VT CONTINUES STREAKS, READIES FOR 2019

- Virginia Tech concluded the 2018 season by keeping a pair of the nation's most significant streaks intact.
- Tech extended the nation's longest active bowl streak to 26 consecutive seasons, a mark that ranks as the third-longest in college football history.

- The Hokies also maintained their dominance over in-state rival Virginia, registering their 15th consecutive victory over the Cavaliers with a 34-31 OT win (11/23/17).

- That 15-game streak vs. UVA ranks as the third-longest active streak in the nation between Power Five foes.

SCORING SUPERLATIVES FOR VIRGINIA TECH

- The Hokies have scored in 309 consecutive games dating back to a 13-7 win vs. Miami (9/23/95), the third-longest active streak in the nation.

- Virginia Tech's scoring streak also ranks fifth all-time in NCAA history.

- The Hokies have won 24 straight contests when holding foes to 21 points or fewer dating back to 2015.

- Virginia Tech is 17-3 when scoring 30+ points under head coach Justin Fuente.

- The Hokies own a 22-1 mark under Fuente when leading at halftime.

- The Hokies have won 38 consecutive non-conference contests when holding foes to 17 points or fewer dating back to 2005.

- Tech owns a 93-5 record in all games dating back to 2005 when limiting its opponents to 17 points or fewer.

SEASON FOUR UNDER JUSTIN FUENTE SET FOR 2019

- Head coach Justin Fuente enters his fourth season at the helm of the Hokies in 2019. He owns a 25-15 record.

- Only two ACC programs have registered more overall wins over the past three seasons since Fuente's arrival in Blacksburg.

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT FOR THE #LPD

- Despite boasting one of the youngest defensive units ever fielded by Bud Foster at Virginia Tech, a host of underclassmen proved their mettle for the Hokies in 2018.

- Sophomore LB Rayshard Ashby led all ACC underclassmen with 105 total tackles (57 solo), a mark tied as the second-best total in the league. He will enter the 2019 season tied as the league's top returning tackler. Ashby tied for second on Tech with 9.5 TFL.

- S Reggie Floyd will return for his senior season. He ranked second on the squad with 88 total tackles (56 solo) and 9.5 TFL.

- Even though he only started five contests, freshman LB Dax Hollifield ranked fourth on Tech with 62 tackles (27 solo). He added 8.0 TFL, 2.0 sacks, a FF and a FR.

- In total, the Hokies are anticipated to return 10 primary defensive starters, losing only DT Ricky Walker.

- Tech's top five tacklers from 2018 will all return in 2019.

LOOKING BACK AT QB RYAN WILLIS IN 2018

- QB Ryan Willis started the final 12 games of the 2018 season. Willis' 24 TD passes tied as the second-highest single-season mark in Tech history.

- Willis finished fourth in the ACC in passing ypg (226.3), passer rating (137.9) and fifth in total offense (256.2 ypg).

- Three of the top five TD seasons by a Tech QB have come since the arrival of Fuente and OC Brad Cornelsen in 2016.

- Willis' 24 TD passes ranked fourth in the ACC in 2018.

EXPLOSIVE OFFENSIVE NUMBERS CONTINUE

- Under the direction of head coach Justin Fuente and offensive coordinator Brad Cornelsen, Tech once again amassed one of the most productive seasons in school history.

- VT's 29 TD passes ranked as the second-best season mark in team history (31 in 2016).

- The three top seasons in Tech history in terms of passing offense have come in each of the past three seasons.

- Tech led the ACC in Red Zone scoring efficiency (90.5 scoring pct.), ranking sixth among Power Five clubs in that department.

- Tech ranked fourth in the ACC in Red Zone defense (78.8 scoring pct.), allowing 31 TDs and 10 FGs on 52 RZ trips.

- The #LPD tied for the ACC lead, forcing six Red Zone turnovers.

- Tech ranked fifth in the ACC with a +3 turnover differential (19 takes/16 gives).

- VT owned a +10 mark (15 takes/5 gives) in its six wins in 2018.

- Tech recovered three fumbles in a 34-31 OT win vs. UVA (11/23/18), tying for the most in a game by an ACC team in 2018.

BEAMER BALL LIVES HERE!

- For the third consecutive year under Fuente and special teams coordinator James Shibest the Hokies scored multiple TDs on special teams.

- TE Chris Cunningham blocked a punt at FSU (9/3/18) that was recovered by WR Eric Kumah for a TD in a 24-3 win.

- WR Tré Turner blocked a punt that was recovered by CB Jovonn Quillen for a TD in 34-31 OT victory vs. UVA (11/23/18).

- K Jordan Stout boomed 61 kickoffs for touchbacks in 2018, a figure that led the ACC and ranked seventh in the nation.

- Willis registered a 2.67 TD-to-INT differential (24 TDs/9 INTs), a mark that ranks as the third-best mark in the ACC in 2018 and the fifth-best seasonal mark in Tech annals dating back to 1996.

- Willis threw a career-high four TDs vs. Marshall (12/1/18), registering his third 300-yard game of the year with 312 yards.

ANOTHER PROLIFIC SEASON FOR TD PASSES

• Tech came two TD passes shy of tying for the most TD passes in a season in team history. The Hokies averaged 2.23 TD passes per game in 13 games in 2018 compared to 2.21 TD passes per game in 14 games in 2016.

