and is seventh among FBS squads in rushing defense, allowing 100.6 ypg.
- North Carolina ranks 12th in the ACC, allowing 200.9 rushing ypg.

THE TALE OF THE TURNOVER TAPE

- Virginia Tech is third in the ACC with a +5 turnover differential (9 takes/4 gives). North Carolina is +4 (9 takes/5 gives).
- North Carolina is -7 (3 takes/10 gives) on the season.
- In seven ACC road wins during the Fuente era, Virginia Tech is +9 (13 takes/4 gives). In three ACC road losses since 2016, the Hokies are -1 (5 take/6 gives).
- Tech S Reggie Floyd owns an INT in back-to-back contests.
- DE Houshun Gaines is tied for the ACC lead with two forced fumbles and is second in the ACC with two fumble recoveries.
- CB Caleb Farley is tied for third in the ACC with two INTs.

STATISTICAL TIDBITS ON TECH'S OFFENSE

- Tech is second in the ACC in pass offense (282.2 ypg), third in total offense (417.8 ypg) and fourth in passer rating (152.0).
- The Hokies lead the ACC in Red Zone offense, scoring on 94.7% of their possessions (13 TDs/5 FGs on 19 RZ trips).

BEAMER BALL LIVES HERE!

- Only Oklahoma (28) has allowed fewer combined KO and punt return yards than Virginia Tech (45). The Hokies have allowed zero punt return yards and 45 KO return yards.
- VT ranks third in the ACC with a 41.2-yard net punting average.
- RB Terius Wheatley ranks second in the ACC with a 25.5-yard KO return average. K Brian Johnson ranks eighth overall in the ACC in scoring, averaging 8.2 ypg.
- CB Greg Stroman registered a 91-yard punt return TD in last year's 59-7 win vs. UNC (10/21/17).

HAZELTON OFF TO A HOT START FOR HOKIES

- After sitting out the 2017 season after transferring from Ball State, Baltimore native WR Damon Hazelton has produced three 100-yard receiving games for the Hokies in 2018.
- Hazelton owns a TD catch in five straight games for VT, tying WR Isaiah Ford for the longest streak in school history.
- He tied a career high with 12 receptions vs. Notre Dame (10/6), matching a mark he established at Toledo (11/16/16).
- Hazelton's 154 receiving yards at ODU (9/22) were a career high and was the third 100-yard game of his collegiate career. His 72-yard TD catch was the longest of his career and the longest pass play of the Fuente era.
- Hazelton's five TD catches are tied for second in the ACC. He ranks fourth in the ACC, averaging 95.8 receiving ypg., while his 6.6 catches per game are fifth in the conference.
- He ranks 10th in the ACC averaging 102.6 all-purpose ypg.

THAT'S WHAT WE'RE TALKING ABOUT, WILLIS!

- QB Ryan Willis started at Duke (9/29) after relieving an injured QB Josh Jackson in the second half at ODU (9/22). Willis responded by throwing for 332 yards and registered a career-high three TDs to earn ACC QB of the Week honors.
- The Duke contest marked his first start since opening for Kansas at Baylor (11/15/16). The Overland Park, Kansas native transferred from Kansas after throwing for 2,530 yards and 12 TDs in two seasons (2015-16).
- His 332 yards at Duke (9/29) marked the second-highest tally of his career and his third career 300-yard game. He threw for a career-high 348 yards vs. TCU (10/8/16).
- Willis hails from an athletic family. Father, Steve, was a kicker at Kansas State. Mother, Lois, was an All-America track athlete at Iowa State, while his older sisters Lauren (Oklahoma) and Abby (St. Louis University) both played D1 college basketball.
- Willis and WR Damon Hazelton are roommates. Over the past two games, that duo has connected for 16 completions for 196 yards (98.0 ypg) with two TDs.

MORE TECH, CAROLINA SCORING STATS

- VT has allowed 34 points (11.3 ppg) in its three wins and haven't permitted more than 17 points in any of those contests.
- Virginia Tech owns a +83 scoring advantage in 2018 (117 scored/34 allowed) in those three victories.
- North Carolina owns a -63 scoring deficit in 2018 (84 scored/147 allowed).
- Virginia Tech is 20-0 under Fuente when leading at halftime, including a 3-0 mark in 2018.
- The Hokies own a +54 point advantage in the first half (102 scored/48 allowed).
- North Carolina has been outscored in the first half by a 49-point margin in 2018 (50 scored/99 allowed).
- The second quarter has been Tech's most prolific scoring period, outscoring foes by a 62-24 margin (+38 advantage).

