HOKIES SET FOR 3-MATCH HOMESTAND

- No. 14 Virginia Tech will end its regular season with a three-match homestand starting with a 6 p.m. dual against ninth-ranked Cornell this Friday in Cassell Coliseum.
- Tech will then face No. 22 Virginia at the Moss Arts Center on Saturday at 7 p.m. in the Commonwealth Clash, presented by Virginia529.
- The Hokies, who currently lead the Commonwealth Clash, 4-3, will look sot secure another team point in the Clash on Saturday.
- The Hokies will look to bounce back from an 18-14 loss to No. 13 North Carolina last Friday in Chapel Hill.
- The loss to the Tar Heels was only the Hokies' second defeat in their last 22 matches against ACC competition.
- This week, Tech six wrestlers in FloWrestling's individual rankings - No. 11 Korbin Myers (133), No. 10 Mekhi Lewis (165), No. 8 David McFadden (174), No. 2 Zack Zavatsky (184), No. 12 Tom Sleigh (197) and No. 14 Billy Miller (285).
- The biggest mover this week for the Hokies was Zavatsky, who jumped four spots to number two after his 12-4 major decision over No. 14 Chip Ness of UNC.

SHORT TIME - CORNELL

- Cornell is currently ranked ninth in the nation in the NWCA Coaches' Poll and is 11-2 on the season.
- They're coming off of a 34-7 win over No. 19 Princeton on Feb. 9, a win that clinched their 17th consecutive lvy League championship.
- The Big Red are led by 26th-year head coach Rob Koll, who's the program's winningest coach at 304-93-5 and has helped mentor 67 All-Americans and 15 national champions.
- This will be Cornell's first trip to Blacksburg but it's their fourth time facing the Hokies.

- The two squared off in Charlottesville at the Virginia Duals and twice in the NWCA National Duals in Cedar Falls, Iowa and Columbus, Ohio in 2011 and 2014, respectively.
- · Cornell has six wrestlers ranked in this week's individual Intermat rankings, including three in the top 10 - No. 8 Vitali Arujau (125), No. 1 Yianni Diakomihalis (141) and No. 7 Ben Honis (197).
- Diakomihalis is 17-0 on the season and the reigning national champion at 141 pounds.

SHORT TIME - VIRGINIA

- Virginia is 12-8 on the season and is currently ranked 22nd in the latest NWCA Coaches' Poll.
- The 'Hoos are coming off of a 26-17 win over Duke in Charlottesvile after dropping back-to-back duals against UNC and NC State.
- Tech defeated UVA earlier this season by a score of 37-5 in the finals of the Virginia Duals on Jan. 12.
- The 32-point win marked the most lopsided victory for the Hokies over the Cavaliers since a 32-0 win back in 2004.
- Tech won nine of the 10 bouts with five going for bonus points.
- The Hokies are 46-32-1 all-time against UVA.
- The 'Hoos are led by fifth-ranked Jack Mueller at 125 pounds and No. 10 Jay Aiello at 197.

HOKIES' HISTORY AT THE MOSS

- Virginia Tech is 7-1 all-time at the Moss Arts Center.
- UVA was the Hokies' first opponent on the stage at the Moss Arts Center on Feb. 1, 2015 as ninthranked Tech topped No. 12 Virginia, 18-16.
- Tech's lone defeat at the Moss was a 22-12 loss to fourth-ranked Missouri last season on Nov. 25, 2017.
- The Hokies are 4-1 all-time against ranked opponents at the Moss Arts Center

ALL HE DOES IS PIN!

- Mitch Moore's win by fall over Duke's Josh Finesilver
 45 seconds into the bout on Feb. 1 was the freshman's team-best ninth pin of the season.
- Seven of Moore's nine pins this year have come in the first period, with his fastest fall coming at 17 seconds against Franklin & Marshall's Patrick Quinlan on Jan. 5.
- With four duals and the postseason still to come, Moore is one more fall away from tying Bill Pfeffer (1979-80) and Jarrod Garnett (2008-09) for 10th in single season pins.
- Moore's nine falls are the most in a single season since Devin Carter registered 11 pins in 2011-12.