RETURNING PASS CATCHERS APLENTY IN 2019

• Ten of the 12 players who registered a catch for the Hokies in 2018 are anticipated to return for the 2019 campaign.

• Those 10 players accounted for 211 receptions for 2,930 yards with 26 TDs in 2018, numbers that translate to 84.4% of the club's catches, 88.8% of the team's receiving yards and 89.7% of the Tech's receiving TDs.

• Every player who caught more than 25 passes for Tech in 2018 is back, including the squad's top five pass catchers - Damon Hazelton, Eric Kumah, Hezekiah Grimsley, Dalton Keene and Tré Turner.

• Turner got hot down the stretch for the Hokies. After catching 10 passes for 209 yards with two TDs in the season's first season games, Turner registered 16 catches for 326 yards and two TDs in his last five contests.

• Turner also produced seven rushing attempts for 101 yards with one TD in his last four games to go along with a huge blocked punt in Tech's 34-31 OT victory vs. UVA (11/23).

MUCH GROUND PRODUCTION RETURNS IN 2019, TOO!

• While Tech does lose RB Steven Peoples to graduation, the Hokies are slated to return 13 of the other 14 players who carried the ball at least once last season.

• Although Peoples led Tech in rushing, players who accounted for 68.1% of the squad's carries, 64.5% of the team's rushing yards and 68.4% of its rushing TDs are anticipated to return in 2019.

KEY SPECIALISTS RETURN FOR TECH, AS WELL

• Tech returns its leading scorer from 2018 (K Brian Johnson), as well as All-ACC third-team punter Oscar Bradburn, in addition to snapper Oscar Shadley and kickoff specialist Jordan Stout.

WALKER, HAZELTON NAMED SECOND-TEAM ALL-ACC

• DT Ricky Walker earned second-team All-ACC honors and is the only primary starter from 2018 not returning in 2019. He led the squad with 10.5 TFL last season.

• Walker will represent Virginia Tech in the East-West Shrine Game on Jan. 19.

• WR Damon Hazelton also earned second-team All-ACC accolades in 2018. He tied for second in the ACC with a team-high eight TD catches, a figure that also tied with WR Ricky Hall (8 in 1998) for the most-ever by a first-year Tech player.

• Hazelton also led Tech with 51 catches for 802 yards.

• Returnees LB Rayshard Ashby and TE Dalton Keene both earned All-ACC honorable mention honors in 2018.

• For the second consecutive season the Hokies will open the season with an ACC road contest. Tech's game at Boston College will mark the earliest start for the Hokies since facing Alabama in the Georgia Dome (8/31/13).

• Last season, Tech began the season with a 24-3 victory at Florida State (9/3/17).

• The Hokies will open the year against Boston College for the first time since 1995. Despite beginning that campaign with a pair of losses, Tech finished the year as BIG EAST champs with a 10-2 record and went on to a 28-10 win vs. Texas in the Sugar Bowl.

• Tech will host Duke at Lane Stadium on Friday, Sept. 27.

• The Hokies will be seeking to extend three-game winning streaks against both Duke and North Carolina.

• Tech will visit Miami on Oct. 5 as the Hokies face Manny Diaz for the initial time as the Hurricanes' head coach.

• Mack Brown will face Tech for the first time in Blacksburg as North Carolina's head coach on Oct. 19. Brown's initial meeting with the Hokies came as Tulane head coach in Frank Beamer's initial season as VT's head coach (10/24/87).

• VT will make its second trip to Notre Dame on Nov. 2. Tech won its initial visit to South Bend by a 34-31 margin (11/19/16).

• Wake Forest will make its first appearance in Lane Stadium since Tech registered a 52-21 win over the Demon Deacons (10/16/10).

• The Hokies will conclude the regular season at Virginia on Friday, Nov. 29 as Tech seeks to extend its winning streak over the Cavaliers to 16 consecutive games.

• Willis owns a 2.67 TD-to-INT differential (24 TDs/9 INTs), a mark that ranks as the third-best mark in the ACC in 2018 and the fifth-best seasonal mark in Tech annals dating back to 1996.

• Willis threw a career-high four TDs vs. Marshall (12/1), registering his third 300-yard game of the year with 312 yards.

