## About Tonight's Game

The Hokies enter the game 6-1 on the season and the Keydets are 5-4 this season ... The Hokies are ranked 15th in the AP poll and 14th in the USA Today Coaches poll .

## Last Time Out: VT 94, CCSU 40

The Hokies picked up a 94-40 win over Central Connecticut State on Saturday evening in Cassell Coliseum ... Ahmed Hill led four Hokies in double figures with a season-high 24 points ... Kerry Blackshear Jr., added 18 points, Ty Outlaw had 15 points and Nickeil Alexander-Walker scored14 points ... Justin Robinson set a new Virginia Tech record with 13 assists in the game and he led the Hokies with seven rebounds ... Tech shot 57.1 percent for the game and made a school-record 18 threepointers.

## Vs. VMI

This is the most-played non-conference opponent for the Hokies ... Tech holds a 91-43 lead in the all-time series, which dates back to the 1908-09 season ... The Hokies have won the last six meetings overall and the 10 meetings in Blacksburg ... Tech is 3-0 against the Keydets under Buzz Williams ... The two teams did not meet last season ... The series dates back to a $15-9 \mathrm{VMI}$ win in Lexington in 1909 ... Tech held a 53-27 series lead when both teams were members of the Southern Conference ... Tech is 2-0 in games against VMI when the Hokies have been ranked ... Tech is 156-64 all-time against schools currently in the Southern Conference.

## Lots to Get To

In the win over Central Connecticut State, the Hokies had quite the game ... The Hokies set a new school record by making 18 threepoint field goals in the game ... It surpassed the former mark of 17 three-pointers made at Louisville on Feb. 8, 2017 ... The 94-40 final score marks the 11th time a Buzz Williamscoached Virginia Tech team has scored at least 94 points and the first time this season and the first time since defeating Radford, 9568, in Cassell Coliseum on Dec. 6, 2017 .. The 54-point margin of victory is the most for the Hokies under Williams and the most since Tech defeated Mount St. Mary's, 99-34 (65 points) on Jan. 2011 in Cassell Coliseum ... CCSU's 40 points is the second-fewest of the season for a Tech opponent.

## All By Himself

In the win over Central Connecticut State, Justin Robinson dished out a career-high 13 assists, breaking the old school mark of 12 assists in a game, most recently set by Robinson at Boston


Justin Robinson College last season ...
Others with 12 assists in a game include Dave Sensibaugh, Bimbo Coles and Troy Manns ... It is the fourth time he has had double figures in assists in a game ... Robinson accomplished the feat in just 28 minutes of action.

## Med Heats Up

In the win over Central Connecticut State, Ahmed Hill had one of his best nights as a Hokie ... Hill scored a season-high 24 points, the fifth time this season he has scored in double figures and the second time he has
 scored at least 20 points ... The 24 points is the second-highest point total by a Hokie this season, behind Nickeil Alexander-
Walker's 25 points in the win over \#23 Purdue ... Hill tied his career-high with six made three-points, going 6-of-9 from behind the arc ... He also tied a career-high with three steals ... He also surpassed the 1,100 career point mark at Virginia Tech and tied Brian Chase for 39th in career scoring at Tech ... Hill now has 1,115 career points.

## Wrapping Up the CCSU Win

Kerry Blackshear Jr., scored 18 points, the sixth time this season he has been in double figures. He also added a season-high five assists ... Nickeil Alexander-Walker scored 14 points. He has scored in double figures in all seven games this season... Ty Outlaw scored 15 points. That is his third consecutive double figure scoring game this season ... Isaiah Wilkins earned the first start of his young career ... P.J. Horne earns his second career start and first of the season... Tech held the Blue Devils to just 17 second half points, the second time in as many home games that Tech held an opponent under 20 points in a half ... Tech held CCSU to just 18.5 percent from the field in the second half, including 15.4 percent from three-point range after the intermission.

