## STILL STANDING

- Tech's stands at 10-0 for the fifth time in program history in 2018-19. The Hokies most recently reached that mark in 2016-17 in Kenny Brooks' first season at the helm in Blacksburg when he guided the Hokies to a 15-0 start. Tech also reached that mark in the 98-99 (18-0), 03-04 (12-0) and 05-06 (12-0) seasons.


## TECH REMAINS ON THE CUSP OF BOTH MAJOR POLLS

- The Hokies are one of 13 D1 schools still unbeaten on the season after Tennessee and Mississippi State both lost on Tuesday night.
- The Hokies are garnering votes in both polls, receiving 21 votes this week in the AP Poll and 22 in the USA Today Coaches Poll.


## IN A CATEGORY OF HER OWN

- Forward Regan Magarity has quietly put together one of the best careers for a women's basketball player in Virginia Tech program history. Already the all-time leader in rebounds, Magarity reached 1,000 career rebounds in the Hokies' win over Mount St. Mary's, joining five other women as active players with 1,000 boards.
- Magarity also owns the most double-doubles of any Hokie (39) a mark which places her sixth amongst active players.
- In 2018-19, she is averaging 14.0 rebounds, and is second in the nation in total boards and first in defensive boards.


FREQUENT FLYERS

- The trip to West Palm Beach is already the Hokies' second venture to Florida this season following the two-game UCF Thanksgiving Tournament that the Hokies won.
- Tech will be back in the Sunshine State in less than two weeks when the ACC season tips off with a clash at Miami.
- Last season the Hokies competed in the Paradise Jam which was relocated to Melbourne, Florida due to hurricanes affecting the Virgin Islands. Additionally in 2017-18, the Hokies had road contests at Miami and Florida State.

Kenny Brooks was named the seventh head women's basketball coach at Virginia Tech on March 28, 2016. He enters his third season at the helm of the Hokies' program heading into the 2018-19 season.

Since Brooks' arrival in Blacksburg, the Hokies have enjoyed back-to-back seasons of 20-plus wins and late runs in the month of March, making a WNIT championship game appearance in 2018 after finishing in the quarterfinals of that competition a season earlier.

To begin his tenure, Brooks and the Hokies reeled off 15 straight wins to open the 2016-17 season, Tech's strongest start to a season in 18 years. Behind that strong start, Tech climbed to as high as No. 15 in the AP Poll.

Brooks has ushered in a new era of up-tempo basketball at Virginia Tech, as his Hokies have reset the team scoring record in each of his first two seasons as well as reset the mark for most 3-pointers made.

During his time in Blacksburg, Brooks has recruited and developed second team All-ACC performer Taylor Emery, who set the single season scoring record in 2017-18 at 667 points. She also scored the most field goals in a single campaign with 236.

Brooks' tenure has also seen two players reach the 1,000-point plateau including forward Regan Magarity who became the program's all-time leading rebounder during the WNIT run in 2018.

Brooks joined the Hokies after an impressive 14-season stint as head coach at James Madison University where he compiled a record of 337-122 (.756), making him the winningest coach in that school's history. Brooks guided the Dukes to 11 consecutive postseason appearances, including six NCAA bids and five trips to the WNIT.

Over an 11-year stretch (2005-2016), Brooks' squads never won fewer than 24 games, averaging 26.3 wins per year. The Dukes won three consecutive CAA championships (2014-2016) under Brooks' tutelage and captured a total of five conference titles over a seven season span.

During those final three seasons in Harrisonburg, Brooks and the Dukes compiled an impressive 60-3 record in conference play.

He was named CAA Coach of the Year for a fourth time in 2015-16, while his student-athletes also garnered CAA Player and Rookie of the Year honors.

Brooks registered winning campaigns in 13 of his 14 seasons in Harrisonburg, ascending to No. 23 in the AP Poll and No. 21 in the USA Today Coaches Poll in 2014-15 as his squad tied a school record with 29 victories. In 2013-14, he led the Dukes to their first NCAA Tournament victory since 1991 when his 11 th-seeded Dukes knocked off sixth-seeded Gonzaga 72-63 in the first round. In 2007, the Dukes earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament, marking only the second time a CAA team had received an at-large berth.

