TECH CELEBRATES 125 SEASONS OF BASEBALL DURING WEEKEND SERIES

Tech to honor those of the past during three-game series with Duke: Starting Friday, Tech will face No. 9 Duke at English Field at Union Park for a three-game ACC series that concludes on Sunday. First pitches this weekend are 6 p.m. (Friday), 3 p.m. (Saturday) and 1 p.m. (Sunday). The weekend will be highlighted with the celebration of 125 seasons of Tech baseball with recognition of various players, coaches and eras of Hokies past, including being on the field pregame on Saturday.

Hokies versus Duke (see more Page 5): Tech will be looking to end a series slide this weekend, as the Hokies have dropped four straight ACC series to the Blue Devils, as Duke has taken a 37-26 edge in the overall match-up including a 23-16 mark as ACC members. The Hokies last won a series back in 2013, sweeping Duke in Durham, but are just 3-9 since.

Meanwhile, head coach John Szefc was 4-2 against the Blue Devils while the head coach at Maryland, winning series in both 2012 and 2013.

Coward approaching ACC milestones: In ACC-only games, Connor Coward has thrown a team-best 45.2 innings and has 47 strikeouts. With three potential weekend starts left, he should easily become just the fourth Tech pitcher with 50 strikeouts in ACC play and could be just the second with more than 60. The top four marks entering the weekend belong to Mark Zecchino (70, 2011), Justin Wright (60, 2010), Mathew Price (56, 2010) and Jesse Hahn (50, 2010).

There have been eight Hokies who have thrown more than 60 innings during ACC play, averaging 5.0 innings over his last three potential starts would make him just the ninth.

Tech careers winding down, but marks within reach: Entering the weekend, there are just 13 regular season games left on the Tech schedule and some Hokies are within reach of a few other milestones - these marks are for players since team joined the ACC (since 2005).

First, Tom Stoffel is just three hits shy of becoming just the 10th Hokie to reach 200 career hits, while his 31 hit-by-pitches are tied for the most in a Tech ACC career (Anthony Sosnoskie and Andrew Rash), his 45 career doubles are the eighth-most in a career and his 126 RBI is tied for eighth-most.

Sam Fragale enters the weekend with 180 career hits, an outside shot at reaching 200, but here is where his other career numbers currently rank in a Tech career: 19 sacrifice flies (1st), 143 RBI (T-4th), 317 total bases (6th), 170 starts (8th), 656 at-bats (8th) and 186 games played (9th).

On the mound, Connor Coward is approaching 200 career innings and career strikeouts - as he enters with 196.2 innings (7th all-time) and 188 strikeouts (5th). Only three Hokies have reached 200 in both categories (since 2005): Rhett Ballard (263 K in 274.2 IP from 2006-09), Joe Mantiply (227 K in 299.2 IP from 2010-13) and Justin Wright (216 K in 226.2 IP from 2008-10).

Virginia Tech Head Coach - First Season



Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock announced the hiring of Tech's 25th head baseball coach on June 9 and formally introduced John Szefc as the head coach of the baseball program on June 15.

Szefc (pronounced SHEFF) accepted the position after leading Maryland to three NCAA appearances and a 180-122 (.596) overall record as the Terrapins' head coach. Prior to his arrival, he owned a 392-259-3 (.602) career record in 12 seasons as an NCAA head coach, producing 10 campaigns with 30 or more wins.

In addition to ending a 43-year NCAA tournament drought and becoming the fastest coach to 100 career wins at Maryland, Szefc spent seven seasons (1996-2002) at the helm of the Marist College baseball program, where he led the team to four conference championships, four NCAA Regional appearances and a 212-137-3 (.607) overall mark. Szefc earned Northeastern Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1997 and was the American Baseball Coaches Associate Northeast Region Coach of the Year in 2001.

The first coach in Maryland history to ever take the Terrapins to an NCAA Super Regional, Szefc accomplished the feat twice in 2014 and 2015 as he guided the program to the first two 40-win seasons in school history and claimed Maryland's first two NCAA Regional crowns. Maryland achieved a final No. 14 ranking both seasons, the highest finishes in school history.

He guided the Terrapins to the ACC Tournament final for the first time in 38 years in 2014 and then took Maryland to the Big Ten tournament final in the school's initial season in that conference, winning a program-best 42 games in 2015.

