## HOKIES IN THE NATIONAL CHARTS IN SEVERAL CATEGORIES

- Tech, who shoots the deep ball well is among the national leaders in made triples with 53, a mark that is good for 4th most in the country.
- Redshirt-senior Regan Magarity, already the Hokies' all-time leading rebounder has gotten off to a fantastic start in that category in 2018-19. She leads the nation in total rebounds to this point and is first in defensive rebounds per contest (11.0). Magarity has recorded four double-doubles in the Hokies' first five games, bringing her career total to 35, a mark that is also first in program history. She is one of four players in the nation to record four double-doubles to this point in the season.

## THESE DATES IN HISTORY

- On November 24, Tech is 4-6 all-time, last playing on this date last season at the Paradise Jam in Melbourne, Florida. The Hokies lost that game 79-77 to Butler on a 3-pointer in the corner.
- On November 25, Tech is 7-6 all-time, also playing on this date in last season's Paradise Jam, falling to the tournament's champion West Virginia 79-61. The Hokies and Mountaineers would later meet in the Final Four of the WNIT, where the Hokies would win a 64-61 thriller on Taylor Emery's triple in the final seconds.

## RECORD SETTING OPENING NIGHT

- Not only did the Hokies defeat USC Upstate by a 51-point margin, they did so in record setting fashion. JUCO transfer Trinity Baptiste recorded a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds in her Virginia Tech debut. That was the first opening night double-double for a newcomer since 1981, when Fran Pfister had 11 points and 10 rebounds in Tech's 89-58 win over William & Mary.
- Tech also set some watermarks for the Kenny Brooks era, recording 22 assists as a team. It was the most in the program since the Hokies amassed 23 in a 80-44 victory against NC Central in 2014.
- The Hokies' 60-point second half was the most in a single half since Coach Brooks arrived in Blacksburg.

## EMERY ONE OF THE ACC'S BEST

- Senior guard Taylor Emery, fresh off of the most prolific scoring season in program history has been named a preseason All-ACC performer by the league's head coaches.
- Emery was a Second Team selection during the 2017-18 season where she averaged 18.5 points per game and set the Virginia Tech record for points scored in a season with 667.

## HOKIES RECEIVING VOTES

- In the preseason Associated Press Poll, Virginia Tech earned two votes. In the latest poll, Tech has received five votes.

## COACHES PICK TECH 10TH

- Tech was selected in the preseason behind National Champions Notre Dame and regular season league champs, Louisville as well as a plethora of other NCAA teams including; Syracuse, NC State, Miami, Duke and Florida State.
- Last season, the Hokies finished in a tie for ninth, occupying the nine seed during tournament play after a 6-10 regular season.

## A FAMILIAR NAME IN THE ACC

- Tech's freshman point guard Dara Mabrey, comes from a basketball family that includes two sisters who have suited up for Muffet McGraw at Notre Dame.
- Marina is a senior guard for the Irish who helped the squad win the National Championship a season ago.
- The Mabrey sisters will go head to head when the Irish head to Blacksburg for a 7 p.m. tip on Jan. 16 at Cassell Coliseum.

## BASKETBALL RUNS IN THE FAMILY

- Another Brooks has joined Head Coach Kenny on the court in Blacksburg this season with the arrival of freshman guard Chloe.
- The younger sister of junior sharpshooter Kendyl, Chloe was a State Champion in 2016 with Spotswood High.

Kenny Brooks was named the seventh head women's basketball coach at Virginia Tech on March 28, 2016. He enters his third season at the helm of the Hokies' program heading into the 2018-19 season.

Since Brooks' arrival in Blacksburg, the Hokies have enjoyed back-to-back seasons of 20-plus wins and late runs in the month of March, making a WNIT championship game appearance in 2018 after finishing in the quarterfinals of that competition a season earlier.

To begin his tenure, Brooks and the Hokies reeled off 15 straight wins to open the 2016-17 season, Tech's strongest start to a season in 18 years. Behind that strong start, Tech climbed to as high as No. 15 in the AP Poll.

