HOKIES, HERD SET TO PLAY 12TH GAME

- In a contest not originally on either team's schedule, circumstances made the 13th all-time meeting between Virginia Tech and Marshall a possibility this Saturday as the Hokies seek a sixth win and bowl eligibility.
- Both teams had contests cancelled on Sept. 15, presenting the opportunity for each squad to play a 12th game on December 1.
- Only 190 miles separate Blacksburg, Virginia from Huntington, W.Va., making this contest very logistically feasible for Marshall and its fans to return to Virginia Tech.
- This week's game will mark the first meeting between the two schools since Tech registered a 29-21 triple-OT thriller at Lane Stadium (9/21/13).
- Saturday's contest will be the first December game at Lane Stadium since a contest vs. Miami (12/1/01).
- The Hokies have won the last eight meetings in the series dating back to 1951. Marshall's two wins against Tech came in 1939 and 1940 in Huntington.
- Tech registered an emotional 34-31 OT win vs. Virginia (11/23) that extended the Hokies' streak of supremacy over the Cavaliers to 15 consecutive victories.
- The victory over UVA also marked the 50th career win for Justin Fuente as an FBS head coach. This week he's seeking his 25th victory at Virginia Tech.
- Marshall is coming off a 28-25 win at FIU (11/24), marking a third consecutive win for the Herd.
- VT head coach Justin Fuente owns a 5-1 record at Lane Stadium against non-conference foes with that lone loss coming at the hands of Notre Dame (10/6).
- Virginia Tech also suffered a tragic loss in the crash of Southern Airways Flight 932 that took the lives of all 75 souls on board on Nov. 14, 1970. An All-America safety and exceptional punt returner for Tech, Frank Loria was a member of the 1970 Marshall coaching staff. His No. 10 was retired by Tech prior to the 1971 season and he was inducted in the College Football Hall of Fame in 1999.

KEY SCORING STATS ON TECH, MARSHALL

- The Hokies have won 23 straight contests when holding foes to 21 points or fewer dating back to 2015.
- Marshall has never scored more than 21 points against the Hokies in the 12 previous games in the series.
- In the five post-2000 meetings between the two squads, Tech owns a 199-76 scoring edge, good for an average score of 39.8-15.2.
- Virginia Tech is 21-1 under Fuente when leading at halftime, including a 4-1 mark in 2018.
- Since 1996, Tech is 46-0 when holding non-conference foes to 17 points or fewer at Lane Stadium.
- Marshall owns a 4-17 record under head coach Doc Holliday when scoring 17 points or fewer.

WHAT TO WATCH ON QB RYAN WILLIS

- Tech QB Ryan Willis has started Tech's last eight contests in 2018, completing 57.4 percent of his passes with 17 TDs and only eight INTs with a 130.9 rating.
- Willis is the Hokies' second-leading rusher on the season with 336 yards and three TDs.
- He ranks fifth in the ACC in passing ypg (218.5) and total offense (252.1 ypg), while ranking seventh in pass efficiency (130.9).

TIDBITS FROM THE TURNOVER TABLE

- Virginia Tech is +2 (16 takes/14 gives) on the season.
 - Tech is +8 (13 takes/5 gives) in its five losses and are -6 (3 takes/9 gives) in their six losses in 2018.
 - Marshall is +1 on the season (23 takes/22 gives), owning a +7 mark (19 takes/12 gives) in eight wins and going -6 (4 takes/10 gives) in their three losses.
- ### MORE NUGGETS ON HOKIES, HERD
- Tech has won seven straight games against squads hailing from the state of West Virginia. VT's last such win was a 31-24 victory at FedExField vs. West Virginia (9/3/17). The Hokies also won games against WVU in 2004 and 2005. VT defeated Marshall in 2013, 2011, 2009 and 2005.
 - Marshall is no stranger to playing current Power Five foes. In addition to Virginia Tech, the Herd has faced other P5 foes such as West Virginia, Ohio State, Pitt and NC State under Doc Holliday.
 - In Holliday's second season as head coach, the Herd registered a 17-13 win at Louisville (10/1/11) against a Cardinals squad that was led by QB Teddy Bridgewater.

MORE SCORING TIDBITS ON TECH, MARSHALL

- Dating back to 2000, Virginia Tech is 32-0 at Lane Stadium when scoring 30+ points vs. non-conference foes.
- Tech's 34 points vs. UVA (11/23) marked the club's first 30-point outing since a 31-14 win at Duke (9/29).
- Marshall has lost 13 straight games when allowing 30+ points dating back to a 49-28 loss at Western Kentucky (11/27/15).
- The Herd has been outscored by an average margin of 32.3 to 22.7 in its three losses in 2018.
- Marshall is 50-10 under Doc Holliday when scoring 30+ points, including seven straight wins and an 11-1 mark dating back to 2016.
- Marshall has outscored its opponents by an average margin of 30.1 to 15.8 in its eight wins in 2018.

ACC RANKINGS FOR THE LPD

- Tech ranks second in the ACC in Red Zone defense (77.1%), allowing 19 TDs and eight FGs on 35 opponent possessions.
- Tech has forced an ACC-high five Red Zone turnovers. The LPD ranks fourth in the ACC in pass defense (193.1 ypg).
- VT is fifth in the ACC, allowing 20.2 first downs per game.