Szefc has coached 97 players that have been drafted or signed professional contracts since 1997, including six selected in the 2017 MLB draft. Over the last five drafts, 25 of his players have been selected, including the 45th pick of the 2014 draft Jake Stinnett, the highest pick of a Maryland player in almost a decade. He has also helped develop 23 All-Americans, including 10 of the 20 players in Maryland history to earn that distinction.

The Middletown, N.Y. native arrived at Maryland after a two-year stint as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas State (2011-12) and a two-season stay as assistant head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas (2009-10). He also enjoyed a six-season tenure as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Louisiana-Lafayette (2003-08). Szefc began his coaching career as an assistant at Sacred Heart (1995) and at Drexel (1990-93).

Szefc managed the New York Generals in the Atlantic College Baseball League during the summers of 1995 and 1996. He led the club to a 47-28 record, earned two consecutive division titles and the ACBL title game in 1996.

Collegiately, he played two years at Connecticut before transferring in 1987 to Drexel. During his senior campaign for the Dragons, he was tabbed an All-East Coast Conference outfielder.

He graduated from Drexel University with a degree in corporate communications in 1989. He also holds a master's degree in sports administration from Temple University.

Szefc and his wife, Barbara, have a daughter, Anna, and two sons, John Michael and Sam.

WHAT IS A HOKIE?

Probably the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics and the answer dates back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With it came a contest held by the student body for writing a new cheer and senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull said the words had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. "Hokie" soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. Below is the "Old Hokie" yell:

**Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy!
Tech! Tech! V.P.I.!
Sola-Rex Sola-Rah
Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!!
Rae, Ri, V.P.I.**

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE!

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not **recognized names and should not be used.**

Facing ranked opponents: The chart on the left shows how the Hokies have fared against any ranked opponent in their history as a member of the ACC. Currently, there are two ACC teams left on Tech's 2018 schedule who are currently ranked in one of the five major polls.

This season, Tech has played eight games versus ranked opponents and are just 1-7 - but have been competitive as that mark includes an 0-3 record in one-run games and 0-2 in two-run games. The Hokies' lone win this season was over then-No. 6 NC State in Game 1 of the ACC series against the Wolfpack, 10-2, and they almost won the series as the Hokies dropped the rubber match, 1-0.

First year at Tech: Virginia Tech has had 25 head coaches in its 125 seasons, but just seven since 1945. Below is how the previous six (along with coach John Szeffc) fared in their first season.

Szeffc at English Field at Union Park: All-time, Coach John Szeffc is 8-9 in the park, winning his first game here on April 12, 2014 as the head coach at Maryland (a 4-2 decision). However, his Terps lost that ACC series two games to one (April 11-13).

This season, Szeffc has guided the Hokies to a 7-7 mark at home.

English Field at Union Park

On March 21, 2016, Virginia Tech renamed its baseball stadium to English Field at Union Park in recognition of a generous commitment of support to the athletics department from Union Bank & Trust. The stadium received substantial upgrading with help from the \$3.5 million committed by the Richmond-based bank. On the date, Virginia Tech's Board of Visitors approved extending naming rights to the stadium to Union Bank for 10 years in recognition of the company's financial support.

Located at the intersection of Southgate Drive and Duck Pond Drive, English Field at Union Park is an incredible new home for Virginia Tech baseball. Designed by Cannon Design and built by Whiting-Turner, the \$20 million renovation project added a new grandstand area - with new press-level premium suites - 1,132 permanent chair-back seats in concrete stands and a club level above the first-base dugout, along with a social picnic area down the right-field line. The terracing along the third-base line remains.

English Field was officially dedicated during a special ceremony on April 8, 1989 and is named for the late E.R. 'Red' English and his wife, Ruth, who provided financial support for its initial construction.

English, a native of Altavista, Va., played as an offensive and defensive guard on Tech's football team from 1930-33 and graduated in 1934. He contributed to Tech athletics for more than 50 years and was one of the founders of The Student Aid Association in 1949. He served as president of that organization two of its first three years. English received the most outstanding alumni award at Tech in 1984.

Through a generous gift from alumnus George Sampson, the home team dugout was named for long-time Tech baseball coach G.F. 'Red' Laird during a ceremony on April 12, 1991. Laird recruited and coached Sampson at Tech.