Brooks has ushered in a new era of up-tempo basketball at Virginia Tech, as his Hokies have reset the team scoring record in each of his first two seasons as well as reset the mark for most 3-pointers made.

During his time in Blacksburg, Brooks has recruited and developed second team All-ACC performer Taylor Emery, who set the single season scoring record in 2017-18 at 667 points. She also scored the most field goals in a single campaign with 236.

Brooks' tenure has also seen two players reach the 1,000-point plateau including forward Regan Magarity who became the program's all-time leading rebounder during the WNIT run in 2018.

Brooks joined the Hokies after an impressive 14-season stint as head coach at James Madison University where he compiled a record of 337-122 (.756), making him the winningest coach in that school's history. Brooks guided the Dukes to 11 consecutive postseason appearances, including six NCAA bids and five trips to the WNIT.

Over an 11-year stretch (2005-2016), Brooks' squads never won fewer than 24 games, averaging 26.3 wins per year. The Dukes won three consecutive CAA championships (2014-2016) under Brooks' tutelage and captured a total of five conference titles over a seven season span.

During those final three seasons in Harrisonburg, Brooks and the Dukes compiled an impressive 60-3 record in conference play.

He was named CAA Coach of the Year for a fourth time in 2015-16, while his student-athletes also garnered CAA Player and Rookie of the Year honors.

Brooks registered winning campaigns in 13 of his 14 seasons in Harrisonburg, ascending to No. 23 in the AP Poll and No. 21 in the USA Today Coaches Poll in 2014-15 as his squad tied a school record with 29 victories. In 2013-14, he led the Dukes to their first NCAA Tournament victory since 1991 when his 11th-seeded Dukes knocked off sixth-seeded Gonzaga 72-63 in the first round. In 2007, the Dukes earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament, marking only the second time a CAA team had received an at-large berth.

Under Brooks, JMU tallied six CAA Players of the Year, three Rookies of the Year and two Defensive Players of the Year. The Dukes also recorded 31 All-CAA selections, 11 Defensive team and 10 All-Rookie team selections during his tenure.

The Waynesboro, Virginia, native has coached three WNBA Draft picks; first-rounder Tamera Young, as well as Lauren Okafor and Jazmon Gwathmey, in addition to several other players who have signed professional contracts.

A 1992 graduate of James Madison, Brooks played for three seasons under legendary coach Lefty Driesell and made two NIT appearances while earning a degree in business management. He began his coaching career as a part-time assistant for the 1993-94 JMU men's squad that won the CAA Tournament and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

After four seasons as an assistant for the men's program at VMI (1994-98), he moved back to his alma mater as a men's assistant from 1998-2002. He was named interim women's head coach on Dec. 6, 2002 before taking over those duties on a full-time basis on March 21, 2003.

Brooks and his wife, the former Chrissy Stewart have four children; Kendyl, Chloe, Gabby and Nicholas.

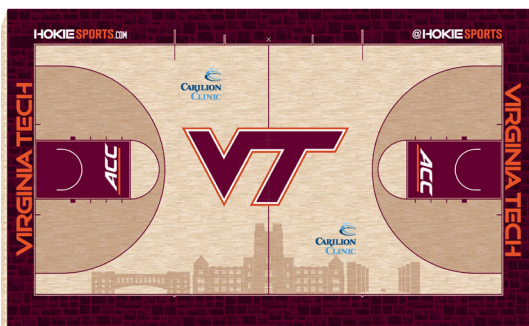

### ENTER SANDMAN

The history behind Virginia Tech's use of Metallica's "Enter Sandman" started during the 2000 season. That summer, Tech added a new scoreboard to Lane Stadium and the athletics marketing team decided to use the song for an entrance video. The group considered "Welcome to the Jungle" by Guns N' Roses and "Sirius" by the Alan Parsons Project before settling on "Enter Sandman." As the song played on one chilly evening prior to the team's entrance, members of the Marching Virginians began to jump up and down in rhythm in an effort to stay warm. The Lane Stadium crowd followed suit and the jumping hasn't stopped since.