INSIDE THE SERIES: VIRGINIA TECH-NORTH CAROLINA

- The matchup on Saturday will be the 41st meeting in the all-time series between Virginia Tech and North Carolina.
- The Hokies lead the all-time series, 22-12-6, and have won seven of the last 10 meetings.
- Virginia Tech's last visit to Chapel Hill was good but wet one as the No. 25 Hokies stomped No. 17 North Carolina, 34-3, amidst Hurricane Matthew.
- The win was Justin Fuente's first victory over a ranked opponent as head coach at Virginia Tech and it helped propel the Hokies to a 10-4 season, a spot in the ACC championship game and a win in the 2017 Belk Bowl over Arkansas.
- Virginia Tech is the only FBS program this season that has played their first three conference games on the road.
- 1993 was the last and only other season in the FBS Era (1978) that Virginia Tech started conference play with three road contests.

2016 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

- The consensus 2016 ACC Coach of the Year, Fuente was also named the top first-year FBS head coach in the nation by the Football Writers Association of America, sharing that honor with USC's Clay Helton.
- Tech finished the 2016 season ranked No. 16 in both the AP Poll and the Coaches Poll, marking the highest final mark for the Hokies since 2010 (No. 16 AP, No. 15 Coaches).
- Virginia Tech, Penn State, Colorado, West Virginia and Western Michigan all finished in the AP Top 25 after getting zero votes in the AP Preseason Poll.
- Tech's 10 wins were the team's most since 2011 and the most ever by a first-year Virginia Tech head coach, surpassing the previous mark of nine wins by C.P. Miles in 1905.

- Named Virginia Tech's head coach on Nov. 29, 2015 after orchestrating one of the more dramatic program resurrections in recent college football history at Memphis.
- The Hokies are in their third season under Fuente in 2018, who has compiled a 22-10 record in Blacksburg, the most wins by any Tech coach in his first two campaigns.
- Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson is the only other active ACC head coach who can boast as many victories in his first two seasons at a conference school than Fuente (19).
- With 19 wins in his first two seasons at Tech, Fuente owns more victories than every Tech coach has accumulated in his first three seasons with the exception of B.C. Cabbage, who guided the program to 21 victories from 1921-23.
- The Hokies have finished back-to-back seasons in the final AP Poll for the first time since 2010-11. The Hokies will be seeking to conclude three straight seasons in the AP Top 25 for the first time since doing it eight consecutive years under Frank Beamer (2004-11).
- Fuente is one of only six FBS head coaches to register nine or more wins each of the past four seasons.
- Tech concluded the 2017 season with a 9-4 mark, finishing the year No. 24 in the AP Top 25 and No. 25 in the Amway USA Today Coaches Poll.
- Tech extended its streak of consecutive bowl appearances to 25 straight seasons in 2017 under Fuente, the longest active streak recognized by the NCAA. Should Tech earn its 26th straight bowl berth in 2018, that mark that would give VT sole possession of the third-longest streak in NCAA history.
- The Hokies have won 14 consecutive Commonwealth Cup games over Virginia, including both matchups under Fuente.
- Tech has won 19 consecutive games during Fuente's tenure when leading at halftime.
- VT owns a 7-2 mark under Fuente in games immediately following a loss.
- Fuente's well-deserved reputation for his work with quarterbacks became apparent once again in 2017 as QB Josh Jackson orchestrated the most prolific season of any freshman in Tech history.
- Jackson's 2,991 passing yards were a VT freshman record and the most of any FBS freshman in 2017, while his 20 TDs and 135.2 rating were second among FBS

freshmen behind Georgia QB Jake Fromm (24 TDs, 160.1 ranking).

- Tech's traditionally stout Lunch Pail Defense also lived up to its reputation in 2017, pitching three shutouts.
- The #LPD finished the 2017 season fourth in the FBS in scoring defense (14.8 ppg) and posted an FBS-best three shutouts, while only Michigan (26.1%) held foes to a lower third-down conversion rate than VT (25.2).
- Virginia Tech continued its special teams success under Fuente as the Hokies tied for second in the FBS with six blocked kicks, finished second with 413 punt return yards and the led the nation in fewest return yards allowed with 335.
- In total, the Hokies registered five return scores in 2017 (two punt return TDs, two INT return TDs and one fumble return TD).