ACC RANKINGS FOR THE TECH OFFENSE

- Tech ranks fifth in the ACC in passing offense (251.7 ypg) and sixth in the ACC in total offense (424.5 ypg).

RUSHING NUMBERS OF NOTE ON VT, MARSHALL

- Senior RB Steven Peoples is Tech's leading rusher with 135 carries for 682 yards (5.2 avg.) and a team-high five TDs. Peoples registered 96 yards vs. UVA (11/23).
 - Virginia Tech has limited its foes to 119.6 net rushing ypg in its five wins, holding three of those opponents to under 100 team net rushing yards and allowing only three rushing TDs.
 - Tech's 254 net rushing yards vs. UVA (11/23) were the squad's third-highest total of the season. The Hokies owned a 90-yard rushing edge against UVA (164 gained).
 - In its five losses Tech has allowed 274.7 net rushing ypg and 24 rushing TDs.
 - Marshall ranks sixth in the nation in rushing defense (100.5 ypg). Last week at FIU (11/24), the Herd allowed a season-high 190 net rushing yards, marking the first time this season they had permitted over 150 net rushing yards.
- ### HAZELTON LEADS ACC WITH EIGHT TD CATCHES
- WR Damon Hazelton is tied for the ACC lead with eight TD receptions. He ranks sixth in the conference, averaging 67.7 receiving ypg. He's eighth in the ACC, averaging 4.1 catches per game.
 - Hazelton's eight TD catches are tied with WR Ricky Hall (8 in 1998) for the most-ever by a first-year Tech player.
 - He owns three 100-yard receiving games for VT in 2018.

VT SEEKS A COMPLETE GAME AGAINST MARSHALL

- Virginia Tech has outscored its foes by a 39-point margin in the first half (179-140) this season, but has been outscored by a 71-point margin in the second half and OT (208-137).
- The Hokies have outscored their foes in the second half and OT of their five wins by a 80-58 scoring edge.
- Tech owned a 14-0 halftime lead last week vs. UVA (11/23).
- In Tech's last four losses, the Hokies have been outscored 94-36 in the second half of those games.
- The second quarter has been Tech's most productive scoring period in 2018 with 104 points.
- Marshall is 6-0 in 2018 when leading after the first quarter in 2018. MU has won 17 consecutive games when scoring first.

VIRGINIA TECH VS. MARSHALL: INSIDE THE SERIES

- Saturday's game will mark the 13th football meeting between Virginia Tech and Marshall University.
- Tech holds a 10-2 edge in the series, which began in 1913.
- Tech won the first two games of the series in Blacksburg during the 1913 and 1914 seasons. The Hokies traveled to Huntington, W.Va., in 1939 and 1940 to take on the Thundering Herd and lost both contests.
- From 1951-53, the two schools met in nightgames at Bluefield, W.Va., with the Hokies winning each game by seven points or less. The last of those meetings was a 7-0 Tech win in 1953.
- Head coach Justin Fuente is 0-1 in his career vs. Marshall after falling to the Herd in his initial season at Memphis, 38-28 (11/3/12).
- In regular season December contests, the Hokies are 1-4 all-time.
- Saturday's game will only be the second game ever played in Lane Stadium in December following a 26-24 loss to Miami on Dec. 1, 2001.

VIRGINIA TECH-MARSHALL CONNECTIONS

- Two Hokies - **Frank Loria** and **Rick Tolley** - were on the Marshall staff that was part of the Southern Airways Flight 932 that crashed on Nov. 14, 1970 as the team was returning from East Carolina.
- Loria played for the Hokies from 1965-1967, helping lead Tech to a berth in the 1966 Liberty Bowl. He joined the Marshall University coaching staff in 1969 as the defensive backs coach.
- Loria played safety in the same defensive backfield with former Tech head coach Frank Beamer. Tolley played football as a center and linebacker at Tech from 1958-61 and was the head coach of the Marshall football team during the 1969 and 1970 seasons.
- Marshall's defensive ends coach **Cornell Brown** was a defensive lineman for Virginia Tech from 1993-96 and is often regarded as one of the most important players in program history.
- A native of Lynchburg, his commitment to Frank Beamer in the early 1990s marked the beginning of the Hokies' run as one of the best and most consistent programs in college football.
- Brown's freshman season in 1993 kicked off the Hokies' streak of 25 consecutive bowl games and he earned consensus first-team All-America honors as a junior while helping lead Tech to a win over Texas in the 1995 Sugar Bowl.
- Brown's No. 58 jersey was retired by Virginia Tech in 2002.
- Marshall's defensive tackles coach **J.C. Price** was also a defensive lineman for Virginia Tech, helping the Hokies win a Big East title in 1995 while earning first-team All-Big East and third team All-America honors.
- He was a third round selection by the Carolina Panthers in the 1996 NFL Draft. Price earned bachelor's degrees in interdisciplinary studies (1998) and health and education (2002) from Tech.

