TECH HEADS TO CHAPEL HILL FOR FINAL REGULAR SEASON WEEKEND

The Hokies close out regular season at North Carolina: Virginia Tech will finish its 125th regular season of baseball in Chapel Hill this weekend with a three-game ACC series with the sixth-ranked North Carolina Tar Heels. First game of the set is Thursday with a scheduled 6 p.m. first pitch.

Hokies versus UNC: There has not been much success for the Tech against the Tar Heels, especially since the Hokies joined the ACC in 2005. UNC holds the overall mark at 73-26-2, with a 31-4 record in ACC games, a 39-13-2 mark at home and is 12-0-1 in ACC series (see Page 5 for more).

Of note, the last time Tech played in Chapel Hill, April 10, 2016 - the Hokies won 4-3, which was their first victory there since 1976 that also ended a school record 17-game losing streak that season.

Some success on the road: Entering its last road weekend, Tech is eyeing a chance to surpass the most wins on the road in conference play since 2013. The Hokies have already won four games on the road in the league - one each at Georgia Tech, Boston College, Virginia and Notre Dame. The four victories are more than the last two year's win totals combined - the team went 1-14 in 2017 and 2-13 in 2016. Since 2013, when the team tied the program's best mark with an 8-7 road league record, Tech had won at most four games - in 2015 - the last time they made the ACC Tournament.

Eying a couple century marks: Sam Fragale enters the weekend just four hits shy of 200 for his career. He would join Tom Stoffel, who notched his 200th hit May 1, and become just the 11th player since Tech joined the ACC (2005) to reach the milestone. Stoffel and Fragale would be the first two teammates to collect hit No. 200 in the same season since Alex Perez and Brendon Hayden (2015).

Connor Coward enters the weekend with 193 career strikeouts, which is currently tied for the fourth most ever during a pitcher's career as an ACC player. If he can post seven strikeouts this weekend, he'd be the first Hokie with 200 since Joe Mantipty (227, 2010-13).

Lastly, Jack Owens (runs), Luke Scherzer (strikeouts) and Joe Freiday, Jr. (hits) all enter the weekend three shy in their respective category from reaching the 100-mark milestone.

Seymour in rare company: Ian Seymour has a chance to do what no Tech freshman pitcher has done before in the ACC - lead the team in ERA overall and in ACC-only games. The last freshman to lead the team in ERA was Joe Saunders (3.92, 2000). He also has a chance to post just the second sub-3.00 ERA in league-only play (min. 20 IP) joining Joe Mantipty (2.73, 2013). Lastly, Seymour - along with Coward - have now become the fifth and sixth pitchers to reach 50 strikeouts in ACC-only action. The others: Marc Zecchino (70, 2011) and 2010 pitchers Justin Wright (60), Mathew Price (56) and Jesse Hahn (50).

Virginia Tech Head Coach - First Season



Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock announced the hiring of Tech's 25th head baseball coach on June 9 and formally introduced John Szefc as the head coach of the baseball program on June 15.

Szefc (pronounced SHEFF) accepted the position after leading Maryland to three NCAA appearances and a 180-122 (.596) overall record as the Terrapins' head coach. Prior to his arrival, he owned a 392-259-3 (.602) career record in 12 seasons as an NCAA head coach, producing 10 campaigns with 30 or more wins.

In addition to ending a 43-year NCAA tournament drought and becoming the fastest coach to 100 career wins at Maryland, Szefc spent seven seasons (1996-2002) at the helm of the Marist College baseball program, where he led the team to four conference championships, four NCAA Regional appearances and a 212-137-3 (.607) overall mark. Szefc earned Northeastern Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1997 and was the American Baseball Coaches Associate Northeast Region Coach of the Year in 2001.

The first coach in Maryland history to ever take the Terrapins to an NCAA Super Regional, Szefc accomplished the feat twice in 2014 and 2015 as he guided the program to the first two 40-win seasons in school history and claimed Maryland's first two NCAA Regional crowns. Maryland achieved a final No. 14 ranking both seasons, the highest finishes in school history.

