## HOKIES RETURN HOME VS. WILLIAM & MARY

- Virginia Tech (No. 12 AP/No. 14 USA Today Coaches) faces William & Mary at Lane Stadium on Saturday.
- The Hokies are facing an extremely short week following a 24-3 win on Monday night at Florida State (9/3).
- VT's 21-point win over No. 19 FSU was the second-biggest margin of victory for an ACC team playing its first game of the year against a ranked foe. The only margin greater in a season opener against a ranked team was North Carolina's 22-point win over No. 18 USC in 1993.
- W&M opened the year with a 14-7 win at Bucknell (9/1).
- Tech is 10-2 at home under head coach Justin Fuente, including a 4-0 mark vs. non-conference foes. The Hokies won their final three home games of 2017 and are 5-1 overall in September games at Lane under Fuente.
- The iconic Jimmy Laycock is in his 39th and final season as William & Mary's head coach. A longtime friend and colleague of Frank Beamer, Laycock's uninterrupted tenure at an NCAA Division I program ranks third all-time behind only Joe Paterno (46 seasons at Penn State) and Amos Alonzo Stagg (41 seasons at Chicago).

- Virginia Tech has won 11 straight meetings with W&M in dating back to 1977 in a series that began in 1904.
- Tech is 13-2 all-time against The Tribe at Lane Stadium.
- Tech head coach Justin Fuente was a little over two months old the last time W&M defeated Tech, a 27-15 decision at Lane Stadium (10/2/76).
- The Tribe is no stranger to facing FBS foes and registered a 26-14 victory at Virginia (9/5/09).
- The two teams faced a pair of common opponents in 2017. Tech posted a 27-0 win vs. Delaware (9/9/17) and a 10-0 win at Virginia (11/24/17), while W&M lost 17-0 at Delaware (10/14/17) and 28-10 at Virginia (9/2/17).

## KEY VT-W&M SCORING STATS TO WATCH

- Tech has outscored W&M by a combined 78-12 margin in its two most recent contests in 2007 and 2014.
- VT has won 20 consecutive games when it holds foes to 21 points or fewer dating back to 2015.
- Since Bud Foster took over as Tech's defensive coordinator in 1996, the Hokies are 100-1 when holding foes to 10 points or fewer.
- W&M has lost 16 straight when being held to 10 points or fewer dating back to 2005, including three games in 2017.
- Virginia Tech is 18-0 under Fuente when leading at halftime, including a 9-0 mark in 2017.
- Dating back to 2010, W&M is 2-22 when allowing 30 points or more, including seven straight losses.
- Tech is 13-1 under Fuente when 30 points or more, including four consecutive victories.
- VT has won 20 consecutive games when it holds foes to 21 points or fewer dating back to a 28-13 win vs. NC State (10/9/15), including a 24-3 victory at FSU (9/3).

## GOT FUENTE?

- Justin Fuente is one of only six active FBS head coaches to lead his squad to nine or more victories each of the past four seasons.
- Fuente went 19-8 in his first two seasons at VT, the most wins by any Tech coach in his initial two campaigns in Blacksburg.
- Fuente's 19 wins in his first two ACC seasons are tied with Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson for the most among active league head coaches. Johnson went 19-7 from 2008-09 at Georgia Tech.
- With those 19 wins in his first two seasons in Blacksburg, Fuente owns more victories than every Tech coach has accumulated in his first three seasons with the exception of B.C. Cabbage, who guided the program to 21 victories from 1921-23.

## BEST TWO-YEAR QB DEBUTS FOR HOKIES

- QB Josh Jackson has guided Tech to 10 victories as the Hokies' starting QB in 2017-18. He has a shot to etch his name among other elite Tech signal callers who piled up wins in their first two seasons.

## FIVE OF TOP SIX RUSHERS RETURN IN 2018

- Including QB Josh Jackson (324 rushing yards in 2017), Tech returns five of its six top ground gainers from a year ago. Jackson led the Hokies with six rushing TDs in 2017.
- In total, players who accounted for 73.9% (1,666 of 2,254) of Tech's rushing yards in 2017 are back in 2018. Those players also contributed 89.5% of VT's rushing TDs (17 of 19) last season.
- RB Deshawn McCleese led VT with 530 rushing yards in 2017, including a career-high 124 yards vs. Oklahoma State (12/28/17).
- Other key RB returnees include Steven Peoples (267 yards in 2017), Jalen Holston (226 yards) and Coleman Fox (223 yards).