2016 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

- The consensus 2016 ACC Coach of the Year, Fuente was also named the top first-year FBS head coach in the nation by the Football Writers Association of America, sharing that honor with USC's Clay Helton.
- Tech finished the 2016 season ranked No. 16 in both the AP Poll and the Coaches Poll, marking the highest final mark for the Hokies since 2010 (No. 16 AP, No. 15 Coaches).
- Virginia Tech, Penn State, Colorado, West Virginia and Western Michigan all finished in the AP Top 25 after getting zero votes in the AP Preseason Poll.
- Tech's 10 wins were the team's most since 2011 and the most ever by a first-year Virginia Tech head coach, surpassing the previous mark of nine wins by C.P. Miles in 1905.

- Named Virginia Tech's head coach on Nov. 29, 2015 after orchestrating one of the more dramatic program resurrections in recent college football history at Memphis.
- The Hokies are in their third season under Fuente in 2018, who has compiled a 24-14 record in Blacksburg, the most wins by any Tech coach in his first two campaigns.
- Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson is the only other active ACC head coach who can boast as many victories in his first two seasons at a conference school than Fuente (19).
- With 19 wins in his first two seasons at Tech, Fuente owns more victories than every Tech coach has accumulated in his first three seasons with the exception of B.C. Cabbage, who guided the program to 21 victories from 1921-23.
- The Hokies have finished back-to-back seasons in the final AP Poll for the first time since 2010-11. The Hokies will be seeking to conclude three straight seasons in the AP Top 25 for the first time since doing it eight consecutive years under Frank Beamer (2004-11).
- Fuente is one of only six FBS head coaches to register nine or more wins each of the past four seasons.
- Tech concluded the 2017 season with a 9-4 mark, finishing the year No. 24 in the AP Top 25 and No. 25 in the Amway USA Today Coaches Poll.

- Tech extended its streak of consecutive bowl appearances to 25 straight seasons in 2017 under Fuente, the longest active streak recognized by the NCAA. Should Tech earn its 26th straight bowl berth in 2018, that mark that would give VT sole possession of the third-longest streak in NCAA history.
- The Hokies have won 14 consecutive Commonwealth Cup games over Virginia, including both matchups under Fuente.
- Tech has won 19 consecutive games during Fuente's tenure when leading at halftime.
- VT owns a 7-2 mark under Fuente in games immediately following a loss.
- Fuente's well-deserved reputation for his work with quarterbacks became apparent once again in 2017 as QB Josh Jackson orchestrated the most prolific season of any freshman in Tech history.
- Jackson's 2,991 passing yards were a VT freshman record and the most of any FBS freshman in 2017, while his 20 TDs and 135.2 rating were second among FBS

freshmen behind Georgia QB Jake Fromm (24 TDs, 160.1 ranking).

- Tech's traditionally stout Lunch Pail Defense also lived up to its reputation in 2017, pitching three shutouts.
- The #LPD finished the 2017 season fourth in the FBS in scoring defense (14.8 ppg) and posted an FBS-best three shutouts, while only Michigan (26.1%) held foes to a lower third-down conversion rate than VT (25.2).
- Virginia Tech continued its special teams success under Fuente as the Hokies tied for second in the FBS with six blocked kicks, finished second with 413 punt return yards and the led the nation in fewest return yards allowed with 335.
- In total, the Hokies registered five return scores in 2017 (two punt return TDs, two INT return TDs and one fumble return TD).

* Foster, who became the Hokies' co-defensive coordinator in 1995, is also the nation's longest-tenured DC.



The famed Virginia Tech Lunch Pail has come to symbolize the blue-collar approach of the Hokies' defense under longtime defensive coordinate Bud Foster.

- In 1995, Foster served as co-defensive coordinator with Rod Sharpless, whose mother-in-law found the original Lunch Pail in Mercerville, New Jersey. The pail once belonged to a coal miner and after a record-setting defensive season, the Lunch Pail became an iconic part of Hokies' lore.
- The Pail travels wherever the Hokies go and its care is only entrusted to a defensive leader.
- Before the start of every season, a signed mission statement from the defense is placed in The Pail. Then every week, unit goals, team goals and keys to success are placed in The Pail, plus the turf from any road victories.
- Since 2007, The Pail has also contained the names of the 32 fallen Hokies taken in the April 16 tragedy.
- Darryl Tapp is the only player who has ever earned lifetime possession of an incarnation of The Pail from Foster.

- Even though the namesake is no longer the big whistle in Blacksburg, Virginia Tech's BeamerBall philosophy has not waned under third-year head coach Justin Fuente.
- There have been 150 non-offensive touchdowns and 145 blocked kicks by Virginia Tech since Frank Beamer's first season as head coach in 1987.
- Under Fuente, the Hokies have scored 10 non-offensive touchdowns – three punt return touchdowns, two fumble return touchdowns, two interception return touchdowns, two blocked punt return touchdowns and one blocked field goal return touchdown.
- Since Fuente's hiring, the Hokies are tied for eighth in Power Five with seven combined punt return, interception return and fumble return touchdowns.
- The Hokies have blocked more kicks over the last three seasons under Fuente (11) than the previous five seasons combined (9).