He guided the Terrapins to the ACC Tournament final for the first time in 38 years in 2014 and then took Maryland to the Big Ten tournament final in the school's initial season in that conference, winning a program-best 42 games in 2015.

Szefc has coached 97 players that have been drafted or signed professional contracts since 1997, including six selected in the 2017 MLB draft. Over the last five drafts, 25 of his players have been selected, including the 45th pick of the 2014 draft Jake Stinnett, the highest pick of a Maryland player in almost a decade. He has also helped develop 23 All-Americans, including 10 of the 20 players in Maryland history to earn that distinction.

The Middletown, N.Y. native arrived at Maryland after a two-year stint as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas State (2011-12) and a two-season stay as assistant head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas (2009-10). He also enjoyed a six-season tenure as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Louisiana-Lafayette (2003-08). Szefc began his coaching career as an assistant at Sacred Heart (1995) and at Drexel (1990-93).

Szefc managed the New York Generals in the Atlantic College Baseball League during the summers of 1995 and 1996. He led the club to a 47-28 record, earned two consecutive division titles and the ACBL title game in 1996.

Collegiately, he played two years at Connecticut before transferring in 1987 to Drexel. During his senior campaign for the Dragons, he was tabbed an All-East Coast Conference outfielder.

He graduated from Drexel University with a degree in corporate communications in 1989. He also holds a master's degree in sports administration from Temple University.

Szefc and his wife, Barbara, have a daughter, Anna, and two sons, John Michael and Sam.

WHAT IS A HOKIE?

Probably the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics and the answer dates back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With it came a contest held by the student body for writing a new cheer and senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull said the words had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. "Hokie" soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. Below is the "Old Hokie" yell:

**Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy!
Tech! Tech! V.P.I.!
Sola-Rex Sola-Rah
Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!!
Rae, Ri, V.P.I.**

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE!

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not **recognized names and should not be used.**

This season, Tech has played 11 games versus ranked opponents and are 2-9 - but have been competitive as that mark includes an 1-3 record in one-run games and 0-2 in two-run games.

First year at Tech: Virginia Tech has had 25 head coaches in its 125 seasons, but just seven since 1945.

Szeffc at English Field at Union Park: All-time, Coach John Szeffc is 11-14 in the park, winning his first game here on April 12, 2014.

This season, Szeffc has guided the Hokies to a 10-12 mark at home.

English Field at Union Park

On March 21, 2016, Virginia Tech renamed its baseball stadium to English Field at Union Park in recognition of a generous commitment of support to the athletics department from Union Bank & Trust.

Located at the intersection of Southgate Drive and Duck Pond Drive, English Field at Union Park is an incredible new home for Virginia Tech baseball.

English Field was officially dedicated during a special ceremony on April 8, 1989 and is named for the late E.R. 'Red' English and his wife, Ruth, who provided financial support for its initial construction.

English, a native of Altavista, Va., played as an offensive and defensive guard on Tech's football team from 1930-33 and graduated in 1934.

Through a generous gift from alumnus George Sampson, the home team dugout was named for long-time Tech baseball coach G.F. 'Red' Laird during a ceremony on April 12, 1991.

The team's year-by-year overall mark in its 30 seasons at English Field at Union Park can be seen on the right. Before it, the Hokies played their home baseball games at Tech Park.

Fragale, 100 straight starts and counting: With his start at Virginia (April 6), Sam Fragale started his 100th consecutive game for the Hokies, (last 17 of 2016, all 55 last year and every game this season). His current 123-game streak is currently the longest on the team.

The second longest streak was held by Jack Owens, who had started every game he'd played for Tech (99 straight) until an illness kept him out of midweek games versus VMI and Liberty (May 1&2). The honor of second-longest start streak now goes to Tom Stoffel, whose at 75 straight starts.