## What a Sell Out

The Central Connecticut State game was officially a sell out ... It was the Hokies' first announced sell out of the season ... The Hokies sold out nine games in the 2017-18 season, including seven of the nine home Atlantic Coast Conference games ... Single game tickets and mini plans for Tech's other home games are still available ... Quantities are limited and the best available seats are going fast ... Virginia Tech's ACC single game tickets will go on sale in midDecember, if available.

## Tech in the Polls

The Virginia Tech Hokies are currently ranked 15th in the AP poll ... Tech has been as high as 13 th this season, the school's highest AP ranking since the 1995-96 season ... Tech peaked that season in late February at No. 8, its all-time highest ranking ... The last time the Hokies played a game ranked higher than 13th was on Feb. 25, 1996, a 57-41 loss at Temple when the Hokies were ranked 12th ... Tech is 14 th in the USA Today Coaches poll.

## Keep It Low

In the win over Saint Francis, the Hokies held the Red Flash to 37 points ... That is the fewest points allowed by the Hokies under Buzz Williams and the fewest since allowing Mount St. Mary's 34 points in a 99-34 win over the Mountaineers on Jan. 2, 2011 in Cassell Coliseum ... It is the second-fewest points allowed by an ACC team this season ... Tech allowed SFU just 15 points in the second half, the fewest points allowed in a half under Williams and the fewest points allowed in any half since allowing Miami just 15 points in the first half on Feb. 15, 2014 ... The last time Tech allowed fewer than 15 points in a half was on Dec. 22, 2011, when Tech allowed Eastern Michigan just nine first half points ... Tech held Central Connecticut State to 40 points on Dec. 1.

## Climbing the Lists

In the loss to Louisville last season, Ahmed Hill became the 47th player in Virginia Tech history to record 1,000 career points ... In the win over No. 5 Duke last year, Justin Robinson scored his 1,000th career point ... Robinson passed Coleman Collins in the Penn State game and is now 37th on the career scoring list at 1,161 and Hill is now tied with Brian Chase for 39th place with 1,115 .

## Getting on Track

In the win over Saint Francis, Ty Outlaw was 5-of-9 from three-point range ... Outlaw entered the game with just four made three-pointers in the first four games combined ... Outlaw followed that by
 going 4-of-5 from behind the arc at Penn State and follwed that with a 3-of-5 effort in the win over Central Connecticut State ... Outlaw is 12 -of- 19 from three in the last two games, for 63.2 percent... Outlaw holds the Virginia Tech record for most three-pointers in a game, with eight against Miami two years ago ... He is 73-of-149 in this Tech career, for 49.0 percent.

## A Giving "5"

With his seven assists in the win over Saint Francis, Justin Robinson moved into fourth place at Virginia Tech in career assists, passing AI Young ... He currently has 487 career assists.

## That's a TO

Virginia Tech forced Gardner-Webb into 29 turnovers in the season-opener ... That is the most forced turnovers for the Hokies under Buzz Williams ... The 29 forced turnovers are the most by a Virginia Tech team since forcing UNC Greensboro into 29 turnovers on Nov. 21, 2010 in the Greensboro Coliseum ... The last time the Hokies forced 30-or-more turnovers in a game was 35 forced turnovers against Maryland-Eastern Shore on Nov. 23, 2004 in Cassell Coliseum ... The school record is 37 forced turnovers, twice, most recently by VMI in 1983 ... The Hokies forced Northeastern into 18 turnovers in the win in Charleston and 22 turnovers in the win over Saint Francis on Nov. 24.

## Sharing is Good

Virginia Tech recorded a season-high 28 assists on 36 made baskets in the win over Central Connecticut State ... Tech had 20 assists on 32 made baskets in the win over Gardner-Webb ... Tech reached the 20-assist mark eight times last year, including a school-record 36 assists in the win over The Citadel ... Tech had 21 assists on 36 baskets in the win over Northeastern and 22 assists on just 27 made baskets in the win over Saint Francis.

