### TECH TO FACE BEARCATS IN MILITARY BOWL

- Virginia Tech and Cincinnati will square off in the Military Bowl in Annapolis, Md. on Dec. 31, a rematch of the 2014 Military Bowl that the Hokies won by a 33-17 margin.
- Tech has extended the nation's longest active bowl streak to 26 consecutive seasons, a mark that ranks as the third-longest in college football history.
- The Hokies registered a wild 34-31 OT victory over UVA (11/23) to set up a 41-20 win over Marshall (12/1) that propelled Tech to bowl eligibility.
- The Hokies have compiled a 25-14 record in three seasons under head coach Justin Fuente, meaning only Clemson (38) and Miami (26) have registered more overall victories among ACC schools since Fuente's arrival.
- Cincinnati enters the Military Bowl boasting a 10-2 mark under head coach Luke Fickell. The Bearcats posted a 56-6 win vs. East Carolina (11/23) in their last contest.

### HISTORY BETWEEN HOKIES, BEARCATS

- The 2018 Military Bowl contest will mark the 12th meeting between Virginia Tech and Cincinnati.
- The Hokies own a 6-5 record in their 11 previous games against the Bearcats, including a 2-1 mark in three prior bowl contests.
- Tech's initial bowl appearance came against Cincinnati in the 1947 Sun Bowl, played on Jan. 1, 1947 after the Hokies compiled a 3-4-3 regular season record in 1946.

### INITIAL SCOUTING REPORT ON CINCINNATI

- Cincinnati is 14-10 overall in two seasons under Fickell, but has won 11 of its last 13 games dating back to its 2017 finale.
- RB Michael Warren owns six 100-yard rushing games in 2018. He is averaging 105.7 rushing ypg and has a team-high 17 rushing TDs.
- QB Desmond Ridder has thrown 19 TDs and only five INTs on the season, averaging 196.6 passing ypg. He threw for 335 yards with four TDs vs. East Carolina (11/23) and had a season-high 352 yards in a 26-20 OT win at SMU (10/27).
- Cincinnati is 8-0 in 2018 when holding foes to 21 points or fewer.
- Senior DT Cortez Broughton owns a team-high 17.5 TFL for Cincinnati. He also leads the Bearcats with 6.5 sacks and is tied for the team lead with five passes defended.

### SCORING STATS ON MILITARY BOWL FOES

- Virginia Tech is 17-2 when scoring 30+ points under Fuente.
- Cincinnati is 1-9 under Fickell when allowing 30+ points. That lone win was a 34-30 victory vs. Ohio (9/22).
- The Hokies have won 24 straight contests when holding foes to 21 points or fewer dating back to 2015.
- UC is 3-6 under Fickell when being held to 21 points or fewer. That lone win was a 34-30 victory vs. Ohio (9/22).
- The Hokies have won 38 consecutive non-conference contests when holding foes to 17 points or fewer dating back to 2005.
- Tech owns a 93-5 record in all games dating back to 2005 when limiting its opponents to 17 points or fewer.
- Cincinnati has been held to 17 points or fewer in both of its losses in 2018 - a 24-17 OT loss at Temple (10/20) and a 38-13 setback vs. No. 11 UCF (11/17).

### THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT FOR THE #LPD

- Despite boasting one of the youngest defensive units ever fielded by Bud Foster at Virginia Tech, a host of underclassmen have proven their mettle for the Hokies in 2018.
- Sophomore LB Rayshard Ashby leads all ACC underclassmen with 100 total tackles (55 solo), the fourth-best total in the league. The three players ranking ahead of Ashby were all seniors.

- Freshman CB Caleb Farley leads Tech with seven passes defended and is tied for the team lead with two INTs.
- Even though he's only started five contests, freshman LB Dax Hollifield ranks fifth on Tech with 59 tackles (26 solo). He also owns 8.0 TFL, 2.0 sacks and a fumble recovery.
- Sophomore CB Bryce Watts is playing with a surgically repaired broken forearm, yet still ranks second on the squad with six passes defended and registered an INT vs. Marshall (12/1).

### WHAT TO WATCH ON QB RYAN WILLIS

- Tech QB Ryan Willis has played in 11 games in relief of QB Josh Jackson who was injured at ODU (9/22). Willis' 22 TD passes are the third-highest single-season mark in Tech history.
- The two players who have thrown more TDs in a season than Willis (Jerod Evans & Tyrod Taylor) both played in 14 games those years.
- Three of the top five TD seasons by a Tech QB have come since the arrival of Fuente and OC Brad Cornelsen in 2016.

- Willis ranks third in the ACC in passing ypg (227.0), fourth in passer rating (137.9) and fifth in total offense (256.2 ypg).

