- Scot Thomas has had 17 winning seasons in 22 years, building the program from the ground up starting in 1996.
- Became Tech's first head softball coach when he was hired on July 7, 1995.
- In 22 seasons, he has recorded 790 wins averaging 35 wins per season and making the conference tournament championship game eight times (2 Atlantic 10; 2 Big East; 4 ACC). Tech has also advanced to at least the semifinals of eight of the 12 ACC Tournaments its played in since joining the league.
- Has led the Hokies to eight NCAA Regionals - four-straight from 2005-08 and four-consecutive from 2012-15.
- Guided Tech to its fourth-straight NCAA Regional in 2008, a program first. Tech was seeded 16th nationally and No. 1 at the Columbus Regional in 2007. Overall Tech, has been to eight NCAA Regionals.
- Led Tech to the Women's College World Series in 2008, a first for the program. The Hokies also finished a program-best eighth in both final polls that year.
- Led the Hokies to a 1-0 upset win over the USA National Team in an exhibition game on March 26, 2008 at Oklahoma City, snapping the team's 185-game pre-Olympic exhibition tour winning streak.
- Led the Hokies to Atlantic Coast Conference tournament titles in both 2007 and 2008. Also led the Hokies to the regular-season title in 2007, a program first.
- Has coached two NFCA/Louisville Slugger All-Americans: Angela Tincher (2nd team in 2007; 1st team in 2008 and 1st team in 2009) and Jenna Rhodes (3rd team in 2009).
- Has had 36 different players named to the VaSID All-State University Team 68 different times, including at least three on each of the last 10 teams.
- Had four former players play in the NPF: Angela Tincher and Kelsey Hoffman with the Akron Racers; Jenna Rhodes with the Rockford Thunder/Tennessee Diamonds; and Courtney Liddle with the NY/NJ Comets/Pennsylvania Rebellion.
- Has had six current or former players represent their respective country in international events: Angela Tincher (USA), Shanel Garofalo (Italy), Charisse Mariconda (Puerto Rico), Ashlee Dobbe, Richelle McGarva and Jess Hodge (Canada).

SCHO ON PACE FOR BREAKOUT SEASON

- Senior Caroline Schoenewald looks to have saved her best season for last as she is on pace to set career bests in batting average, hits, home runs and runs scored.
- Her 10 doubles this season is a new career high and her 37 hits is also a career best.
- Against No. 15 Florida State, Schoenewald had a 5 for 9 showing at the plate over three games with two multi-hit games, including a two-double performance in the second contest in the series.
- She has started in all 47 games this season in center field.

11 NEWCOMERS TIES FOR MOST IN THE ACC

- Virginia Tech's 11 newcomers – made up of nine freshmen and two junior college transfers – are tied with Louisville for the most in the ACC.
- Of the 11 newcomers, nine saw the field in the first weekend; including seven true freshmen.
- Of the seven, six registered starts, three drove in runs and two – Keely Rochard and Jordan Dail – recorded wins in the pitcher's circle.

EBERLE'S SCORELESS STREAK ENDS

- The weekend of the Texas Invitational saw arguably the best pitching performance in the young career of sophomore Carrie Eberle.
- Her eight-inning, complete game shutout against No. 20 Michigan marked her third consecutive shutout, all against Power Five competition, and extended her scoreless inning streak to 22.
- She came on in relief against Wichita State and got her streak up to 23 innings before a run came across, making it the longest streak since Jasmin Harrell's 23.1 straight shutout innings in 2012 between March 25 and April 1.

PITCHING AND DEFENSE SHINE IN FEBRUARY

- During the first month of action, the Hokies boasted strong defense and developed one of the top pitching tandems in the ACC.
- Sophomore Carrie Eberle posted a 1.15 ERA in the month of February, which ranked second in the ACC, while freshman Jordan Dail ranked ninth with a 1.51 ERA.
- The Hokies' team earned run average of 2.00 during the first month trailed only Florida State (1.43) and Duke (1.57) in the ACC.
- Tech's defense also stood out as it entered March with only 11 errors in 13 games and a .970 fielding percentage overall, good enough for third in the conference.

- Carrie Eberle tossed two complete game shutouts and allowed only four hits over 14 innings of work to go 2-0 at the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.
- For her efforts, College Sports Madness named her ACC Softball Player of the Week.
- She struck out eight batters, tying her career high, and surrendered only one base hit against Purdue while also fielding four groundouts herself.
- She's the first Virginia Tech pitcher since Maggie Tyler in 2016 to throw back-to-back complete game shutouts. For her efforts, College Sports Madness named her ACC Softball Player of the Week.

DAIL FANS 12 IN FIRST CAREER START

- Jordan Dail turned in one of the top performances by a Virginia Tech freshman making her first career start as she struck out 12 batters and allowed one run against Penn State in her first complete game effort and her first career victory.
- Her 12 Ks tied Kelly Heinz and Angela Tincher for the most by the Hokie freshman in her first career start.

- The 2018 campaign marks 10 years since Virginia Tech's magical run to its second consecutive ACC Championship and the Women's College World Series.
- Tech finished the 2008 season with a 49-19 overall record and a 16-5 mark in conference play en route to claiming its second consecutive ACC Championship.
- After beating Michigan in the Super Regionals, Virginia Tech became only the second ACC program to advance to the Women's College World Series. The Hokies and Florida State are still the only two ACC schools to reach Oklahoma City.
- In the middle of that season, the Hokies pulled off arguably the greatest upset in the history of the sport as Tincher no-hit the United States National Team in a 1-0 exhibition victory.