ZZ WINS NO. 100

- Zack Zavatsky's 18-9 major decision over Duke's Kaden Russell last Friday marked his 100th career victory.
- Zavatsky is the 12th Virginia Tech wrestler to eclipse the 100-win plateau and he currently ranked 12th on the program's all-time wins list.
- 46 of Zavatsky's 100 wins have gone for bonus points.
- The Latrobe, Pa., native is a two-time ACC champion, a three-time NCAA qualifier and was an All-American in 2018 who placed sixth in the country at 184.

KORBIN NAMED ACC WRESTLER OF THE WEEK

- Korbin Myers was named ACC Wrestler of the Week on Tuesday after winning both of his matches in a 2-0 week for the Hokies.
- In his match against Phillippi, Myers led 3-2 late in the third period. Phillippi accumulated riding time of over a minute, which would have deadlocked the score 3-3 at the end of regulation. But in the final seconds, Myers scored two points on a reversal that extended his lead to 5-2. That made the riding point moot, as Myers' late moved sealed the 5-3 upset decision
- Myers then went on to defeat Lehigh's Brandon Paetzell with a workmanlike 4-1 decision on Jan. 27.
- Myers wasn't scored on once in 14 minutes of mat time.

HOKIES WIN VA. DUALS TITLE

- Virginia Tech went 3-0 with wins over Chattanooga, Old Dominion and Virginia to win the 2019 Virginia Duals National College Division title.
- The Hokies have won four Virginia Duals titles over the last six years and two in the last three.
- Tech improved to 3-0 all-time against the 'Hoos in finals at the Virginia Duals.
- In 30 bouts at the Duals, Tech went 26-4 with 12 bonus point wins.

Laprade Named ACC Wrestler OF the Week

- Virginia Tech redshirt sophomore B.C. LaPrade was named ACC Wrestler of the Week on Jan. 15 after going 3-0 at the Virginia Duals.
- LaPrade posted three wins in leading the No. 13
 Hokies to the team title at last weekend's Virginia
 Duals, including a win over sixth-ranked Larry Early
 of Old Dominion and a first-period pin of Virginia's
 Jake Keatiing.
- LaPrade was only taken down twice in three matches at the Duals. LaPrade improved to 11-4 overall and 6-1 in duals following last weekend's action. He also entered FloWrestling's 157-pound rankings this week at No. 16.

CARTER JOINS VT STAFF

- Head coach Tony Robie announced on Jan.
 10 that Hokie legend Devin Carter was added to the Virginia Tech coaching staff as a volunteer assistant
- Carter was a four-time ACC champion, a threetime All-American and a national finalist at 141 pounds for the Hokies in 2014.
- He's currently on track to earn his PhD in industrial/organizational psychology from Virginia Tech in May.
- "We're excited that Devin's schedule will allow him to be in the room to help our team for the remainder of this season," Robie said. "His presence and the intensity that he brings to practice every day will be a huge benefit to our guys. Devin is without a doubt one of the toughest people that I've coached over the past two decades and we are fortunate to have him on staff."
- A native of Christiansburg, Carter re-wrote the record book at Virginia Tech. He won 121 career matches with 38 pins and became the school's first NCAA finalist when he advanced to the final match at the 2014 Championships. Carter was the first three-time All-American in program history and his 19 NCAA Champions

5 HOKIES PLACE AT THE SCUFFLE

- Five Virginia Tech wrestlers placed and redshirt senior Tom Sleigh earned his 100th career win at the Southern Scuffle in Chattanooga, Tenn., Jan. 2.
- Sleigh and redshirt junior David McFadden (174) both placed third at their weights while redshirt senior Billy Miller (285) finished in sixth place at heavyweight.
- Competing unattached for the Hokies, sophomore Hunter Bolen (184) went 5-1 en route to a second-place finish and freshman Collin Gerardi (133) placed seventh.
- The 12th-ranked Hokies finished in ninth place in the team race with 46.5 points.
- Bolen defeated Oklahoma State's Jacobe Smith, 3-1, Binghamton's Lou Deprez, 3-2, and wrestled a tight match with third-ranked Shakur Rasheed of Penn State in the finals where he dropped a 4-1 decision.