### WALKER, HAZELTON SECOND-TEAM ALL-ACC

- The senior leader of Tech's Lunch Pail Defense, DT Ricky Walker earned second-team All-ACC honors after anchoring the Hokies youthful defense. He owns a team-high 10.5 TFL and earned ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors following a 34-31 OT win vs. Virginia (11/23).
- WR Damon Hazelton also earned second-team All-ACC accolades in 2018. He tied for second in the ACC with eight TDs catches, a figure that also tied with WR Ricky Hall (8 in 1998) for the most-ever by a first-year Tech player.
- He ranks seventh in the ACC averaging 62.1 receiving ypg.
- Hazelton owns three 100-yard receiving games for VT in 2018.

### BIG PLAY TRÉ

- Freshman WR Tré Turner has gotten hot down the stretch for the Hokies. After catching 10 passes for 209 yards with two TDs in the season's first seven games, Turner owns 15 catches for 286 yards and two TDs in his last four contests.
- Turner also owns seven rushing attempts for 78 yards with one TD in his last three games to go along with a huge blocked punt in Tech's 34-31 OT victory vs. UVA (11/23).

### ADDITIONAL NUGGETS OF NOTE ON THE HOKIES

- Tech leads the ACC in Red Zone offense (91.9 scoring pct.), registering 26 TDs, eight FGs and no turnovers on 37 RZ trips.
- Tech ranks fourth in the ACC in Red Zone defense (77.6 scoring pct.), allowing 28 TDs and 11 FGs on 49 RZ trips. The #LPD is tied for the ACC lead, forcing six Red Zone turnovers.
- Tech is +10 (15 takes/5 gives) in its six wins and is -6 (3 takes/9 gives) in its six losses in 2018.
- Virginia Tech has limited its foes to 138.3 net rushing ypg in its six wins, holding three of those opponents to under 100 team net rushing yards and allowing only five rushing TDs.
- Senior RB Steven Peoples leads Tech with 760 rushing yards and five TDs. His 5.1 yards-per-carry average is the best of any VT player with a minimum of 50 carries.

- Willis owns a 2.75 TD-to-INT differential (22 TDs/8 INTs), a mark that ranks as the second-best mark in the ACC in 2018 and the fifth-best seasonal mark in Tech annals dating back to 1996.
- Willis threw a career-high four TDs vs. Marshall (12/1), registering his third 300-yard game of the year with 312 yards.

**VIRGINIA TECH VS. CINCINNATI: INSIDE THE SERIES**

- Virginia Tech and Cincinnati will square off for the 12th time in their histories on Dec. 31 in the Military Bowl.
- This will be the fourth time that the Cincinnati will face Virginia Tech in a bowl game, making the Bearcats the Hokies' most commonly played bowl opponent.
- After meeting seven times at each other's home venues between 1985 and 2006, this will be the fourth consecutive meeting between the two teams at a neutral site.
- Tech is 2-1 against Cincinnati in bowl games with the lone loss coming in the 1947 Sun Bowl.
- Head coach Justin Fuente went up against the Bearcats three times in his career while at Memphis as American Athletic Conference foes and he went 2-1.
- Ironically, Fuente's Tigers beat Cincinnati, 41-14, in 2014, the same year the Bearcats played the Hokies in the Military Bowl.
- In non-bowl action, Cincinnati served as Virginia Tech's second and only other loss in the 1995 season before the Hokies rattled off 10 straight victories en route to the program's first major bowl win over Texas in the Sugar Bowl.
- Tech's win over the Bearcats in 1987 was Frank Beamer's second career victory at Virginia Tech, where he would go on to win 238 games.

## 2016 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

- The consensus 2016 ACC Coach of the Year, Fuente was also named the top first-year FBS head coach in the nation by the Football Writers Association of America, sharing that honor with USC's Clay Helton.
- Tech finished the 2016 season ranked No. 16 in both the AP Poll and the Coaches Poll, marking the highest final mark for the Hokies since 2010 (No. 16 AP, No. 15 Coaches).
- Virginia Tech, Penn State, Colorado, West Virginia and Western Michigan all finished in the AP Top 25 after getting zero votes in the AP Preseason Poll.
- Tech's 10 wins were the team's most since 2011 and the most ever by a first-year Virginia Tech head coach, surpassing the previous mark of nine wins by C.P. Miles in 1905.

- Named Virginia Tech's head coach on Nov. 29, 2015 after orchestrating one of the more impressive program resurrections in recent college football history at Memphis.
- In three seasons under Fuente, the Hokies have gone 25-14 with three bowl game appearances and winning an ACC Coastal Division title in 2016. Fuente's 25 victories at Virginia Tech in just 39 games rank third in program history and are the fewest games needed to reach that plateau since B.C. Cabbage registered 25 victories in 35 games between 1921 and 1925.
- In 2018, despite the Hokies having the youngest defensive two-deep in the ACC and losing starting QB Josh Jackson to a season-ending injury only three games into the season, Fuente led the Hokies to their 26th consecutive bowl game – the longest active streak in the nation and the third longest in college football history.
- Tech also retained possession of the Commonwealth Cup after defeating in-state rival Virginia for a 15th consecutive season.
- Tech's tradition of special teams excellence continued in 2018 as the Hokies returned blocked punts for touchdowns for the first time since 1998. Meanwhile, the Hokies allowed 334 combined punt/kickoff return yards, the seventh-lowest total in the FBS.