BACK FOR ANOTHER SEASON

• Virginia Tech's Bud Foster and Charley Wiles are two of the longest tenured active FBS assistants that have served in consecutive years at the same institution.

LONGEST TENURED FBS ASSISTANTS

The famed Virginia Tech Lunch Pail has come to symbolize the blue-collar approach of the Hokies' defense under longtime defensive coordinator Bud Foster.

- In 1995, Foster served as co-defensive coordinator with Rod Sharpless, whose mother-in-law found the original Lunch Pail in Mercerville, New Jersey. The pail once belonged to a coal miner and after a record-setting defensive season, the Lunch Pail became an iconic part of Hokies' lore.
- The Pail travels wherever the Hokies go and its care is only entrusted to a defensive leader.
- Before the start of every season, a signed mission statement from the defense is placed in The Pail. Then every week, unit goals, team goals and keys to success are placed in The Pail, plus the turf from any road victories.
- Since 2007, The Pail has also contained the names of the 32 fallen Hokies taken in the April 16 tragedy.
- Darryl Tapp is the only player who has ever earned lifetime possession of an incarnation of The Pail from Foster.

- Even though the namesake is no longer the big whistle in Blacksburg, Virginia Tech's BeamerBall philosophy has not waned under third-year head coach Justin Fuente.
- There have been 149 non-offensive touchdowns and 144 blocked kicks by Virginia Tech since Frank Beamer's first season as head coach in 1987.
- Under Fuente, the Hokies have scored nine non-offensive touchdowns – three punt return touchdowns, two fumble return touchdowns, two interception return touchdowns, one blocked punt return and one blocked field goal return.
- Since Fuente's hiring, the Hokies are tied for eighth in Power Five with seven combined punt return, interception return and fumble return touchdowns.
- The Hokies have blocked more kicks over the last three seasons under Fuente (11) than the previous five seasons combined (9).



BEAMER NAMED TO COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

- Former Virginia Tech head coach Frank Beamer was named College Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2018 in his initial year of eligibility.
- The induction is set for Dec. 4 in New York City.
- The winningest coach in Virginia Tech history, Beamer's 280 victories rank sixth overall in FBS history and are the 13th most by a college football coach at any NCAA division.
- He led the Hokies to their first ever national title game appearance as part of an impressive streak of 23 consecutive bowl berths in his final 23 seasons.
- Under Beamer, the Hokies posted five top-10 finishes and became one of only six programs in college football history to go to a bowl game in at least 20-straight seasons.
- A five-time conference Coach of the Year, Beamer won three BIG EAST titles and added four ACC titles in five conference championship game appearances.
- A monument of Beamer was unveiled at Moody plaza prior to the Notre Dame game on Oct. 6. The naming of the Beamer-Lawson Indoor Practice Facility was also approved on Oct. 6.

- Head coach Justin Fuente and the Hokies pay homage to Frank Beamer and Virginia Tech's legacy of excellence on special teams by selecting a special teams player of the week who will wear No. 25.
- With Coach Beamer's blessing, his retired No. 25 was worn by a player who exemplified the role special teams played during Virginia Tech's rise to national prominence.

WILLIS ALREADY SETTING RECORDS

- Redshirt junior Ryan Willis is already etching his name in the Virginia Tech record book through his first two starts as a Hokie.
- Willis is the first Tech QB since Logan Thomas in 2013 to throw for more than 300 yards in back-to-back games.
- He's also the first Hokie signal caller to throw for 300+ yards in his first two starts.
- In his first start since Nov. 11 2016 at Baylor as a Kansas Jayhawk, Willis threw for 332 yards on 17 of 27 passing with a career high three touchdown passes in Virginia Tech's 31-14 win at No. 22 Duke (9/29).
- Willis' 332 passing yards were the most for a QB making his first start at Virginia Tech.
- The win marked Willis' first career win as a starter and his third career 300-yard passing game.
- Willis was only the second Virginia Tech quarterback to make his first two starts with the Hokies against ranked teams; joining Bryan Randall in 2002 vs. No. 14 LSU and No. 16 Marshall.