## BEAMER BALL LIVES HERE!

- Virginia Tech's tradition of excellence on special teams, affectionately known as "Beamer Ball" is alive and well.
- Tech TE Chris Cunningham blocked a punt at FSU (9/3) that was recovered by WR Eric Kumah for a three-yard TD. Kumah became only the third VT player since 1987 to register a blocked kick TD and another TD in the same game. He also had a 49-yard TD catch.
- Dating back to 1999, Miami (25) and Oregon (23) are the only two squads to return more punts for TDs than VT (22).
- Only Texas A&M (8) blocked more kicks than VT (6) in 2017. Florida State, Arizona State, Northern Illinois also blocked six.
- Virginia Tech tied for the FBS lead with Arizona State and Texas A&M with five blocked punts in 2017.
- No Power Five squad allowed fewer combined punt/KO returns than VT (335) in 2017, while only Washington (458) registered more punt return yards than VT (413) last season.

## THE #LPD = NASTY D

- Tech's vaunted Lunch Pail Defense finished the 2017 season fourth in the FBS in scoring defense (14.8 ppg) and posted an FBS-best three shutouts.

- The #LPD picked up right where it left off in a dominating 24-3 win at Florida State (9/3).
- Tech had 14.0 tackles for loss, while allowing only 12 first downs.
- FSU broke off an 85-yard run, but the Seminoles gained only nine net yards on their 27 other rushing attempts.
- FSU took 63 offensive snaps, 35 of which (55.5%) went for no gain or loss, the highest percentage for the Seminoles in a game since a contest vs. Florida (11/25/06).
- CB Caleb Farley had two INTs and a sack and was named ACC Defensive Back of the Week in his first college game.
- LB Rayshard Ashby produced 2.0 TFL, seven total tackles and a fumble recovery to earn ACC Defensive Linebacker of the Week honors in his first collegiate start.

## QB JOSH JACKSON - WHAT A DEBUT IN 2017!

- QB Josh Jackson's 2,991 passing yards were a VT freshman record and the most of any FBS freshman in 2017.

- Jackson led all FBS freshman QBs in total offense (255.0 ypg).
- Jackson's 3,315 yards of total offense and 520 total plays were by far the highest tallies of any FBS freshman.

## FOOTBALL IS FAMILY AT VIRGINIA TECH

- Dating back to 1987, 27 sets of brothers have played at Virginia Tech. 2018 marks the 17th consecutive season that the Hokies have had at least one set of brothers on its roster - the longest known streak in the FBS.
- The Hokies made history in the 2018 NFL Draft when Tremaine Edmunds (16th overall - Buffalo) and Terrell Edmunds (28th overall - Pittsburgh) become the first pair of siblings ever selected in the first round of the same NFL Draft. The eldest Edmunds brother, Trey, played at Tech and serves as a RB for New Orleans.
- Tech boasts two sets of brothers on the current roster - identical twins (redshirt juniors) Kevin and Connor Kish, as well as senior DL Vinny Mihota and true freshman OL Louis Mihota. Current Hokies OL Kyle Chung (son of Eugene) and RB Coleman Fox (son of Rich) are following in the footsteps of their fathers who played for the Hokies.

**INSIDE THE SERIES: VIRGINIA TECH VS. WILLIAM & MARY**

- Saturday's game will be the 65th football meeting between Virginia Tech and William & Mary, with the Hokies leading the series, 41-18-4.
- The two schools met every year for 40 straight seasons between 1945 and 1985 and each year for 14 consecutive years between 1929 and 1942.
- Tech and William & Mary were members of the Southern Conference together from 1936-64. In that span, the Hokies Posted just a 10-15-2 mark against the Tribe in conference play.
- The last nine contests have been held in Blacksburg with the Hokies winning all nine. Tech has won the last 10 in a row - and 12 of the last 13 - against the Tribe.
- Thirteen straight games (1929-41) were played in Richmond. The two also played in Richmond in 1945, 1947, 1972 and 1977. The series has also been played in Roanoke (1906, 1959, 1961 and 1969) and in Norfolk (1975).
- Virginia Tech has won its home opener in 28 of the last 31 seasons since Frank Beamer's first season in 1987. The only teams to have beaten the Hokies in their first home game of the year during Beamer's tenure were James Madison (21-16; 2010), Boston College (20-14; 1995) and Clemson (22-10; 1987). The Clemson game was Beamer's first at helm.