- Under the tutelage of Fuente and offensive coordinator Brad Cornelsen, redshirt junior QB Ryan Willis finished the regular season with 22 touchdown passes, making him the third different Virginia Tech quarterback in the Fuente Era to throw 20 or more touchdowns in a season; joining Jerod Evans (29 in 2016) and Jackson (20 in 2017).
- Tech also improved to 22-1 during Fuente's tenure when leading at halftime.
- With 19 wins in his first two seasons at Tech, Fuente owned more victories than every Tech coach has accumulated in his first three seasons with the exception of B.C. Cabbage, who guided the program to 21 victories from 1921-23.
- The Hokies finished back-to-back seasons in the final AP Poll in 2016-17 for the first time since 2010-11. The Hokies will be seeking to conclude three straight seasons in the AP Top 25 for the first time since doing it eight consecutive years under Frank Beamer (2004-11).
- Tech concluded the 2017 season with a 9-4 mark, finishing the year No. 24 in the AP Top 25 and No. 25 in the Amway USA Today Coaches Poll.

- Tech extended its streak of consecutive bowl appearances to 25 straight seasons in 2017 under Fuente, the longest active streak recognized by the NCAA. Should Tech earn its 26th straight bowl berth in 2018, that mark that would give VT sole possession of the third-longest streak in NCAA history.
- Fuente's well-deserved reputation for his work with quarterbacks became apparent again in 2017 as QB Josh Jackson orchestrated the most prolific season of any freshman in Tech history.
- Jackson's 2,991 passing yards were a VT freshman record and the most of any FBS freshman in 2017, while his 20 TDs and 135.2 rating were second among FBS freshmen behind Georgia QB Jake Fromm (24 TDs, 160.1 ranking).
- Tech's traditionally stout Lunch Pail Defense also lived up to its reputation in 2017, pitching three shutouts.

\* Foster, who became the Hokies' co-defensive coordinator in 1995, is also the nation's longest-tenured DC.



The famed Virginia Tech Lunch Pail has come to symbolize the blue-collar approach of the Hokies' defense under longtime defensive coordinate Bud Foster.

- In 1995, Foster served as co-defensive coordinator with Rod Sharpless, whose mother-in-law found the original Lunch Pail in Mercerville, New Jersey. The pail once belonged to a coal miner and after a record-setting defensive season, the Lunch Pail became an iconic part of Hokies' lore.
- The Pail travels wherever the Hokies go and its care is only entrusted to a defensive leader.
- Before the start of every season, a signed mission statement from the defense is placed in The Pail. Then every week, unit goals, team goals and keys to success are placed in The Pail, plus the turf from any road victories.
- Since 2007, The Pail has also contained the names of the 32 fallen Hokies taken in the April 16 tragedy.
- Darryl Tapp is the only player who has ever earned lifetime possession of an incarnation of The Pail from Foster.

- Even though the namesake is no longer the big whistle in Blacksburg, Virginia Tech's BeamerBall philosophy has not waned under third-year head coach Justin Fuente.
- There have been 150 non-offensive touchdowns and 145 blocked kicks by Virginia Tech since Frank Beamer's first season as head coach in 1987.
- Under Fuente, the Hokies have scored 10 non-offensive touchdowns – three punt return touchdowns, two fumble return touchdowns, two interception return touchdowns, two blocked punt return touchdowns and one blocked field goal return touchdown.
- Since Fuente's hiring, the Hokies are tied for eighth in Power Five with seven combined punt return, interception return and fumble return touchdowns.
- The Hokies have blocked more kicks over the last three seasons under Fuente (11) than the previous five seasons combined (9).

### BEAMER NAMED TO COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

- Former Virginia Tech head coach Frank Beamer was named College Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2018 in his initial year of eligibility.
- The induction is set for Dec. 4 in New York City.
- The winningest coach in Virginia Tech history, Beamer's 280 victories rank sixth overall in FBS history and are the 13th most by a college football coach at any NCAA division.
- He led the Hokies to their first ever national title game appearance as part of an impressive streak of 23 consecutive bowl berths in his final 23 seasons.
- Under Beamer, the Hokies posted five top-10 finishes and became one of only six programs in college football history to go to a bowl game in at least 20-straight seasons.
- A five-time conference Coach of the Year, Beamer won three BIG EAST titles and added four ACC titles in five conference championship game appearances.
- A monument of Beamer was unveiled at Moody Plaza prior to the Notre Dame game on Oct. 6. The naming of the Beamer-Lawson Indoor Practice Facility was also approved on Oct. 6.

- Head coach Justin Fuente and the Hokies pay homage to Frank Beamer and Virginia Tech's legacy of excellence on special teams by selecting a special teams player of the week who will wear No. 25.
- With Coach Beamer's blessing, his retired No. 25 was worn by a player who exemplified the role special teams played during Virginia Tech's rise to national prominence.