## Big Week for NAW Nickeil Alexander-

 Walker earned big props following his performance in the Charleston Classic ... In leading the Hokies to the championship, Alexander-Walker was named the Most Valuable Player in the event, joining

on the all-tournament team ... On Monday, Nov. 19, Alexander-Walker was named the ACC Player of the Week for the first time in his career ... His 25 points in the win over Purdue was his second-highest career point total, trailing only his 29 points in a win over The Citadel last season ... His seven rebounds in the game was a season-high for him and also his second-best performance on the glass ... His seven assists in the win over Northeastern is a new career-high.

## Gimme That!

Virginia Tech recorded 16 steals in the win over Gardner-Webb ... That is the most steals in a game by the Hokies since Nov. 21, 2010, when Tech forced UNC Greensboro into 20 steals ... The 16 steals is the most in a game for the Hokies under Buzz Williams and just the sixth time that Tech has had double figure steals in a game under Williams ... That number moved up to seven times with double-digit steals with the 11 steals at Penn State.

## Ah, Youth

Isaiah Wilkins is the
10th-youngest player in Division I basketball this season and the fourthyoungest among Power 6 players ... Wilkins was born on September 29, 2000.

Isaiah Wilkins was 5-of-7 from threepoint range in the win over Gardner-Webb ... That is the most three-pointers in a game by a Virginia Tech freshman since Justin Bibbs was 5-of-6 from three-point range in a win over Miami of Ohio in the 2014-15 season ... The school record for three-pointers in a game by a freshman at Virginia Tech is six, by Carlos Dixon against High Point on Dec. 30, 2000 ... In the win over Saint Francis, Wilkins came off the bench to lead the team with eight rebounds in just 13 minutes of action ... He earned his first career start in the win over Central Connecticut State.

## Home Streak

Virginia Tech has won 20 consecutive home non-conference regular season games ... The school record is 23 , set twice, once between Jan. 29, 1981 and Jan. 7, 1984 and from Nov. 13, 2005 and Nov. 26, 2009.

## Lots of People Watching 5

Justin Robinson is one of 20 players named to the 2018-19 Bob Cousy Award Watch List ... The award is given annually by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame to the top point guard in the nation ... He is one of 50 players named to the 2019 Citizen Naismith Trophy Men's Player of the Year watch list ... The award is given annually by the Atlanta Tipoff Club to the nation's top player ... Robinson is one of 50 players named to the 2019 John R. Wooden Award, presented by Wendy's Player of the Year watch list ... Robinson is one of 40 players on the Lute Olson Award Watch List.

## Tech in NCAA Stats

As of Dec. 4th, the Hokies are fourth in three-point field goal percentage, 16th in turnover margin, seventh in three-point field goal per game and scoring margin, ninth in scoring defense and 10th nationally in field goal percentage and turnover margin ... Tech is 16 th in assists per game, 24th in assist turnover ratio and 30th in steals per game.

## Analytics and All

As of Dec. 4th, the Hokies are ranked 10th by Kenpom.com ... Tech isleads the nation in defensive three-point percentage, is second in defensive free throw rate, third in defensive turnover percentage and effective field goal percentage, fourth in three-point percentage, sixth in raw offensive efficiency and seventh in adjusted offensive efficiency and three-point field goal percentage ... Tech is 29th in assist percentage and 35 th in defensive efficiency.

## Defeating Ranked Teams

With the win over No. 23/22 Purdue, the Hokies are 1-0 against ranked teams this season ... The Hokies were 4-3 against ranked teams last season and 3-6 in the 2016-17 season ... The seven combined wins against nationally-ranked teams in the two previous season are the most in a two-year span in school history ... The wins over No. 10 UNC and No. 2 Virginia last season marked the first time Tech won two straight against top 10 teams since winning three straight against top 10 teams in 2007 ... The win at UVa was Tech's second-ever against a team ranked second nationally (the other was a 76-72 win over No. 2 Memphis State on Feb. 1, 1986) ... Tech's last previous road win against a ranked team was on Jan. 22, 2012, when Tech defeated No. 15 Virginia in John Paul Jones Arena ... Tech has defeated No. 5 Duke in Cassell Coliseum in each of the last two seasons.