Under Brooks, JMU tallied six CAA Players of the Year, three Rookies of the Year and two Defensive Players of the Year. The Dukes also recorded 31 All-CAA selections, 11 Defensive team and 10 All-Rookie team selections during his tenure.

The Waynesboro, Virginia, native has coached three WNBA Draft picks; first-rounder Tamera Young, as well as Lauren Okafor and Jazmon Gwathmey, in addition to several other players who have signed professional contracts.

A 1992 graduate of James Madison, Brooks played for three seasons under legendary coach Lefty Driesell and made two NIT appearances while earning a degree in business management. He began his coaching career as a part-time assistant for the 1993-94 JMU men's squad that won the CAA Tournament and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

After four seasons as an assistant for the men's program at VMI (1994-98), he moved back to his alma mater as a men's assistant from 1998-2002. He was named interim women's head coach on Dec. 6, 2002 before taking over those duties on a full-time basis on March 21, 2003.

Brooks and his wife, the former Chrissy Stewart have four children; Kendyl, Chloe, Gabby and Nicholas.

For more than half a century, Cassell Coliseum has provided Virginia Tech with one of the greatest home venues in all of college sports. Winning has been the norm in the facility since its opening in 1961, and Cassell is perhaps even more exciting today than ever in its history.

Cassell serves as the home to Virginia Tech women's basketball, volleyball and wrestling programs, and in 2010-11, the Virginia Tech athletics department celebrated Cassell's 50th anniversary by bringing back many of the former great players and coaches in various sports who have played in the arena. Also, the first men's basketball team ever to play in Cassell was recognized.

Construction for the main portion of Cassell began in 1961, and though not completed, the Tech men's basketball team opened the arena on Jan. 3, 1962, with a $91-67$ victory over Alabama. The team played in the building for two years before workers from T.C. Brittain and Company of Decatur, Ga., finished the building in December of 1964 at a cost of $\$ 2.7$ million.

For years, the arena was called the Virginia Tech Coliseum. But on September 17, 1977, Virginia Tech officials and friends dedicated the coliseum in honor of the late Stuart K. Cassell, who spearheaded the project. In the late 1950s, Cassell, who was the chief business officer at the time and later became the vice president of the school, saw the need for a new basketball arena to replace the outdated War Memorial Gymnasium, and he eventually managed to get the state legislature to ap-
 prove the building of the 8,000-seat arena. Cassell, though, found a seat manufacturer that made seats a little smaller than normal seats and squeezed an extra 2,000 seats into the building, bringing the capacity to 10,000 .

Since that time, Cassell Coliseum has undergone many renovations and additions to make it the building it is today. The latest addition came in the fall of 2013 when Tech officials hired Panasonic to install two new video scoreboards with high-definition LED displays on each end of the arena. The scoreboards are 18 feet high and 29 feet wide - more than double the size of the previous video scoreboards - and enhance the fan experience. Combined with a new video scoreboard for Lane Stadium, the Hokies' football home, and a new control room, the project cost nearly $\$ 7$ million.

Other improvements have been made. Prior to the 2003-04 season, the concourse area was renovated and now features more accessible concession areas, new flooring, video monitors that allow fans to watch the action when not in the arena and the addition of Hokie stone to many of the entrances to the seating area. In 2001-02, the seats were stripped of their original paint and refinished to retain their natural wood look. In 1996-97, workers replaced the roof of the facility and installed structural access to the heating and lighting systems. They also restored and resealed the exterior concrete walls and buttresses.

Through new projects, renovations and maintenance reserve projects, Cassell Coliseum has undergone approximately $\$ 10$ million in improvements over the past decade.

Cassell Coliseum today ranks as one of the most difficult places for opposing teams to play and is considered one of the best home environments in all of college sports.