## "BIG PLAY" TRE SHINES VS. UVA

- While freshman WR Tré Turner has turned into a key target when the Hokies need a "money play", a play resulting in a first down or a touchdown, he also got his first taste of BeamerBall against Virginia.
- After making an acrobatic, one-handed touchdown catch in the first quarter, Turner blocked his first career punt on the next UVA possession that was recovered in the end zone for a touchdown.
- Along with the blocked kick, Turner racked up 112 yards of offense (43 rushing, 69 receiving).
- His performance against UVA led to him wearing Frank Beamer's No. 25 vs. Marshall, where he turned in a career-high 99 receiving yards on three catches and a 45-yard TD reception.
- Of Turner's 25 career receptions, 17 have gone for a first down and three have been touchdowns.
- Turner's first eight catches of his career went for first downs.
- His 19.8 yards per reception ranks third among FBS true freshmen:

## HAZELTON MAKING AN IMPACT

- Ball State transfer Damon Hazelton has lived up to the hype in 2018.
- His eight TD catches are tied for second in the ACC and his 62.1 receiving yards per game ranks seventh in the conference.
- His eight receiving touchdowns are tied for sixth on Virginia Tech's single season TD chart.
- He has three 100-yard receiving games, tied for the second most in the conference.
- Against Notre Dame (10/6), Hazelton tied WR Isaiah Ford's program record of five consecutive games with a receiving TD.
- He registered his first 100-yard receiving game as a Hokie vs. William & Mary (9/8) and his first catch in a VT uniform was a 10-yard TD catch vs. Florida State (9/3).
- The Baltimore native racked up 51 catches for 505 yards in 11 games for Ball State as a true freshman.
- He transferred from Ball State and was recommended to Tech wide receivers coach Holmon Wiggins by Texas A&M wide receivers coach Aaron Moorehead, who coached wide receivers for the Hokies due to 2013-14.
- He sat out last season due to NCAA transfer rules, redshirted, and made friends with New York Giants wide receiver Odell Beckham, Jr. while working out with trainer Jamal Liggins.

## WILLIS ALREADY SETTING RECORDS

- Redshirt junior Ryan Willis is already etching his name in the Virginia Tech record book through his first three starts as a Hokie.
- He's currently tied for second in program history with three 300-yard passing games
- Willis is the first Tech QB since Logan Thomas in 2013 to throw for more than 300 yards in back-to-back games.
- He's also the first Hokie signal caller to throw for 300+ yards in his first two starts.
- In his first start since Nov. 11 2016 at Baylor as a Kansas Jayhawk, Willis threw for 332 yards on 17 of 27 passing with a career high three touchdown passes in Virginia Tech's 31-14 win at No. 22 Duke (9/29).
- Willis' 332 passing yards were the most for a QB making his first start at Virginia Tech.
- The win marked Willis' first career win as a starter and his third career 300-yard passing game.
- Willis was only the second Virginia Tech quarterback to make his first two starts with the Hokies against ranked teams; joining Bryan Randall in 2002 vs. No. 14 LSU and No. 16 Marshall.

## HOKIES HAVE NFL BLOODLINES

Virginia Tech has multiple players on its roster this season that grew up in NFL households:

**C Kyle Chung:** father, Eugene, was an All-American offensive lineman at Virginia Tech and a first round pick of the New England Patriots. He's currently on the Philadelphia Eagles' coaching staff.

**DL Robert Porcher:** father, Robert, was a first round pick of the Detroit Lions where he was a three-time Pro Bowler. He finished his career with 95.5 sacks in 12 seasons.

**RB Terius Wheatley:** father, Tyrone, was a three-time first-team All-Big Ten selection at Michigan, a first round pick of the New York Giants and went on to play 10 seasons in the NFL.

**LB Keshon Artis:** family cousin, Kenny Easley, was the fourth overall pick taken in 1981 by Seattle where he went to five Pro Bowls and had his No. 45 retired.

## HOKIES STOP ANOTHER STREAK

- In its history, Virginia Tech has been known to stop some of their ranked opponents' significant streaks.
- This season, the Hokies halted yet another streak:

### Significant Streaks Stopped by the Hokies

**Texas** (12/31/95): 28-10 win in the 1995 Sugar Bowl snapped a nine-game win streak.

**Texas A&M** (9/21/02): 13-3 win broke the Aggies' 29-game non-conference win streak.

**Miami** (11/1/03): 31-7 victory snapped their 39-game regular season win streak.

**Ohio State** (9/6/14): 35-21 upset in broke its 25-game regular season win streak.

**North Carolina** (10/8/16): 34-3 drubbing over the Tar Heels broke their nine-game home win streak.

**Duke** (9/29/18): 31-14 win broke the Blue Devils' seven-game win streak dating back to 2017.

## GAME-WINNING DRIVE LIFTS VT

The Hokies' 18 play, 98-yard game-winning touchdown drive at North Carolina (10/13) is tied for the fourth-longest drive in program history and stands as the longest game-winning drive in program history.