HAZELTON MAKING AN IMPACT

- Expected to make an instant impact at wideout for the Hokies entering the 2018 season, Ball State transfer Damon Hazelton has lived up to the hype in the early going.
- His 95.8 receiving yards per game ranks fourth in the ACC.
- He has three 100-yard receiving games, tied for the most in the ACC, and has four in his career.
- Hazelton put up 100-yard receiving games in back-to-back weeks (vs. W&M, at ODU) and has scored a touchdown in all five games this season.
- Against Notre Dame (10/6), Hazelton tied WR Isaiah Ford's program record of five consecutive games with a receiving TD (list below).
- He registered his first 100-yard receiving game as a Hokie vs. William & Mary (9/8) and his first catch in a VT uniform was a 10-yard TD catch vs. Florida State (9/3).
- The Baltimore native racked up 51 catches for 505 yards in 11 games for Ball State as a true freshman.
- He transferred from Ball State and was recommended to Tech wide receivers coach Holmon Wiggins by Texas A&M wide receivers coach Aaron Moorehead, who coached wide receivers for the Hokies from 2013-14.
- He sat out last season due to NCAA transfer rules, redshirted, and made friends with New York Giants wide receiver Odell Beckham, Jr. while working out with trainer Jamal Ligin.

- Joey Slye's big leg was a weapon for Virginia Tech the past four seasons but redshirt freshman Jordan Stout has seamlessly carried on the Hokies' success in winning the hidden yardage battle.
- 31 of the Honaker, Virginia native's 33 kickoffs have gone for touchbacks, a total that leads the FBS.
- Between Stout and punter Oscar Bradburn, Tech's opponents have only 45 return yards this season and their average drive starts at the 23-yard line, compared to the 33-yard line for the Hokies.

ECU VS. VT: THE GAME THAT WASN'T

- The Hokies' week three contest vs. East Carolina was the first canceled game for Virginia Tech since its season opener vs. Georgia Tech in 2000.
- Tech went on to go 11-1 that season with a victory over Clemson in the 2001 Gator Bowl.
- Ironically enough, the Hokies' week three opponent that season was also East Carolina.

OFFENSE HITS THE GROUND VS. W&M

- The Hokies' 305 rushing yards vs. William & Mary (9/8) was the second-highest total under head coach Justin Fuente.
- The previous time the Hokies rushed for 300+ yards in a game was vs. Western Michigan (9/27/14) when Tech rushed for 308 yards.
- Tech's 586 yards of total offense against the Tribe ranks 10th in a single game in program history. Its the seventh most total yards of offense gained in Lane Stadium since 1987.
- The offense was so effective that sophomore P Oscar Bradburn didn't need to punt. The last time Virginia Tech didn't register a punt in a game was 9/11/10 vs. James Madison.
- Virginia Tech had three quarterbacks - Josh Jackson, Ryan Willis and Hendon Hooker - rush for a touchdown, a first in program history.
- This is only the second season since 1996 where Virginia Tech has had three different quarterbacks rush for touchdowns in a single season. 2015 (Dwayne Lawson, Michael Brewer, Brenden Motley) being the other.
- Tech's 22 first downs in the first half tied for the second most in a half in program history since 1987. The Hokies also had 22 first downs against Wake Forest on Oct. 16, 2010. The program record is 24 in the first half against UCF on August 31, 2003.
- Tech's 401 total yards in the first half was its third most in a half since 1987. the hokies had 420 total yards in the first half against Rutgers on 10/9/99 and the record is 434 against Wake Forest with 434 10/16/10.

LPD LEADS TECH IN WIN AT FSU

- Virginia Tech's dominating 24-3 victory at Florida State was the Hokies' first win in Tallahassee since Nov. 16, 1974.
- The Hokies improved to 100-1 under Bud Foster at defensive coordinator when they hold opponents to 10 points or fewer.
- It was only the fifth time since 1996 under Foster and the third time on the road that the Hokies held a ranked opponent to three points or less.
- It marked the first time in program history that Virginia Tech opened with ranked opponents in back-to-back seasons and won both games after dropping its previous 10 matchups.
- The Hokies held the Seminoles to their lowest point total at home since 2008 when FSU also put up three points against Wake Forest.
- Justin Fuente moved to 4-0 all-time against Willie Taggart as a head coach.

FARLEY FIGHTS THROUGH ADVERSITY

- It's been a long and tumultuous road for redshirt freshman DB Caleb Farley, who has two interceptions in three starts at cornerback for Virginia Tech.
- After racking up 78 yards of total offense (61 receiving yards, 17 rushing yards) in the 2017 spring game, Farley tore his ACL on the first day of fall camp that kept him out the remainder of the season.
- Off the field, Farley dealt with another major blow personally in January 2018 when his mother succumbed to nearly a decade-long battle with cancer.