## CARILION CLINIC COURT

The court at Cassell Coliseum received a makeover during the summer months in 2017. Three iconic campus landmarks, Torgersen Bridge, Burruss Hall and the Pylons are depicted on the court, in addition to a Hokie Stone design surrounding the playing surface. Featured prominently near midcourt is the logo of Carilion Clinic, a proud supporter of Virginia Tech Athletics. The court was named Carilion Clinic Court at Cassell Coliseum as part of the partnership between Carilion Clinic and Virginia Tech Athletics.

## THE NEW RIVER VALLEY BELONGS TO THE HOKIES

- Tech has dominated the matchup with nearby Radford, particularly in recent years, winning nine straight meetings by an average margin of 21.1 points.
- After the Dec. 4, 2018 victory, Tech now leads the series 28-9.
- Taylor Emery's 21 points lifted the Hokies to a gritty 55-44 win on Carilion Clinic Court. Regan Magarity also secured 16 rebounds for the Hokies who improved to $9-0$ on the season with the win.


## HOKIES CONTINUE TO FIND SUCCESS IN ACC/BIG TEN CHALLENGE

- The Hokies, who defeated Rutgers 67-51 on Nov. 28 have now won four straight in the competition by an average margin of 19.2 points per game.
- The matchup with Rutgers was the first for the programs in the competition, and the first in the series since 2004 when both schools were members of the Big East conference.
- Tech is 7-6 all-time in the Challenge and have a remarkably close margin in points scored (VT 803, opponents 777).
- The Hokies have now defeated Rutgers, Illinois, Nebraska and Penn State in consecutive seasons in the competition.


## COACH BROOKS REACHES MILESTONE IN BLACKSBURG

- Hokies' Head Coach Kenny Brooks earned his 50th win since moving to Blacksburg in 2016 with the squad's 85-57 victory over Richmond at the UCF Thanksgiving Tournament.
- Brooks needed just 78 games to reach the feat.
- He now stands at 390 career victories, earning the first 337 at his alma mater, James Madison.


## FLORIDIANS SHINE IN HOME STATE AT UCF THANKSGIVING TOURNAMENT

- The Virginia Tech roster features four student-athletes from the Sunshine State and two, Taylor Emery and Trinity Baptiste showed out in Orlando.
- Emery scored 22 points and grabbed 7 rebounds in the Hokies' win over Villanova on Saturday. Then on Sunday the Tampa native went a perfect 10 for 10 from the free throw line for the second time in her career, scoring 13 points as Tech easily defeated Richmond.
- Baptiste scored two field goals Saturday, including the game-winning and-one with 2.8 seconds on the clock. Sunday against Richmond, the forward had a game-high 24 points, including three triples as she recorded a double-double.


## DOMINANT AT HOME

- The Hokies have recorded 48 consecutive non-conference victories at home dating back to a 74-42 victory over Longwood on 12/06/14.

## JEAN BACK IN ACTION

- Senior forward Alexis Jean returned to the floor last week in the Hokies; 67-51 victory over Rutgers in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge, scoring her only field goal attemmpt in seven minutes of work. - It was her first appearance of the season following a shoulder injury which occured in practice before the season tipped off.
- Jean averaged 8.8 points and 6.1 rebounds per game last season, her first with the Hokies.


## HOT OUT OF THE GATE

- The Hokies dropped 96 points in the season opening win over USC Upstate. It was the most since Tech poured in 99 against Wagner in last season's opener.
- The 60 second half points were the most since at least 2016 when Kenny Brooks took the helm of the program. - Tech has 10 wins in its history by a 50-point margin, with two of those coming under Coach Brooks.
- The Hokies made 13 triples against the Spartans, the most of any contest of the season so far.


## THAT'S THE WAY TO START A <br> CAREER!

- Sophomore forward Trinity Baptiste came off of the bench to record a double-double in her first career game with the Hokies, tallying 10 points an 10 rebounds. It was the first time since 1981 that a player recorded a double-double to open the season as a newcomer. - She then repeated the feat in the Hokies' second game against Georgia Southern, going for 13 points and 12 rebounds.