BEAMER NAMED TO COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

- Former Virginia Tech head coach Frank Beamer was named College Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2018 in his initial year of eligibility.
- The induction is set for Dec. 4 in New York City.
- The winningest coach in Virginia Tech history, Beamer's 280 victories rank sixth overall in FBS history and are the 13th most by a college football coach at any NCAA division.
- He led the Hokies to their first ever national title game appearance as part of an impressive streak of 23 consecutive bowl berths in his final 23 seasons.
- Under Beamer, the Hokies posted five top-10 finishes and became one of only six programs in college football history to go to a bowl game in at least 20-straight seasons.
- A five-time conference Coach of the Year, Beamer won three BIG EAST titles and added four ACC titles in five conference championship game appearances.
- A monument of Beamer was unveiled at Moody Plaza prior to the Notre Dame game on Oct. 6. The naming of the Beamer-Lawson Indoor Practice Facility was also approved on Oct. 6.

- Head coach Justin Fuente and the Hokies pay homage to Frank Beamer and Virginia Tech's legacy of excellence on special teams by selecting a special teams player of the week who will wear No. 25.
- With Coach Beamer's blessing, his retired No. 25 was worn by a player who exemplified the role special teams played during Virginia Tech's rise to national prominence.

"BIG PLAY" TRE SHINES VS. UVA

- While freshman WR Tre Turner has turned into a key target when the Hokies need a "money play", a play resulting in a first down or a touchdown, he also got his first taste of BeamerBall against Virginia.
- After making an acrobatic, one-handed touchdown catch in the first quarter, Turner blocked his first career punt on the next UVA possession that was recovered in the end zone for a touchdown.
- Along with the blocked kick, Turner racked up 112 yards of offense (43 rushing, 69 receiving).
- Of Turner's 22 career receptions, 14 have gone for a first down and three have been touchdowns.
- Turner's first eight catches of his career went for first downs.
- His 18.0 yards per reception ranks fourth among FBS true freshmen:

HAZELTON MAKING AN IMPACT

- Ball State transfer Damon Hazelton has lived up to the hype in 2018
- His eight TD catches are tied for the most in the ACC and his 67.7 receiving yards per game ranks sixth in the conference.
- His eight receiving touchdowns are tied for sixth on Virginia Tech's single season TD chart.
- He has three 100-yard receiving games, tied for the second most in the conference.
- Hazelton put up 100-yard receiving games in back-to-back weeks (vs. W&M, at ODU) and scored a touchdown in his first five games as a Hokie.
- Against Notre Dame (10/6), Hazelton tied WR Isaiah Ford's program record of five consecutive games with a receiving TD (list below).
- He registered his first 100-yard receiving game as a Hokie vs. William & Mary (9/8) and

his first catch in a VT uniform was a 10-yard TD catch vs. Florida State (9/3).

- The Baltimore native racked up 51 catches for 505 yards in 11 games for Ball State as a true freshman.
- He transferred from Ball State and was recommended to Tech wide receivers coach Holmon Wiggins by Texas A&M wide receivers coach Aaron Moorehead, who coached wide receivers for the Hokies from 2013-14.
- He sat out last season due to NCAA transfer rules, redshirted, and made friends with New York Giants wide receiver Odell Beckham, Jr. while working out with trainer Jamal Liggins.
- Hazelton is also on verge of setting Virginia Tech's single season for receiving TDs by a first year player

11 PLAYERS MAKE FIRST STARTS FOR THE #LPD IN 2018

- Virginia Tech's defense has had 11 different players make their first career start this season, the most in the FBS.
- With only three starters back on defense, it's been a while since defensive coordinator Bud Foster has had a defensive unit this inexperienced when looking at career starts.
- The Hokies' 55 career returning starts are the fewest since the 2000 squad brought back 42 starts.
- Foster's fewest defensive starters since becoming defensive coordinator in 1996 was three following the National Championship game season in 1999.

WILLIS ALREADY SETTING RECORDS

- Redshirt junior Ryan Willis is already etching his name in the Virginia Tech record book through his first three starts as a Hokie.
- Willis is the first Tech QB since Logan Thomas in 2013 to throw for more than 300 yards in back-to-back games.

- He's also the first Hokie signal caller to throw for 300+ yards in his first two starts.
- In his first start since Nov. 11 2016 at Baylor as a Kansas Jayhawk, Willis threw for 332 yards on 17 of 27 passing with a career high three touchdown passes in Virginia Tech's 31-14 win at No. 22 Duke (9/29).
- Willis' 332 passing yards were the most for a QB making his first start at Virginia Tech.
- The win marked Willis' first career win as a starter and his third career 300-yard passing game.
- Willis was only the second Virginia Tech quarterback to make his first two starts with the Hokies against ranked teams; joining Bryan Randall in 2002 vs. No. 14 LSU and No. 16 Marshall.

HOKIES HAVE NFL BLOODLINES

▪ Virginia Tech has multiple players on its roster this season that grew up in NFL households:

C Kyle Chung: father, Eugene, was an All-American offensive lineman at Virginia Tech and a first round pick of the New England Patriots. He's currently on the Philadelphia Eagles' coaching staff.

DL Robert Porcher: father, Robert, was a first round pick of the Detroit Lions where he was a three-time Pro Bowler. He finished his career with 95.5 sacks in 12 seasons.

RB Terius Wheatley: father, Tyrone, was a three-time first-team All-Big Ten selection at Michigan, a first round pick of the New York Giants and went on to play 10 seasons in the NFL.

LB Keshon Artis: family cousin, Kenny Easley, was the fourth overall pick taken in 1981 by Seattle where he went to five Pro Bowls and had his No. 45 retired. He was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2017.