## Top Returner

Nickeil Alexander-Walker is one of only seven returning sophomores in the Power 6 to start every game during their rookie season ... The Toronto native is one of just two in the ACC, joining Oshae Brissett of Syracuse ... Of the seven players, Alexander-Walker owns the third-best points per game mark among the group, trailing lowa State's Lindell Wigginton (16.7 ppg) and Brissett (14.9) ... He also has the second-most 3 -pointers made (58) and 3-point field goal percentage (.392) ... Last season, 30 freshmen in the Power Five and BIG EAST started 25 or more games for their squads, including Alexader-Walker ... Among that group, arguably the best sophomores in the country, AlexanderWalker had the third-best 3-point field goal percentage, trailing Stanford's Daejon Davis (.403) and Wigginton (.401).

For the second consecutive season, Virginia Tech won the Commonwealth Clash, the annual athletic competition between Virginia Tech and the University of Virginia last year ... The Hokies won last year's Commonwealth Clash 12.5-8.5, after winning on a tie-breaker the previous season, when the score was 11-11 ... Tech leads this season, 3-1.5 $\ldots$ This season's two men's basketball games will count towards half a point each ... The Commonwealth Clash is sponsored by Virginia529, The Official College Savings Plan of Virginia Tech.

## Wrapping Up The Purdue Win

Ahmed Hill, who only had five points in the first half on the Purdue win, exploded for 18 points in the second half on 6-of10 shooting, including three 3-pointers and three free throws ... It was his most points in a game since Nov. 17, 2017, versus Washington when he had 23 ... The Hokies made more free throws than Purdue attempted, as they made 19-of-26 compared to Purdue's 7 -of-11 mark ... The win over Purdue marks the first time that the Hokies have ever defeated a ranked Big Ten team ... Tech is the fifth ACC team to win the championship at the Charleston Classic, joining Clemson (2008), Miami ('09, '14) and Virginia ('15) ... It's been 10 years since the Hokies won a non-conference tournament, winning the Holiday Festival title in New York in 2008 ... This is the first three-game in-season tournament that Virginia Tech has ever won.

## 505 and Counting

Tech has now hit a three-point field goal in 505 consecutive games ... Since the three-point arc was added for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time Tech did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003.

## About Attendance

Virginia Tech has increased percentage of capacity in each of the last four seasons ... Tech ranked seventh in percent of capacity in the ACC last season at 83 percent ... The year before, the Hokies were eighth at 76 percent ... Tech was ranked 11th at 67 percent in the 2015-16 season and 13th at 58 percent in the 2014-15 season ... This past season, the Hokies had an average attendance of 7,678 , up from 7,476 the year before and 5,744 in the 201415 season ... Tech is second in average attendance growth in the ACC over the past four season, with a 34 percent increase in attendance, trailing only Miami ... Season ticket sales increased by more than 1,000 last season and has a 62 percent increase in sales in the past four seasons ... Tech had an all-time high of 6,107 season tickets sold last season ... ## Head Coach Buzz Williams

Buzz Williams has proven that hard work, determination and an eye for details are key aspects in building an elite-level collegiate basketball program. The head coach of the men's squad is in his fifth season in Blacksburg and has the Hokies poised to continue their growth as a program in the toughest conference in college basketball. He and his staff take a simplistic, yet very effective approach - "Get Better."

Though his program has earned growing acclaim nationally, Williams does not focus on such external praise. He wakes up every morning with a sense of purpose to make the Hokies the best that they can be.

On Jan. 29, 2017, the Hokies defeated Boston College, 85-79, to give Williams his 200th career victory. Now beginning his 12th season as a collegiate head coach, Williams has an overall record of 233-147. Williams has compiled a 80-61 record, now in his fifth season in Blacksburg.

To cap off the 2017-18 season,
the Hokies made a second consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance, the first time the school could claim that in more than three decades. The Hokies finished the season 21-12 overall and $10-8$ in the ACC. Tech made it three consecutive 20 -win season and three consecutive 10 -win ACC seasons.