3 HOKIES PLACE AT CLIFF KEEN

- Competing in the nation's toughest tournament outside of the NCAA Championships, No. 13
 Virginia Tech had three wrestlers place at the Cliff Keen Invitational.
- Redshirt freshman Mekhi Lewis made a run to the finals at 165 pounds but was defeated by 10th-ranked Isaiah White of Nebraska by decision, 2-0.
- His second-place finish was the highest for a Tech individual followed by redshirt junior Zack Zavatsky's fourth place finish at 184 and redshirt senior Tom Sleigh's seventh place finish at 197.
- The Hokies finished in a tie for 11th in the team standings with 84.5 points.

In his first season leading the program, head coach Tony Robie continued Virginia Tech wrestling's run of success as the Hokies won its second consecutive ACC Championship and placed eighth at the NCAA Championships.

Robie became the first ACC wrestling coach in history to guide his team to ACC championships in his first two seasons. With Robie on staff, Virginia Tech has now won four ACC titles over the last six years and seven conference trophies overall when including dual meet titles. The Hokies have also placed in the top 10 at NCAAs in each of the last six years.

In Robie's first full campaign, Virginia Tech placed at least three wrestlers on the podium at nationals for the sixth consecutive season. Jared Haught led the group of three All-Americans in 2018 by becoming the Hokies' second-ever national finalist, joining Devin Carter in 2014. Four Hokies – Haught, David McFadden, Brent Moore and Dennis Gustafson – won ACC titles, with Moore taking home Most Valuable Wrestler honors. Robie also coached McFadden to a regular season record of 30-0, the first undefeated season at Virginia Tech since 2001-02.

In duals, Robie led the Hokies to a 14-3 overall record, a 4-1 mark in ACC matches and a final ranking of No. 10 in the final NWCA Coaches Poll. Robie's 14 dual meet victories ranks second in the ACC record book for most wins by a first-year head coach behind Wade Schalles' 15 wins with Clemson in 1978. His .824 winning percentage ranks third all-time in ACC history for a rookie head coach. In Virginia Tech history, Robie's winning percentage ranks first among rookie head coaches while his 14 wins ranks second behind Tom Brands' 16 dual meet wins in 2004-05. Robie, who started five freshmen in duals for a majority of the season, was also named a finalist for the Theraworx NWCA National Coach of the Year award.

On March 21, 2017, Robie was promoted to head wrestling coach at Virginia Tech after serving as interim head coach since February of that year. During that span, Robie led the Hokies to the team title at the ACC Championships and a sixth-place finish at the 2017 NCAA Championships in St. Louis – Tech's fifth-straight top-10 finish at nationals.

Robie was an integral part of the Virginia Tech wrestling staff for 11 seasons as associate head coach under former head coach Kevin Dresser. Between that 2006-07 and 2016-17, the Hokies won three ACC Dual Meet Championships, three ACC tournament championships and finished in the top 10 at the NCAA Championships five times. One of those top 10 team finishes included a then-ACC record and program best fourth place finish in 2016. He also helped recruit and coach 17 ACC champions and 14 All-Americans.

Robie came to Blacksburg after serving as the head coach at Binghamton University, a program that had been discontinued after the 2003-04 school year because of budget constraints. Before taking over at Binghamton, he was an assistant coach for four seasons at the University of Michigan.

In seven years as a Division I assistant coach, Robie helped coach 23 All-Americans, nine Academic All-Americans and one national champion. As the Wolverines' top assistant coach, Robie recruited three top-10 classes, including the No. 2 ranked class in 2004. His one-on-one work with Michigan student-athlete Ryan Bertin culminated with Bertin's 2003 NCAA championship - the school's first national champion in 18 years. In all, Michigan's team earned national top-10 status all four years that Robie was a coach there. His dedication and influence off the mat resulted in the wrestling team winning the 2003 community service award at the school.

Robie joined the Michigan staff after coaching stops at West Virginia (1998-99) and Edinboro (1999-00).

A native of Erie, Pa., Robie was a Dean's List student at Edinboro and received the school's Academic Achievement Award before graduating with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice in 1997. Robie and his wife, Jennifer, reside in Christiansburg with their three children – Nate, Luke and Jake.