HOKIES STOP ANOTHER STREAK

- In its history, Virginia Tech has been known to stop some of their ranked opponents' significant streaks.
- This season, the Hokies halted yet another streak:

Significant Streaks Stopped by the Hokies

Texas (12/31/95): 28-10 win in the 1995 Sugar Bowl snapped a nine-game win streak.

Texas A&M (9/21/02): 13-3 win broke the Aggies' 29-game non-conference win streak.

Miami (11/1/03): 31-7 victory snapped their 39-game regular season win streak.

Ohio State (9/6/14): 35-21 upset in broke its 25-game regular season win streak.

North Carolina (10/8/16): 34-3 drubbing over the Tar Heels broke their nine-game home win streak.

Duke (9/29/18): 31-14 win broke the Blue Devils' seven-game win streak dating back to 2017.

GAME-WINNING DRIVE LIFTS VT

▪ The Hokies' 18 play, 98-yard game-winning touchdown drive at North Carolina (10/13) is tied for the fourth-longest drive in program history and stands as the longest game-winning drive in program history.

▪ North Carolina was ready to put the game away, driving to the Tech one-yard line midway through the fourth quarter. But then Tyree Rodgers forced a fumble from UNC tailback Michael Carter that Jovonn Quillen recovered at the Tech 2 with 6:13 remaining in the game.

▪ The drive took 18 plays, tied for the third most in a TD drive in Tech history, in 5:54 that ended with a one-yard TD grab by TE Dalton Keene.

FARLEY FIGHTS THROUGH ADVERSITY

- It's been a long and tumultuous road for redshirt freshman DB Caleb Farley, who has two interceptions in three starts at cornerback for Virginia Tech.
- After racking up 78 yards of total offense (61 receiving yards, 17 rushing yards) in the 2017 spring game, Farley tore his ACL on the first day of fall camp that kept him out the remainder of the season.
- Off the field, Farley dealt with another major blow personally in January 2018 when his mother succumbed to nearly a decade-long battle with cancer.
- Farley, who cornerbacks coach Brian Mitchell called a "borrowed wide receiver", moved from wideout to cornerback in the spring and is listed as a second-string corner and is expected to return punts and kicks.

ECU VS. VT: THE GAME THAT WASN'T

- The Hokies' week three contest vs. East Carolina was the first canceled game for Virginia Tech since its season opener vs. Georgia Tech in 2000.
- Tech went on to go 11-1 that season with a victory over Clemson in the 2001 Gator Bowl.
- Ironically enough, the Hokies' week three opponent that season was also East Carolina.

LPD LEADS TECH IN WIN AT FSU

- Virginia Tech's dominating 24-3 victory at Florida State was the Hokies' first win in Tallahassee since Nov. 16, 1974.
- The Hokies improved to 100-1 under Bud Foster at defensive coordinator when they hold opponents to 10 points or fewer.
- It was only the fifth time since 1996 under Foster and the third time on the road that the Hokies held a ranked opponent to three points or less.
- It marked the first time in program history that Virginia Tech opened with ranked opponents in back-to-back seasons and won both games after dropping its previous 10 matchups.
- The Hokies held the Seminoles to their lowest point total at home since 2008 when FSU also put up three points against Wake Forest.
- Justin Fuente moved to 4-0 all-time against Willie Taggart as a head coach.

KUMAH BREAKS OUT VS. FSU

▪ Junior WR Eric Kumah registered his first career multi-touchdown game in unique fashion at Florida State by becoming only the third Hokie since 1987 to have a return and receiving score in the same game.

THE BELL COW LEADS THE LPD

- With all of the talent on last year's Lunch Pail Defense that finished fourth in the nation in scoring defense and featured seven players currently on NFL rosters, defensive coordinator Bud Foster still called senior defensive tackle Ricky Walker the "Bell Cow" of his unit.
- Walker and former Tech great Greg Stroman are the only two players to wear Frank Beamer's No. 25 jersey three times.
- After playing in 11 games as a true freshman, Walker took a redshirt year and came in 2016 as a redshirt sophomore where he racked up 28 tackles, 6.5 TFLs and four pass breakups.
- Last year was a career year for Walker who posted 41 tackles, 12.5 TFLs and 4.5 sacks in 13 starts.
- His performance helped him earn All-ACC Honorable Mention honors.
- Walker earned his degree in sociology in May and became a father over the summer.
- Walker's brother, Rijo, was a four-year letterwinner at UVA and is currently works on the staff with the College Football Playoff as its team operations coordinator.

HOKIES MAKE HISTORY AT 2018 DRAFT

- The 2018 NFL Draft was a historic one for the Hokies as the program saw Terrell and Tremaine Edmunds become the 12th and 13th first round draft picks in school history.
- The Edmunds brothers were the first set of brothers to be drafted in the first round of the draft.
- Virginia Tech had two players picked in the first for only the second time in program history and the first time since 2004.
- Tech's five draft picks overall were its most selections since five Hokies came off the board in 2010.
- When including Adonis Alexander's selection by Washington in the NFL's Supplemental Draft, the Hokies had six draftees, their most since 2008 (8).