The team's year-by-year overall mark in its 30 seasons at English Field at Union Park can be seen on the right. Before it, the Hokies played their home baseball games at Tech Park, where it compiled a 431-122-1 (.779 winning percentage) record over 34 seasons. All-time, Tech is 1,256-567-12 (.688) in games played in Blacksburg.

The boys were back in town: Scheduling and Mother Nature saw the Hokies start the year playing 12 of their first 13 on the road and 18 of 22, which included traveling to five different states. Since joining the ACC, Tech's road swing to start the season was the third longest for a team behind the 2015 squad that played its first 11 contests on the road, the longest stretch to open a season, and 15 of 16 to start the year. The 2005 team played 21 of its first 22 games away from Blacksburg.

Fragale, 100 and counting: With his start at Virginia (April 6), Sam Fragale started his 100th consecutive game for the Hokies, (last 17 of 2016, all 55 last year and every game this season). His current 113-game streak is the longest on the team. The second longest streak on the team is Jack Owens, who has started every game he's played for Tech (96 straight). Last season, Ryan Tufts finished his career by starting in the last 127 games at Tech.

Quick notes on Tech's big win over Dayton: The Hokies beat Dayton 19-3 on April 4 as they hit four home runs in the game, here's some quick notes on that contest. The last time Tech scored at least 19 runs was last year at Nevada (Feb. 26) in a 24-10 victory. The last time the Hokies scored at least 19 runs and won by more than 15 was versus Alcorn State (May 8, 2016) in a 23-7 victory.

The last time the Hokies hit four (or more) home runs in a game was April 11, 2017 at Radford (4) and they did that seven times last season. The last time Tech hit three home runs in a single inning was March 28, 2017 – Joe Freiday, Jr., Jack Owens and Ryan Tufts all hit a home run in the second inning versus Campbell, while Owens, Tom Stoffel and Freiday did it in the second inning versus Dayton. The last two Hokies to hit back-to-back home runs was Owens and Tufts in that Campbell game – as Owens and Stoffel did in the second inning of that April 4th game.

Tech playing ACC Doubleheaders: In its history in the ACC, Tech has played 26 doubleheaders and overall has won two, lost nine and has split 15. Of the 26 doubleheaders, it's split right down the middle with 13 of them being played on the road and 13 at English Field at Union Park. This season, they've played two at home (Pittsburgh and Louisville) and two on the road (at Boston College, at Virginia) splitting three of four. Overall, Tech has played five doubleheaders this year.

On the road, the Hokies are 0-5-8 in DHs, while they are 2-4-7 in ACC DHs at English Field at Union Park. Tech played seven DHs last season, including five in the ACC. They split the two ACC DHs played at home against Georgia Tech (April 21) and No. 3 North Carolina (May 13). On the road, they lost two - at Pittsburgh (March 25) and at Miami (May 19) - and split at Duke (March 11).

Hokies start 2-0 in ACC for first time ever: In 14 seasons in the league, Tech is now 6-8 in ACC openers, including winners in three of its last four, as the Hokies picked up a 4-1 victory over Pittsburgh, March 9. For the first time in six tries, the Hokies then won their second game as well, with a 3-1 victory over the Panthers the next day, giving Tech its first ever 2-0 start in ACC play. They lost the back half of the doubleheader that Saturday ending the chance for its first ever 3-0 start.

A rare 1-0 ballgame: On Saturday March 31, the Hokies lost to No. 6 NC State 1-0 loss - just the second 1-0 ballgame ever at English Field at Union Park - the previous one was May 12, 2004, a win over Campbell. The last time Tech lost a home game 1-0 was April 5, 1972 against North Carolina at Tech Park. It was just the second 1-0 game ever played by the Hokies in an ACC game - they beat Boston College, 1-0, in Chestnut Hill, Massachusetts on May 3, 2013.

Hokies playing Free Baseball: Just eight games into the 2018 season, Tech had already played two extra-inning games, going 1-1. The 12-inning affair versus Radford (Feb. 27) was the longest in terms of innings for a Tech game since a 4-3 win over Clemson on March 22, 2015. The last time Tech played two extra-inning games before the month of March was in 2015 - Feb. 23 vs. Rider (L, 4-3, 12) and Feb. 28 vs. Toledo (W, 1-0, 10).