- North Carolina was ready to put the game away, driving to the Tech one-yard line midway through the fourth quarter. But then Tyree Rodgers forced a fumble from UNC tailback Michael Carter that Jovonn Quillen recovered at the Tech 2 with 6:13 remaining in the game.
- The drive took 18 plays, tied for the third most in a TD drive in Tech history, in 5:54 that ended with a one-yard TD grab by TE Dalton Keene.

## FARLEY FIGHTS THROUGH ADVERSITY

- It's been a long and tumultuous road for redshirt freshman DB Caleb Farley, who has two interceptions in three starts at cornerback for Virginia Tech.
- After racking up 78 yards of total offense (61 receiving yards, 17 rushing yards) in the 2017 spring game, Farley tore his ACL on the first day of fall camp that kept him out the remainder of the season.
- Off the field, Farley dealt with another major blow personally in January 2018 when his mother succumbed to nearly a decade-long battle with cancer.
- Farley, who cornerbacks coach Brian Mitchell called a "borrowed wide receiver", moved from wideout to cornerback in the spring and is listed as a second-string corner and is expected to return punts and kicks.

## ECU VS. VT: THE GAME THAT WASN'T

- The Hokies' week three contest vs. East Carolina was the first canceled game for Virginia Tech since its season opener vs. Georgia Tech in 2000.
- Tech went on to go 11-1 that season with a victory over Clemson in the 2001 Gator Bowl.
- Ironically enough, the Hokies' week three opponent that season was also East Carolina.

## LPD LEADS TECH IN WIN AT FSU

- Virginia Tech's dominating 24-3 victory at Florida State was the Hokies' first win in Tallahassee since Nov. 16, 1974.
- The Hokies improved to 100-1 under Bud Foster at defensive coordinator when they hold opponents to 10 points or fewer.
- It was only the fifth time since 1996 under Foster and the third time on the road that the Hokies held a ranked opponent to three points or less.
- It marked the first time in program history that Virginia Tech opened with ranked opponents in back-to-back seasons and won both games after dropping its previous 10 matchups.
- The Hokies held the Seminoles to their lowest point total at home since 2008 when FSU also put up three points against Wake Forest.
- Justin Fuente moved to 4-0 all-time against Willie Taggart as a head coach.

- His game-sealing TD catch in the 4th quarter went for 49 yards, a career-long reception.

**THE BELL COW LEADS THE LPD**

- With all of the talent on last year's Lunch Pail Defense that finished fourth in the nation in scoring defense and featured seven players currently on NFL rosters, defensive coordinator Bud Foster still called senior defensive tackle Ricky Walker the "Bell Cow" of his unit.
- Walker and former Tech great Greg Stroman are the only two players to wear Frank Beamer's No. 25 jersey three times.
- After playing in 11 games as a true freshman, Walker took a redshirt year and came in 2016 as a redshirt sophomore where he racked up 28 tackles, 6.5 TFLs and four pass breakups.
- Last year was a career year for Walker who posted 41 tackles, 12.5 TFLs and 4.5 sacks in 13 starts.
- His performance helped him earn All-ACC Honorable Mention honors.
- Walker earned his degree in sociology in May and became a father over the summer.
- Walker's brother, Rijo, was a four-year letterwinner at UVA and is currently works on the staff with the College Football Playoff as its team operations coordinator.

**HOKIES MAKE HISTORY AT 2018 DRAFT**

- The 2018 NFL Draft was a historic one for the Hokies as the program saw Terrell and Tremaine Edmunds become the 12th and 13th first round draft picks in school history.
- The Edmunds brothers were the first set of brothers to be drafted in the first round of the draft.
- Virginia Tech had two players picked in the first for only the second time in program history and the first time since 2004.
- Tech's five draft picks overall were its most selections since five Hokies came off the board in 2010.
- When including Adonis Alexander's selection by Washington in the NFL's Supplemental Draft, the Hokies had six draftees, their most since 2008 (8).

J.C. Coleman set a new Virginia Tech bowl record for rushing yards and Joey Slye booted four field goals as the Virginia Tech football squad wrapped up the 2014 season with a 33-17 win over the University of Cincinnati Saturday to claim the Military Bowl presented by Northrup Grumman at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. The win gave the Hokies their seventh win of the season and assured them of their 22nd straight winning season.

"I know 7-6 isn't what our fans wanted or us as coaches, but the toughness and resiliency that our guys have shown while ignoring the outside noise throughout the season," acting head coach Shane Beamer said. "To come out there and play like they did today I couldn't be any happier for a group of kids."

Cincinnati got off to a hot start offensively, moving up and down the field, but could only convert its 300 yards of first-half offense into 10 points. After Gunner Kiel connected with Chris Moore for a 31-yard touchdown pass, Michael Brewer led the Tech offense down the field for a score on Coleman's 1-yard plunge to tie it up. Early in the second quarter, Slye connected on a 45-yard field goal and later hit a Virginia Tech bowl and Military Bowl record 49-yard field goal to end the first half.