HEAD COACH - 3RD SEASON



- Named Virginia Tech's head coach on Nov. 29, 2015 after orchestrating one of the more impressive program resurrections in recent college football history at Memphis.
- In three seasons under Fuente, the Hokies have gone 25-15 with three bowl game appearances and winning an ACC Coastal Division title in 2016. Fuente's 25 victories at Virginia Tech through three seasons are the most in program history. His 25 wins in just 40 games rank third in program history and are the fewest games needed to reach that plateau since B.C. Cabbage registered 25 victories in 35 games between 1921 and 1925.
- In 2018, despite the Hokies having the youngest defensive two-deep in the ACC and losing starting QB Josh Jackson to a season-ending injury only three games into the season, Fuente led the Hokies to their 26th consecutive bowl game – the longest active streak in the nation and the third longest in college football history.
- Tech also retained possession of the Commonwealth Cup after defeating in-state rival Virginia for a 15th consecutive season.
- Tech's tradition of special teams excellence continued in 2018 as the Hokies returned two blocked punts for touchdowns for the first time since 1998. Meanwhile, the Hokies allowed 350 combined punt/kickoff return yards, the sixth-lowest total in the FBS.
- Under the tutelage of Fuente and offensive coordinator Brad Cornelsen, redshirt junior QB Ryan Willis finished the regular season with 22 touchdown passes, making him the third different Virginia Tech quarterback in the Fuente Era to throw 20 or more touchdowns in a season; joining Jerod Evans (29 in 2016) and Jackson (20 in 2017).
- Tech also improved to 22-1 during Fuente's tenure when leading at halftime.
- With 19 wins in his first two seasons at Tech, Fuente owned more victories than every Tech coach has accumulated in his first three seasons with the exception of B.C. Cabbage, who guided the program to 21 victories from 1921-23.
- The Hokies finished back-to-back seasons in the final AP Poll in 2016-17 for the first time since 2010-11. The Hokies will be seeking to conclude three straight seasons in the AP Top 25 for the first time since doing it eight consecutive years under Frank Beamer (2004-11).
- Tech concluded the 2017 season with a 9-4 mark, finishing the year No. 24 in the AP Top 25 and No. 25 in the Amway USA Today Coaches Poll.
- Tech extended its streak of consecutive bowl appearances to 25 straight seasons in 2017 under Fuente, the longest active streak recognized by the NCAA. Should Tech earn its 26th straight bowl berth in 2018, that mark that would give VT sole possession of the third-longest streak in NCAA history.
- Fuente's offensive acumen has resulted in Tech registering the top three seasons for passing yards per game in each of his three campaigns in Blacksburg despite utilizing three different primary quarterbacks.
- Jackson's 2,991 passing yards were a VT freshman record and the most of any FBS freshman in 2017, while his 20 TDs and 135.2 rating were second among FBS freshmen behind Georgia QB Jake Fromm (24 TDs, 160.1 ranking).
- Tech's traditionally stout Lunch Pail Defense also lived up to its reputation in 2017, pitching three shutouts.

2016 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

- The consensus 2016 ACC Coach of the Year, Fuente was also named the top first-year FBS head coach in the nation by the Football Writers Association of America, sharing that honor with USC's Clay Helton.
- Tech finished the 2016 season ranked No. 16 in both the AP Poll and the Coaches Poll, marking the highest final mark for the Hokies since 2010 (No. 16 AP, No. 15 Coaches).
- Virginia Tech, Penn State, Colorado, West Virginia and Western Michigan all finished in the AP Top 25 after getting zero votes in the AP Preseason Poll.
- Tech's 10 wins were the team's most since 2011 and the most ever by a first-year Virginia Tech head coach, surpassing the previous mark of nine wins by C.P. Miles in 1905.

The famed Virginia Tech Lunch Pail has come to symbolize the blue-collar approach of the Hokies' defense under longtime defensive coordinate Bud Foster.

- In 1995, Foster served as co-defensive coordinator with Rod Sharpless, whose mother-in-law found the original Lunch Pail in Mercerville, New Jersey. The pail once belonged to a coal miner and after a record-setting defensive season, the Lunch Pail became an iconic part of Hokies' lore.
- The Pail travels wherever the Hokies go and its care is only entrusted to a defensive leader.
- Before the start of every season, a signed mission statement from the defense is placed in The Pail. Then every week, unit goals, team goals and keys to success are placed in The Pail, plus the turf from any road victories.
- Since 2007, The Pail has also contained the names of the 32 fallen Hokies taken in the April 16 tragedy.
- Darryl Tapp is the only player who has ever earned lifetime possession of an incarnation of The Pail from Foster.

- Even though the namesake is no longer the big whistle in Blacksburg, Virginia Tech's BeamerBall philosophy has not waned under third-year head coach Justin Fuente.
- There have been 150 non-offensive touchdowns and 145 blocked kicks by Virginia Tech since Frank Beamer's first season as head coach in 1987.
- Under Fuente, the Hokies have scored 10 non-offensive touchdowns – three punt return touchdowns, two fumble return touchdowns, two interception return touchdowns, two blocked punt return touchdowns and one blocked field goal return touchdown.
- Since Fuente's hiring, the Hokies are tied for eighth in Power Five with seven combined punt return, interception return and fumble return touchdowns.
- The Hokies have blocked more kicks over the last three seasons under Fuente (11) than the previous five seasons combined (9).

BEAMER NAMED TO COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

- Former Virginia Tech head coach Frank Beamer was named College Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2018 in his initial year of eligibility.
- The induction is set for Dec. 4 in New York City.
- The winningest coach in Virginia Tech history, Beamer's 280 victories rank sixth overall in FBS history and are the 13th most by a college football coach at any NCAA division.
- He led the Hokies to their first ever national title game appearance as part of an impressive streak of 23 consecutive bowl berths in his final 23 seasons.
- Under Beamer, the Hokies posted five top-10 finishes and became one of only six programs in college football history to go to a bowl game in at least 20-straight seasons.
- A five-time conference Coach of the Year, Beamer won three BIG EAST titles and added four ACC titles in five conference championship game appearances.
- A monument of Beamer was unveiled at Moody Plaza prior to the Notre Dame game on Oct. 6. The naming of the Beamer-Lawson Indoor Practice Facility was also approved on Oct. 6.