**CONNECTIONS: VIRGINIA TECH-WILLIAM & MARY**

- William & Mary defensive line coach Kevin Lewis was a four-year letterwinner at Virginia Tech from 2000-04 where he helped lead the Hokies to the 2004 ACC Championship.
- Lewis played in 12 games a senior and finished the year with 18 tackles, an interception and a fumble recovery.
- Lewis' brother, Jonathan, was a two-time All-ACC selection for the Hokies between 2002-05; one of the many siblings that found success together at Virginia Tech.
- Tech redshirt junior Coleman Fox will be going up against his younger brother, Riley, who's a redshirt freshman linebacker for the Tribe.
- Both brothers attended Salem High School in Salem, Va., and are the sons of Rich Fox, a four-year letterwinner for the Hokies from 1986-89.
- Fox was a member of the Tech squad that won the 1986 Peach Bowl and was a part of Frank Beamer's first teams as the head coach of the Hokies.
- The eldest Fox scored four combined rushing touchdowns as a junior and senior.
- Virginia Tech took on William & Mary in the first-ever game played at Lane Stadium - a 9-7 victory on Oct. 2, 1965.

## 2016 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

- The consensus 2016 ACC Coach of the Year, Fuente was also named the top first-year FBS head coach in the nation by the Football Writers Association of America, sharing that honor with USC's Clay Helton.
- Tech finished the 2016 season ranked No. 16 in both the AP Poll and the Coaches Poll, marking the highest final mark for the Hokies since 2010 (No. 16 AP, No. 15 Coaches).
- Virginia Tech, Penn State, Colorado, West Virginia and Western Michigan all finished in the AP Top 25 after getting zero votes in the AP Preseason Poll.
- Tech's 10 wins were the team's most since 2011 and the most ever by a first-year Virginia Tech head coach, surpassing the previous mark of nine wins by C.P. Miles in 1905.

- Named Virginia Tech's head coach on Nov. 29, 2015 after orchestrating one of the more dramatic program resurrections in recent college football history at Memphis.
- The Hokies are in their third season under Fuente in 2018, who has compiled a 20-8 record in Blacksburg, the most wins by any Tech coach in his first two campaigns.
- Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson is the only other active ACC head coach who can boast as many victories in his first two seasons at a conference school than Fuente (19).
- With 19 wins in his first two seasons at Tech, Fuente owns more victories than every Tech coach has accumulated in his first three seasons with the exception of B.C. Cabbage, who guided the program to 21 victories from 1921-23.
- The Hokies have finished back-to-back seasons in the final AP Poll for the first time since 2010-11. The Hokies will be seeking to conclude three straight seasons in the AP Top 25 for the first time since doing it eight consecutive years under Frank Beamer (2004-11).
- Fuente is one of only six FBS head coaches to register nine or more wins each of the past four seasons.
- Tech concluded the 2017 season with a 9-4 mark, finishing the year No. 24 in the AP Top 25 and No. 25 in the Amway USA Today Coaches Poll.
- Tech extended its streak of consecutive bowl appearances to 25 straight seasons in 2017 under Fuente, the longest active streak recognized by the NCAA. Should Tech earn its 26th straight bowl berth in 2018, that mark that would give VT sole possession of the third-longest streak in NCAA history.
- The Hokies have won 14 consecutive Commonwealth Cup games over Virginia, including both matchups under Fuente.
- Tech has won 18 consecutive games during Fuente's tenure when leading at halftime.
- VT owns a 6-1 mark under Fuente in games immediately following a loss.
- Fuente's well-deserved reputation for his work with quarterbacks became apparent once again in 2017 as QB Josh Jackson orchestrated the most prolific season of any freshman in Tech history.
- Jackson's 2,991 passing yards were a VT freshman record and the most of any FBS freshman in 2017, while his 20 TDs and 135.2 rating were second among FBS

freshmen behind Georgia QB Jake Fromm (24 TDs, 160.1 ranking).