With Fragale and Stoffel both set to depart after the season, the longest streak - if each of these men continue to start the rest of the season - will fall to Nick Menken, who has started every game since March 27, a span of 29 straight, and Nick Owens, who's at 28 straight.

Last season, Ryan Tufts finished his career by starting in his last 127 games at Tech.

Tech playing ACC Doubleheaders: In its history in the ACC, Tech has played 26 doubleheaders and overall has won two, lost nine and has split 15. Of the 26 doubleheaders, it's split right down the middle with 13 of them being played on the road and 13 at English Field at Union Park. This season, they've played two at home (Pittsburgh and Louisville) and two on the road (at Boston College, at Virginia) splitting three of four. Overall, Tech has played five doubleheaders this year.

On the road, the Hokies are 0-5-8 in DHs, while they are 2-4-7 in ACC DHs at English Field at Union Park. Tech played seven DHs last season, including five in the ACC. They split the two ACC DHs played at home against Georgia Tech (April 21) and No. 3 North Carolina (May 13). On the road, they lost two - at Pittsburgh (March 25) and at Miami (May 19) - and split at Duke (March 11).

Hokies start 2-0 in ACC for first time ever: In 14 seasons in the league, Tech is now 6-8 in ACC openers, including winners in three of its last four, as the Hokies picked up a 4-1 victory over Pittsburgh, March 9. For the first time in six tries, the Hokies then won their second game as well, with a 3-1 victory over the Panthers the next day, giving Tech its first ever 2-0 start in ACC play. They lost the back half of the doubleheader that Saturday ending the chance for its first ever 3-0 start.

A rare 1-0 ballgame: On Saturday March 31, the Hokies lost to then No. 6 NC State 1-0 - just the second 1-0 contest ever played at English Field at Union Park. The previous one was May 12, 2004, a win over Campbell. The last time Tech lost a home game 1-0 was April 5, 1972 against North Carolina at Tech Park. It was just the second 1-0 game ever played by the Hokies in an ACC game. Tech beat Boston College, 1-0, in Chestnut Hill, Massachusetts on May 3, 2013.

Hokies playing Free Baseball: A couple notes regarding extra-inning games this season for Tech after they played two last ACC weekend versus Miami (Friday and Sunday).

Number one - the Hokies are 3-5 in extra-inning games, as they've played a program record eight in 2018. The previous high was seven completed by the 2013 squad, while both the 2014 and 2017 seasons Tech played six free baseball games.

Number two - Tech's longest game, in terms of innings is 14 - done three times, while the Hokies have played five 13-inning games. The 12-inning game last Friday night versus Miami tied for the second longest ACC game played in Blacksburg behind a March 25, 2006, 13-inning game versus Boston College (a 6-4 loss).

Number three - two extra-inning games in an ACC weekend series has now happened three times in Tech's history and ironically, they've all been played in Blacksburg. In 2006, Tech lost twice to the Eagles in extras (March 25 & 26 - 9-7 in 10), and in 2015, the Hokies split two extra-inning games against Clemson (March 20 - lost 4-0 in 10 & March 22 - won 4-3 in 12).

Number four - the 31 total innings played by Tech and Miami are the second-most ever competed in a three-game ACC weekend, tied with the Clemson series in 2015. The most innings ever played in a three-game ACC series is 32, set by that Boston College series in 2006 and matched by a 2013 series at NC State (April 5-7) that included a 14-inning Friday night start and two nine-inning games.

Tech walks it off: In his first home game as Tech head coach, eighth game overall, John Szefc saw his team win in walk-off fashion in extra innings against Radford, 3-2 in 12 frames (Feb. 27). In the last 10 seasons, the Hokies have had 29 walk-off wins - with the most occurring during the 2012 season, when they had seven, while last year they had just one. The earliest walk-off in that span (by date) was Feb. 25, 2012 - Chad Morgan sac fly in the bottom of the ninth gave Tech a 4-3 win over Iowa in Conway, South Carolina. That game was also the eighth of the season.