The Hokies are up to five extra-inning games this season (2-3) after last Saturday's 12-inning loss at Notre Dame. Last year, the Hokies went 1-5 in six free baseball games, while going 2-0 in 2016, 2-2 in 2015 and 3-3-1 during the 2014 campaign.

Tech walks it off: In his first home game as Tech head coach, eighth overall, John Szefc saw his team win in walk-off fashion in extra innings against Radford, 3-2 in 12 frames (Feb. 27). In the last 10 seasons, the Hokies have had 28 walk-off wins - with the most occurring during the 2012 season, when they had seven, while last year they had one. The earliest walk-off in that span (by date) was Feb. 25, 2012 - Chad Morgan sac fly in the bottom of the ninth gave Tech a 4-3 win over Iowa in Conway, South Carolina. That game was also the eighth of the season.

VIRGINIA TECH GAME NOTES - WEEKEND NO. 11



Three pitchers return from TJ: Two Virginia Tech pitchers have made successful returns to the mound this year after coming off Tommy John surgeries, while a third saw his first ever action as a Tech pitcher after the same surgery.

Nic Enright was the Hokies' opening day starter on Feb. 16 at Coastal Carolina and has pitched in 17 games this season with three starts. The last time he appeared on the mound for Tech (before this season) was May 1, 2016.

Making a return from his second TJ surgery in back-to-back years, Luke Scherzer made a one-inning start against Central Michigan on March 7 and has made a total of seven overall. The last time he pitched in a Tech game was May 19, 2015.

After missing last year as a true freshman, Connor Yoder made his first appearance in for Tech versus Louisville (April 14) and has a two total outings.

Coward strikes out a dozen: Connor Coward tied a school record for most strikeouts in an ACC regular-season game when he struck out 12 Pittsburgh Panthers over seven innings in a 4-1 victory (March 9). The last, and only other pitcher, to have 12 strikeouts in an ACC regular-season game was Marc Zecchino, who did it on April 10, 2011 at Wake Forest in seven innings as well.

It was the most punch outs in a regular-season game since 2005, when Ryan Kennedy struck out 15 versus Navy in seven innings on February 20, 2015.

Of note, on May 27, 2010, Justin Wright struck out 15 Georgia Tech batters in an ACC Baseball tournament game, in a nine-inning effort.

Coward strikes out 11 again and again: Only seven pitchers in Tech's ACC history (since 2005) have struck out at least 10 batters twice in a single season, and only two of them, Coward and Zecchino, have struck out at least 11 batters twice and both of those Hokies have done it three times.

Zecchino (in 2011) and Coward both had one 12-K performance and two 11-K efforts. Of those outings, both men struck out 11+ twice against ACC opponents - again, not done by any other pitcher in Tech's history in the league.

Of note, Wright is the only other Tech pitcher with three career 10-plus strikeout games, one in 2009 and two in 2010, while all three of his efforts were against ACC teams (one was in the tournament). Jesse Hahn is the only other pitcher with two 10-K efforts against ACC teams, notching both of his in 2010.

Seymour in select company: With his win over Notre Dame last Friday, freshman Ian Seymour picked up his third win of the season and with it, is on some very short lists for Tech freshman pitchers during an ACC season (since 2005).

First, he becomes the first freshman ever at the school to win a Game 1 ACC start.

Second, he is just the third pitcher with two ACC wins as a starter - joining Justin Wright (2008) and Mathew Price (2009), who also each won two games.

Of note, only four Hokie freshman ever won an ACC start as Packy Naughton (2015) was the fourth.

Third, he's just the third pitcher with three overall wins as a starter (versus any opponent) - joining Price (2009) and Joe Mantiply (2010), who also each won three games. (Lastly, next note)

Seymour strikes out 10: A total of 16 Hokies have struck out 10-plus batters in a game since 2005 and only 11 have done it in an ACC game. Seymour became the first to do it as a freshman, when he struck out 10 Pittsburgh Panthers March 10. Wright and Price each did it once as sophomores.

The last freshman with more than 10 Ks in a game was Pat Pinkman, vs. Liberty, when he struck out 12, March 3, 1998. Pinkman struck out 10 or more batters three times that season.