- Head coach Justin Fuente and the Hokies pay homage to Frank Beamer and Virginia Tech's legacy of excellence on special teams by selecting a special teams player of the week who will wear No. 25.
- With Coach Beamer's blessing, his retired No. 25 was worn by a player who exemplified the role special teams played during Virginia Tech's rise to national prominence.

THE GENESIS OF "BIG PLAY" TRÉ

▪ In 2018, freshman WR Tré Turner turned into a key target when the Hokies needed a "money play" - a play resulting in a first down or a touchdown - and he even got his first taste of BeamerBall against Virginia (11/23/18).

▪ After making an acrobatic, one-handed touchdown catch in the first quarter against UVA, Turner blocked his first career punt on the next UVA possession that was recovered in the end zone for a touchdown.

▪ Along with the blocked kick, Turner racked up 112 yards of offense (43 rushing, 69 receiving).

▪ His performance against UVA earned him the honor of wearing Frank Beamer's No. 25 vs. Marshall, where he turned in a career-high 99 receiving yards on three catches and a 45-yard TD reception.

▪ Of Turner's 25 career receptions, 17 have gone for a first down and three have been touchdowns.

▪ Turner's first eight catches of his career went for first downs.

▪ 60 of the Honaker, Virginia native's 71 kickoffs went for touchbacks in 2018, a percentage that ranked fourth in the FBS.

▪ Between Stout and punter Oscar Bradburn, Tech's opponents had only 350 return yards, a total that ranked sixth in the Power Five.

HAZELTON MAKES IMPACT IN 2018

▪ Ball State transfer Damon Hazelton certainly lived up to the hype in 2018.

▪ His eight TD catches tied for third in the ACC and his 61.7 receiving yards per game ranked 12th in the conference.

▪ His eight receiving touchdowns are also tied for sixth on Virginia Tech's single season TD chart.

▪ He registered three 100-yard receiving games, which tied for the fourth most in the conference.

▪ Against Notre Dame (10/6/18), Hazelton tied WR Isaiah Ford's program record of five consecutive games with a receiving TD.

▪ He registered his first 100-yard receiving game as a Hokie vs. William & Mary (9/8/18) and his first catch in a VT uniform was a 10-yard TD catch at Florida State (9/3/18).

▪ The Baltimore native racked up 51 catches for 505 yards in 11 games for Ball State as a true freshman.

▪ He transferred from Ball State and was recommended to Tech wide receivers coach Holmon Wiggins by Texas A&M wide receivers coach Aaron Moorehead, who coached wide receivers for the Hokies from 2013-14.

▪ He sat out last season due to NCAA transfer rules, redshirted, and made friends with New York Giants wide receiver Odell Beckham, Jr. while working out with trainer Jamal Liggins.

WILLIS ETCHES NAME IN RECORD BOOK

- Redshirt junior Ryan Willis etched his name in the Virginia Tech record book in his first season with the Hokies.
- He's currently tied for second in program history with three 300-yard passing games.
- Willis' 2,716 passing yards ranks eighth in Tech history.
- After games against Duke and Notre Dame, Willis became the first Tech QB since Logan Thomas in 2013 to throw for more than 300 yards in back-to-back games.
- His 31 completions against the Irish ranks third in a single game in program history.
- He was also the first Hokie signal caller to throw for 300+ yards in his first two starts.
- In his first start since Nov. 11 2016 at Baylor as a Kansas Jayhawk, Willis threw for 332 yards on 17 of 27 passing with a career high three touchdown passes in Virginia Tech's 31-14 win at No. 22 Duke (9/29/18).
- Willis' 332 passing yards were the most for a QB making his first start at Virginia Tech.
- The win marked Willis' first career win as a starter and his third career 300-yard passing game.
- Willis was only the second Virginia Tech quarterback to make his first two starts with the Hokies against ranked teams; joining Bryan Randall in 2002 vs. No. 14 LSU and No. 16 Marshall.

HOKIES HAVE NFL BLOODLINES

▪ Virginia Tech has multiple players on its roster this season that grew up in NFL households:

C Kyle Chung: father, Eugene, was an All-American offensive lineman at Virginia Tech and a first round pick of the New England Patriots. He's currently on the Philadelphia Eagles' coaching staff.

DL Robert Porcher: father, Robert, was a first round pick of the Detroit Lions where he was a three-time Pro Bowler. He finished his career with 95.5 sacks in 12 seasons.

RB Terius Wheatley: father, Tyrone, was a three-time first-team All-Big Ten selection at Michigan, a first round pick of the New York Giants and went on to play 10 seasons in the NFL.

LB Keshon Artis: family cousin, Kenny Easley, was the fourth overall pick taken in 1981 by Seattle where he went to five Pro Bowls and had his No. 45 retired.

HOKIES STOP ANOTHER STREAK

- In its history, Virginia Tech has been known to stop some of their ranked opponents' significant streaks.
- This season, the Hokies halted yet another streak:

Significant Streaks Stopped by the Hokies
Texas (12/31/95): 28-10 win in the 1995 Sugar Bowl snapped a nine-game win streak.