• Farley, who cornerbacks coach Brian Mitchell called a "borrowed wide receiver", moved from wideout to cornerback in the spring and is listed as a second-string corner and is expected to return punts and kicks.

KUMAH BREAKS OUT VS. FSU

- Junior WR Eric Kumah registered his first career multi-touchdown game in unique fashion at Florida State by becoming only the third Hokie since 1987 to have a return and receiving score in the same game.
- Kumah's TD off of a blocked punt by r-junior TE Chris Cunningham was Virginia Tech's 149th non-offensive touchdown scored since Frank Beamer's first season as head coach.
- His game-sealing TD catch in the fourth quarter went for 49 yards, a new career-high.

THE BELL COW IS BACK

- With all of the talent on last year's Lunch Pail Defense that finished fourth in the nation in scoring defense and featured seven players currently on NFL rosters, defensive coordinator Bud Foster still called senior defensive tackle Ricky Walker the "Bell Cow" of his unit.
- After playing in 11 games as a true freshman, Walker took a redshirt year and came in 2016 as a redshirt sophomore where he racked up 28 tackles, 6.5 TFLs and four pass breakups.
- Last year was a career year for Walker who posted 41 tackles, 12.5 TFLs and 4.5 sacks in 13 starts.
- His performance helped him earn All-ACC Honorable Mention honors.
- Walker earned his degree in sociology in May and became a father over the summer.
- Walker's brother, Rijo, was a four-year letterwinner at UVA and is currently works on the staff with the College Football Playoff as its team operations coordinator.

O-LINE TECH'S VETERAN UNIT

- The most experienced position group for the Hokies is the offensive line who return 51 career starts between Kyle Chung (16), Yosuah Nijman (22) and Braxton Pfaff (13).
- Chung and Pfaff started and played in all 13 games last season while Nijman posted eight starts before an injury ended his season.
- For his senior season, Nijman (6'7", 314) will play at right tackle for the first time in his career.
- Chung, who was granted a sixth year of eligibility during the offseason, moved from right tackle to left guard.
- It won't be Chung's first go-around working inside as he started two games at center vs. Tennessee in the Battle at Bristol and the following game vs. Boston College in 2016.

BLACKSBURG - Virginia Tech quarterback Josh Jackson threw three touchdown passes and the Hokies' defense added two scores to carry the No. 14 Hokies to a 59-7 victory over North Carolina in an ACC game played Saturday at Lane Stadium.

With the win, Tech moved to 6-1 overall, 2-1 in the ACC and beat the Tar Heels for the 11th time in 14 games since joining the ACC. North Carolina (1-7, 0-5 ACC) lost its fifth straight game.

Tech looked rested and focused coming off a bye week and played that way, scoring in all three phases of the game in the first half and bolting out to a 35-0 halftime lead. Tech scored twice on defense, getting the first score of the game on a 12-yard fumble return for a touchdown from defensive tackle Ricky Walker in what served as a foreshadowing of things to come for the Tar Heels.

The Hokies added a 91-yard punt return for a touchdown by Greg Stroman – his second punt return for a score this season – and a 69-yard interception return for a touchdown from defensive back Reggie Floyd.

Jackson threw scoring tosses of 4, 8 and 8 yards, and he finished with 132 yards passing on an afternoon in which he only played a little more than two quarters. The Hokies finished with 383 yards of offense.

North Carolina only ventured into Virginia Tech territory three times, turned the ball over three times, and finished with 172 yards.

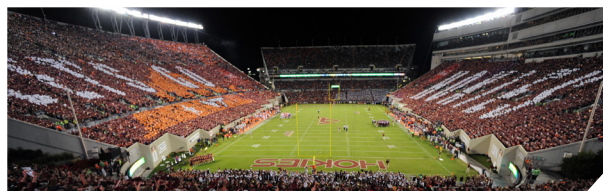

LANE STADIUM - HOME OF THE HOKIES

Rising high into the mountainous sky of the New River Valley, Virginia Tech's Lane Stadium enters its 53rd year of football competition in 2017. The Tech football team has enjoyed over two decades of success, going to 24 straight bowl games and winning 10 or more games eight straight seasons from 2004-11. A big part of that success is the home-field advantage the Hokies enjoy at Lane Stadium/Worsham Field.