The Hokies got the ball first in the second half and again went right down the field as Brewer hit tight end Ryan Malleck from 1-yard out to give Tech a 20-10 lead. With the Bearcats on the move, Tech's defense swung the momentum to its side for good as linebacker Deon Clarke came blitzing up the middle to sack Kiel. The ball popped loose and was scooped up by defensive tackle Nigel Williams. Williams rumbled 26 yards, but fumbled the ball and freshman Greg Stroman picked it up, returning it to the goal line before being driven into the end zone for a wild score.

"Firstly, I was trying to get the ball and not fall as I did it," Williams said. "Unfortunately the running back ran me down, but I trusted the guys behind me to pick it up and finish the play...I had a little flashback to my tight end days when I picked the ball up."

"I was going to go block," Stroman said. "I saw him pick it up and I was running after him to go block. Then it just came loose and I was in the right place at the right time, just trying to get in there. He [the Cincinnati player] was trying to rip at the ball and I was just trying to get in there. My teammates helped to push me in."

Slye would connect on two more field goals and Cincinnati would score in the fourth quarter, but it wasn't enough as the Hokies completed the victory over the co-champs of the American Athletic Conference.

Coleman was named MVP after running for 157 yards and a touchdown on 25 carries. The 157 yards set a new Tech bowl record for yards, surpassing Kevin Jones and Darren Evans, who each ran for 153 yards in a game.

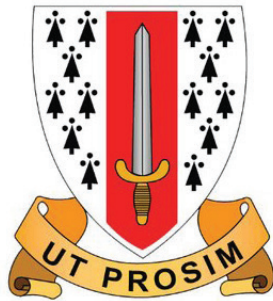

Virginia Tech jumped out to a quick lead and never relinquished it, rolling to a 24-3 victory over Florida State at Doak Campbell Stadium on Monday night in an ACC game that marked the season opener for both squads.

With the victory, Virginia Tech, ranked No. 20 in the Associated Press poll, snapped a six-game losing streak to the Seminoles in Tallahassee. Florida State came in ranked No. 19.

The Hokies played a strong first half, taking a 17-3 lead into the locker room. A Josh Jackson touchdown pass to Damon Hazelton and a field goal by Brian Johnson on the Hokies' first two possessions gave them a 10-0 lead.

Tech's special teams made the biggest play of the first half when tight end Chris Cunningham blocked the punt of FSU punter Logan Tyler. Tech's Eric Kumah caught the deflection and ran it three yards into the end zone for a touchdown, which gave the Hokies the 17-3 cushion.

Tech then put the game away late in the fourth quarter when Jackson threw a 49-yard touchdown pass to Kuman with 5:11 remaining.

Jackson threw for 207 yards and two touchdowns. Tech's defense forced five turnovers, recorded four sacks and held Florida State to just 94 yards rushing.

GAME NOTES

- Kumah's blocked punt return for a score marked the Hokies' first since Anthony Shegog returned one for a touchdown in Tech's win at Purdue in 2015.
- Cunningham's blocked punt marked the Hokies' 11th blocked kick under Justin Fuente and the ninth non-offensive touchdown.

Josh Jackson threw a touchdown pass and ran for a touchdown and Steven Peoples rushed for two touchdowns, as No. 12 Virginia Tech blasted in-state foe William & Mary 62-17 in a non-conference game at Lane Stadium on Saturday in a game that marked the Hokies' home opener.

The Hokies (2-0) showed no hangover coming off their huge win over Florida State on Monday night, scoring on 10 straight possessions during one stretch of the game and never punting. They racked up more than 400 yards offense in the first 30 minutes alone, and not to be outdone, Tech's defense held William & Mary to 100 first-half yards and just three first downs.

Despite Steven Peoples' career-best rushing performance, Virginia Tech struggled for much of the afternoon against in-state foe Old Dominion, and the No. 13 Hokies fell 49-35 to the Monarchs in a nonconference game at Ballard Stadium.

Peoples rushed for 156 yards on 20 carries and scored on runs of 87 yards and 1 yard. Quarterback Josh Jackson threw two touchdown passes.

But the Hokies struggled against ODU's offense, led by backup quarterback Blake LaRussa. The 5-foot-11 LaRussa completed 30 of 49 for 495 yards and threw touchdown passes of 14, 4, 25 and 29 yards. He also rushed for a touchdown on a day in which ODU's offense finished with 632 yards.

The Hokies led 28-21 with 32 seconds left in the third quarter, but ODU scored on its next two possessions, taking a 35-28 lead – its first lead of the game.

Things got worse for Tech, as Jackson went down with a lower leg injury on the first play of the ensuing drive. Backup quarterback Ryan Willis led the Hokies on a 75-yard march that ended with a touchdown pass, tying the game at 35.