Texas A&M (9/21/02): 13-3 win broke the Aggies' 29-game non-conference win streak.

Miami (11/1/03): 31-7 victory snapped their 39-game regular season win streak.

Ohio State (9/6/14): 35-21 upset in broke its 25-game regular season win streak.

North Carolina (10/8/16): 34-3 drubbing over the Tar Heels broke their nine-game home win streak.

Duke (9/29/18): 31-14 win broke the Blue Devils' seven-game win streak dating back to 2017.

GAME-WINNING DRIVE LIFTS VT

▪ The Hokies' 18 play, 98-yard game-winning touchdown drive at North Carolina (10/13/18) is tied for the fourth-longest drive in program history and stands as the longest game-winning drive in program history.

- North Carolina was ready to put the game away, driving to the Tech one-yard line midway through the fourth quarter. But then Tyree Rodgers forced a fumble from UNC tailback Michael Carter that Jovonn Quillen recovered at the Tech 2 with 6:13 remaining in the game.
- The drive took 18 plays, tied for the third most in a TD drive in Tech history, in 5:54 that ended with a one-yard TD grab by TE Dalton Keene.

FARLEY FIGHTS THROUGH ADVERSITY

- It's been a long and tumultuous road for redshirt freshman DB Caleb Farley, who has two interceptions in three starts at cornerback for Virginia Tech.
- After racking up 78 yards of total offense (61 receiving yards, 17 rushing yards) in the 2017 spring game, Farley tore his ACL on the first day of fall camp that kept him out the remainder of the season.
- Off the field, Farley dealt with another major blow personally in January 2018 when his mother succumbed to nearly a decade-long battle with cancer.
- Farley, who cornerbacks coach Brian Mitchell called a "borrowed wide receiver", moved from wideout to cornerback in the spring and is listed as a second-string corner and is expected to return punts and kicks.

LPD LEADS TECH IN WIN AT FSU

- Virginia Tech's dominating 24-3 victory at Florida State was the Hokies' first win in Tallahassee since Nov. 16, 1974.
- The Hokies improved to 100-1 under Bud Foster at defensive coordinator when they hold opponents to 10 points or fewer.
- It was only the fifth time since 1996 under Foster and the third time on the road that the Hokies held a ranked opponent to three points or less.
- It marked the first time in program history that Virginia Tech opened with ranked opponents in back-to-back seasons and won both games after dropping its previous 10 matchups.
- The Hokies held the Seminoles to their lowest point total at home since 2008 when FSU also put up three points against Wake Forest.
- Justin Fuente moved to 4-0 all-time against Willie Taggart as a head coach.

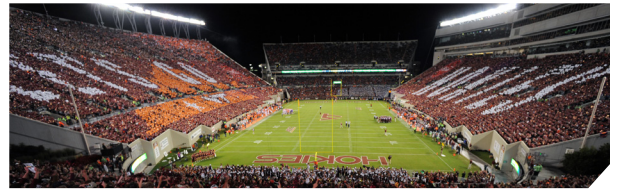

LANE STADIUM - HOME OF THE HOKIES

Rising high into the mountainous sky of the New River Valley, Virginia Tech's Lane Stadium enters its 53rd year of football competition in 2017. The Tech football team has enjoyed over two decades of success, going to 24 straight bowl games and winning 10 or more games eight straight seasons from 2004-11. A big part of that success is the home-field advantage the Hokies enjoy at Lane Stadium/Worsham Field.

Sitting at roughly 2,057 feet above sea level, the stadium is the second-highest among all FBS schools in the eastern United States, trailing only Appalachian State (3,300). Completed in 1965, Lane Stadium/Worsham Field has gone through numerous changes, renovations and additions. But through it all, it has always been regarded as one of the finest places to watch – and toughest places for opponents to play – a college football game.

THE HOKIE STONE

Before each home football game, Virginia Tech football players and coaching staff enter Lane Stadium through a tunnel. On the stadium-side entrance to Worsham Field, they pass beneath a Hokie Stone, which they touch for good luck and is flanked by these words: "For those who have passed. For those to come ... Reach for Excellence."

ENTER SANDMAN

The history behind Virginia Tech's use of Metallica's "Enter Sandman" started during the 2000 season. That summer, Tech added a new scoreboard to Lane Stadium and the athletics marketing team decided to use the song for an entrance video. The group considered "Welcome to the Jungle" by Guns N' Roses and "Sirius" by the Alan Parsons Project before settling on "Enter Sandman." As the song played on one chilly evening prior to the team's entrance, members of the Marching Virginians began to jump up and down in rhythm in an effort to stay warm. The Lane Stadium crowd followed suit and the jumping hasn't stopped since.

Virginia Tech jumped out to a quick lead and never relinquished it, rolling to a 24-3 victory over Florida State at Doak Campbell Stadium on Monday night in an ACC game that marked the season opener for both squads.

With the victory, Virginia Tech, ranked No. 20 in the Associated Press poll, snapped a six-game losing streak to the Seminoles in Tallahassee. Florida State came in ranked No. 19.

The Hokies played a strong first half, taking a 17-3 lead into the locker room. A Josh Jackson touchdown pass to Damon Hazelton and a field goal by Brian Johnson on the Hokies' first two possessions gave them a 10-0 lead.