Sitting at roughly 2,057 feet above sea level, the stadium is the second-highest among all FBS schools in the eastern United States, trailing only Appalachian State (3,300). Completed in 1965, Lane Stadium/Worsham Field has gone through numerous changes, renovations and additions. But through it all, it has always been regarded as one of the finest places to watch – and toughest places for opponents to play – a college football game.

THE HOKIE STONE

Before each home football game, Virginia Tech football players and coaching staff enter Lane Stadium through a tunnel. On the stadium-side entrance to Worsham Field, they pass beneath a Hokie Stone, which they touch for good luck and is flanked by these words: "For those who have passed. For those to come ... Reach for Excellence."

ENTER SANDMAN

The history behind Virginia Tech's use of Metallica's "Enter Sandman" started during the 2000 season. That summer, Tech added a new scoreboard to Lane Stadium and the athletics marketing team decided to use the song for an entrance video. The group considered "Welcome to the Jungle" by Guns N' Roses and "Sirius" by the Alan Parsons Project before settling on "Enter Sandman." As the song played on one chilly evening prior to the team's entrance, members of the Marching Virginians began to jump up and down in rhythm in an effort to stay warm. The Lane Stadium crowd followed suit and the jumping hasn't stopped since.

Virginia Tech jumped out to a quick lead and never relinquished it, rolling to a 24-3 victory over Florida State at Doak Campbell Stadium on Monday night in an ACC game that marked the season opener for both squads.

With the victory, Virginia Tech, ranked No. 20 in the Associated Press poll, snapped a six-game losing streak to the Seminoles in Tallahassee. Florida State came in ranked No. 19.

The Hokies played a strong first half, taking a 17-3 lead into the locker room. A Josh Jackson touchdown pass to Damon Hazelton and a field goal by Brian Johnson on the Hokies' first two possessions gave them a 10-0 lead.

Tech's special teams made the biggest play of the first half when tight end Chris Cunningham blocked the punt of FSU punter Logan Tyler. Tech's Eric Kumah caught the deflection and ran it three yards into the end zone for a touchdown, which gave the Hokies the 17-3 cushion.

Tech then put the game away late in the fourth quarter when Jackson threw a 49-yard touchdown pass to Kuman with 5:11 remaining.

Jackson threw for 207 yards and two touchdowns. Tech's defense forced five turnovers, recorded four sacks and held Florida State to just 94 yards rushing.

GAME NOTES

- Kumah's blocked punt return for a score marked the Hokies' first since Anthony Shegog returned one for a touchdown in Tech's win at Purdue in 2015.
- Cunningham's blocked punt marked the Hokies' 11th blocked kick under Justin Fuente and the ninth non-offensive touchdown.
- Tech brought 14 true freshmen on the trip and two of them started – left tackle Christian Darrisaw and long snapper Oscar Shadley.

Josh Jackson threw a touchdown pass and ran for a touchdown and Steven Peoples rushed for two touchdowns, as No. 12 Virginia Tech blasted in-state foe William & Mary 62-17 in a non-conference game at Lane Stadium on Saturday in a game that marked the Hokies' home opener.

The Hokies (2-0) showed no hangover coming off their huge win over Florida State on Monday night, scoring on 10 straight possessions during one stretch of the game and never punting. They racked up more than 400 yards offense in the first 30 minutes alone, and not to be outdone, Tech's defense held William & Mary to 100 first-half yards and just three first downs.

Peoples scored on runs of 6 and 4 yards and Jackson scored on an 8-yard run. Jackson, who played the entire first half and one series in the second, completed 12 of 16 for 217 yards and threw a 39-yard touchdown pass to Damon Hazelton.

The Hokies finished with 586 yards of total offense. William & Mary had 266, led by quarterback Shon Mitchell's 208 yards passing.

Hazelton caught four passes for a career-high 107 yards for the Hokies.

Despite Steven Peoples' career-best rushing performance, Virginia Tech struggled for much of the afternoon against in-state foe Old Dominion, and the No. 13 Hokies fell 49-35 to the Monarchs in a nonconference game at Ballard Stadium.

Peoples rushed for 156 yards on 20 carries and scored on runs of 87 yards and 1 yard. Quarterback Josh Jackson threw two touchdown passes.