- Tech's traditionally stout Lunch Pail Defense also lived up to its reputation in 2017, pitching three shutouts.
- The #LPD finished the 2017 season fourth in the FBS in scoring defense (14.8 ppg) and posted an FBS-best three shutouts, while only Michigan (26.1%) held foes to a lower third-down conversion rate than VT (25.2).
- Virginia Tech continued its special teams success under Fuente as the Hokies tied for second in the FBS with six blocked kicks, finished second with 413 punt return yards and led the nation in fewest return yards allowed with 335.
- In total, the Hokies registered five return scores in 2017 (two punt return TDs, two INT return TDs and one fumble return TD).

The famed Virginia Tech Lunch Pail has come to symbolize the blue-collar approach of the Hokies' defense under longtime defensive coordinate Bud Foster.

In 1995, Foster served as co-defensive coordinator with Rod Sharpless, whose mother-in-law found the original Lunch Pail in Mercerville, New Jersey. The pail once belonged to a coal miner and after a record-setting defensive season, the Lunch Pail became an iconic part of Hokies' lore.

The Pail travels wherever the Hokies go and its care is only entrusted to a defensive leader.

Before the start of every season, a signed mission statement from the defense is placed in The Pail. Then every week, unit goals, team goals and keys to success are placed in The Pail, plus the turf from any road victories.

Since 2007, The Pail has also contained the names of the 32 fallen Hokies taken in the April 16 tragedy.

Darryl Tapp is the only player who has ever earned lifetime possession of an incarnation of The Pail from Foster.

# \* *BeamerBall By The Numbers*

- Even though the namesake is no longer the big whistle in Blacksburg, Virginia Tech's BeamerBall philosophy has not waned under third-year head coach Justin Fuente.
- There have been 149 non-offensive touchdowns and 144 blocked kicks by Virginia Tech since Frank Beamer's first season as head coach in 1987.
- Under Fuente, the Hokies have scored nine non-offensive touchdowns – three punt return touchdowns, two fumble return touchdowns, two interception return touchdowns, one blocked punt return and one blocked field goal return.
- Since Fuente's hiring, the Hokies are tied for eighth in Power Five with seven combined punt return, interception return and fumble return touchdowns.
- The Hokies have blocked more kicks over the last three seasons under Fuente (11) than the previous five seasons combined (9).

### BEAMER NAMED TO COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

- Former Virginia Tech head coach Frank Beamer was named College Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2018 in his initial year of eligibility.
- The induction is set for Dec. 4 in New York City.
- The winningest coach in Virginia Tech history, Beamer's 280 victories rank sixth overall in FBS history and are the 13th most by a college football coach at any NCAA division.
- He led the Hokies to their first ever national title game appearance as part of an impressive streak of 23 consecutive bowl berths in his final 23 seasons.
- Under Beamer, the Hokies posted five top-10 finishes and became one of only six programs in college football history to go to a bowl game in at least 20-straight seasons.
- A five-time conference Coach of the Year, Beamer won three BIG EAST titles and added four ACC titles in five conference championship game appearances.

- Head coach Justin Fuente and the Hokies pay homage to Frank Beamer and Virginia Tech's legacy of excellence on special teams by selecting a special teams player of the week who will wear No. 25.

## LPD LEADS TECH IN WIN AT FSU

- Virginia Tech's dominating 24-3 victory at Florida State was the Hokies' first win in Tallahassee since Nov. 16, 1974.
- The Hokies improved to 100-1 under Bud Foster at defensive coordinator when they hold opponents to 10 points or fewer.
- It was only the fifth time since 1996 under Foster and the third time on the road that the Hokies held a ranked opponent to three points or less.
- It marked the first time in program history that Virginia Tech opened with ranked opponents in back-to-back seasons and won both games after dropping its previous 10 matchups.
- The Hokies held the Seminoles to their lowest point total at home since 2008 when FSU also put up three points against Wake Forest.
- Justin Fuente moved to 4-0 all-time against Willie Taggart as a head coach.

## FARLEY, ASHBY WIN ACC HONORS

- Following Virginia Tech's 24-3 victory over No. 19 Florida State on Monday night, Rayshard Ashby and Caleb Farley were named ACC Players of the Week.
- Ashby (5-10, 230) made his first career start and looked like a season performer, tallying seven tackles, including 2.0 tackles for loss and a forced fumble against the Seminoles.
- Farley (6-2, 202) played in his first collegiate after sitting out the 2017 campaign with a knee injury. His debut contest featured a pair of interceptions, a sack, two tackles.