Tech's special teams made the biggest play of the first half when tight end Chris Cunningham blocked the punt of FSU punter Logan Tyler. Tech's Eric Kumah caught the deflection and ran it three yards into the end zone for a touchdown, which gave the Hokies the 17-3 cushion.

Tech then put the game away late in the fourth quarter when Jackson threw a 49-yard touchdown pass to Kuman with 5:11 remaining.

Jackson threw for 207 yards and two touchdowns. Tech's defense forced five turnovers, recorded four sacks and held Florida State to just 94 yards rushing.

GAME NOTES

- Kumah's blocked punt return for a score marked the Hokies' first since Anthony Shegog returned one for a touchdown in Tech's win at Purdue in 2015.
- Cunningham's blocked punt marked the Hokies' 11th blocked kick under Justin Fuente and the ninth non-offensive touchdown.

Josh Jackson threw a touchdown pass and ran for a touchdown and Steven Peoples rushed for two touchdowns, as No. 12 Virginia Tech blasted in-state foe William & Mary 62-17 in a non-conference game at Lane Stadium on Saturday in a game that marked the Hokies' home opener.

The Hokies (2-0) showed no hangover coming off their huge win over Florida State on Monday night, scoring on 10 straight possessions during one stretch of the game and never punting. They racked up more than 400 yards offense in the first 30 minutes alone, and not to be outdone, Tech's defense held William & Mary to 100 first-half yards and just three first downs.

Peoples scored on runs of 6 and 4 yards and Jackson scored on an 8-yard run. Jackson, who played the entire first half and one series in the second, completed 12 of 16 for 217 yards and threw a 39-yard touchdown pass to Damon Hazelton.

The Hokies finished with 586 yards of total offense. William & Mary had 266, led by quarterback Shon Mitchell's 208 yards passing.

Hazelton caught four passes for a career-high 107 yards for the Hokies.

Despite Steven Peoples' career-best rushing performance, Virginia Tech struggled for much of the afternoon against in-state foe Old Dominion, and the No. 13 Hokies fell 49-35 to the Monarchs in a nonconference game at Ballard Stadium.

Peoples rushed for 156 yards on 20 carries and scored on runs of 87 yards and 1 yard. Quarterback Josh Jackson threw two touchdown passes.

But the Hokies struggled against ODU's offense, led by backup quarterback Blake LaRussa. The 5-foot-11 LaRussa completed 30 of 49 for 495 yards and threw touchdown passes of 14, 4, 25 and 29 yards. He also rushed for a touchdown on a day in which ODU's offense finished with 632 yards.

The Hokies led 28-21 with 32 seconds left in the third quarter, but ODU scored on its next two possessions, taking a 35-28 lead – its first lead of the game.

Things got worse for Tech, as Jackson went down with a lower leg injury on the first play of the ensuing drive. Backup quarterback Ryan Willis led the Hokies on a 75-yard march that ended with a touchdown pass, tying the game at 35.

But the Hokies simply had no answer for ODU. LaRussa polished off a 75-yard drive with 5:11 left and Jeremy Cox's 40-yard touchdown run sealed the win.

Making his first start as a Hokie, quarterback Ryan Willis threw for 332 yards and three touchdowns to lead Virginia Tech to a 31-14 bounce-back victory over No. 22 Duke in an ACC game played Saturday night at Wallace Wade Stadium.

Playing in place of injured starter Josh Jackson, Willis looked like a veteran, throwing the ball accurately and making good decisions, as the Hokies rebounded from a loss to ODU last Saturday. He completed 17 of 27 in the game.

Willis, who transferred from Kansas in 2017, made a beautiful throw over Damon Hazelton's outside shoulder for a 27-yard touchdown pass on the first play of the second quarter to give the Hokies a 10-7 lead, and Tech never trailed again. The Hokies padded their score on their next possession when tight end Dalton Keene hauled in a short pass from Willis and broke several tackles en route to a 67-yard touchdown. Those two scores in a three-minute span enabled the Hokies to take control of the game.

Duke cut the lead to 24-14 on a 1-yard run by Deon Jackson with 13:47 left in the game, but Willis and the Hokies answered. A 75-yard drive ended with a 10-yard touchdown pass from Willis to Phil Jackson.

Tech finished with 413 yards of offense. The Hokies' defense held Duke to 327 yards and sacked Duke's Daniel Jones three times.

GAME NOTES

- Tech beat a ranked team for the fourth time in Justin Fuente's tenure as the head coach (UNC in 2016, West Virginia in 2017, FSU 2018).
- The 300-yard passing game marked the third of Willis' career. He twice went over 300 yards during his two years at Kansas.
- Hazelton's touchdown reception in the second quarter gave him a touchdown reception in all four games this season.

Despite another solid performance from quarterback Ryan Willis and a big game from receiver Damon Hazelton, Virginia Tech struggled to stop Notre Dame's offense in the second half, falling to the No. 6 Irish 45-23 in a non-conference game played Saturday night at Lane Stadium.

The Hokies trailed by just a point at halftime, 17-16, after Willis connected with Hazelton for a 3-yard touchdown with 12 seconds left in the first half. But Notre Dame made several big plays in the second half to pull away.