### CASSELL COLISEUM, THE HOME OF THE HOKIES

For more than half a century, Cassell Coliseum has provided Virginia Tech with one of the greatest home venues in all of college sports. Winning has been the norm in the facility since its opening in 1961, and Cassell is perhaps even more exciting today than ever in its history.

Cassell serves as the home to Virginia Tech women's basketball, volleyball and wrestling programs, and in 2010-11, the Virginia Tech athletics department celebrated Cassell's 50th anniversary by bringing back many of the former great players and coaches in various sports who have played in the arena. Also, the first men's basketball team ever to play in Cassell was recognized.

Construction for the main portion of Cassell began in 1961, and though not completed, the Tech men's basketball team opened the arena on Jan. 3, 1962, with a 91-67 victory over Alabama. The team played in the building for two years before workers from T.C. Brittain and Company of Decatur, Ga., finished the building in December of 1964 at a cost of \$2.7 million.

For years, the arena was called the Virginia Tech Coliseum. But on September 17, 1977, Virginia Tech officials and friends dedicated the coliseum in honor of the late Stuart K. Cassell, who spearheaded the project. In the late 1950s, Cassell, who was the chief business officer at the time and later became the vice president of the school, saw the need for a new basketball arena to replace the outdated War Memorial Gymnasium, and he eventually managed to get the state legislature to approve the building of the 8,000-seat arena. Cassell, though, found a seat manufacturer that made seats a little smaller than normal seats and squeezed an extra 2,000 seats into the building, bringing the capacity to 10,000.

Since that time, Cassell Coliseum has undergone many renovations and additions to make it the building it is today. The latest addition came in the fall of 2013 when Tech officials hired Panasonic to install two new video scoreboards with high-definition LED displays on each end of the arena. The scoreboards are 18 feet high and 29 feet wide – more than double the size of the previous video scoreboards – and enhance the fan experience. Combined with a new video scoreboard for Lane Stadium, the Hokies' football home, and a new control room, the project cost nearly \$7 million.

Other improvements have been made. Prior to the 2003-04 season, the concourse area was renovated and now features more accessible concession areas, new flooring, video monitors that allow fans to watch the action when not in the arena and the addition of Hokie stone to many of the entrances to the seating area. In 2001-02, the seats were stripped of their original paint and refinished to retain their natural wood look. In 1996-97, workers replaced the roof of the facility and installed structural access to the heating and lighting systems. They also restored and resealed the exterior concrete walls and buttresses.

Through new projects, renovations and maintenance reserve projects, Cassell Coliseum has undergone approximately \$10 million in improvements over the past decade.

The athletics department has taken out some seats to make room for more seating for the handicapped, and also renovations in certain areas forced the need to eliminate some seating. The capacity of the building now sits at nearly 9,275.

Cassell Coliseum today ranks as one of the most difficult places for opposing teams to play and is considered one of the best home environments in all of college sports.

## 2018-19 SEASON TIPS OFF

In year three under Head Coach Kenny Brooks, the Hokies have added junior college transfer forward Trinity Baptiste as well as welcomed in a talented freshman class which includes New Jersey's Gatorade Player of the Year, point guard Dara Mabrey and Shaniya Jones, a guard from High Point, North Carolina.

## BAPTISTE'S BUCKETS

•Forward Trinity Baptiste has made an immediate impact since transferring from Northwest Florida State College. Not only did she record a double-double in her first appearance, the season opener, but she followed that up with another double-double-performance against Georgia Southern.

• She became the first Hokie since 1981 to record a double-double in a season opening debut and is the only player to do so in the first two games as a newcomer.

• Baptiste was the catalyst in game three at Liberty, coming off of the bench and scoring four points and pulling down three boards in the first quarter. She finished the game with 12 points and six rebounds.

## STEADY AS SHE GOES

• Freshman point guard Dara Mabrey has hardly flinched this season. Thrust into starting since the opening tip, Mabrey got her career started with an 18-point performance knocking down four 3-pointers and dishing out five assists.

• Through three games, she has scored in double figures each time and is shooting 53 percent from the field.