## FARLEY FIGHTS THROUGH ADVERSITY

- It's been a long and tumultuous road for redshirt freshman DB Caleb Farley, who is started at cornerback for Virginia Tech in the season opener at Florida State (9/3).
- After racking up 78 yards of total offense (61 receiving yards, 17 rushing yards) in the 2017 spring game, Farley tore his ACL on the first day of fall camp that kept him out the remainder of the season.
- Off the field, Farley dealt with another major blow personally in January 2018 when his mother succumbed to nearly a decade-long battle with cancer.
- Farley, who cornerbacks coach Brian Mitchell called a "borrowed wide receiver", moved from wideout to cornerback in the spring and is listed as a second-string corner and is expected to return punts and kicks.

## KUMAH BREAKS OUT VS. FSU

- Junior WR Eric Kumah registered his first career multi-touchdown game in unique fashion at Florida State by becoming only the third Hokie since 1987 to have a return and receiving score in the same game.
- Kumah's TD off of a blocked punt by r-junior TE Chris Cunningham was Virginia Tech's 149th non-offensive touchdown scored since Frank Beamer's first season as head coach.
- His game-sealing TD catch in the fourth quarter went for 49 yards, a new career-high.

## THE BELL COW IS BACK

- With all of the talent on last year's Lunch Pail Defense that finished fourth in the nation in scoring defense and featured seven players currently on NFL rosters, defensive coordinator Bud Foster still called senior defensive tackle

Ricky Walker the "Bell Cow" of his unit.

- After playing in 11 games as a true freshman, Walker took a redshirt year and came in 2016 as a redshirt sophomore where he racked up 28 tackles, 6.5 TFLs and four pass breakups.
- Last year was a career year for Walker who posted 41 tackles, 12.5 TFLs and 4.5 sacks in 13 starts.
- His performance helped him earn All-ACC Honorable Mention honors.
- Walker earned his degree in sociology in May and became a father over the summer.
- Walker's brother, Rijo, was a four-year letterwinner at UVA and is currently works on the staff with the College Football Playoff as its team operations coordinator.

## FOSTER WITH RETURNING STARTERS

- With only four starters back on defense, it's been a while since defensive coordinator Bud Foster has had a defensive unit this inexperienced when looking at career starts.
- The Hokies' 68 career returning starts are the fewest since the 2010 squad brought back 64 starts. The last time Tech brought back four starters on defense was 2008.
- Foster's fewest defensive starters since becoming defensive coordinator in 1996 was three following the National Championship game season in 1999.
- Despite the inexperience, Tech won the ACC Championship in both 2008 and 2010.

## BEAMERBALL CONTINUES

- Blocked kicks and opponent return yards proved to be critical in Virginia Tech's success in 2017 and it struck early in 2018.
- With the Hokies holding on to a 10-3 lead in the second quarter at Florida State (9/3), Chris Cunningham blocked a punt at FSU's own three-yard line before Eric Kumah grabbed it out of mid-air and took it in for the score.
- Only Oklahoma (85), Georgia (77), Auburn (65) and Arizona (58) had more touchbacks on kickoffs than Virginia Tech (59) in the Power Five in 2017.
- Sophomore punter Oscar Bradburn allowed only 49 punt return yards, a total that ranked ninth in the Power Five.
- Overall, the Hokies led the Power Five with 335 total opponent return yards.

- Overall, the Hokies also dominated the hidden yardage battle when comparing drive start averages; opponents' average drive started on 24-yard line while the Hokies average drive start was just over the 35-yard line.
- Led by Jovonn Quillen's two blocked punts, Virginia Tech's six blocked kicks tied for second in the Power Five last season.
- Special teams coordinator James Shibest was named 2017 Special Teams Coordinator of the Year by FootballScoop.com, marking the second time he's won that honor.

### O-LINE TECH'S VETERAN UNIT

- The most experienced position group for the Hokies is the offensive line who return 51 career starts between Kyle Chung (16), Yosuah Nijman (22) and Braxton Pfaff (13).
- Chung and Pfaff started and played in all 13 games last season while Nijman posted eight starts before an injury ended his season.
- For his senior season, Nijman (6'7", 314) will play at right tackle for the first time in his career.
- Chung, who was granted a sixth year of eligibility during the offseason, will move from right tackle to left guard.
- It won't be Chung's first go-around working inside as he started two games at center vs. Tennessee in the Battle at Bristol and the following game vs. Boston College in 2016.
- Chung is the son of Eugene Chung, an All-American for the Hokies in 1991 and a first-round draft pick of the New England Patriots. He's currently an assistant coach with the Philadelphia Eagles.