But the Hokies simply had no answer for ODU. LaRussa polished off a 75-yard drive with 5:11 left and Jeremy Cox's 40-yard touchdown run sealed the win.

Making his first start as a Hokie, quarterback Ryan Willis threw for 332 yards and three touchdowns to lead Virginia Tech to a 31-14 bounce-back victory over No. 22 Duke in an ACC game played Saturday night at Wallace Wade Stadium.

Playing in place of injured starter Josh Jackson, Willis looked like a veteran, throwing the ball accurately and making good decisions, as the Hokies rebounded from a loss to ODU last Saturday. He completed 17 of 27 in the game.

Willis, who transferred from Kansas in 2017, made a beautiful throw over Damon Hazelton's outside shoulder for a 27-yard touchdown pass on the first play of the second quarter to give the Hokies a 10-7 lead, and Tech never trailed again. The Hokies padded their score on their next possession when tight end Dalton Keene hauled in a short pass from Willis and broke several tackles en route to a 67-yard touchdown. Those two scores in a three-minute span enabled the Hokies to take control of the game.

Despite another solid performance from quarterback Ryan Willis and a big game from receiver Damon Hazelton, Virginia Tech struggled to stop Notre Dame's offense in the second half, falling to the No. 6 Irish 45-23 in a non-conference game played Saturday night at Lane Stadium.

The Hokies trailed by just a point at halftime, 17-16, after Willis connected with Hazelton for a 3-yard touchdown with 12 seconds left in the first half. But Notre Dame made several big plays in the second half to pull away.

The Irish scored touchdowns on four of their first five possessions of the second half, including on their first two possessions the third quarter (a 97-yard touchdown run by Dexter Williams and a 40-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Ian Book to Miles Boykin). The latter score gave the Irish a 31-16 lead with 4:59 left in the third quarter.

Notre Dame all but sealed the game early in the fourth quarter when an 11-play, 64-yard drive ended with a 5-yard touchdown pass from Book to Boykin that gave the Irish a 38-16 lead with 9:08 remaining.

Tech cut into that lead when Willis threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to Eric Kuman with 5:40 remaining, but Notre Dame answered with a 31-yard touchdown run by Williams to account for the final margin.

GAME NOTES

- Hazelton recorded his third 100-yard receiving game of the season and now has caught at least one touchdown pass in all five of the Hokies' games this season, tying Isaiah Ford's program record.
- Hazelton's 12 receptions tied a career high. He caught 12 in a game while playing at Ball State before transferring to Tech.
- Willis became the first Tech quarterback since Logan Thomas in 2013 to throw for at least 300 yards in back-to-back games.

Virginia Tech quarterback Ryan Willis threw a touchdown pass to Dalton Keene with 19 seconds left to lift the Hokies to a 22-19 victory over North Carolina in an ACC game played Saturday night at Kenan Stadium.

North Carolina was ready to put the game away, driving to the Tech 1 midway through the fourth quarter. But the Hokies' Tyree Rodgers forced a fumble from North Carolina tailback Michael Carter that Jovonn Quillen recovered at the Tech 2 with 6:13 remaining in the game.

Willis then led Tech on a 98-yard march, with the Hokies converting on third down on four occasions and on fourth down once. The drive ended with Willis connecting with Keene on a 1-yard touchdown with 19 seconds left. The Hokies went for two points and Willis hit Hazelton, giving the Hokies a 22-19 lead.

North Carolina had one final chance, but couldn't advance the ball past midfield.

Willis paced the Tech offense with 309 total yards. He completed 20 of 36 for 221 yards, with two touchdowns and two interceptions. He also rushed for 88 yards on 15 carries.

The Tar Heels finished with 522 yards. Carter led the way, rushing for 165 yards.

Despite two passing touchdowns and one rushing score from quarterback Ryan Willis, Virginia Tech struggled to slow down Georgia Tech's rushing attack and fell 49-28 to the Yellow Jackets in an ACC game played Thursday night at Lane Stadium.

With the loss, the Hokies dropped to 4-3 overall, 3-1 in the ACC. Georgia Tech moved to 4-4, 2-3.

The key play in the game came midway through the second quarter when the Hokies, leading 21-14, forced Georgia Tech to punt. But Virginia Tech punt returner Sean Savoy muffed the punt, and Georgia Tech recovered at the Virginia Tech 12. Two plays later, Jordan Mason scored on a 5-yard run to tie the game at 21 with 6:57 left in the first half.

That touchdown was the first of four consecutive touchdowns scored by the Yellow Jackets, as Georgia Tech's ground game was in full throttle. Behind quarterback Tobias Oliver – starting in place of injured Taquon Marshall – the Yellow Jackets rushed for 465 yards and registered 35 first downs. Oliver finished with 40 carries for 215 yards and three touchdowns.

The Hokies finished with 323 yards of offense. Willis completed 15 of 22 for 201 yards and two touchdowns, and he also rushed for 22 yards and a score.