Virginia Tech became just the 15th school in NCAA FBS history to reach the 700-win plateau with a three-overtime, 29-21, victory over Marshall University. Quarterback Logan Thomas rushed for a touchdown and a two-point conversion during the third overtime period to give Tech the come-from-behind win in a rain-drenched game at Lane Stadium.

Thomas had staked the Hokies to a 14-7 first quarter lead with a 2-yard TD plunge, only to see the Thundering Herd post a 14-point second quarter for a 21-14 advantage that lasted deep into the fourth quarter. The senior quarterback finally pulled Tech even with a 14-play, 83-yard scoring drive that was capped by a 2-yard, fourth down touch-down pass to Willie Byrn with 3:09 to go.

The Hokies' defense came up big in overtime, blocking a field goal in the first OT, then forcing and recovering a fumble in the second. Tech missed field goals in each of the first two extra periods, before Thomas found the end zone. Marshall moved to the 14 on its last possession before missing on three consecutive passes.

The two teams combined for 174 plays, 743 yards of offense and 45 first downs. Tech redshirt freshman tailback Trey Edmunds posted his second career 100-yard rushing game with 110 yards on 22 carries. Meanwhile, Byrn, who made his first career start, grabbed his first collegiate touchdown pass.

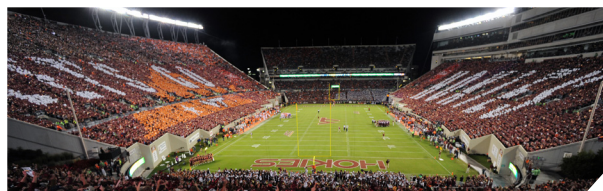

LANE STADIUM - HOME OF THE HOKIES

Rising high into the mountainous sky of the New River Valley, Virginia Tech's Lane Stadium enters its 53rd year of football competition in 2017. The Tech football team has enjoyed over two decades of success, going to 24 straight bowl games and winning 10 or more games eight straight seasons from 2004-11. A big part of that success is the home-field advantage the Hokies enjoy at Lane Stadium/Worsham Field.

Sitting at roughly 2,057 feet above sea level, the stadium is the second-highest among all FBS schools in the eastern United States, trailing only Appalachian State (3,300). Completed in 1965, Lane Stadium/Worsham Field has gone through numerous changes, renovations and additions. But through it all, it has always been regarded as one of the finest places to watch – and toughest places for opponents to play – a college football game.

THE HOKIE STONE

Before each home football game, Virginia Tech football players and coaching staff enter Lane Stadium through a tunnel. On the stadium-side entrance to Worsham Field, they pass beneath a Hokie Stone, which they touch for good luck and is flanked by these words: "For those who have passed. For those to come ... Reach for Excellence."

ENTER SANDMAN

The history behind Virginia Tech's use of Metallica's "Enter Sandman" started during the 2000 season. That summer, Tech added a new scoreboard to Lane Stadium and the athletics marketing team decided to use the song for an entrance video. The group considered "Welcome to the Jungle" by Guns N' Roses and "Sirius" by the Alan Parsons Project before settling on "Enter Sandman." As the song played on one chilly evening prior to the team's entrance, members of the Marching Virginians began to jump up and down in rhythm in an effort to stay warm. The Lane Stadium crowd followed suit and the jumping hasn't stopped since.

Virginia Tech jumped out to a quick lead and never relinquished it, rolling to a 24-3 victory over Florida State at Doak Campbell Stadium on Monday night in an ACC game that marked the season opener for both squads.

With the victory, Virginia Tech, ranked No. 20 in the Associated Press poll, snapped a six-game losing streak to the Seminoles in Tallahassee. Florida State came in ranked No. 19.

The Hokies played a strong first half, taking a 17-3 lead into the locker room. A Josh Jackson touchdown pass to Damon Hazelton and a field goal by Brian Johnson on the Hokies' first two possessions gave them a 10-0 lead.

Tech's special teams made the biggest play of the first half when tight end Chris Cunningham blocked the punt of FSU punter Logan Tyler. Tech's Eric Kumah caught the deflection and ran it three yards into the end zone for a touchdown, which gave the Hokies the 17-3 cushion.

Tech then put the game away late in the fourth quarter when Jackson threw a 49-yard touchdown pass to Kuman with 5:11 remaining.

Jackson threw for 207 yards and two touchdowns. Tech's defense forced five turnovers, recorded four sacks and held Florida State to just 94 yards rushing.

GAME NOTES

- Kumah's blocked punt return for a score marked the Hokies' first since Anthony Shegog returned one for a touchdown in Tech's win at Purdue in 2015.
- Cunningham's blocked punt marked the Hokies' 11th blocked kick under Justin Fuente and the ninth non-offensive touchdown.
- Tech brought 14 true freshmen on the trip and two of them started – left tackle Christian Darrisaw and long snapper Oscar Shadley.

Josh Jackson threw a touchdown pass and ran for a touchdown and Steven Peoples rushed for two touchdowns, as No. 12 Virginia Tech blasted in-state foe William & Mary 62-17 in a non-conference game at Lane Stadium on Saturday in a game that marked the Hokies' home opener.

The Hokies (2-0) showed no hangover coming off their huge win over Florida State on Monday night, scoring on 10 straight possessions during one stretch of the game and never punting. The Hokies finished with 586 yards of total offense. William & Mary had 266, led by quarterback Shon Mitchell's 208 yards passing.