Seymour closing in on a record: Currently, in ACC-only games, Seymour has tossed 38.0 innings and has 40 strikeouts. When it comes to Tech true freshman pitchers in ACC-only games, he's got a chance to set both records. Back in 2009, Mathew Price tossed 48.2 innings while striking out 41 which are both program records. As freshman in 2008, Justin Wright (42.0 IP) and Jesse Hahn (41.1 IP) both surpassed 40.0 innings, but neither had more than 35 strikeouts.

VIRGINIA TECH GAME NOTES - WEEKEND NO. 11



The home run tracker: Sam Fragale hit his sixth home run of the season in Tech's 9-1 win at Notre Dame last Friday. For Fragale, it was the 29th long ball of his career - which is tied for the second-most in a career for a Hokie since the team started playing in the ACC. Andrew Rash (2010-13) hit the most in a career since 2005 with 42, while Tyler Horan (2011-13) launched 29 as well. Competing the top five home run hitters as ACC members are Michael Seaborn (2008-11) with 25 and Brendon Hayden (2012-15) with 24.

More home run tracking: When looking at the most home runs hit by a true freshman at Tech (as a member of the ACC), JD Mundy's five last year tied for the most with Mark Zagunis (2012) and Jose Cueto (2005). Below is a chart for the most home runs hit after a true sophomore season, the number in () is the number of home runs hit during that season in ACC games and total through soph. year.

Owens home runs start the game: Jack Owens opened the ACC series at Georgia Tech (March 16) by hitting a solo home run to center field, the sixth home run of his career. With that round tripper, he became just the third Hokie to hit a game-opening home run on the road in an ACC game (see below, *italics*).

Only seven Hokies have ever hit a leadoff home run in the first inning (on the road or at home, first Tech at-bat in a game) as a member of the ACC. Below is a list of those men. Saige Jenco is the only player to do it twice, on the road, while Owens joins him as the only players with two Tech first at-bat home runs.

Stoffel ties school/ACC record: In the third game of Tech's ACC series against Pittsburgh on March 10 (Game 2 of the doubleheader), Tom Stoffel tripled in both the first and fifth innings, tying the Tech school record for triples in a game, now done by 15 Hokies. The last Hokie with two triples in a game was Saige Jenco (May 5, 2015 vs. West Virginia), while Tyler Horan was the last to do it in an ACC game (March 16, 2013 at Duke). It also tied the ACC record, which had been done by 73 players prior to Stoffel.

Four freshmen in the starting lineup: At the Westin Lake Mary Stetson Invitational in DeLand, Florida, the Hokies' lineup card on March 3 versus Purdue featured four true freshmen - Cam Irvine in right field, Darion Jacoby in left field, Michael Fernandez as the DH and Ian Seymour on the mound.

The last time a Tech lineup card had four true freshmen on it was in on April 12, 2014 against Maryland - yes, Maryland, who was led by then second-year head coach John Szefc. Getting starts that day were Tom Stoffel (RF), Ricky Surum (SS), Miguel Ceballos (3B) and Aaron McGarity on the mound. Add in redshirt-freshman Saige Jenco and five first-year players made a start that day.

At Boston College (March 22, Game 2), Irvine (DH), Jacoby (LF) and Seymour (SP) were joined by Jojo Odachowski (SS), marking the second time this season four true freshmen were in the Hokies' starting lineup.

Two Hokies earn preseason All-America honors: Sam Fragale, who was a Second Team All-ACC first baseman last season, moved over to third base for the upcoming season and was twice named a preseason All-American at the spot. He earned third team honors from both the NCBWA and Collegiate Baseball.

Tom Stoffel, who was also a Second Team All-ACC selection in the outfield last season, was also selected by Collegiate Baseball as a preseason All-American on the third team, as a utility player.

Horanski named to the 2018 Johnny Bench Award Watch List: The Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission announced the official watch list for the 2018 Johnny Bench Award presented by BaseballSavings.com on March 6 and Tech's Luke Horanski was one of ninety-seven catchers nominated for the award by their coaches. Because the award is given annually to the top division one collegiate catcher, the list will be updated to include other candidates until April 30, 2018.

The watch list will be narrowed down to the semifinalists, whom will be announced May 16, 2018.