Virginia Tech fell behind early and couldn't get back in the game, falling 52-22 to Pitt in an ACC game played Saturday night at Heinz Field.

Pitt jumped out to a 17-0 lead and never looked back. The Panthers got an early field goal from Alex Kessman and then used a 53-yard run from Darrin Hall to set up an 8-yard touchdown run by Quadree Ellison toward the end of the first quarter. A 78-yard touchdown pass from Kenny Pickett to Maurice Ffrench early in the second quarter gave the Panthers the 17-point advantage.

The Hokies got on the board when quarterback Ryan Willis threw a 29-yard touchdown pass to receiver Eric Kumah. The play capped an 80-yard drive and cut the Panthers' lead to 17-7.

But Pitt scored touchdowns on its final two possessions to end the first half and ultimately pulled away.

Willis threw two more touchdown passes in the second half. He completed 22 of 34 for 231 yards, with three touchdown passes, and he also rushed for 65 yards. The Hokies amassed 432 yards of offense, while Pitt finished with 654 yards of offense.

Virginia Tech kicker Brian Johnson made a 42-yard field goal in overtime, and the Hokies' Emmanuel Belmar recovered a fumble on Virginia's ensuing possession, all of which gave the Hokies a 34-31 victory over rival Virginia in a Commonwealth Clash game played Saturday evening at Lane Stadium.

With the win, the Hokies snapped their four-game losing streak and extended their winning streak over Virginia to 15 consecutive games.

Tech appeared to be on the ropes after Virginia kicker Brian Delaney made a 28-yard field goal with 2:41 remaining in regulation to give the Cavaliers a 31-24 lead. But the Hokies made several big plays in the final 2:30 of regulation and overtime.

The biggest came on third-and-10 from the Tech 25 when quarterback Ryan Willis connected with tight end Dalton Keene for a 45-yard gain to the Virginia 30. Two plays later, the Hokies tied the game at 31 when Hezekiah Grimsley recovered a Steven Peoples fumble in the end zone for a touchdown. The extra point tied the game at 31 with 1:51 left.

Neither team scored on their final possessions, thus sending the game into overtime for the first time in the 100 games of the series.

Tech got the ball first and settled for Johnson's 42-yard field goal to take a 34-31 lead – but only after Willis somehow avoided a sack by Virginia's Charles Snowden. On the Cavaliers' possession, Bryce Perkins completed an 11-yard pass to Hasise Dubois on the first play, but on the next play, Perkins botched an exchange with tailback Jordan Ellis, and the Hokies' Belmar recovered to give Tech the win.

- Turner's blocked punt marked just the second blocked kick of the season for the Hokies. Tech's only other blocked kick came in the season opener against Florida State when Chris Cunningham blocked a punt that Eric Kumah recovered and returned for a touchdown.
- Peoples' 96 rushing yards marked the second-most in a game in his career. He rushed for 156 in the Hokies' loss at Old Dominion.
- Willis now has thrown at least one touchdown pass in all eight of his starts and in nine straight games.
- Johnson's 31-yard field goal marked his first since the Hokies' loss to Notre Dame.

Virginia Tech quarterback Ryan Willis threw for 312 yards and four touchdowns to lead Virginia Tech to a 41-20 nonconference victory over Marshall at Lane Stadium on Saturday.

The game served as a makeup game for both schools because of the effects of Hurricane Florence in mid-September. Virginia Tech's game against East Carolina and Marshall's game against South Carolina, both scheduled for Sept. 15, were canceled.

The Hokies, who have won two straight to close the regular season, got started quickly against the Thundering Herd, as defensive tackle Ricky Walker forced Marshall quarterback Isaiah Green to fumble on Marshall's first play from scrimmage, and Tech's TyJuan Garbutt recovered. That play ultimately led to a field goal by Brian Johnson, and the Hokies never trailed.

Willis threw four touchdown passes in the first half to four different receivers. He tossed a 46-yard touchdown pass to Hezekiah Grimsley that gave the Hokies a 10-0 lead, and after Marshall scored on the final play of the first quarter, Willis dominated the second period, throwing touchdown passes of 45 yards to Tre Turner, 7 yards to Steven Peoples and 32 yards to Eric Kumah. The Hokies led 31-6 at the break.

Willis completed 18 of 26 for 312 yards, with four touchdowns. The Hokies finished with 454 total yards.

Marshall tailback Brenden Knox paced the Thundering Herd, rushing for 204 yards on 27 carries and scoring a touchdown. The Thundering Herd finished with 452 total yards.

**GAME NOTES**

- For the fourth time during the Hokies' bowl streak, they won their final game of the season to become bowl eligible (2012, 2014, 2015, 2018).
- The Hokies moved to 22-5 under head coach Justin Fuente when scoring first.
- Grimsley's 46-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter marked the first touchdown reception of his career. Peoples' 7-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter marked his first receiving touchdown of the season.
- Holston's 40-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter was the longest rush of his career. Deshawn McCleave's 54-yard reception in the second quarter was a career long.