### HOKIES MAKE HISTORY AT 2018 DRAFT

- The 2018 NFL Draft was a historic one for the Hokies as the program saw Terrell and Tremaine Edmunds become the 12th and 13th first round draft picks in school history.
- The Edmunds brothers were the first set of brothers to be drafted in the first round of the draft.
- Virginia Tech had two players picked in the first for only the second time in program history and the first time since 2004.
- Tech's five draft picks overall were its most selections since five Hokies came off the board in 2010.
- When including Adonis Alexander's selection by Washington in the NFL's Supplemental Draft,

the Hokies had six draftees, their most since 2008 (8).

**BLACKSBURG** – Virginia Tech got its season started on a positive note, getting 251 yards passing from quarterback Michael Brewer and 106 yards rushing from tailback Shai McKenzie in a 34-9 victory over William & Mary on Saturday.

The Hokies won their home opener for the 25th time in Frank Beamer's 28 seasons.

Brewer, a transfer from Texas Tech who won the starting job the week before, completed 23-of-30 passes for 251 yards, with two touchdowns to lead Tech. He completed passes to nine different receivers, including touchdown passes of 13 yards to Isaiah Ford and 8 yards to Bucky Hodges.

McKenzie, who enrolled in January but missed spring practice while recovering from an ACL tear suffered last fall while in high school, became the first true freshman to rush for more than 100 yards in a season opener at Tech since Shyrone Stith in 1996.

Freshman kicker Joey Slye kicked field goals of 20 and 27 yards for the Hokies. Freshmen scored all but six points for the Hokies.

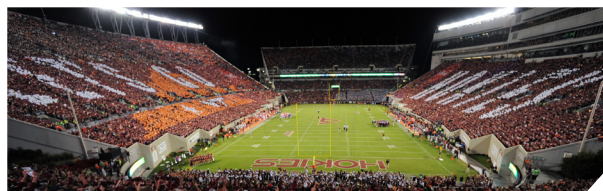

Lane Stadium doesn't blow people away by the brute strength of a massive stadium, but with knowledgeable fans that always reach a frenzied pitch at the right time, the Hokies make the most of their numbers.

Every good stadium has at least one end designed for deafening noise levels, and the enclosed South End Zone at Lane Stadium fits the bill perfectly. Holding more than 11,000 screaming Virginia Tech fans, the section amplifies noise and renders audibles useless. That's not to mention the isolation factor. With the nearest major airport nearly 45 minutes away, opponents' fans are never out in force at Lane Stadium.

### LANE STADIUM - HOME OF THE HOKIES

Rising high into the mountainous sky of the New River Valley, Virginia Tech's Lane Stadium enters its 53rd year of football competition in 2017. The Tech football team has enjoyed over two decades of success, going to 24 straight bowl games and winning 10 or more games eight straight seasons from 2004-11. A big part of that success is the home-field advantage the Hokies enjoy at Lane Stadium/Worsham Field.

Sitting at roughly 2,057 feet above sea level, the stadium is the second-highest among all FBS schools in the eastern United States, trailing only Appalachian State (3,300). Completed in 1965, Lane Stadium/Worsham Field has gone through numerous changes, renovations and additions. But through it all, it has always been regarded as one of the finest places to watch – and toughest places for opponents to play – a college football game.

### THE HOKIE STONE

Before each home football game, Virginia Tech football players and coaching staff enter Lane Stadium through a tunnel. On the stadium-side entrance to Worsham Field, they pass beneath a Hokie Stone, which they touch for good luck and is flanked by these words: "For those who have passed. For those to come ... Reach for Excellence."

### ENTER SANDMAN

The history behind Virginia Tech's use of Metallica's "Enter Sandman" started during the 2000 season. That summer, Tech added a new scoreboard to Lane Stadium and the athletics marketing team decided to use the song for an entrance video. The group considered "Welcome to the Jungle" by Guns N' Roses and "Sirius" by the Alan Parsons Project before settling on "Enter Sandman." As the song played on one chilly evening prior to the team's entrance, members of the Marching Virginians began to jump up and down in rhythm in an effort to stay warm. The Lane Stadium crowd followed suit and the jumping hasn't stopped since.