The Hokies took care of business in the regular season. They defeated four nationally-ranked teams for the first time in school history, including three wins against top 10 programs. The Hokies also finished 11-2 in the nonconference regular season slate.

The 2016-17 season was their most successful season in the last decade. Tech finished the season 22-11 overall and earned its first NCAA Tournament bid since 2007. Tech was 10-8 in the ACC regular season for the second consecutive season. The Hokies claimed three top 25 victories against ACC foes and finished with an impressive 11-1 record in non-conference regular season action.

Williams led the Hokies through many of the usual obstacles that beset college basketball programs each season. Injuries were one such obstacle, but the Hokies weathered the injuries and continued to achieve. Towards the end of the season, with just a handful of
healthy bodies, Tech thrived and earned its at-large NCAA Tournament berth through its efforts.

In his second season, the Hokies were one of the most improved teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference and the NCAA. Predicted, once again, to reside near the bottom of the league standings, the Hokies finished with a 20-15 overall record under Williams, including a 10-8 mark in the ACC. Tech advanced to the second round of the 2016 NIT, defeating Princeton at home in overtime before falling at BYU two days later.

In his inaugural season at Virginia Tech, Williams led the Hokies to an 11-22 overall record. He began building the culture that would allow the Hokies to enjoy future successes. The team went a long ways toward establishing an identity - one predicated on hard work, accountability both on and off the court and playing with a tough, competitive nature.

Recruiting is the lifeblood of any intercollegiate athletics program, and Williams has led the Hokies to new heights in this area. While he has been able to attract elite recruits, he is less focused on national perception and more focused on finding what he likes to call, "OKGs", or "our kind of guys."

Williams came to Virginia Tech following six seasons as the head coach of the Marquette Golden Eagles. At Marquette, he had a record of 13969 and led the team to five NCAA Tournament appearances, including a trip to the regional finals in the 2012-13 season - the same season that the team won the Big East Conference regularseason title. Williams led the Golden Eagles to a 69-39 Big East Conference record during his time in Milwaukee. During Williams' tenure, six Marquette players made it to the NBA.

Williams was an assistant at Marquette during the 2007-08 season. MU concluded the year 25-10 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003.

His coaching career has included stints as an assistant, associate head and head coach. He has been at the NCAA Division I level for 21 seasons, and 2018-19 will mark his 12th campaign as a head coach. Williams has recruited and coached more than 20 players who have earned all-conference accolades, including two league Players of the Year, two conference Freshmen of the Year and four Associated Press All-Americans.

Williams arrived in Milwaukee after serving for one season as the head coach at the University of New

Orleans. He guided the Privateers to a 14-win campaign in 2006-07. His roster featured Bo McCalebb, the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. UNO claimed fourth place in the Sun Belt's Western Division and advanced to the league tournament quarterfinals. The squad claimed as many victories on the road that season as it had in the previous three seasons combined. His recruiting class for the 2007-08 season was ranked in the top 50 nationally by HoopScoopOnline.com.

Prior to UNO, Williams served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas A\&M for two seasons (2004-05 and 2005-06) under head coach Billy Gillispie. Both of his recruiting classes with the Aggies were ranked among the best in the nation and featured some of the top-ranked talent at the prep level. The squad made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in

25 years in 2005-06. The previous team posted the top turnaround in the nation, improving its win total in 2004-05 by 14 games compared to 2003-04.

Williams spent four seasons (200001 through 2003-04) at Colorado State, where he served as an assistant the first three seasons before being promoted to associate head coach in 2003-04. Two of his recruiting classes were ranked among the 40 best in the nation, including the 2003 group, which was tabbed No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference. Colorado State made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 13 years during his tenure, and HoopScoopOnline.com named him one of the top assistants in the country.

The Van Alstyne, Texas, native was previously an assistant at Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A\&MKingsville (1998-99) and TexasArlington (1994-98). He earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Oklahoma City University in 1994 before completing his master's work in the same field at Texas A\&M-Kingsville in 1999.

Williams is married to the former Corey Norman and the couple have two daughters, Zera and Addyson, and two sons, Calvin and Mason.