Hazelton caught four passes for a career-high 107 yards for the Hokies.

Despite Steven Peoples' career-best rushing performance, Virginia Tech struggled for much of the afternoon against in-state foe Old Dominion, and the No. 13 Hokies fell 49-35 to the Monarchs in a nonconference game at Ballard Stadium.

Peoples rushed for 156 yards on 20 carries and scored on runs of 87 yards and 1 yard. Quarterback Josh Jackson threw two touchdown passes.

But the Hokies struggled against ODU's offense, led by backup quarterback Blake LaRussa. The 5-foot-11 LaRussa completed 30 of 49 for 495 yards and threw touchdown passes of 14, 4, 25 and 29 yards. He also rushed for a touchdown on a day in which ODU's offense finished with 632 yards.

The Hokies led 28-21 with 32 seconds left in the third quarter, but ODU scored on its next two possessions, taking a 35-28 lead – its first lead of the game.

Things got worse for Tech, as Jackson went down with a lower leg injury on the first play of the ensuing drive. Backup quarterback Ryan Willis led the Hokies on a 75-yard march that ended with a touchdown pass, tying the game at 35.

But the Hokies simply had no answer for ODU. LaRussa polished off a 75-yard drive with 5:11 left and Jeremy Cox's 40-yard touchdown run sealed the win.

Making his first start as a Hokie, quarterback Ryan Willis threw for 332 yards and three touchdowns to lead Virginia Tech to a 31-14 bounce-back victory over No. 22 Duke in an ACC game played Saturday night at Wallace Wade Stadium.

Playing in place of injured starter Josh Jackson, Willis looked like a veteran, throwing the ball accurately and making good decisions, as the Hokies rebounded from a loss to ODU last Saturday. He completed 17 of 27 in the game.

Willis, who transferred from Kansas in 2017, made a beautiful throw over Damon Hazelton's outside shoulder for a 27-yard touchdown pass on the first play of the second quarter to give the Hokies a 10-7 lead, and Tech never trailed again. The Hokies padded their score on their next possession when tight end Dalton Keene hauled in a short pass from Willis and broke several tackles en route to a 67-yard touchdown. Those two scores in a three-minute span enabled the Hokies to take control of the game.

Duke cut the lead to 24-14 on a 1-yard run by Deon Jackson with 13:47 left in the game, but Willis and the Hokies answered. A 75-yard drive ended with a 10-yard touchdown pass from Willis to Phil Jackson.

Despite another solid performance from quarterback Ryan Willis and a big game from receiver Damon Hazelton, Virginia Tech struggled to stop Notre Dame's offense in the second half, falling to the No. 6 Irish 45-23 in a non-conference game played Saturday night at Lane Stadium.

The Hokies trailed by just a point at halftime, 17-16, after Willis connected with Hazelton for a 3-yard touchdown with 12 seconds left in the first half. But Notre Dame made several big plays in the second half to pull away.

The Irish scored touchdowns on four of their first five possessions of the second half, including on their first two possessions the third quarter (a 97-yard touchdown run by Dexter Williams and a 40-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Ian Book to Miles Boykin). The latter score gave the Irish a 31-16 lead with 4:59 left in the third quarter.

Notre Dame all but sealed the game early in the fourth quarter when an 11-play, 64-yard drive ended with a 5-yard touchdown pass from Book to Boykin that gave the Irish a 38-16 lead with 9:08 remaining.

Tech cut into that lead when Willis threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to Eric Kuman with 5:40 remaining, but Notre Dame answered with a 31-yard touchdown run by Williams to account for the final margin.

Despite leading at halftime, Virginia Tech saw No. 24 Boston College score 21 unanswered points in the second half and pull away for a 31-21 victory over the Hokies in an ACC game played Saturday at Lane Stadium.

The Hokies trailed 7-0 after BC tailback AJ Dillon scored on a 3-yard run in the first quarter, but Tech answered, scoring on a 26-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Ryan Willis to Damon Hazleton on the ensuing possession to tie the game at 7. Then the Hokies took a 14-7 lead early in the second quarter when Willis connected with Eric Kumah for a 4-yard touchdown.

BC, though, dominated most of the second half, scoring 21 unanswered points to take a 28-14 lead. The Hokies cut into the lead on a Willis touchdown pass to Tre Turner with 4:58 remaining, but the Eagles answered with a field goal with 2:31 remaining to seal the game.

Willis led the Hokies' offense, completing 25 of 42 for 281 yards, with three touchdowns and an interception. He also rushed for 49 yards.

BC finished with 396 yards of offense, including 219 on the ground. Dillon led the way with 96 yards on the ground.

GAME NOTES

- Willis' three touchdown passes give him 13 on the season. He's thrown just four interceptions – none in the past two games.
- Hazleton finished with two receptions for 40 yards and a touchdown. Hazleton's touchdown reception was his seventh of the season, moving him to within four of Isaiah Ford's single-season school record of 11 set in 2015.
- Rico Kearney and Dax Hollifield received the starts because of injuries to linebackers Rayshard Ashby and Dylan Rivers. Both Kearney and Hollifield made their first career starts.
- Also, Tyree Rodgers received the start in place of Khalil Ladler, who had to sit out the first half after being called for targeting in the Georgia Tech game. The start marked the second of Rodgers' career – he also started in the Notre Dame game.