The Irish scored touchdowns on four of their first five possessions of the second half, including on their first two possessions the third quarter (a 97-yard touchdown run by Dexter Williams and a 40-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Ian Book to Miles Boykin). The latter score gave the Irish a 31-16 lead with 4:59 left in the third quarter.

Notre Dame all but sealed the game early in the fourth quarter when an 11-play, 64-yard drive ended with a 5-yard touchdown pass from Book to Boykin that gave the Irish a 38-16 lead with 9:08 remaining.

Tech cut into that lead when Willis threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to Eric Kuman with 5:40 remaining, but Notre Dame answered with a 31-yard touchdown run by Williams to account for the final margin.

GAME NOTES

- Hazelton recorded his third 100-yard receiving game of the season and now has caught at least one touchdown pass in all five of the Hokies' games this season, tying Isaiah Ford's program record.
- Hazelton's 12 receptions tied a career high. He caught 12 in a game while playing at Ball State before transferring to Tech.
- Willis became the first Tech quarterback since Logan Thomas in 2013 to throw for at least 300 yards in back-to-back games.

Despite two passing touchdowns and one rushing score from quarterback Ryan Willis, Virginia Tech struggled to slow down Georgia Tech's rushing attack and fell 49-28 to the Yellow Jackets in an ACC game played Thursday night at Lane Stadium.

With the loss, the Hokies dropped to 4-3 overall, 3-1 in the ACC. Georgia Tech moved to 4-4, 2-3.

The key play in the game came midway through the second quarter when the Hokies, leading 21-14, forced Georgia Tech to punt. But Virginia Tech punt returner Sean Savoy muffed the punt, and Georgia Tech recovered at the Virginia Tech 12. Two plays later, Jordan Mason scored on a 5-yard run to tie the game at 21 with 6:57 left in the first half.

That touchdown was the first of four consecutive touchdowns scored by the Yellow Jackets, as Georgia Tech's ground game was in full throttle. Behind quarterback Tobias Oliver – starting in place of injured Taquon Marshall – the Yellow Jackets rushed for 465 yards and registered 35 first downs. Oliver finished with 40 carries for 215 yards and three touchdowns.

The Hokies finished with 323 yards of offense. Willis completed 15 of 22 for 201 yards and two touchdowns, and he also rushed for 22 yards and a score.

Despite leading at halftime, Virginia Tech saw No. 24 Boston College score 21 unanswered points in the second half and pull away for a 31-21 victory over the Hokies in an ACC game played Saturday at Lane Stadium.

Virginia Tech fell behind early and couldn't get back in the game, falling 52-22 to Pitt in an ACC game played Saturday night at Heinz Field.

Pitt jumped out to a 17-0 lead and never looked back. The Panthers got an early field goal from Alex Kessman and then used a 53-yard run from Darrin Hall to set up an 8-yard touchdown run by Quadree Ellison toward the end of the first quarter. A 78-yard touchdown pass from Kenny Pickett to Maurice Ffrench early in the second quarter gave the Panthers the 17-point advantage.

The Hokies got on the board when quarterback Ryan Willis threw a 29-yard touchdown pass to receiver Eric Kumah. The play capped an 80-yard drive and cut the Panthers' lead to 17-7.

But Pitt scored touchdowns on its final two possessions to end the first half and ultimately pulled away.

Miami scored 28 unanswered points midway through the game, and the 'Canes went on to a 38-14 victory over Virginia Tech in an ACC game played Saturday at Lane Stadium.

The Hokies took a 14-10 lead in the second quarter when receiver Tre Turner scored on a 20-yard jet sweep with 10:06 remaining in the first half. But the wheels fell off after that, as Miami scored on a 1-yard run by quarterback N'Kosi Perry with 33 seconds left in the half to retake the lead, 17-14.

That touchdown marked the first of four unanswered scores for the 'Canes. Miami scored three touchdowns in the third quarter, including two on its final two possessions of the period. Jeff Thomas returned a punt 51 yards for a touchdown, and Cam'Ron Davis scored on a 16-yard pass from Perry.

The Hokies' only other score in the game came on a 15-yard touchdown pass from Ryan Willis to tight end Dalton Keene on Tech's first possession of the game. Willis completed just 18 of 36 passes for 216 yards, with a touchdown and two interceptions, to lead a Tech offense that amassed 335 yards.

Perry threw for 171 yards and two touchdowns for Miami, which finished with 339 yards.

GAME NOTES

- Keene's touchdown reception marked his third of the season and the third of his career. The sophomore has caught 18 passes this season after catching just 10 a year ago.
- Turner's rushing touchdown marked his first rushing attempt of his career.
- Willis now has thrown 17 touchdown passes, with just five interceptions on the season.
- Rayshard Ashby led the Hokies with 14 tackles, including one for a loss, in his return from an injury. The sophomore linebacker leads the Hokies with 77 tackles this season, including 38 solo.

Virginia Tech kicker Brian Johnson made a 42-yard field goal in overtime, and the Hokies' Emmanuel Belmar recovered a fumble on Virginia's ensuing possession, all of which gave the Hokies a 34-31 victory over rival Virginia in a Commonwealth Clash game played Saturday evening at Lane Stadium.

With the win, the Hokies snapped their four-game losing streak and extended their winning streak over Virginia to 15 consecutive games.