But the Hokies struggled against ODU's offense, led by backup quarterback Blake LaRussa. The 5-foot-11 LaRussa completed 30 of 49 for 495 yards and threw touchdown passes of 14, 4, 25 and 29 yards. He also rushed for a touchdown on a day in which ODU's offense finished with 632 yards.

The Hokies led 28-21 with 32 seconds left in the third quarter, but ODU scored on its next two possessions, taking a 35-28 lead – its first lead of the game.

Things got worse for Tech, as Jackson went down with a lower leg injury on the first play of the ensuing drive. Backup quarterback Ryan Willis led the Hokies on a 75-yard march that ended with a touchdown pass, tying the game at 35.

But the Hokies simply had no answer for ODU. LaRussa polished off a 75-yard drive with 5:11 left and Jeremy Cox's 40-yard touchdown run sealed the win.

Making his first start as a Hokie, quarterback Ryan Willis threw for 332 yards and three touchdowns to lead Virginia Tech to a 31-14 bounce-back victory over No. 22 Duke in an ACC game played Saturday night at Wallace Wade Stadium.

Playing in place of injured starter Josh Jackson, Willis looked like a veteran, throwing the ball accurately and making good decisions, as the Hokies rebounded from a loss to ODU last Saturday. He completed 17 of 27 in the game.

Willis, who transferred from Kansas in 2017, made a beautiful throw over Damon Hazelton's outside shoulder for a 27-yard touchdown pass on the first play of the second quarter to give the Hokies a 10-7 lead, and Tech never trailed again. The Hokies padded their score on their next possession when tight end Dalton Keene hauled in a short pass from Willis and broke several tackles en route to a 67-yard touchdown. Those two scores in a three-minute span enabled the Hokies to take control of the game.

Duke cut the lead to 24-14 on a 1-yard run by Deon Jackson with 13:47 left in the game, but Willis and the Hokies answered. A 75-yard drive ended with a 10-yard touchdown pass from Willis to Phil Jackson.

Tech finished with 413 yards of offense. The Hokies' defense held Duke to 327 yards and sacked Duke's Daniel Jones three times.

GAME NOTES

- Tech beat a ranked team for the fourth time in Justin Fuente's tenure as the head coach (UNC in 2016, West Virginia in 2017, FSU 2018).
- The 300-yard passing game marked the third of Willis' career. He twice went over 300 yards during his two years at Kansas.
- Hazelton's touchdown reception in the second quarter gave him a touchdown reception in all four games this season.
- After missing the ODU game with injuries, both left tackle Christian Darrisaw and safety Divine Deablo returned to their starting roles.
- Patterson's 10-yard touchdown catch was the first receiving TD of his career.
- Steven Peoples scored on a 6-yard run in the third quarter and now has scored a touchdown in three straight games.

Despite another solid performance from quarterback Ryan Willis and a big game from receiver Damon Hazelton, Virginia Tech struggled to stop Notre Dame's offense in the second half, falling to the No. 6 Irish 45-23 in a non-conference game played Saturday night at Lane Stadium.

The Hokies trailed by just a point at halftime, 17-16, after Willis connected with Hazelton for a 3-yard touchdown with 12 seconds left in the first half. But Notre Dame made several big plays in the second half to pull away.

The Irish scored touchdowns on four of their first five possessions of the second half, including on their first two possessions the third quarter (a 97-yard touchdown run by Dexter Williams and a 40-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Ian Book to Miles Boykin). The latter score gave the Irish a 31-16 lead with 4:59 left in the third quarter.

Notre Dame all but sealed the game early in the fourth quarter when an 11-play, 64-yard drive ended with a 5-yard touchdown pass from Book to Boykin that gave the Irish a 38-16 lead with 9:08 remaining.

Tech cut into that lead when Willis threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to Eric Kumah with 5:40 remaining, but Notre Dame answered with a 31-yard touchdown run by Williams to account for the final margin.

GAME NOTES

- Hazelton recorded his third 100-yard receiving game of the season and now has caught at least one touchdown pass in all five of the Hokies' games this season, tying Isaiah Ford's program record.
- Hazelton's 12 receptions tied a career high. He caught 12 in a game while playing at Ball State before transferring to Tech.
- Willis became the first Tech quarterback since Logan Thomas in 2013 to throw for at least 300 yards in back-to-back games.
- Willis' 52 pass attempts were the most by a Tech quarterback since Michael Brewer threw the ball 56 times in a 28-21 loss to East Carolina in 2014.