In the last four seasons, the Hokies have 13 walk-off wins, eight against ACC opponents. Below is a list of Tech's walk-off victories the last four seasons.

VIRGINIA TECH GAME NOTES - WEEKEND NO. 14



Three pitchers return from TJ: Two Virginia Tech pitchers have made successful returns to the mound this year after coming off Tommy John surgeries, while a third saw his first ever action as a Tech pitcher after the same surgery.

Nic Enright was the Hokies' opening day starter on Feb. 16 at Coastal Carolina and has pitched in 24 games this season with four starts. The last time he appeared on the mound for Tech (before this season) was May 1, 2016.

Making a return from his second TJ surgery in back-to-back years, Luke Scherzer made a one-inning start against Central Michigan on March 7 and has made a total of eight overall. The last time he pitched in a Tech game was May 19, 2015.

After missing last year as a true freshman, Connor Yoder made his first appearance in for Tech versus Louisville (April 14) and has a five total outings.

Coward strikes out a dozen: Connor Coward tied a school record for most strikeouts in an ACC regular-season game when he struck out 12 Pittsburgh Panthers over seven innings in a 4-1 victory (March 9). The last, and only other pitcher, to have 12 strikeouts in an ACC regular-season game was Marc Zecchino, who did it on April 10, 2011 at Wake Forest in seven innings as well.

It was the most punch outs in a regular-season game since 2005, when Ryan Kennedy struck out 15 versus Navy in seven innings on February 20, 2015.

Of note, on May 27, 2010, Justin Wright struck out 15 Georgia Tech batters in an ACC Baseball tournament game, in a nine-inning effort.

Coward strikes out 11 again and again: Only seven pitchers in Tech's ACC history (since 2005) have struck out at least 10 batters twice in a single season, and only two of them, Coward and Zecchino, have struck out at least 11 batters twice and both of those Hokies have done it three times.

Zecchino (in 2011) and Coward both had one 12-K performance and two 11-K efforts. Of those outings, both men struck out 11+ twice against ACC opponents - again, not done by any other pitcher in Tech's history in the league.

Of note, Wright is the only other Tech pitcher with three career 10-plus strikeout games, one in 2009 and two in 2010, while all three of his efforts were against ACC teams (one was in the tournament). Jesse Hahn is the only other pitcher with two 10-K efforts against ACC teams, notching both of his in 2010.

Seymour in select company: With his win over Notre Dame (April 20), freshman Ian Seymour picked up his third win of the season and with it, is on some very short lists for Tech freshman pitchers during an ACC season (since 2005).

First, he becomes the first freshman ever at the school to win a Game 1 ACC start.

Second, he is just the third pitcher with two ACC wins as a starter - joining Justin Wright (2008) and Mathew Price (2009), who also each won two games.

Of note, only four Hokie freshman ever won an ACC start as Packy Naughton (2015) was the fourth.

Third, he's just the third pitcher with three overall wins as a starter (versus any opponent) - joining Price (2009) and Joe Mantiply (2010), who also each won three games. (Lastly, next note)

Seymour strikes out 10: A total of 16 Hokies have struck out 10-plus batters in a game since 2005 and only 11 have done it in an ACC game. Seymour became the first to do it as a freshman, when he struck out 10 Pittsburgh Panthers March 10. Wright and Price each did it once as sophomores.

The last freshman with more than 10 Ks in a game was Pat Pinkman, vs. Liberty, when he struck out 12, March 3, 1998. Pinkman struck out 10 or more batters three times that season.

Seymour sets ACC freshman pitching records at Tech: In ACC-only games, Seymour has tossed 48.2 innings and has 50 strikeouts. When it comes to Tech true freshman pitchers in ACC-only games, he's poised to set both records. He already owns the strikeout mark, passing Mathew Price, who had 41 in 2009, and he's now tied with Price, who threw 48.2 innings that season.