Tech appeared to be on the ropes after Virginia kicker Brian Delaney made a 28-yard field goal with 2:41 remaining in regulation to give the Cavaliers a 31-24 lead. But the Hokies made several big plays in the final 2:30 of regulation and overtime.

The biggest came on third-and-10 from the Tech 25 when quarterback Ryan Willis connected with tight end Dalton Keene for a 45-yard gain to the Virginia 30. Two plays later, the Hokies tied the game at 31 when Hezekiah Grimsley recovered a Steven Peoples fumble in the end zone for a touchdown. The extra point tied the game at 31 with 1:51 left.

Neither team scored on their final possessions, thus sending the game into overtime for the first time in the 100 games of the series.

Tech got the ball first and settled for Johnson's 42-yard field goal to take a 34-31 lead – but only after Willis somehow avoided a sack by Virginia's Charles Snowden. On the Cavaliers' possession, Bryce Perkins completed an 11-yard pass to Hasise Dubois on the first play, but on the next play, Perkins botched an exchange with tailback Jordan Ellis, and the Hokies' Belmar recovered to give Tech the win.

GAME NOTES

- Turner's blocked punt marked just the second blocked kick of the season for the Hokies. Tech's only other blocked kick came in the season opener against Florida State when Chris Cunningham blocked a punt that Eric Kumah recovered and returned for a touchdown.
- Peoples' 96 rushing yards marked the second-most in a game in his career. He rushed for 156 in the Hokies' loss at Old Dominion.
- Willis now has thrown at least one touchdown pass in all eight of his starts and in nine straight games.
- Johnson's 31-yard field goal marked his first since the Hokies' loss to Notre Dame.

Virginia Tech quarterback Ryan Willis threw for 312 yards and four touchdowns to lead Virginia Tech to a 41-20 nonconference victory over Marshall at Lane Stadium on Saturday.

The game served as a makeup game for both schools because of the effects of Hurricane Florence in mid-September. Virginia Tech's game against East Carolina and Marshall's game against South Carolina, both scheduled for Sept. 15, were canceled.

The Hokies, who have won two straight to close the regular season, got started quickly against the Thundering Herd, as defensive tackle Ricky Walker forced Marshall quarterback Isaiah Green to fumble on Marshall's first play from scrimmage, and Tech's TyJuan Garbutt recovered. That play ultimately led to a field goal by Brian Johnson, and the Hokies never trailed.

Willis threw four touchdown passes in the first half to four different receivers. He tossed a 46-yard touchdown pass to Hezekiah Grimsley that gave the Hokies a 10-0 lead, and after Marshall scored on the final play of the first quarter, Willis dominated the second period, throwing touchdown passes of 45 yards to Tre Turner, 7 yards to Steven Peoples and 32 yards to Eric Kumah. The Hokies led 31-6 at the break.

Willis completed 18 of 26 for 312 yards, with four touchdowns. The Hokies finished with 454 total yards.

Marshall tailback Brenden Knox paced the Thundering Herd, rushing for 204 yards on 27 carries and scoring a touchdown. The Thundering Herd finished with 452 total yards.

GAME NOTES

- For the fourth time during the Hokies' bowl streak, they won their final game of the season to become bowl eligible (2012, 2014, 2015, 2018).
- The Hokies moved to 22-5 under head coach Justin Fuente when scoring first.

Despite getting two touchdown passes and a rushing touchdown from quarterback Ryan Willis, Virginia Tech couldn't quite overcome Cincinnati in a back-and-forth affair, falling 35-31 to the Bearcats in the Military Bowl held at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium on Monday afternoon.

With the loss, the Hokies closed the season with a 6-7 overall record and saw their streak of consecutive winning seasons come to an end at 25. The Bearcats finished with an 11-2 record and became just the third 11-win team in program history.

Tech led 31-28 late in the fourth quarter, but Cincinnati marched 64 yards in five plays and scored on a Michael Warren's 8-yard run to take a 35-31 lead with 1:29 remaining. The Hokies drove to the Cincinnati 48 on the ensuing drive, but on second-and-10, Willis' pass was intercepted by James Wiggins at the Cincinnati 17 with 33 seconds left. The Bearcats then took a knee to run out the clock and seal the victory.

Arguably the biggest play in the game came early in the fourth quarter after the Hokies' Dylan Rivers intercepted a pass and returned it to the Cincinnati 12. The Hokies, who led 31-28 and had a great chance to increase their lead, drove to the Cincinnati 3, where they faced fourth-and-1. Head coach Justin Fuente elected to go for it, but Willis was sacked and fumble and Cincinnati regained possession.

GAME NOTES

- For the first time this season, Tech lost a game despite rushing for at least 200 yards. The Hokies rushed for 224 against a Cincinnati defense allowing just 101.8 coming into the game.
- For the eighth time this season, the Hokies finished with more than 400 yards of offense.
- Willis' two touchdown passes gave him 24 for the season – tying for the second-most touchdown pass in a single season in Tech history (Tyrod Taylor). Jerod Evans holds the school record with 29.
- McCleese's 102 yards were his second-most in a game in his career. He rushed for 124 yards in the Hokies' loss to Oklahoma State in the Camping World Bowl last December.