## ALREADY MAKING HISTORY TOGETHER

- Forwards Regan Magarity and Trinity Baptiste have already carved out some history, recording concurrent double-doubles three times in 2018-19. That tally is already tied for third in the annals of Virginia Tech women's basketball history.


## THREE DOUBLE-DOUBLES IN ONE NIGHT

- Tech's trio of Regan Magarity (18 points, 11 rebounds), Trinity Baptiste (13 points, 12 rebounds) and Taylor Emery (14 points, 10 rebounds) each recorded double-doubles in the Hokies' 78-49 victory over Georgia Southern.
- It was the fourth time in program history that the feat had been accomplished, and the first since 1986.


## FIRST TIME ON THE ROAD, A LITTLE NERVY FOR THE HOKIES

- Tech opened the season 2-0 at home before travelling outside the confines of Cassell Coliseum, up I-81 to take on Liberty in Lynchburg, Virginia.
- The Hokies bested a quality Flames squad that featured in the 2018 NCAA Tournament 72-61.
- Four players were in double figures that night as Tech moved to 3-0 on the season; Taylor Emery (13), Dara Mabrey (13), Trinity Baptiste (12) and Rachel Camp (10).


## MABREY, A TRUE FRESHMAN AND A TRUE TALENT

- Dara Mabrey has started each of the Hokies' contests so far and has acquitted herself well, averaging 13.7 points and shooting .500 from the floor in 26 minutes of work each night.
- Mabrey, the youngest of three in a basketball family, has an older sister Marina who plays for ACC foe Notre Dame and an older sister Michaela who also played hoops for the Fighting Irish.
- The Belmar, New Jersey native went off for 26 points against Monmouth, a school just minutes from her hometown. She knocked down 4 of 6 shots from beyond the arc in that contest and also grabbed 7 rebounds.

## RECORD SETTING OPENING NIGHT

-Not only did the Hokies defeat USC Upstate by a 51-point margin, they did so in record setting fashion. JUCO transfer Trinity Baptiste recorded a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds in her Virginia Tech debut. That was the first opening night double-double for a newcomer since 1981, when Fran Pfister had 11 points and 10 rebounds in Tech's 89-58 win over William \& Mary.
-Tech also set some watermarks for the Kenny Brooks era, recording 22 assists as a team. It was the most in the program since the Hokies amassed 23 in a 80-44 victory against NC Central in 2014.
-The Hokies' 60-point second half was the most in a single half since Coach Brooks arrived in Blacksburg.

## EMERY ONE OF THE ACC'S BEST

-Senior guard Taylor Emery, fresh off of the most prolific scoring season in program history has been anmed a preseason All-ACC performer by the league's head coaches.
-Emery was a Second Team selection during the 201718 season where she averaged 18.5 points per game and set the Virginia Tech record for points scored in a season with 667.

## HOKIES RECEIVING VOTES

-In the preseason Associated Press Poll, Virginia Tech earned two votes. In the latest poll, Tech has received five votes.

## COACHES PICK TECH 10TH

-Tech was selected in the preseason behind National Champions Notre Dame and regular season league champs, Louisville as well as a plethora of other NCAA teams including; Syracuse, NC State, Miami, Duke anfd Florida State.
-Last season, the Hokies finished in a tie for ninth, occupying the nine seed during tournament play after a 6-10 regular season.

## A FAMILIAR NAME IN THE ACC

-Tech's freshman point guard Dara Mabrey, comes from a basketball family that includes two sisters who have suited up for Muffet McGraw at Notre Dame. -Marina is a senior guard for the Irish who helped the squad win the National Championship a season ago. -The Mabrey sisters will go head to head when the Irish head to Blacksburg for a 7 p.m. tip on Jan. 16 at Cassell Coliseum.

## BASKETBALL RUNS IN THE FAMILY

-Another Brooks has joined Head Coach Kenny on the court in Blacksburg this season with the arrival of freshman guard Chloe.
-The younger sister of junior sharpsooter Kendyl, Chloe was a State Champion in 2016 with Spotswood High.