The overall freshman strikeout mark is held by Pinkman with 82 in 1998.

VIRGINIA TECH GAME NOTES - WEEKEND NO. 14



The home run tracker: Sam Fragale hit his eighth home run of the season in Tech's loss to Miami May 11. For Fragale, it was the 31st long ball of his career - which is the second-most in a career for a Hokie since the team started playing in the ACC. Andrew Rash (2010-13) holds the mark for most home runs in a career since 2005 with 42, while Fragale recently broke a tie with Tyler Horan (2011-13), who hit 29. Completing the top five home run hitters as an ACC member are Michael Seaborn (2008-11) with 25 and Brendon Hayden (2012-15) with 24.

More home run tracking: When looking at the most home runs hit by a true freshman at Tech (as a member of the ACC), JD Mundy's five last year tied for the most with Mark Zagunis (2012) and Jose Cueto (2005). Below is a chart for the most home runs hit through a true sophomore season, the number in (XX) is the home runs hit during that season in ACC games.

Owens home runs start the game: Jack Owens opened the ACC series at Georgia Tech (March 16) by hitting a solo home run to center field, the sixth home run of his career. With that round tripper, he became just the third Hokie to hit a game-opening home run on the road in an ACC game (see below, *italics*).

Only seven Hokies have ever hit a leadoff home run in the first inning (on the road or at home, Tech's first at-bat in a game) as a member of the ACC. Below is a list of those men. Saige Jenco is the only player to do it twice, on the road, while Owens joins him as the only players with two Tech first at-bat home runs.

Stoffel ties school/ACC record: In the third game of Tech's ACC series against Pittsburgh on March 10 (Game 2 of the doubleheader), Tom Stoffel tripled in both the first and fifth innings, tying the Tech school record for triples in a game, now done by 15 Hokies. The last Hokie with two triples in a game was Saige Jenco (May 5, 2015 vs. West Virginia), while Tyler Horan was the last to do it in an ACC game (March 16, 2013 at Duke). It also tied the ACC record, which had been done by 73 players prior to Stoffel.

Four freshmen in the starting lineup: At the Westin Lake Mary Stetson Invitational in DeLand, Florida, the Hokies' lineup card on March 3 versus Purdue featured four true freshmen - Cam Irvine in right field, Darion Jacoby in left field, Michael Fernandez as the DH and Ian Seymour on the mound.

The last time a Tech lineup card had four true freshmen on it was in on April 12, 2014 against Maryland - yes, Maryland, who was led by then second-year head coach John Szefc. Getting starts that day were Tom Stoffel (RF), Ricky Surum (SS), Miguel Ceballos (3B) and Aaron McGarity on the mound. Add in redshirt-freshman Saige Jenco and five first-year players made a start that day.

At Boston College (March 22, Game 2), Irvine (DH), Jacoby (LF) and Seymour (SP) were joined by Jojo Odachowski (SS), marking the second time this season four true freshmen were in the Hokies' starting lineup.

Two Hokies earn preseason All-America honors: Sam Fragale, who was a Second Team All-ACC first baseman last season, moved over to third base for the upcoming season and was twice named a preseason All-American at the spot. He earned third team honors from both the NCBWA and Collegiate Baseball.

Tom Stoffel, who was also a Second Team All-ACC selection in the outfield last season, was also selected by Collegiate Baseball as a preseason All-American on the third team, as a utility player.

Horanski named to the 2018 Johnny Bench Award Watch List: The Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission announced the official watch list for the 2018 Johnny Bench Award presented by BaseballSavings.com on March 6 and Tech's Luke Horanski was one of ninety-seven catchers nominated for the award by their coaches. Because the award is given annually to the top division one collegiate catcher, the list will be updated to include other candidates until April 30, 2018.

The watch list will be narrowed down to the semifinalists, whom will be announced May 16, 2018.