Virginia Tech fell behind early and couldn't get back in the game, falling 52-22 to Pitt in an ACC game played Saturday night at Heinz Field.

Pitt jumped out to a 17-0 lead and never looked back. The Panthers got an early field goal from Alex Kessman and then used a 53-yard run from Darrin Hall to set up an 8-yard touchdown run by Quadree Ellison toward the end of the first quarter. A 78-yard touchdown pass from Kenny Pickett to Maurice Ffrench early in the second quarter gave the Panthers the 17-point advantage.

The Hokies got on the board when quarterback Ryan Willis threw a 29-yard touchdown pass to receiver Eric Kumah. The play capped an 80-yard drive and cut the Panthers' lead to 17-7.

But Pitt scored touchdowns on its final two possessions to end the first half and ultimately pulled away.

Willis threw two more touchdown passes in the second half. He completed 22 of 34 for 231 yards, with three touchdown passes, and he also rushed for 65 yards. The Hokies amassed 432 yards of offense, while Pitt finished with 654 yards of offense.

GAME NOTES

- Willis' three touchdown passes give him 16 on the season against just four interceptions. He has thrown at least two touchdown passes in all six of his starts since entering the starting lineup for injured starter Josh Jackson.
- Kumah's touchdown receptions were his fourth and fifth of the season. He now has seven in his career. His six receptions tied a career high, and his 80 yards receiving were the third-most in his career.
- Damon Hazelton hauled in a 24-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter and now has at least one touchdown reception in eight of nine games this season.
- The Hokies' second scoring drive of the game – the one that ended with the 5-yard touchdown pass from Willis to Kumah – took 7:38 off the clock. That is the Hokies' longest scoring drive this season (previous 6:05 vs. Notre Dame).

Miami scored 28 unanswered points midway through the game, and the 'Canes went on to a 38-14 victory over Virginia Tech in an ACC game played Saturday at Lane Stadium.

The Hokies took a 14-10 lead in the second quarter when receiver Tre Turner scored on a 20-yard jet sweep with 10:06 remaining in the first half. But the wheels fell off after that, as Miami scored on a 1-yard run by quarterback N'Kosi Perry with 33 seconds left in the half to retake the lead, 17-14.

That touchdown marked the first of four unanswered scores for the 'Canes. Miami scored three touchdowns in the third quarter, including two on its final two possessions of the period. Jeff Thomas returned a punt 51 yards for a touchdown, and Cam'Ron Davis scored on a 16-yard pass from Perry.

The Hokies' only other score in the game came on a 15-yard touchdown pass from Ryan Willis to tight end Dalton Keene on Tech's first possession of the game. Willis completed just 18 of 36 passes for 216 yards, with a touchdown and two interceptions, to lead a Tech offense that amassed 335 yards.

Perry threw for 171 yards and two touchdowns for Miami, which finished with 339 yards.

GAME NOTES

- Keene's touchdown reception marked his third of the season and the third of his career. The sophomore has caught 18 passes this season after catching just 10 a year ago.
- Turner's rushing touchdown marked his first rushing attempt of his career.

Virginia Tech kicker Brian Johnson made a 42-yard field goal in overtime, and the Hokies' Emmanuel Belmar recovered a fumble on Virginia's ensuing possession, all of which gave the Hokies a 34-31 victory over rival Virginia in a Commonwealth Clash game played Saturday evening at Lane Stadium.

With the win, the Hokies snapped their four-game losing streak and extended their winning streak over Virginia to 15 consecutive games.

Tech appeared to be on the ropes after Virginia kicker Brian Delaney made a 28-yard field goal with 2:41 remaining in regulation to give the Cavaliers a 31-24 lead. But the Hokies made several big plays in the final 2:30 of regulation and overtime.

The biggest came on third-and-10 from the Tech 25 when quarterback Ryan Willis connected with tight end Dalton Keene for a 45-yard gain to the Virginia 30. Two plays later, the Hokies tied the game at 31 when Hezekiah Grimsley recovered a Steven Peoples fumble in the end zone for a touchdown. The extra point tied the game at 31 with 1:51 left.

Neither team scored on their final possessions, thus sending the game into overtime for the first time in the 100 games of the series.

Tech got the ball first and settled for Johnson's 42-yard field goal to take a 34-31 lead – but only after Willis somehow avoided a sack by Virginia's Charles Snowden. On the Cavaliers' possession, Bryce Perkins completed an 11-yard pass to Hasise Dubois on the first play, but on the next play, Perkins botched an exchange with tailback Jordan Ellis, and the Hokies' Belmar recovered to give Tech the win.

GAME NOTES

- Turner's blocked punt marked just the second blocked kick of the season for the Hokies. Tech's only other blocked kick came in the season opener against Florida State when Chris Cunningham blocked a punt that Eric Kumah recovered and returned for a touchdown.
- Peoples' 96 rushing yards marked the second-most in a game in his career. He rushed for 156 in the Hokies' loss at Old Dominion.
- Willis now has thrown at least one touchdown pass in all eight of his starts and in nine straight games.
- Johnson's 31-yard field goal marked his first since the Hokies' loss to Notre Dame.
